CWRU Hosts Kenyon in only NCAC Game, Sept. 15

CASE RESERVE, DENISON RECORD FIRST
NORTH COAST GRID VICTORIES IN WEEK ONE;
KENYON STUNS ADRIAN, '83 PLAYOFF TEAM

CLEVELAND, OH--Case Western Reserve University and Denison University recorded the first football victories of the new North Coast Athletic Conference, last Saturday, Sept. 8 when CWRU defeated Oberlin College, 29-7, and Denison defeated the College of Wooster, 13-11.

In the second week of NCAC action, this Saturday, September 15, Case Western Reserve University (1-0) will host Kenyon College (1-0) in the only Conference game (1:30 PM) at Eddie Finnigan Field in Cleveland. All other North Coast teams are involved in non-Conference action. The matchups that day are: ALLEGHENY COLLEGE at Lebanon Valley (PA); DENISON hosts Kalamazoo (MI); OBERLIN travels to Bluffton (OH); OHIO WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY travels to Albion (MI); and WOOSTER travels to John Carroll in Cleveland.

In non-Conference action of North Coast teams in week one of the first football season, Kenyon College, which was 5-3-1 in 1983, stunned Adrian College of Michigan, 30-23, in a major NCAA Division III upset. Adrian, which was 8-1 last year, won the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association championship, was ranked sixth in the nation, and selected for the Division III playoffs. The Kenyon victory, in addition to the pre-season ranking of Case Western Reserve University (ninth in the Division III top ten) by Sports Illustrated, are factors that are quickly establishing the NCAC as one of the best football conferences in the Midwest.

Case Reserve quickly confirmed its first-place pre-season ranking by the media as it handled Oberlin College, 29-7. Denison, picked for second in the NCAC, had a scrap with Wooster, 13-11. Allegheny College lost a squeaker to an improving Thiel College (PA) team, 14-7. Ohio Wesleyan did not play Saturday, but starts its season this Saturday at Albion.

Kenyon Stuns Adrian, 30-23

LORDS SWEEP NCAC PLAYER OF WEEK
HONORS WITH TODD STONER & DAVE MORRISON

CLEVELAND, OH--Two members of the Kenyon College football squad, wide receiver Todd Stoner and linebacker Dave Morrison, earned "Player of the Week" honors for their performances in Kenyon's stunning victory over Adrian College of Michigan, 30-23, September 8.

Senior wide receiver Todd Stoner (Lambertville, MI/Bedford HS) led the Lord offensive assault as he gathered in nine receptions from quarterback Dan Pantic for 146 yards and one touchdown. The 5-10, 160-pounder, who was ranked seventh in the nation last year as a receiver (NCAA Div III), also scored on a two-point conversion following a touchdown.

For this performance, Stoner was named the first North Coast Athletic Conference "Player of the Week" on Offense, while teammate Dave Morrison was the first "Player of the Week" on Defense.

Senior linebacker Dave Morrison (Cincinnati, OH/Western Hills HS) compiled impressive defensive stats as he was the main defender in shutting down the explosive Michigan team. The 5-11, 185-pound three-year starter recorded 23 tackles, including 13 unassisted. He had one quarterback sack and one interception. Both players were praised by Coach Larry Kindblom for not only their performances but their outstanding leadership in this close game.

This Kenyon victory over Adrian was most impressive because Adrian was ranked sixth in the nation (NCAA Div III) at the end of the 1983 season. Their 8-1 record and winning of the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association grid title earned them an NCAA playoff spot last year.

DENISON, OHIO WESLEYAN TO VIE FOR
FIRST NCAC MEN'S SOCCER CROWN

CLEVELAND, OH--Looking back at last year's records, it is a toss-up. The Denison University men's soccer team was 16-4-1 while Ohio Wesleyan University posted a 16-5-1 mark. Each team defeated the other in postseason play last year and both plan to win the first North Coast Athletic Conference title this year.

"The NCAC Championship will be won by either Denison or Ohio Wesleyan," said Jerry Harbak, Case Western Reserve University coach and chairman of the NCAC Soccer Coaches' Association. "Both of these programs have been NCAA playoff caliber for the last 15-20 years and this year will be no exception. This will be an outstanding soccer conference. I expect even the last place in the conference standings to have at least a .500 record overall."

"The big difference though is that Denison and Ohio Wesleyan expect to be in the NCAA playoffs -- the rest of us dream about it," Harbak said.

Denison, an NCAA Division III powerhouse, is coming off a season in which the Big Red won the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) championship, 3-0 over Ohio Wesleyan. Though Denison returns its major offensive threats from a year ago, the Big Red loses eight seniors on defense, including goalkeeper Steve Horan who figured in 10 shutouts. Junior Nick Sage (19 goals, 11 assists), senior Bill Paul (13 goals, four assists) and junior Perry Blossom (11 goals, four assists) are being counted on heavily by coach Ted Barclay. "We should score a few goals," said Barclay. "Our ability to stop them will be the question."

Ohio Wesleyan matches Denison in tradition, and last year matched the Big Red on the field as well. After losing the OAC championship, the Battling Bishops defeated Denison in the NCAA regionals in a shootout after two overtimes. OWU went on to the NCAA championship semifinals and lost 4-1 to Scranton University.

The Bishops' major loss from '83 is defensive back Andy Taylor, but coach Jay Martin is excited about those who are returning. Among them is senior Ricky Wiman, an All-Ohio Academic selection. Wiman is a two-time all-America performer who will play sweeperback. Other returnees are senior Tim Schmiechen, a two-time all-Mideast stopperback and sophomore Matt Byers, an all-Mideast forward.

All other Conference teams are bunched behind the two leaders, including Allegheny College which finished third in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in '83 (7-5.) Though second-year coach Marty Goldberg will miss Ted Skattum (top scorer in '83 with 24 points), the team will be anchored by senior goalie Pete Klapper, a two-time All-PAC performer who allowed just 1.11 goals per contest last year. Junior Mike Mangialardi will provide the offensive punch at striker position. "We seem to have a good mixture of experience and young recruits," said Goldberg, "and our offense will determine how successful we are."

CWRU's coach Jerry Harbak will try to improve upon a 6-6-2 record (second in the PAC in '83) and will attempt such with some talented but inexperienced underclassmen. "It will take about four or five matches to really get straightened out," said Harbak. "We're probably a year away from seriously contending."

Lost from the squad via graduation is academic All-America Jeff Rights, Spartan midfielder who holds the school's all-time career scoring mark at 101 points. The Spartans are returning three key players from 1983, including goalkeeper Andy Orosz, a previous All-Ohio selection until sidelined with injuries most of last season. Stan Shulman scored 21 points at wing (six goals, nine assists), and the three-time All-PAC star was invited for an Olympic tryout for his outstanding all-around play.

Kenyon College (6-8-1), Oberlin College (7-5-4), and the College of Wooster (5-12-1) all have sights set on winning seasons, but Conference competition might make it difficult. Lords' coach Jeffrey Vennell loses star goalie Paul Tobin, but returns senior Hugh Garrott, former All-OAC midfielder. Oberlin was probably affected less by graduation than other NCAC schools, but coach Fred Shults' Yeomen will need to develop consistency. Wooster is hoping sophomore John Porter and senior Doug Hart can lead Bob Nye's Fighting Scots to some upset victories.

DENISON THE FAVORITE IN
NCAC WOMEN'S SOCCER

CLEVELAND, OH--Barring any significant changes during the year, the North Coast Athletic Conference women's soccer season should feature Denison University in the favorite's role. On the heels of an 11-6-1 ledger in the 1983 campaign, coach Cheryl Marra's squad is optimistic about garnering the inaugural championship.

Oberlin College will likely be the Big Red's chief competition due to its 3-4-1 record as a club team the previous season. The other three NCAC women's soccer participants, Case Western Reserve University, Kenyon College, and Ohio Wesleyan University, are all fielding teams on the varsity level for the first time.

The Denison Big Red (11-6-1 in '83) will return 18 players to this year's contingent, among them the top three scorers and top two goalies. Karen Talty (halfback), Paula Bongiovanni (center), and Beck-Von-Peccoz (forward) will again bolster the offense for coach Marra. Goalies Laura Jarrell and Kendall Cameron will alternate in the net unless one claims the starting position.

Another key to the Big Red is the return of sweeper Stacy Poole, who was injured for much of the '83 season.

Denison has not lost to any NCAC school in the last two years, thus solidifying their role as Conference favorite.

Guiding the Yeowomen of Oberlin in their quest for the title is coach Ira Steinberg. Playing on the club level last year, Oberlin compiled a 3-4-1 mark. Despite losing sweeper Jenny Nash and top goalie Sarah Howell, Steinberg feels his team will battle Denison for the top spot in the NCAC. Scoring was widespread last year and this fall, the top point producers should be forward Shannon Beach and halfback Susie Eisenfeld. A deciding factor in the Conference race could come on September 29 when Oberlin plays host to Denison. Last year Denison prevailed 1-0.

Competing on the varsity level will be a unique experience for Case Western Reserve, Kenyon and Ohio Wesleyan. Each of these schools has an enthusiastic outlook for the upcoming campaign. Dedication and determination by these yearling teams will be needed to offset their lack of experience.

Kenyon College (1-1; 0-1 NCAC) will be hosted by Ohio Wesleyan University (0-1; 0-0 NCAC). Ohio Wesleyan holds a 9-5-2 advantage in this series dating back to 1899. Kickoff for all NCAC games is 1:30 PM. Oberlin College (0-2; 0-1 NCAC) is in non-Conference action at Geneva (PA).

Case Western Reserve sits atop the NCAC after two weeks of football action. The Spartans extracted their second victory of the year against a formidable Kenyon squad, 27-24, in what will stand as one of the year's most hair-raising games; one in which the lead changed no less than five times. The CWRU-Kenyon game was the only NCAC game of the week.

In non-Conference action, Denison beat Kalamazoo (MI), 62-21, at Granville for its second win, while Allegheny recorded its first victory beating host Lebanon Valley (PA), 28-3. Oberlin lost to Bluffton, 28-22; Wooster dropped a 20-0 decision to John Carroll, and Ohio Wesleyan lost at Albion (MI), 20-10, in their first outing of the season.

CLEVELAND, OH--Tailback Chris Spriggs of Denison University and cornerback Ron Stepanovic of Case Western Reserve University were named North Coast Athletic Conference "Players of the Week" for performances in their teams' victories last Saturday, September 15.

Sophomore tailback Chris Spriggs (Newark, OH/Newark HS), one of the national leaders (seventh) in total offense last season, was named "Player of the Week" on offense for his performance in Denison's 62-21 victory over Kalamazoo (MI). Spriggs, 6-0, 175 pounds, totalled 347 yards in offense, as he rushed 21 times for 204 yards (9.7 ypc) and four touchdowns. He also passed for 143 yards (7 of 13). Spriggs currently leads the NCAC in rushing (315 yards in 2 games) and scoring (15 ppg).

The NCAC "Player of the Week" on defense is senior cornerback Ron Stepanovic (Eastlake, OH/Willoughby South HS), a two-year All-America choice (Associated Press, hon. ment.) for Case Reserve.

Stepanovic led the CWRU defense in the Spartans' narrow victory over NCAC rival, Kenyon, 27-24. He had two interceptions, one for a first quarter 32-yard touchdown, and the other setup CWRU's go-ahead TD in the fourth quarter. This former All-Ohio high school player also led the squad in tackles with 11, including six solos.

Coach Keith Piper, now in his 31st year at Denison, recorded his 150th career win with the Kalamazoo victory, which puts the Big Red mentor among the top win marks of all NCAA active coaches.

CLEVELAND, OH--Competition in the first North Coast Athletic Conference field hockey season will be keen with two 1983 NCAA qualifiers and two more highly competitive teams vying for the initial crown.

And nobody senses the fierce battles more than the Conference coaches.

"The NCAC is going to be very strong," Denison coach Janine Hathorn said. "I expect us, along with Wooster and Kenyon, to make it tough competition to the championship. Ohio Wesleyan will be there, too, and Oberlin has improved a lot."

Echoed Wooster coach Terri Prodoehl, "Basically, all the schools in the Conference are tough. Someone from the Conference has gone to nationals on a regular basis."

Denison and Wooster, both NCAA tournament participants last season, are the favorites to battle for the NCAC title.

Denison returns nine letter winners from last year's 13-3-2 squad that won a conference championship and placed fourth in the nation. First-year coach Hathorn will count on senior Meg Filoon, last season's no. 2 scorer, and sophomore Tara Maloney, an all-NCAA Tournament right wing, for offensive punch. Seniors Kristen Hall (link), Barb van Horn (center back) and Randi Lake (goalie) also will make the Big Red contenders for another NCAA berth. "With so many players returning plus an extremely talented freshman class, we're looking pretty good," Hathorn said.

Wooster will also be aiming for a second straight national tournament appearance. The Scotties lost only two letter winners from last season's 9-3-3 team. Senior Patty Rudman and junior Carol Martin are the key playmaking forwards while sophomore Lisa Blackadar returns as the team's top defender. "We should be one of the top schools. We didn't lose many players, so we should have a very strong season," fifth-year coach Prodoehl said.

Ohio Wesleyan will be nipping at the heels of the NCAC favorites. Second-year coach coach Laura Bump welcomes back 11 letter winners from last year's 7-5-5 team that placed second in the Ohio Division III state tournament. Senior forward

Lissen Thompson is the Battling Bishops' leading returning scorer. Classmate Laurie Kaplan will anchor the midfield line and junior Cindy Stedman returns at defense. "We're predominantly a senior team (eight.) And when you put them with the great freshman class we have coming in, I expect a very good year for us," Bump said.

Kenyon, 6-7-3 last year, is the NCAC's underdog. The Ladies will count on their attack-oriented game to surprise the opposition. Sophomore inner Harriet Stern, a top scorer last season, returns to lead the offense. Freshman link Amy Bowser and junior sweeper Penny White are the key defensive players. "We're really solid on defense. We need some improvement on offense," second-year coach Sandy Moore said, "but the team is looking good."

Oberlin's chief goal is to post a winning record, a feat second-year coach Heather Setzler says is realistic. "I think we're capable of doing it. A lot will depend on Robin Cardin," she said. Cardin, a freshman goalkeeper, injured her knee in pre-season and is healing steadily. Seniors Penny Wung and Marjorie Edmonds will lead the defensive corps while classmate Colleen Ottoson, last year's Most Improved Player, leads the front line. Nine letter winners return for the Yeowomen.

CLEVELAND, OH--Week four of the North Coast Athletic Conference will feature two Conference matchups, Saturday, September 29, while three other NCAC teams play in non-Conference football action.

Kenyon College (2-1; 1-1 NCAC) will travel to the College of Wooster (0-3; 0-2 NCAC). Wooster holds a 30-13-2 edge in this series dating back to 1890. Ohio Wesleyan University (0-2; 0-1 NCAC) will travel to Denison University (3-0; 2-0 NCAC). Denison holds a 43-27-7 edge in this series. The three other NCAC teams will be engaged in non-Conference action. Allegheny College (1-2; 0-1 NCAC) will host perennial NAIA power Westminster College (PA); Case Western Reserve University (3-0; 3-0 NCAC) hosts its arch rival John Carroll University in the Battle of eastside Cleveland College football. And Oberlin College (0-3; 0-1 NCAC) concludes three straight weeks of non-Conference action when it travels to Kalamazoo (MI) College.

After three weeks of action, undefeated Case Western Reserve University (3-0) remains in first place of the NCAC. The Spartans have had two squeakers against Conference opponents and just pulled out a 21-14 win over an aggressive College of Wooster team.

The big story of the NCAC is the emergence of Denison's Big Red as a football juggernaut. In the last two games, Denison has blown out opponents. Their 52-14 win over the Allegheny College Gators last Saturday was preceded by a 62-21 thumping of Kalamazoo. The Big Red should surely be among NCAA Division III football leaders with their 473 yards per game average of total offense and an average of 362 yards rushing. They have scored an average of 42.3 points per game.

Sophomore tailback Chris Spriggs (Newark, OH) is leading the Big Red attack, averaging 254 yards in total offense and scoring an average of 16 points per game.

CLEVELAND, OH--Quarterback Dan Pantic of Kenyon College and linebacker Bob Nau of Oberlin College were named North Coast Athletic football "Players of the Week" for their performances last Saturday, September 22.

Pantic, a senior from Parma, Ohio (Parma Senior HS) was named NCAC Player of the Week for his third straight excellent game, as he hit on 22 of 33 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns. The 6-0, 180-pound thrower made the difference for the Lords in their second victory in three starts as Kenyon edged Ohio Wesleyan University, 17-12 in an NCAC game. Pantic has been among the NCAC passing leaders from week one, and one of the leaders in shaping Kenyon's 2-1 record. He leads the NCAC in total offense with 284 yards per game.

SEVEN TEAMS SEEK PATH TO CONFERENCE CROWN SEPTEMBER 24, 1984

CLEVELAND, OH--The North Coast Athletic Conference will be looking to establish its credibility in women's volleyball when the seven teams begin competition this fall.

Allegheny College has a new coach and a new outlook in 1984. Jeanne Arbuckle welcomes back eight returning letter winners and five starters, led by last year's Most Valuable Player Gwen Herron, 5-6 middle hitter.

Heron will be joined by junior hitters Leslie Bentson and Amy Kissinger, along with setters Rhoda Smartz and Amy Smith, who will operate the Gators' 6-0 offense. The only starter without experience will be freshman Penny Hess, a 5-8 middle hitter.

"We have no seniors on the team," said Arbuckle, "but we have plenty of experience. These players have been together for several years, and when you work together like that, it pays off."

Case Western Reserve University is coming off a disappointing 5-16 season, but 11th-year coach Mina Moore is optimistic.

"We're beginning our third year with the same players together," she said. "That experience and teamwork will provide us with continuity this season."

Senior hitter Kelly Boothby is joined by junior hitters Maureen Trayle and Patti Vrobel, along with setters Diane Cifani and Sue White. The Spartans run a 6-2 and 5-1 offense.

The Big Red from Denison University should have little difficulty improving last year's 1-29 record. "We have many of the right ingredients to win," said eighth-year coach Sally Dellinger. "Our players have shown enthusiasm, hustle and a willingness to improve. On the other hand, we have no seniors and we could use some additional height."

Denison's tallest player is sophomore hitter Anne Jewell (5-10). She is joined by junior hitters Robin Constock (5-4) and Laura Finch (5-6). The 6-2 offense is run by two sophomore setters -- Nancy Wambach and Michele Whitaker.

Kenyon College will rely on defense according to first-year coach Gretchen Weitbrecht, who played her collegiate volleyball at Bowling Green State University. "We will have a young team," she said, "and our attack will need to be strengthened."

Weitbrecht's first objective is to establish consistency with the hopes of improving the Ladies' 7-21 mark in 1983.

Senior co-captain Gina Bauman is one of two starters returning for Kenyon. Senior hitter Marguerite Bruce, who is the other co-captain, also started for the Ladies last year.

These two veterans will be joined by freshman hitter Shelley Swank, sophomore setter Barb Evans, junior hitter Margarite Silver and sophomore hitter Sarah Stivers.

Oberlin College also will field a young team this year. The Yeowomen have only two seniors and two juniors on their 11-player squad. Coach Pat Milkovich will rely heavily on middle hitter Marian Fowler (5-11) for much of Oberlin's offensive attack. In addition, Johanna Walter will handle much of the setting duties this year.

Ohio Wesleyan University finished 1983 at 8-25, and first-year coach Jana Edwards will be relying heavily on freshmen to turn things around in 1984.

Senior hitter Lynn Cook, junior hitter Kelly Maxwell and sophomore setter Amy Barkett will guide three freshmen starters. The Battling Bishops will run a 5-1 offense centering around Barkett.

"We will have a strong-hitting team," said Edwards, "but we will have to overcome our inexperience early if we are to win."

Edwards' goals for 1984 include winning at least half of the team's matches.

The College of Wooster, the only team with a winning record in 1983 (22-16), is the favorite to win the NCAC title. Seniors Karen Light and Caryn Hommes are outstanding middle blockers/hitters, and, according to second-year coach Deb Stockham, both are fine defensive players.

Junior setters Nora Land and Bernice Walker run the offense, and junior hitter Tammy Allen provides power from the outside.

The question of supremacy will be answered November 9-10 at the NCAC Championships, which will be hosted by Oberlin College.

Case Western Reserve University (4-0; 3-0 NCAC) and Denison University (4-0; 3-0 NCAC) are now co-leaders in the NCAC grid race. These two powerful squads will be engaged in non-Conference action when Case Reserve will be on the road against undefeated (4-0) Presidents' Athletic Conference leader Washington & Jefferson College and Denison will host always-tough DePauw (IN) at Granville, OH.

With an eye on the calendar, the matchup of Case Reserve and Denison October 20 in Cleveland now looms very large on the NCAC football schedule.

In other NCAC action, the College of Wooster Fighting Scots will be searching for their first win in Indiana when they visit Wabash College. Kickoff for all games is 1:30 PM, excepting Wooster at Wabash which is 2:00 PM.

CLEVELAND, OH--Denison University tailback Chris Spriggs, who is among the national leaders in three offensive categories, and Oberlin College linebacker Keith LaDu, have been named the North Coast Athletic Conference "Players of the Week" for their performances in their team's victories Saturday, September 29.

Sophomore Chris Spriggs (Newark, OH/Newark HS) received his second NCAC Player of the Week honor on offense for his part in the Big Red's fourth straight win, 28-9, over Ohio Wesleyan. The 6-0, 175 pounder, who had picked up 100 yards rushing in the first quarter, galloped to 197 yards rushing on the day (33 carries) and hit on nine of 17 passes for 86 yards. In all, he accounted for 283 yards in total offense, throwing for two TDs and rushing for one.

This was a typical day for Spriggs, whose impressive offensive output have him listed high in three national categories this week in the NCAA Division III statistical rankings: fifth among rushers, fifth in total offense and sixth in scoring. Sprigg's totals have risen steadily since these rankings (which are two weeks old) and he should be a bonafide candidate to lead the nation in at least one of these categories. He is currently leading the North Coast in rushing with 707 yards in 113 attempts for 176.8 yards per game! His closest challenger is 90 yards away in average per game.

Freshman Keith LaDu (Ashtabula, OH) was a key figure in Oberlin College's first victory of the season, an impressive 26-10 win over Kalamazoo (MI) team. Filling in for injured linebacker Bob Nau, LaDu, in his very first start, responded with 17 tackles, of which nine were unassisted, one fumble recovery and one pass broken up. He also had two quarterback sacks. LaDu was Ashtabula County Player of the Year in 1983.

NORTH COAST GRID TEAMS & INDIVIDUALS PEPPER NCAA FOOTBALL RANKINGS...

The North Coast Athletic Conference is quickly establishing an impact on the national NCAA Division III football scene as five individual players are ranked among the nation's leaders in offensive categories and two teams, Denison and Kenyon, are listed among team leaders.

The statistical rankings, released this past Monday, September 24, by the NCAA, which cover only the first two games of action (see NCAC stats for stats thru four games), show Denison ranked in three offensive categories. The Big Red, under veteran coach Keith Piper, is ranked fifth in rushing offense, seventh in total offense, and ninth in scoring offense. Kenyon, showcasing an aerial circus this season, is ranked seventh in passing offense.

Chris Spriggs, the amazing sophomore tailback for Denison, ranks high in three offensive categories. This Newark, Ohio native is listed fifth among Division III rushers and fifth in total offense. He is sixth in scoring.

Case Reserve senior quarterback Fred DiSanto (South Euclid, OH/St. Ignatius HS) is listed second in passing efficiency and ninth in total offense. Kenyon quarterback Dan Pantic (Parma, OH/Parma Sr. HS) is listed third in total offense, while teammate Wally Danforth (Pittsburgh, PA/Trinity-Pawling HS) is listed fifth among field goal kickers. The third Kenyon Lord nationally-ranked is senior wide receiver Todd Stoner (Lambertville, MI/Bedford HS). Stoner ranks 10th among receivers.

"Key NCAC Matchup is Kenyon at Denison"

NATIONALLY RANKED CASE RESERVE & DENISON
LEAD NORTH COAST; PAIR UNDEFEATED AT 5-0

CLEVELAND, OH--One of the nation's best passing offenses will meet one of the best rushing offenses when Kenyon College travels to Denison University for one of the season's top games in the North Coast Athletic Conference, Saturday, October 13.

Week six in the NCAC football season will feature this Conference game plus two others as the North Coast moves toward a key stage in its grid standings. Denison, which is 5-0 overall and 3-0 in the NCAC, is tied for the Conference lead with Case Western Reserve University and features the second-best rushing offense in all of NCAA Division III with 325 yards per game. Kenyon is ranked fourth among all Division III passing offenses (270 yards per game), so fireworks are possible in Granville, Ohio for that one. Kenyon, at 3-1 in the NCAC and 4-1 overall, is just one game out of first place. Their only loss was a narrow one, 27-24 to undefeated Case Reserve.

NCAC co-leader, Case Western Reserve, now at 5-0 overall and 3-0 in the NCAC, and ranked 15th nationally in the first NCAA Division III poll, will entertain Ohio Wesleyan University, which is coming off its first win of the season. Wesleyan is now 1-2 in the NCAC and 1-3 overall. Allegheny College (0-2 NCAC; 1-4 overall) will be looking for their first Conference win when they continue on the road to Oberlin College (0-2 NCAC; 1-4 overall). The College of Wooster is idle Saturday. All North Coast kickoffs are at 1:30 PM.

Following their national ranking this past week in 15th position among all NCAA Division III teams, Case Reserve found themselves staring at a key game last Saturday when they travelled to Washington & Jefferson College, ranked eighth. The Spartans were able to beat W&J 34-16 and continue undefeated at 5-0.

In addition to CWRU's ranking, both Denison and Kenyon received votes in the national poll. Denison extracted a tough 21-20 win over DePauw of Indiana, but lost several key players with injuries in that contest. The nation's leading rusher, Chris Spriggs of Denison, left the game in the second quarter and did not return. His status for the Kenyon game is undetermined. Denison, with their successful single-wing offense, remains undefeated on the year.

The Gators of Allegheny College held Kenyon's explosive attack to a 14-14 halftime tie, but were bested 28-14 at the gun. Ohio Wesleyan ran, passed and kicked its way to scrape out a 20-16 win, their first of the season, against a stubborn Oberlin squad. The College of Wooster continued their murderous schedule when they lost a 33-9 decision at the hands of once-defeated Wabash College of Indiana.

CLEVELAND, OH-- Ohio Wesleyan University quarterback Jay Hood and Case Western Reserve University defensive end Fred Manley were named North Coast Athletic Conference Players of the Week on Offense and Defense, respectively.

Jay Hood, (Ada, OH/Ada HS), the junior signal-caller for the Battling Bishops led Ohio Wesleyan to their first victory of the season, last Saturday, when they beat Oberlin College, 20-16. Hood, a 5-8, 160-pounder, threw 15 completions on 24 attempts for 137 yards. He also rushed for 23 key yards and scored one TD for the Bishops. He is the third-ranked quarterback in the NCAC with 102.3 rating points, trailing only nationally-ranked Fred DiSanto of CWRU (152 points) and Dan Pantic of Kenyon (126 points.)

Senior defensive end Fred Manley, (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch HS), was a key player in Case Western Reserve University's big win over Washington & Jefferson College, 34-16, Saturday. Manley, who earned Associated Press Little America mention (second team) last year at linbacker, made 13 tackles for the Spartans as they defeated W&J, the eighth-ranked team in NCAA Division III ratings this week. Two of Manley's three quarterback sacks were in critical third and long situations during the fourth quarter. CWRU needed these big defensive plays and three fourth quarter TD's to upset the Presidents of W&J. The four-year starter is 6-1 and 225 pounds.

NORTH COAST WAVES

Five North Coast Athletic Conference football players are mentioned in the NCAA statistical rankings this week, led by Denison tailback Chris Spriggs. Spriggs, a Newark, Ohio native (Newark HS), leads the nation's Division III rushers with 178 yards rushing per game after four games. He is also listed fourth in scoring with 16 points per game and fourth in total offense with 254 yards per game. Case Reserve quarterback Fred DiSanto (S. Euclid, OH/St. Ignatius HS) is listed fourth among all quarterbacks and among the leaders in total offense. Dan Pantic (Parma, OH/Parma HS), who leads the NCAC in total offense, is among the leaders in that category...his receiving mate at Kenyon, Todd Stoner (Lambertville, MI/Bedford HS), is the fifth-ranked receiver. Ohio Wesleyan's Brad Warnimont (Napoleon, OH/Napoleon HS) was listed among the top punters. (See the enclosed football stats for current figures; the NCAA rankings are always a week behind).

Among the team rankings, Denison, off to its best start in six years, is second nationally in rushing offense and total offense with 480 yards per game. Kenyon is among the leaders in passing offense.

MURDERER'S ROW is what Coach Jim Kapp and the Fighting Scots at Wooster have looked at this season. Despite their 0-5 record, the Scots have played tough against each of their opponents, four of which were mentioned in last week's national poll. Wooster lost 13-11 to Denison, now 5-0; CWRU, 5-0 and ranked 15th nationally, had to score three fourth-quarter TD's to defeat the Scots, 21-14; Kenyon (4-1) bested them 33-14; Saturday's loss to Wabash (IN) was to a 4-1 team...all these teams received votes in the national poll.

Shaheem Abrahams, the 5-6 kicker for Ohio Wesleyan, was a big part of the Bishops' 20-16 win over Oberlin...this native of South Africa tied a OWU record with a 47 yard field goal.

CLEVELAND, OH--Seven teams of the North Coast Athletic Conference are ranked nationally among the various polls and rankings of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and its affiliated organizations.

In football, Case Western Reserve University, now 5-0 overall and the co-leader in the NCAC grid race, was ranked 15th nationally in the first NCAA Division III football poll, released last Tuesday. Denison, now 5-0, the co-leader of the NCAC and Kenyon College, 4-1, were listed as teams also receiving votes. This representative showing was the equal of any conference nationally.

Two teams were ranked high in the women's field hockey ratings. Traditionally strong Denison was listed seventh in the Division III poll, while the College of Wooster was ranked 12th. Following the poll, Wooster defeated archrival Denison, 3-1. Wooster is currently undefeated at 10-0, while Denison is 9-1-1.

No stranger to national rankings, Ohio Wesleyan University's men's soccer squad, currently 9-1-1 and the NCAC leader (2-0-1) was ranked fourth in the week's Division III soccer ratings. Oberlin, 7-0-3, was ranked at eighth.

In women's volleyball, the College of Wooster team is romping with a 21-4 record and is currently ranked number one in the NCAA's Midwest region.

It was a goal of the North Coast Athletic Conference to provide a forum for equity among both men's and women's sports and strive for excellence in a wide variety of sports. At the midway point of its very first fall season, it appears that the North Coast is on track to reaching that goal.

UNBEATEN CASE RESERVE AND DENISON, BOTH 6-0
MEET SATURDAY, OCTOBER 20, IN CLASSIC SHOWDOWN

CLEVELAND, OH--You couldn't ask for a better game. In what will be the most dramatic football game in the inaugural season of the North Coast Athletic Conference, undefeated Denison University at 6-0 will meet Case Western Reserve University, also 6-0, this Saturday in Cleveland for what may well be the championship of the Conference.

Nationally-ranked Case Reserve, 12th in last week's NCAA Division III poll, will host the Big Red of Denison in what will be one of the nation's top Division III matchups Saturday. At stake may be the Conference championship and possible national rankings for both teams. Both teams are 4-0 in NCAC action and will have one Conference game remaining following their clash in Cleveland. (CWRU meets Allegheny College October 27, while Denison winds up NCAC action against Oberlin College November 3.)

Week seven in the NCAC football season will feature a full slate of Conference action. In addition to the co-leaders meeting in Cleveland, the College of Wooster (0-5; 0-4 NCAC) will return to action, after a week off, when they travel to Meadville, PA to tangle with the Gators of Allegheny College (1-5; 0-3 NCAC). Oberlin College (2-4; 1-2 NCAC) will be looking for their third win when they engage second-place NCAC team Kenyon College (4-2; 3-2 NCAC) at Gambier, Ohio. The Battling Bishops of Ohio Wesleyan (1-4; 1-3 NCAC) will be hosted by non-Conference foe, Otterbein College in Westerville, Ohio.

In a matchup of nationally-ranked offenses, Denison's explosive offense and alert defense prevailed over the NCAC's second-place team, Kenyon, Saturday, 37-7, in a close game through two quarters. Conference co-leader Case Reserve got it in gear against Ohio Wesleyan when they scored a school-record 45 points to best the Bishops, 45-15. Allegheny and Oberlin staged a battle-royale, but the defense-minded Yeomen held on for a 14-13 decision. Wooster was idle this past Saturday.

Despite great differences offensively, Denison and Case Reserve are almost twins when it comes to the bottom-line statistics. Denison leads the Conference in scoring offense, notching 35.5 points per game, followed closely by CWRU which has scored 33.3 points per game. Denison also leads the NCAC in scoring defense, giving up a paltry 13.7 points per game, while CWRU is a shade below at 14 points per game.

Offensively, both teams average over 400 yards per game with Denison showcasing the nation's second-rated rushing offense with 328 yards per game, while CWRU has a more balanced attack. Chris Spriggs (Newark, OH) of the Big Red has led the nation in rushing all season (146 yards per game) while the Spartans are paced by their all-time passing leader Fred DiSanto (South Euclid, OH/St. Ignatius HS), ranked all season among the NCAA Division III top five quarterbacks.

CLEVELAND, OH--Junior fullback Steve Kaye of Denison University and sophomore linebacker John Gudel of Allegheny College have been named North Coast Athletic Conference football "Players of the Week" on offense and defense, respectively.

Kaye, a native of Rumson, NJ, led the Big Red rushing attack as Denison scored an impressive victory last Saturday against once-beaten Kenyon College, 37-7. The 5-10, 195-pound running back led all rushers with 108 yards on 21 attempts. Kaye's performance took the burden off tailback Chris Spriggs, Denison's leading rusher who also leads the nation. Spriggs was nursing a sore knee, though he did chip in 104 yards rushing, 50 yards off his average per game.

Linebacker John Gudel (Garfield Hts, OH/Trinity HS) made contributions both defensively and offensively to Allegheny's effort in their one-point loss, 14-13, to Oberlin College. The 6-1, 190-pounder made eight tackles, six of which were unassisted. He also had one pass interception and returned that for a 47-yard TD, notching six of the Gator's 13 points. Gudel also broke up one pass.

NORTH COAST WAVES.....

The North Coast certainly has its share of outstanding field goal kickers this season, among them Ohio Wesleyan's Shaheem Abrahams (South Africa), Denison's Gary Keller (Leesburg, FL), and Case Reserve's Mike Weber (Cincinnati, OH/Oakhill HS), who have all booted many three-pointers in the high forties...but Weber's 51-yarder against Ohio Wesleyan last Saturday may stand for a while as an NCAC record.

Offensively, the North Coast has a collection of many nationally-ranked players, including Chris Spriggs (Newark, OH/Newark HS) of Denison, the nation's leading rusher...but the runnerups to these standouts are not bad either. CWRU's tailback Jim Donnelly (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier HS), who led the Presidents' Athletic Conference the last two seasons, is unlikely to catch Spriggs in yards, but his 5.0 average per carry (527 yards/89.5 per game) is close to Spriggs' per carry of 5.3. Donnelly, a two-year Academic All-America first teamer, needs only 175 yards in the remaining three games to become CWRU's all-time rusher. He has 2144 career yards.

HOW 'BOUT THEM DOGS! Don't scoff at Oberlin's 2-4 record, especially if you haven't run against them. The Yeomen are leading the NCAC, and have most of the season, in defending against the rush; they've given up but 116 yards per game. They are second only to Denison in total defense, giving up only 267 yards per game.

A hat-trick in field hockey is hard to come by but Ohio Wesleyan had TWO in their defeat of Muskingum, 10-2. Freshman Daina Stankevics (Wellesley, MA) and senior Lissen Thompson (Devon, PA) each had one.

NCAC GRID CROWN; CAN CLINCH CHAMPIONSHIP
AT ALLEGHENY OCTOBER 27

CLEVELAND, OH--Case Western Reserve University, all alone in first place of the North Coast Athletic Conference at 5-0, can clinch the first NCAC football championship this Saturday, October 27, when they meet NCAC foe Allegheny College in Meadville, PA in their final Conference game of the year.

The Spartans, ranked 11th in last week's NCAA Division III poll, earned at least a tie for the NCAC championship when they defeated previously unbeaten Denison University last week in Cleveland, 45-13. Denison, now 4-1 in the NCAC, could possibly tie for the championship, provided CWRU loses at Allegheny and Denison wins their final NCAC game against Oberlin November 3.

Week eight in the NCAC football season will have Case Reserve (7-0; 5-0 NCAC) at Allegheny (2-5; 1-3 NCAC) and Oberlin College (2-5; 1-3 NCAC) will travel to the College of Wooster (0-5; 0-5 NCAC) as the Scots search for their first season win. Plenty of non-Conference action dots the NCAC slate this week. Denison (6-1; 4-1 NCAC) entertains Trinity University of San Antonio, Texas, which may be the long-distance bowl this year in Division III football. Kenyon College (5-2; 4-2 NCAC) will travel to always-tough DePauw of Indiana. The Kenyon Lords are the first team to complete their NCAC schedule and can finish no lower than third this season. Ohio Wesleyan (1-5; 1-3 NCAC) continues its second week of non-Conference action when they travel to Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio.

In a showdown of unbeaten teams, both highly-regarded nationally, Case Reserve stunned Denison, 45-13, in Cleveland with power football, featuring a rushing offense which rolled up 336 yards on the ground and 437 yards total against the NCAC's best defense. The Spartan defense was equal to the offense as they halted the prolific Big Red offense, ranked second in NCAA Division III to 278 yards.

Allegheny rebounded from a one-point loss the previous week, to outlast Wooster in front of a hometown crowd, 30-29, despite a great effort from the Scots and their quarterback, Phil Lucchese. Lucchese accounted for 240 yards in offense and scored three TDs in a losing effort.

Kenyon dominated Oberlin, 33-13, and Ohio Wesleyan lost a non-Conference game at Otterbein College, 14-9.

CLEVELAND, OH--Senior tailback Jim Donnelly of Case Western Reserve University and sophomore linebacker Chris Mandella of Allegheny College have been named North Coast Athletic Conference football "Players of the Week" on offense and defense, respectively.

Donnelly (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier HS), a two time Academic All America first teamer, led a dominating CWRU rushing attack in an NCAC showdown of unbeaten teams, as Case Reserve defeated Denison, 45-13. The 5'9", 185 pounder rushed 27 times for 125 yards and a TD against the best defense in the conference. Donnelly was the workhorse for the Spartans as they amassed 336 yards rushing and 437 yards in total offense. This senior, who needs only 51 yards to become the all-time CWRU rushing leader, is averaging 94.6 yards per game and has scored a CWRU record nine TDs this season.

Chris Mandella (North Huntingdon, PA/Norwin HS) was a key figure in Allegheny's first conference win, a 30-29 struggle over the College of Wooster. This sophomore linebacker had 18 tackles to lead the Gator defense, with four unassisted tackles. He is the second Allegheny defender to earn Player of the Week laurels for the improving Gator defense, with teammate John Gudel earning the honor last week. Mandella leads the Gators with 69 tackles.

Patterson served the last point in the first game; Lake Erie lost their serve in the second game and Patterson served 15 straight points. Patterson then served the first three points of the third game.

The Ohio Wesleyan volleyball team beat Denison October 18 and tied the school mark for most wins in a season at eight for the year.

Senior Ohio Wesleyan All-America soccer candidate Rick Wyman (Bellvue, WA) scored his first collegiate hat trick vs. Capital. For the week, Wyman had five goals and three assists!

CLEVELAND, OH--The fledgling North Coast Athletic Conference will have its first championship decided on Saturday, October 27, with the running of the league cross country meet at the Delaware Golf Club, home course of host Ohio Wesleyan University.

Allegheny College looms as the favorite to win both the men's and women's meets.

The men's meet should come down to a battle between Allegheny, Case Western Reserve University and the College of Wooster. Allegheny and Case Reserve have not competed head-to-head this season, while both have defeated Wooster; Allegheny in a triangular meet September 22 by a score of 19-38; Case Reserve in the Ohio Intercollegiate Meet October 12.

Competing for individual honors will be Allegheny's Tom Brewer, Case Reserve's Vince Van Burik, and Wooster's Paul Fleming and Todd Fach.

The women's meet features Allegheny, who returns five runners from last year's team which qualified for the NCAA Championship Meet. Oberlin College, Kenyon College and Wooster will also be in the thick of things. Allegheny defeated Wooster 21-38 in a triangular meet on September 22, while Wooster and Oberlin have traded wins over each other. Oberlin finished first among NCAC teams at the Ohio Intercollegiate Meet October 12, avenging a loss to Wooster in Wooster's Invitational Meet on September 29.

Among the leading contenders for individual honors will be Chris Dudeck of Allegheny, Oberlin's Kathy Andrews and Wooster's Patty Smanik, along with Vanessa Jones of Ohio Wesleyan University.

The women's race will begin at 11 AM, followed by the men's race at 11:45 AM. An open race including both men and women will start at 12:30 PM. Course distances are 5000 meters for women and 8000 meter for men. The top three teams and top 15 individuals will advance to the NCAA regional meets on November 3.

CLEVELAND, OH--Case Western Reserve University wrapped up the first football championship of the North Coast Athletic Conference last Saturday, when they defeated Allegheny College, 31-0, in their final NCAC game of the season.

The championship comes with their sixth-straight NCAC win of the year and overall the Spartans are undefeated at 8-0, ranked #12 in the NCAA Division III football poll, and one of only two teams in Ohio undefeated currently.

While the Spartans are finished with their NCAC schedule, they will wrap up their season Saturday, November 3 at home against Carnegie-Mellon University.

Two NCAC games are on tap November 3 and the final standings, including the runnerup spot will put the finishing touches on the season in this second last Saturday of football action.

Denison University, enjoying one of their finest seasons ever, (7-1; 4-1 NCAC) despite a lone loss to Case Reserve, needs a win over Oberlin College (3-5; 2-3 NCAC) to secure the runnerup spot in the Conference. In the other NCAC game, Allegheny College (2-6; 1-4 NCAC) will try to make their last NCAC game of the season a winner, when they travel to Ohio Wesleyan University (1-6; 1-3 NCAC), also a team that is looking for its second Conference win.

In non-Conference action, Kenyon College (5-3; 4-2 NCAC) will try to add a sixth victory to their record, their most in many years, when they travel to Centre College in Kentucky. The College of Wooster (0-7; 0-5 NCAC) will also play a non-league foe when they entertain Marietta College.

In addition to Case Reserve's title-clincher against Allegheny, Oberlin College nipped Wooster, 15-14, while Denison overcame Trinity College of Texas, 19-7 in a non-Conference game at Granville, DePauw of Indiana was a poor host to Kenyon as the Lords dropped a 37-12 decision and Muskingum beat Ohio Wesleyan, 49-0.

NCAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND, OH--Senior tailback Keith Sullivan of Case Western Reserve University and freshman linebacker Keith LaDu of Oberlin College have been named North Coast Athletic Conference football "Players of the Week" on offense and defense, respectively.

Sullivan (Zelienople, PA/Quigley HS) started his first game for the Spartans this year after backing up Academic All America Jim Donnelly for most of the last four years. Donnelly, the second-leading rusher in the NCAC, did not play because of a hip-pointer injury. Sullivan made the most of his chance by gaining 153 yards on 26 carries in CWRU's 31-0 win over Allegheny College Saturday which gave the Spartans the first NCAC football championship. The 5-10, 190-pounder gained more yards Saturday than he gained all season as Donnelly's backup. Sullivan also scored two TD's in his second to last game for CWRU.

LaDu (Ashtabula, OH) was the main man for the Oberlin College defense in their 15-14 win over the College of Wooster, Saturday. He had 17 solo tackles, seven assisted tackles, one fumble recovery, one blocked pass, one sack and two interceptions.

LaDu's second interception came with 2:31 minutes to play and set up the Oberlin winning field goal. LaDu's performance earned him his second defensive Player of the Week selection in the NCAC; he was also selected for his job in Oberlin's win over Kalamazoo.

NORTH COAST WAVES.....

With Conference titles wrapped up in football, men's and women's cross country, women's soccer, and women's field hockey, only men's soccer and women's volleyball are undetermined. The NCAC Volleyball title will be settled in championship competition, November 9-10, at Oberlin College. ...In men's soccer, Ohio Wesleyan University, with a 4-0-1 record and ranked fourth in NCAA Division III, has clinched a tie for the North Coast Athletic Conference crown with one week remaining on the regular season schedule. Three teams, Denison (2-1), Oberlin (1-1-3) and Wooster (2-2) are tied for second place currently, with Denison having the only chance to catch OWU. For Denison to tie, they would have to win both of their last two games (at Wooster October 31 and at home November 3 against Allegheny). In addition, Ohio Wesleyan would have to lose their final NCAC game, November 3 against Kenyon to complete the Denison possibility.

Chris Spriggs, sophomore tailback from Denison (Newark, OH/Newark HS), second-leading rusher in the nation, was the first North Coast rusher to go over 1000 yards and only the fourth player in Denison history to gain over 1000 yards in a season.

Nationally-ranked Fred DiSanto, CWRU quarterback (S. Euclid, OH/St. Ignatius HS), broke his own single season yardage record, setting a new mark of 1286 yards. DiSanto's favorite target, Dave Stuczynski (Garfield Hts, OH/Holy Name HS), caught six passes for 81 yards, enabling him to break the single season and career yardage marks at CWRU. He now has 549 yards this season and 1395 in his career.

Todd Stoner, senior wide receiver from Kenyon (Lambertville, MI), caught seven passes for 119 yards to remain one of the nation's top 10 receivers in NCAA Division III. Stoner now has 47 catches for 887 yards. Just as Stoner will probably catch passes totaling more than 1000 yards, so too will his quarterback, Dragan Pantic (Parma, OH/Parma HS) pass for over 2000 yards. The senior quarterback, fourth in the country in total offense, has 1856 yards passing with two games remaining.

Jamie Worth, Allegheny's frosh punter from Pen Yan, NY, recorded the longest punt in the NCAC this year. Worth had a 73-yarder vs. CWRU Saturday and is the NCAC's leading punter with a 36.9 average.

DELAWARE, OH--In the very first championship event of the North Coast Athletic Conference, Oberlin College's women's cross country team won the first team championship of the new athletic conference, planned with equity for men's and women's sports, as they notched 50 points to win the women's title, here at the Delaware Golf Club, Saturday, October 27.

The women started the first race, at exactly 11:00 AM, on a picture-perfect fall day with sunny skies and 79-degree temperature, setting the stage for the 5,000 meter run.

Coach Dick Michaels had four of his seven runners finish in the top nine. They were led by Kathy Barnum, who was fourth with a time of 19:31. Kathy Andrews finished seventh with a time of 20:03. Both earned All-Conference honors.

In a close team race, Oberlin, with 50 points, edged second place Allegheny College, 57 points, while Kenyon College was a close third at 61 points. The College of Wooster was fourth with 82 points; Ohio Wesleyan University was fifth with 131 points, while Case Western Reserve University was sixth with 136 points.

Vanessa Jones, a senior runner from Ohio Wesleyan, was the first individual champion in this or any other North Coast Athletic Conference sport, as she hit the tape with an 18:51 clocking. This resident of Pickerington, Ohio, who prepped at Abington Friends School in Jenkintown, PA, made NCAC history with her first place finish in a field of 42 runners.

Todd Fach, a freshman from the College of Wooster, also had a great moment when he hit the tape to win the men's cross country individual title, as he traversed the 8,000 meter course in 27:26. Fach, a graduate of Hoover High in North Canton, Ohio, was the first man to win an NCAC Championship, but he was followed closely by his teammate, Paul Fleming, who finished 10 seconds later at 27:36 in a field of 48 runners.

Allegheny College, however, under Coach Fiore Bergamasco, was the team story in men's cross country, as the favored Gators placed five runners in the top ten finishers, paced by their lead man, Paul Egbert, who finished the course fifth with a time of 27:50.

The top seven runners in each of the men's and women's race were declared All-North Coast Athletic Conference runners, the first All-Conference team for the new loop. The All-Conference teams and their times are listed below.

The top three teams in the men's and women's races will advance to the NCAA Division III Regionals to be held November 10, along with the top fifteen placers in each race.

"Denison, Wooster hoping for NCAA Field Hockey Berth"
DENISON WINS FIRST WOMEN'S SOCCER CROWN;
DENISON AND WOOSTER, CO-CHAMPS IN NCAC FIELD HOCKEY

CLEVELAND, OH--Denison University's women's soccer squad has captured the first North Coast Athletic Conference crown in women's soccer for 1984.

Coach Cheryl Marra's squad posted a perfect 4-0 NCAC mark as they swept all Conference opponents in single round robin play. Overall, the Big Red was 6-6-4 as they completed their season Saturday with a 4-2 non-Conference win over Mt. St. Joseph.

Defense was the trademark of this team from Granville, Ohio as they registered an amazing record of four Conference shutout victories! The Big Red took on some heavy weight competition, playing several NCAA Division I opponents, losing by respectable scores to the likes of Ohio State and Michigan.

Denison was trailed by a competitive Oberlin College squad, 2-1, team which has one Conference game remaining, October 31, against Case Western Reserve University. Kenyon College is in third place with a 2-2 mark. Case Reserve, 0-2-1, and Ohio Wesleyan University, 0-3-1, are winless in the NCAC.

Defensively, Denison had the NCAC's two top goaltenders. Kendall Cameron was the leader with a .898 saves percentage and was credited with four shutouts. Teammate Laura Jarrell was second-highest goaltender with a .891 saves percentage.

On offense, Denison's Kari Talty had the most points, scoring 12 in 16 games, but Case Reserve's Beth Biegelson led the league in points per game with 10 points in seven games with a 1.4 average.

Denison has also earned a share of the first North Coast Athletic Conference Field Hockey Championship, as the Big Red tied the College of Wooster, with identical 7-1 won-loss records, in double round robin play in the NCAC.

Denison and Wooster, both nationally-regarded, took turns beating each other in the NCAC, with Wooster defeating Denison, 3-1, back in September, while Denison edged Wooster, 2-1, within the last two weeks.

DENISON WINS...add one

Last Saturday, Denison edged Wooster again, this time, 2-1, in non-Conference action at the Midwest Division III Field Hockey Tournament at Ohio Wesleyan University. On the strength of that win, plus their national ranking of 11th in Division III Field Hockey, Denison is hoping for an NCAA playoff berth. Wooster, also ranked nationally in the top ten all season, also hopes to figure in the playoff action. The last ranking for Wooster was ninth and there is every possibility both Denison and Wooster could be selected for the 16-team playoffs, which begin November 9.

Rounding out the team standings were Kenyon, ranked third with a 4-4 mark, Ohio Wesleyan was fourth with a 2-6 record and Oberlin was winless and fifth with an 0-8 mark.

Denison and Wooster dominated the top five scorers in the NCAC, as Denison had the leader and runnerup, while Wooster claimed number 3 through five. Meg Fillion of Denison was the NCAC's leading scorer with a 3.2 points per game average. Judy Skwiertz had the league's top goaltending saves percentage of .929 but Oberlin's Robin Cardin recorded an impressive 351 saves in second place.

DENISON AND KENYON TIE FOR RUNNERUP SPOT
IN NCAC FOOTBALL; OHIO WESLEYAN BATTLES
WOOSTER IN FINAL NCAC GAME NOVEMBER 10.

CLEVELAND, OH--Denison University and Kenyon College share the runnerup spot in the first North Coast Athletic Conference football season standings as all Conference teams are either finished or will complete their season this Saturday, November 10.

Week 10, the final one in the NCAC, will see plenty of non-Conference action with the last NCAC game being played at Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, Ohio. The Battling Bishops, under first-year coach Steve Farkasovsky, are 2-6 overall and 2-3 in the NCAC and could finish with a .500 NCAC mark when they entertain the College of Wooster (0-8; 0-5 NCAC). A win could tie the Bishops for fourth in the NCAC (with Oberlin) and the Scots will be playing for pride and their first win of the year.

In non-Conference action, ALLEGHENY COLLEGE (2-7; 1-5 NCAC) will travel to Grove City (PA) College for their finale. The Big Red of DENISON (7-2; 4-2 NCAC) make a long trek to Rochester for their final game of the year. KENYON COLLEGE (6-3; 4-2 NCAC) could capture their seventh win of the season, and establish their best record in many years, when they entertain Hiram College. OBERLIN COLLEGE (4-5; 3-3 NCAC), the hottest property in the late season, can capture a .500 mark when they travel to the Philadelphia area to meet Swarthmore College.

Last Saturday, Case Western Reserve University, the NCAC champ, (9-0; 6-0 NCAC) completed their perfect season with a win over Carnegie-Mellon University, 25-17. The win was especially sweet as the CMU club was the only one to defeat CWRU in '83 and kept the Spartans out of playoff contention. It was the first undefeated season in 46 years on Cleveland's University Circle and the first perfect season in 23 years for any Cleveland area college team.

Coach Don Hunsinger's Oberlin College squad played opportunistic football as they stunned Denison University, the NCAC runnerup, 23-21, in the biggest Conference upset of the year. Denison must now share runnerup laurels with Kenyon College; both completed the NCAC year with 4-2 marks.

Ohio Wesleyan picked up their second win of the season as they saw their offense and defense come together for a 27-17 win over Allegheny. Kenyon defeated Centre College of Kentucky, 10-7, a team which was ranked #15 in Division III three weeks ago. And the College of Wooster remained winless, losing a 15-12 decision to Marietta College.

CLEVELAND, OH Freshman running back Jim Harrell of Oberlin College and junior linebacker Dean Cordle of Ohio Wesleyan University have been named North Coast Athletic Conference football "Players of the Week" on offense and defense, respectively.

Harrell (Swarthmore, PA/Strathaven HS) had the game of his short college career when he rushed 43 times for 213 yards and a touchdown to lead the Yeomen to a stunning upset victory over NCAC powerhouse, Denison, 23-21, last Saturday. The win doubled Oberlin's output of last year, improving them to 4-5 and they finished in the middle of the NCAC with a 3-3 mark. Harrell should get special notice when Oberlin travels to Swarthmore College (PA) next week, Harrell's hometown, in their season finale.

Cordle (Hinckley, OH/Highland HS) had another outstanding day for the Battling Bishops as they notched their second win of the year, defeating Allegheny College, 27-17, last Saturday. The junior had 18 tackles, including 12 solos, with two for a loss. His one interception came with 41 seconds remaining in the game to ice the win. Cordle takes over the OWU lead in tackles with 75 on the year.

DENISON, WOOSTER MAKE NCAA FIELD HOCKEY PLAYOFFS;
OHIO WESLEYAN COPS MEN'S SOCCER CROWN IN NCAC

Denison University and the College of Wooster, co-champions in NCAC field hockey both received invitations to the NCAA Field Hockey playoffs this past week. Both, however, lost in the first round last Saturday with Denison losing to Salem State (NC), 4-0 and Wooster losing to Oneonta State (NY), 3-0.

Coach Jay Martin's Battling Bishops of Ohio Wesleyan captured the first North Coast Athletic Conference Men's soccer title last Saturday when they defeated Kenyon College, 4-0. That gave OWU a 5-0-1 NCAC record and they moved to an impressive 15-3-1 record and a solid candidate for the NCAA playoffs, once again. Brian Bundy had two of the four goals against Kenyon, as he secured his lead as the NCAC's top scorer with 39 points.

NORTH COAST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE CLOSSES FIRST
GRID SEASON ON HIGH NOTE WITH FOUR WINS; NCAC
CHAMP, CWRU, IS NATION'S #10 RANKED TEAM

CLEVELAND, OH The North Coast Athletic Conference closed its inaugural football season last Saturday, November 10, on a high note as four of its six teams in action finished their seasons with victories.

Allegheny College (3-7; 1-5 NCAC) picked up their third win of the year when they beat Grove City College (PA), 9-6. Denison University (8-2; 4-2 NCAC) put the cap on one of the finest seasons in Big Red history when they bested the University of Rochester (NY), 35-27. Kenyon College (7-3; 4-2 NCAC) staged a classic come-from-behind victory over Miram, 23-22, to record their seventh win of the year and post one of the Lords best-ever seasons. Oberlin College (4-6; 3-3 NCAC) stopped just short of an unpredicted .500 season when they lost to an outstanding Swarthmore (PA) College team, 31-3. And in the only NCAC game, the final one of the season, Ohio Wesleyan University (3-6; 3-3 NCAC) edged its Conference record up to the break-even mark as they defeated the College of Wooster (0-9; 0-6 NCAC), 23-7.

In review, it was an outstanding first year of football action for the NCAC, with many more highlights than reverses. The Conference champion, Case Western Reserve University enjoyed its finest season, going undefeated at 9-0 overall and sweeping its Conference slate, 6-0. The Spartans, under coach Jim Chapman, have been ranked all season long in the NCAA Division III football poll and are currently the 10th best team among the nearly 200 Division III football schools. They finished the season among the national leaders in scoring offense and total offense.

The NCAC is the only conference in Ohio to have a team ranked in the nation's top ten and, throughout most of the season, the Conference runnersup, Denison and Kenyon, repeatedly received votes in the national poll--a record equal to any conference in Division III.

Denison continued to have great success with its unique single-wing offense, as it finished the season as the third-best rushing team in the NCAA and among the top ten in total offense. The high-powered Kenyon passing attack also ranks the Lords among the Division III leaders in passing offense.

NCAC members ranged far and wide when they stepped out of rugged Conference action as they played teams from seven states. Denison University played a truly-representative schedule when they played outstanding opponents from Ohio, Michigan (Kalamazoo), Pennsylvania (Allegheny), Indiana (DePauw), Texas (Trinity), and New

York (Rochester). Kenyon played teams from five states and added a win over Centre College of Kentucky.

The NCAC was 13-12 in non-Conference play but had some very significant victories in that win column. CWRU won all three of its non-league games and two were over NCAA Division III ranked teams. CWRU defeated Washington & Jefferson, 34-16, when the Presidents were ranked #8 nationally. W&J finished 8-1, won the Presidents' Athletic Conference championship and are a sure bet playoff team. CWRU defeated Carnegie Mellon University, 25-17, ranked #10 midway in the season. Kenyon stunned Adrian of Michigan, a 1983 playoff team, 30-23, in the season opener and later beat Centre College of Kentucky, a team ranked #15 nationally midway through the season. Denison had the best non-Conference record, a perfect 4-0 mark.

The biggest surprise team of the season has to be Oberlin College, who staged a comeback in the back half of the '84 season, recording four wins, including the upset of the year, a 23-21 stunner against NCAC opponent, Denison. In the NCAC pre-season grid poll, the Yeomen were picked for dead last, following two back-to-back 2-7 seasons.

CLEVELAND, OH--Senior wide receiver Todd Stoner of Kenyon College and junior defensive back Dean Hood of Ohio Wesleyan University have been named North Coast Athletic Conference football "Players of the Week" on offense and defense, respectively.

Stoner (Lambertville, MI/Bedford HS) was a key man in Kenyon's come-from-behind win, 23-22, over Hiram College last Saturday. He grabbed 10 catches for 120 yards and one TD. That brings Stoner's Conference-leading marks to 65 catches for 1134 yards and 11 TDs., impressive figures which should stand as NCAC records for some time to come. In his excellent career, Stoner compiled 197 catches to entrench him at fourth among the all-time NCAA Division III receivers. His 30 career TDs are just three short of the Kenyon record of 33 set by Chris Myers (1967-70).

Hood (Ashtabula, OH/Harbor HS) patrolled the Bishop secondary in their 23-7 win over Wooster. He picked off a first-half pass and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown to put Ohio Wesleyan ahead to stay in the game. The junior safety also chipped in eight key tackles to boost his second-leading team total to 80 for the season.

NORTH COAST WAVES.....

Kenyon's Dragan Pantic, senior quarterback (Parma, OH/Parma HS), came off the bench in the second half to lead the Lords to a comeback finish against Hiram... Pantic, on the bench with back spasms in the first half, threw for 280 yards and 2 TDs... he closed his record-setting career at Kenyon with three more passing marks: most attempts (316), most completions (204) and most yards (2383)--all season marks.

At the Great Lakes Regional in Cross Country at Wooster, Saturday, Oberlin College's women's team, the North Coast champ, won the regional...their team advances to the national meet next Saturday, November 17, held at Ohio Wesleyan University.

Vanessa Jones, Ohio Wesleyan, the North Coast Champion in cross country and Christine Dudeck, Allegheny, also advance to the national meet. Vanessa was the top finisher at the Great Lakes with a time of 19:19. Christine was the sixth place finisher at the NCAA Mideast Regionals at Annville, PA.

Ohio Wesleyan, the North Coast men's soccer champs, received a NCAA playoff bid and lost in the first round, last Saturday, 1-0 in a double overtime heartbreaker to Washington University of St. Louis.

Ohio Wesleyan has four of the top five scorers in men's soccer...Brian Bundy leads the Conference with 39 points, an average of 2 points per game, followed closely by Ken Hyland (35 points, 1.8 per game). Teammates Rick Wyman and Caleb Thomson have notched 22 points and 23 points, respectively, averaging 1.2 points per game. Wesleyan has outscored their opponents by a tremendous 70-16 span.

ALL-CONFERENCE GRID TEAM; CWRU'S DiSANTO
IS OFFENSE MVP, OBERLIN'S NAU IS DEFENSE MVP,
JIM CHAPMAN OF CWRU IS COACH OF THE YEAR

CLEVELAND, OH--Case Western Reserve University, the #9 ranked football team in NCAA Division III and the first North Coast Athletic Conference champion, dominated the first all-conference team selections, as voted by the NCAC football coaches and announced today.

The Spartans, who posted a perfect 9-0 season, including six NCAC wins, landed 10 players on the first teams. Denison University, who was one of two NCAC runnersup, placed five on the first teams. Each Conference team placed at least one player on the first teams.

Quarterback Fred DiSanto of Case Western Reserve University, a senior from South Euclid, OH and St. Ignatius High School, was named the Most Valuable Player on Offense in the Conference and is the recipient of the Mike Gregory Award. The Gregory Award will be presented annually to the MVP on offense in the name of this former great Denison University athlete.

DiSanto led the champion Spartans and was the league's highest rated passer all season. On the year, he completed 98 of 158 passes for a 62.0% mark, had only seven interceptions and threw for nine TDs, placing him tenth in the NCAA Division III rankings with 137.6 points.

He is the all-time passer at CWRU and, in 1983, was named MVP of the Presidents' Athletic Conference. DiSanto may be the only collegian to ever earn the MVP honor in two conferences during a college career.

CASE RESERVE, NCAC GRID CHAMP...add one

Bob Nau (Canton, OH/McKinley HS), a senior linebacker for the resurgent Oberlin College team (4-6; 3-3 NCAC), was the top defender for the Yeomen and was named Most Valuable Player on Defense in the Conference and is the recipient of the Hank Critchfield Award. The Critchfield Award will be presented annually to the MVP on defense in the name of this former great College of Wooster graduate.

Nau led Oberlin in tackles for the third straight year and was the leader in the Yeomen's comeback performance this year, according to Coach Don Hunsinger. He was named "NCAC Player of the Week" for his performance in a loss against Geneva College. Nau had 17 tackles, of which 10 were unassisted, and he had three QB sacks. Nau, who was a captain this year, led the Oberlin defense, which was the second best in the NCAC, giving up only 287 yards per game.

The first "Coach of the Year" award was bestowed, unanimously, on Jim Chapman, mentor of the CWRU Championship Spartans. Since his arrival at CWRU three years ago, Chapman took a losing program and has run a remarkable 22-4 won-loss record. He was runnerup for Ohio College Coach of the Year last year, following CWRU's nationally-ranked 8-1 season in 1983.
