## NCAC All-Sports Update WOOSTER EARNS FOURTH ALL-SPORTS TITLE; THREE SCHOOLS FINISH WITHIN TWO POINTS

**CLEVELAND** -- Wooster emerged from the tightest race ever to claim the 1994-95 North Coast Athletic Conference All-Sports championship. The Scots and Lady Scots, who also earned All-Sports titles in 1984-85, 1986-87 and 1987-88, totaled 126.5 points to edge Wittenberg (125), Allegheny (124.5) and six-time defending champ Ohio Wesleyan (123). The championship was not decided until the final weekend of the spring season when Wooster won the NCAC Baseball Tournament.

Wooster's championship campaign featured a trio of North Coast titles (baseball, men's basketball and women's soccer) and 16 top-five finishes. Wittenberg, which had never placed higher than fifth heading into the season, improved to second behind two NCAC championships (women's basketball and men's outdoor track & field) and six second-place finishes. Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan each won four conference crowns, as did Kenyon, which placed fifth in the All-Sports race with 114.5 points. Denison (104.5), CWRU (89.5), Oberlin (79) and Earlham (43.5) round out the standings in positions six through nine. Oberlin and Wittenberg made the year's biggest scoring jumps, adding 14 points to their 1993-94 totals. Wooster and Kenyon also made substantial gains of 12.5 and 11.5 points, respectively.

The All-Sports award is given annually to the school that performs the best across the NCAC's 21 sports. Nine points are awarded for a first-place finish, eight for a second, seven for a third, and so on. Men's and women's performances are combined, exemplifying the North Coast's commitment to equity and balance among programs. Wooster won three of the first four All-Sports championships, interrupted only by Denison in year two, leading to Ohio Wesleyan's six-year reign. Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan lead the way with 53 championships over the NCAC's 11 playing seasons, followed by Denison (42), Kenyon (42) and Wooster (31).
