

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Baseball Preview

Three schools -- The College of Wooster, Ohio Wesleyan University and Allegheny College -- have dominated the baseball scene over the North Coast Athletic Conference's first six years. Wooster has won three outright NCAC championships, shared another (with Allegheny in 1985) and finished in second and third the two times it did not win; Ohio Wesleyan has two outright titles and has finished below third only once; and Allegheny has a co-championship, two second place finishes and a third to its credit. Throwing in Wittenberg University, which placed second last spring in its first season in the NCAC, makes for a formidable foursome. The North Coast also has fared well nationally, with two teams advancing to the NCAA Tournament in five of the six years.

Wooster slipped past Wittenberg by one game, Ohio Wesleyan by two and Allegheny by two and one-half to claim the 1990 NCAC title. The 1991 season should see another dogfight among these four, with added pressure coming from an improved Denison University squad. Case Western Reserve University and Oberlin College also could slip into the first division, while Kenyon College and Earlham College look to build a base for future years. The 1991 season also will see the inaugural NCAC Tournament, with the top four teams at the end of the regular season coming together for a three-day, double-elimination tournament to decide the Conference champion.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

The Gators (14-6; 24-12) have thrived on offensive muscle the past two seasons, but head coach Rick Creehan hopes his team can improve upon last year's fourth place finish with improved pitching and defense. Creehan is 159-81 (.663) in seven seasons at Allegheny and has won 20 or more games six times.

Five of Allegheny's top six pitchers will return this spring, led by senior **Dave Welmer** (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline) and hard-throwing sophomore **Jason Cuomo** (Follansbee, WV/Brooke). Welmer, the staff's lone southpaw, went 4-3 with a 3.15 earned run average last season, while Cuomo was 4-0 with a 3.72 ERA. When a starter tires, senior closer **Jeff Filkovski** (Penn, PA/Penn Trafford) will be called upon after earning three saves in 1990. Filkovski, an All America quarterback on the national champion Gator football team, doubles as the team's centerfielder and offensive leader. He hit .266 with four home runs and 17 runs batted in last year and has a .307 career average with 15 homers and 61 RBI. Sophomore second baseman **Steve Cook** (Buffalo, NY/Kenmore West), who hit an even .300 and earned honorable mention All-NCAC honors last season, anchors a young infield.

CASE RESERVE

Case Reserve (10-13; 14-22) hopes to move into the NCAC's first division this spring behind one of the Conference's top pitchers and a solid group of everyday players. Sixth-year head coach Jerry Seimon also has the core of a strong defense, with five starters back from a unit that led the North Coast (.948) in fielding last season.

Junior righthander **Scott Summers** (Salem, OH/Salem) will lead the pitching staff after posting a 5-3 record with a team leading 3.84 earned run average in 1990. One of his wins came on a one hit shutout of perennial NCAC power Ohio Wesleyan. The Spartans hit a solid .274 as a team last season and five of their top eight hitters return in 1991, led by senior **Tim McQuillin** (Delta, OH/Delta) and junior **Ken Holloway** (St. Clairsville, OH/St. Clairsville). McQuillin, a three year starter at first base, hit .297 with 19 runs batted in last season, while Holloway, a two-year starter at third, hit .294 with two home runs and 21 RBI.

DENISON

The 1990 season was one of rebuilding for Denison (8-13; 10-24), which used the opportunity to give a promising group of youngsters a chance to play and gain experience. This season, second-year head coach Dan Briggs hopes to begin reaping the benefits of his patience and challenge the NCAC's upper echelon.

The Big Red offense will be anchored by sophomore catcher **Brett Scott** (Holland, OH/Springfield) and junior rightfielder **Steve Schott** (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit). Scott, an honorable mention All-NCAC selection last season, hit .317 with six home runs and 36 runs batted in as a freshman, while Schott hit a team high .394. Senior **David Gorden** (Flossmoor, IL/Homewood-Flossmoor), who had a 3.80 earned run average last year, and junior **Jeff Evers** (Darien, CT/Dairen), who had an ERA of 3.59, lead the pitching staff.

EARLHAM

After capturing a College Athletic Conference championship in 1989, Earlham (0-17; 3-30) was greeted rather rudely in its first season of NCAC competition. Sixth-year head coach Doug Welsh should benefit from the return of a couple of key players from injury, but he will rely primarily on the development of freshmen and sophomores.

Sophomore shortstop **Brian Britt** (Whiteland, IN/Whiteland) is the Quakers' leading returnee after batting .327 with a team-high 10 stolen bases in his rookie season. Junior rightfielder **Todd Hawkins** (Casstown, OH/Miami East) and senior catcher **Daryl Sears** (Cincinnati, OH/Reading) also are back after hitting .313 and .290, respectively. In addition, the return of senior first baseman **Mike Burke** (Cincinnati, OH/Oak Hills) from a knee injury should help. Earlham had a 9.29 team earned run average last year and that, obviously, will have to improve. Sophomore righthander **Joe Tanner** (Cincinnati, OH/Moeller) has the inside track on the number one spot.

KENYON

Kenyon (4-15; 6-24) will look to begin building a solid foundation this spring under first-year head coach Bob Bunnell. Bunnell is 152-147-2 (.505) in 10 years as a collegiate coach and he took Philadelphia Textile to the NCAA Division II Tournament last spring.

Senior infielders **Josh Webber** (Groton, MA/Groton) and **Roger Colson** (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan) head this year's squad. Webber led the team in hitting last season with a .337 average, while Colson hit .307 and was second in the NCAC in stolen bases with 25. Junior outfielder **Jeff Pfriem** (Worthington, OH/Worthington) also

should help offensively. Webber and Pfriem double as the leaders of the Lord pitching staff, which will need to improve on last year's 7.54 earned run average if the team is going to make a move in the standings.

OBERLIN

After three years of climbing towards the NCAC's first division, Oberlin (6-14; 7-25-1) has slipped over the last two seasons, falling to fifth place in 1989 and seventh in 1990. Fourth-year head coach Jeff White's primary concern this spring will be pitching, where he will have to rebuild a staff that lost three starters to graduation, including hard-throwing righthander Chip Winkarski, who signed with the Cleveland Indians after the season.

Senior southpaw Tom Mancini (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline), who was 2-5 with a 5.36 earned run average last season, is expected to lead this year's staff. Offensively, the Yeomen's top weapon is junior outfielder/catcher James Schopf (Seattle, WA/Garfield), who hit .311 last season. Schopf earned honorable mention All-NCAC honors in 1990, as did sophomore first baseman Brent Eastwood (Washington, MO/Iowa City), who hit .255.

OHIO WESLEYAN

Ohio Wesleyan (18-6; 30-13) fans may not need a program to find out who's on the field for the Bishops this spring, but getting used to where the players are could be a different story. Eighth year head coach Roger Ingles has veterans returning at all eight field positions, but only two return to the spots they played last season. Still, with six returning All-NCAC position players and an experienced pitching staff, Ohio Wesleyan has an excellent chance to claim its second North Coast crown in three years and make a second consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Senior righthander John Nye (Columbus, OH/St. Charles) returns as the ace of the pitching staff after compiling a 9-3 record with a 3.59 earned run average and earning first-team All-NCAC honors last season. He will be joined in the rotation by senior righthander Jim Miller (Seven Hills, OH/St. Ignatius), who was 6-3 with a 5.68 ERA last year, and junior lefthander Steve Mitchell (Delaware, OH/Hayes), who was 3-3 with a 3.58 ERA.

Sophomore Mark Senkowitz (Warten, OH/Champion), a first-team All-NCAC pick a year ago, will return to his natural position behind the plate after forcing his way into the lineup in left field last season by hitting .371 with six home runs and 38 runs batted in. Other top performers include sophomore centerfielder turned second baseman Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley), a first team All NCAC pick who hit .373 with 36 RBI in 1990, and senior outfielder Mark Glaser (Westerville, OH/North), who hit .344 with a team high 20 stolen bases.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg (16-5; 26-7-2) came within one run of sharing the NCAC title with Wooster in 1990, dropping a 2-1 heartbreaker to Oberlin in the final game of the season. That loss not only prevented the Tigers from sharing the North Coast crown, but it probably also kept them out of the NCAA Tournament.

First year head coach Rick Willis will have six returning starters to work with when he fills out his first lineup card, including first team All-NCAC rightfielder Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Bishop Watterson). Callahan, a junior, hit .337 a year ago and displayed a strong arm from the outfield with 12 assists. Senior centerfielder Jerry Cicolani (Mansfield, OH/Madison), a second-team All-Conference pick and a third-team Academic All-America last season, is back after batting .299, as is junior leftfielder Chris Tillotson (Glenview, IL/Glenbrook South), who hit .293. The Tigers' pitching is not nearly as settled, particularly after the graduation loss of first-team All-America hurler Kevin Tatar, who was 11-0 in 1990. Sophomore righthander Tom Fyffe (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge) is the staff's top returnee after posting a 4-1 record with a 4.20 earned run average last season.

WOOSTER

Veteran head coach Tim Pettorini's troops are poised for another march on the North Coast title in 1991. The Scots (17-4; 28-10-1), who captured their fourth NCAC championship and advanced to their sixth consecutive NCAA Midwest Regional last season, show few signs of weakening. Wooster has won 28 or more games for six straight years and is 252-124-3 (.669) in nine seasons under Pettorini.

Senior centerfielder Tom Flynn (Youngstown, OH/Mooney) and junior leftfielder Matt Burdette (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Cuyahoga Falls) are back to anchor the Scot outfield after batting .329 and .349, respectively, last year. The infield features senior Chris Bell (Brookpark, OH/Olmsted Falls) at second base and classmate Matt Sherrieb (Salver, PA/Freeport) at third. Bell was a first team All NCAC performer in 1990 after leading the Conference with an outstanding .415 average. Bell added 32 RBI and a team-high 37 walks. Sherrieb, meanwhile, hit .273 with 10 home runs and 38 RBI. The pitching staff will once again be led by senior righthander Jason Weiner (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights), who was 9-2 with a 2.28 earned run average last season.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Golf Preview

The fact that four North Coast Athletic Conference teams are represented in the spring's initial NCAA Division III Top 20 for the second consecutive year leads one to believe that the NCAC is poised for yet another outstanding season. Ohio Wesleyan University, which has won four consecutive North Coast titles and tied for second at the 1990 NCAA Tournament, is ranked second nationally to lead the Conference contingent. Perennial power Allegheny College, which has made its way into the national top 15 in 13 of the last 16 years, is ranked sixth, followed by Wittenberg University, which tied for fourth at the 1990 NCAA Tournament and was fifth in 1989, in seventh. Wooster, which had made seven consecutive post-season appearances prior to last season, rounds out the list in 15th.

Ohio Wesleyan has placed fourth, ninth, fourth, third and second (tie) in Division III over the past five seasons. The Bishops have had plenty of company at the top of the leaderboard, however, as six NCAC teams (out of the eight that sponsor golf) have posted a total of 17 national top 20 finishes in the six seasons since the Conference's inception. Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster lead the way with five, followed by Allegheny with four and Denison University, Kenyon College and Wittenberg, which entered the North Coast just last year, with one apiece.

While it is very difficult to pick against four-time defending champion Ohio Wesleyan, the Bishops will not have an easy go as they try to "win one for the thumb" at this spring's NCAC Tournament. Wittenberg will be extremely strong again, and both Allegheny and Wooster appear to have improved. Kenyon has been on the upswing over the past three seasons and should also be watched, while Denison figures to be solid once again. Case Western Reserve University and Earlham College are building and fill out the remainder of the North Coast scorecard.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's eight teams.

ALLEGHENY

With three returning NCAA All District II performers helping this year's squad complete one of the finest fall seasons in school history, veteran Allegheny head coach Norm Sundstrom is optimistic that his team can contend for the NCAC title this spring. The Gators, who won a North Coast title in 1986, placed third at the NCAC Tournament in 1990 and have never finished lower than fourth.

Heading the list of All District returnees is junior captain **Marc Voytko (Johnstown, PA/McCort)**, who returned to the squad this fall after taking a year off and posted a team-leading 77.9 stroke average. Juniors **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** and **George Laskey (Hopwood, PA/Geibel)** also are back after finishing one-two on the team in scoring average last spring at 78.0 and 79.8, respectively. Senior letterman **Steve Whidden (Jamestown, NY/Jamestown)** also figures to earn a spot near the top of the lineup.

CASE RESERVE

The Spartans have never placed higher than fifth at the NCAC Tournament, but fourth-year head coach Ron Stuckey can be optimistic this spring with four players back, including his top two performers, from last year's squad that placed seventh.

Junior **Eric Zahn (Hampstead, MD/Hereford)** led the team in stroke average in 1990 and posted a second-round 74 in the UAA Championships, the lowest competitive score ever recorded by a Case Reserve golfer. Senior **Steve Bucha (Cleveland, OH/Valley Forge)** should back Zahn from the number-two spot after finishing second on the team in scoring a year ago. The remaining two returnees are junior **Brian Stadelmaier (Orchard Park, NY/Orchard Park)** and sophomore **Dave Dehlman (Rochester, NY/Mooney)**.

DENISON

Denison was the surprise team of the 1990 NCAC Championships, firing a fine 318 on the second day to finish fifth overall. The Big Red, whose most recent NCAA Tournament berth came in 1984, will look to build on last year's solid finish and return to the top of the North Coast.

Senior **Jeff Walker (Northfield, IL/New Trier)** is expected to play at the top of head coach Sam Dixon's lineup. Walker earned first-team All-Conference honors in 1990 with a third-place finish at the NCAC Tournament. Included in that finish was an outstanding one-over-par 73 in the second round -- the second-best score in the tournament. Senior **David Gillies (Springfield, IL/Southeast)** and juniors **Steve Buecking (Barrington, IL/Barrington)**, **Scott Thomas (St. Louis, MO/Burroughs)** and **Chris Walling (Kingsville, OH/Marian (IN))** are among those expected to battle for the remaining positions in the lineup. Walling was the team's second finisher at last year's NCAC Tournament, ending up in a tie for 16th on the strength of a 76 in round two.

EARLHAM

Fourth-year head coach Frank Carr is optimistic that his team can improve upon last spring's eighth place NCAC finish. The Quakers return four sophomores whom Carr feels have the ability to develop into fine players. Included in that group are last year's top two performers -- **Mark Wheeler (Spencer, IN/Owen Valley)** and **Ken Huus (Evansville, IN/Day)**. Classmates **Stan Hill (Decatur, IN/Adams Central)** and **Bill Ewon (Huber Heights, OH/Wayne)** round out the list of returnees to Earlham's youthful roster, which includes six sophomores, two freshmen and one junior.

KENYON

Kenyon has quietly built an outstanding program, having placed second, third and fourth, respectively, in the highly competitive NCAC over the past three seasons. Included in that successful string was the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1989.

Second-year head coach Mike Pilger will have three of his top four players back in the lineup this spring.

including second-team All-Conference performer **Alex Hindrichs (Houston, TX/St. John's)**. Hindrichs was the team's second-leading scorer last season with an average of 79.0 and he placed eighth at the NCAC Championships with a two-day total of 157. Seniors **Matt Alcorn (Irwin, PA/Penn-Trafford)** and **Andrew Art (Williamstown, MA/Mount Greylock)** join Hindrichs at the top of the lineup. Alcorn led the team in scoring a year ago with a 77.6 average, while Art was third at 80.1.

OHIO WESLEYAN

There is only one thing to do if veteran Ohio Wesleyan head coach Dick Gordin wants to improve on the Bishops' impressive 1990 season -- win the NCAA Division III championship. Gordin's squad won last spring's NCAC Tournament by six strokes, bringing the Conference trophy back to Delaware for the fourth year in a row. From there, Ohio Wesleyan went on to tie for second at the NCAA Championships, its best finish ever.

To reach such lofty heights again in 1991, the Bishops must replace three outstanding players -- three-time All-America Greg Wilhelm, two-time NCAC Player of the Year Todd Benware and first-team All-NCAC honoree Kevin Fillman. Senior **Barry Pry (Findlay, OH/Findlay)**, a two time All America, is back in the fold after leading the team in stroke average a year ago. Pry finished second at the NCAA Tournament last season, missing medalist honors by just one stroke. The second-place national finish was the best ever by an Ohio Wesleyan individual and his total score of 290 established a 72 hole school record. Senior **Jon Whithaus (Findlay, OH/Findlay)**, the team's fifth man last season, is expected to take over the number-two spot this spring. He was a second-team All-NCAC selection in 1989. Junior transfers **Galen Eckland (Lake Geneva, WI/Badger)**, from Duke, and **Matt Roth (Sidney, OH/Sidney)**, from Division III champion Methodist, also figure prominently in the Bishops' plans.

WITTENBERG

With three of its top five players back from last year's squad that finished second at the NCAC Tournament and went on to tie for fourth at the NCAA Championships, Wittenberg will be a team to watch again in 1991. The Tigers fourth place national finish was the best in school history, and it came on the heels of a fifth place finish in 1989.

Head coach Dave Maurer's team was a major factor in last season's NCAC Tournament, firing a 313 in the first round to lead Ohio Wesleyan by two strokes. Wittenberg then pared four strokes off that score in round two only to see Ohio Wesleyan come back with a sparkling 301 to take the title by six strokes. Leading the Tigers' quest for a first NCAC championship (they won four of their last five OAC titles) is junior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)**, who earned NCAC Player of the Year and first-team All-America honors last season. Lyons, a two-time All-America, fired a three over par 147 to take medalist honors at the NCAC Championships and went on to finish third at the NCAA Tournament, just two strokes off the lead. Senior **Scott Allen (Akron, OH/Firestone)** a second-team All-NCAC performer last year, and junior **Karl Postler (Rochester, NY/Sutherland)**, a third-team All-America, join Lyons at the top of the Wittenberg lineup.

WOOSTER

It is easy to understand why Wooster head coach Bob Nye would just as soon forget about the 1990 season. Not only did the Scots finish a disappointing sixth at the NCAC Championships, but they also failed to advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in eight years. Nye, rather, prefers to focus on the upcoming season, when he will be greeted with the return of his top three players from last year and an outstanding transfer.

Leading the way for Wooster in 1991 will be sophomore **Randy Pitts (Jacksonville, FL/Episcopal)**. A second team All NCAC performer last season, Pitts led the team with a 76.3 stroke average and had the low round of the year with a 71. He will be joined by juniors **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** and **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)**, who averaged 78.1 and 80.6, respectively, in 1990. Joining this talented trio will be sophomore **Darren Schubert (Wooster, OH/Wooster)**, a transfer from Akron.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Men's Lacrosse Preview

In each of the North Coast Athletic Conference's previous six seasons, the men's lacrosse championship has gone to the winner of the Denison University-Ohio Wesleyan University contest. Denison won the first two battles and claimed NCAC titles in 1985 and 1986, but Ohio Wesleyan has been dominant ever since, racking up four consecutive Conference championships. Ohio Wesleyan has taken its success to the national level as well, advancing to six straight NCAA Division III Tournaments and nine of 11 overall. The Bishops were national runners-up to 11-time champion Hobart in 1987, 1988 and 1989 and have been semifinalists for five consecutive years.

Ohio Wesleyan will once again be the team to beat in the North Coast this spring, but Denison is coming off another outstanding season and The College of Wooster has improved to the point where it could legitimately become a factor. Kenyon College has put together three solid seasons in a row and also could surprise, while Oberlin College and Wittenberg University hope to begin seeing rewards from the rebuilding process.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's six teams.

DENISON

A solid group of returnees welcomes first-year head coach Mike Caruvann as Denison (4-1; 11-4) tries to regain the NCAC title it last won in 1986. The Big Red have never finished lower than second in the North Coast and own an outstanding 120-49 (710) overall record since 1980.

Senior attackmen **Adam Rice** (Alexandria, VA/Episcopal) and **Ian O'Keefe** (Boston, MA/Roxbury Latin) lead what is for the most part a young and inexperienced front line. Freshman **John Eydenberg** (Locust Valley, NY/Taft (CT)) has the offensive talent to contribute immediately. The midfield will be an area of strength with the return of seniors **Brian Crowley** (Welland, Ontario/Notre Dame), **John Spilman** (Lutherville, MD/Gilman) and **John Byrne** (Baltimore, MD/Calvert Hall) -- Crowley and Spilman were second-team All-NCAC selections in 1990. Defensively, Denison will be led by senior **John Gustafson** (Birmingham, MI/Cranbrook Kingswood) and a pair of freshmen, **Ethan Ewing** (Upperco, MD/Gilman) and **Mike Campanale** (Bala Cynwyd, PA/Episcopal). Senior goalies **Billy Barroll** (Baltimore, MD/Gilman) and **Alex Allen** (Concord, MA/Concord-Carlisle) give the Big Red talent and flexibility. Barroll had a .614 saves percentage and was a second-team All-NCAC selection last spring, while Allen came off the bench to lead the Conference in saves percentage at .656.

KENYON

In the six seasons since the North Coast was formed, Kenyon (7-6; 2-3) is 38-33 overall and 11-14 in Conference games. While the Lords have not been able to beat Denison or Ohio Wesleyan, they have fared well against the remainder of the NCAC and have come away with third place four times and fourth twice.

Veteran head coach Bill Heiser has some holes to fill this spring, but another solid season would appear to be in the offing. Kenyon allowed the fewest goals (141) in the Conference last year and defense should again be the team's foundation. Second-team All-NCAC and first-team All-Midwest goalie **Chris Alpaugh** has graduated, but senior **Phil Wilson** (Lawrenceville, NJ/Lawrenceville) is ready to step in after three seasons in a backup role. Senior **Don Thomas** (Weston, MA/Noble & Greenough), a second-team All-NCAC performer a year ago, leads the defense in front of Wilson. The midfield, with junior **Pat Muller** (Northbrook, IL/Loyola), sophomore **Gordie Walker** (Phoenixville, PA/Haverford) and junior **Eric Brockett** (North Haven, CT/Hamden Hall) manning the first unit, also should be strong. Offense will be the primary question mark, with only one of last year's top five scorers returning -- senior **John Carpenter** (Towaco, NY/Montville Township). Carpenter had 13 goals and seven assists last season and was fifth on the team in scoring.

OSHERLIN

Oberlin (1-4; 4-6) will have to fill a void left with the graduation of 10 seniors if it is to improve upon last year's fifth place NCAC finish. The biggest loss will be that of all-time leading scorer **Dave Herman**, who contributed a team-leading 33 goals last season.

Ninth-year head coach Jim Donovan will be turning to senior attack **Brigham Golden** (Weymouth, MA/Deerfield) for leadership on offense. Golden had 27 goals and 15 assists last season and finished second on the team and sixth in the Conference in scoring with an average of 4.2 points per game. The supporting cast includes sophomore attack **Dan Murphy** (Montclair, NJ/Kimberly), who had 28 goals and eight assists last year, and senior midfielder **Andrei Straumanis** (Winter Park, FL/Western Reserve (OH)). The loss of three defensive starters will hurt the Yeomen, but senior **Ike Sanderson** (Westchester, PA/Henderson) is back to lead the unit. Sophomore **Sam Doak** (Durham, CT/Phillips) and freshman **Alex Graf** (Newcastle, ME/Northfield Mt. Herman (MA)) will vie for the starting position in goal.

OHIO WESLEYAN

The face on the sidelines is new, but the look on the field won't be. First-year head coach Lelan Rogers' 1991 squad should be strong in the attack, the midfield and in goal. With the exception of some new twists brought in by Rogers and his staff and a new face or two on the defensive end, Ohio Wesleyan (5-0; 15-3) will look much like last year's team, which won its fourth consecutive NCAC championship and advanced to the NCAA Division III semifinals for the fifth straight season.

Senior **Mike Arfin** (Suffern, NY/Suffern) and junior **Bill Bishop** (Wilton, CT/Wilton) are the top returning attackers. Arfin shared the team lead with 28 goals last season, while Bishop, with 18 goals and 20 assists, was second on the team in scoring. The Bishop midfield, long an area of strength, should again serve as the team's

backbone. Senior **Neil Ringers (Ridgefield, CT/Ridgefield)**, a two-time All-America, leads a crop of six seniors in the midfield ranks. He shared the team lead with 28 goals in 1990 and was a first-team All-NCAC and second-team All-America selection. Senior midfielders **Kim Hall (Brewerton, NY/Liverpool)**, a second-team All-Conference pick last year, and **Mike Szwajkos (Syracuse, NY/Liverpool)**, the team's face-off specialist, also are back. Defensively, second-team All-NCAC junior **Kevin Wall (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** returns to lead a young unit, which will get plenty of support from senior goalie **Rich Flynn (Williston Park, NY/Mineola)**, a second-team All-America and first-team All-Conference honoree in each of the last two seasons.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg (0-5; 1-7) hopes to continue making strides in its second season of NCAC competition. The Tigers were 0-6 against varsity opponents in 1989 and lost their first three games last year before a 17-14 triumph over Marietta.

Head coach **Steve Ritzenthaler** hopes that a solid recruiting class will be enough to compensate for the graduation loss of Jeff Mayer, who led the NCAC in scoring last season with 40 goals and eight assists for an average of 6.0 points per game. Sophomore midfielder **Jack Cleary (Chappaqua, NY/Greeley)** is the team's leading returnee.

WOOSTER

With senior attackmen **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor)** and **Andy Fox (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris Central)** returning for a final season, head coach **Jon Hind** can build around one of the most potent scoring combinations in Division III. Davidow, who achieved All-America status last year after setting a team record and leading the NCAC with 51 goals, and Fox, who led the Conference in assists with 45, are two of the country's premier scorers and together they hope to push Wooster (3-2; 10-6) into the national spotlight.

The Scots' 10 wins last season were the most since 1983 and Hind may have an even better team this spring. Sophomore **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** and junior **Alan Pohoryles (Bethesda, MD/Sandy Springs Friends)** join Davidow and Fox on the attack after scoring 31 and 20 goals, respectively, last year. Junior **Pete Trummel (West Hartford, CT/Conard)** and seniors **Chris Dumont (Princeton, NJ/Princeton)**, **Jim Papp (East Grand Rapids, MI/East Grand Rapids)** and **Chuck Wheat (Rochester, NY/Penfield)** lead the defense in front of goalies **Rich Green (Philadelphia, PA/Lower Merion)** and **Neil Hagan (Rocky River, OH/St. Ignatius)**.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Women's Lacrosse Preview

Denison University has won each of the six North Coast Athletic Conference women's lacrosse championships. By taking a seventh this spring, Denison's rule over the NCAC would be rivaled only by the Kenyon College men's and women's swimmers, which would be the only other teams to have won all seven championships the North Coast has had to offer.

The Big Red claimed their sixth title last season (and advanced to their second NCAA Tournament in three years) with a two game edge over Kenyon College and Wittenberg University. In fact, Denison's margin of victory has been at least two games in every year except 1986, when Kenyon came within a single game. Four different teams -- Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan University, Wittenberg and The College of Wooster -- have taken turns at second place over the NCAC's six seasons, but no one has been able to knock the Big Red from their throne. Kenyon and Wittenberg figure to be Denison's chief combatants again this spring, but improved teams from Oberlin College, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster could also pose a threat.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's seven teams.

DENISON

Denison (10-2; 11-5) has five All-NCAC performers back from last season's team that claimed the school's sixth consecutive Conference crown. Second-year head coach Sue Stimmel's squad got off to a slow start in 1990, but closed the regular season with nine straight wins to earn its second NCAA Tournament invitation in three years and establish itself as the Conference favorite once again this season.

Heading the list of returning All-NCAC honorees are first team selections **Chrissy Talarico (Spring Lakes, NJ/Suffield (CT))** and **Sharon Dewey (Alexandria, VA/St. Agnes)**. Talarico, a sophomore, was second on the team and seventh in the Conference in scoring with 36 goals and six assists in her rookie season, while Dewey, a junior, headed the Big Red defense. Junior midfielder **Amy Bradley (East Aurora, NY/Nichols)** and senior defenders **Sherry Gamble (Bolivar, PA/St. Andrew's (DE))** and **Missy Murphy (Radnor, PA/Carroll)** also are back after earning second team All-NCAC honors a year ago. It is hoped that junior attack **Christina Monacelli (Philadelphia, PA/Episcopal)**, who missed all of last season with a knee injury after finishing as the team's third-leading scorer in 1989, will be able to help offset the graduation loss of Jen Sherbrooke, the NCAC's leading scorer (49 goals, 17 assists) and Co-Player of the Year in 1990.

EARLHAM

Earlham (0-12; 0-13) looks forward to a season of improvement as second-year head coach Dora Scalco continues the rebuilding process she began last spring. The Quakers return 10 players who saw extensive action in 1990.

Sophomore **Fin Lehman (Spring City, PA/Kimberton Waldorf)**, a first team All-NCAC selection as a defensive wing last season, heads the list of returnees. Lehman will make the transition to center this spring, where her all-around ability will be even more of a plus. Other top players include junior defender **Rebecca Silva (Philadelphia, PA/Springside)**, a second-team All-Conference pick last year, senior attack **Anie Sklar (Garrett Park, MD/Woodward)** and sophomore attack **Chris Seelaus (Drexel Hill, PA/Penn Wood)**. Sklar, a regular in 1989, returns from overseas studies to provide needed experience, while Seelaus had 14 goals last season and is the team's leading returning scorer.

KENYON

The Ladies (8-4; 9-5) have never posted a sub-.500 record or finished below third in the NCAC's six seasons. Despite the loss of three first-team All-Conference performers, don't look for seventh-year head coach Sandy Moore's squad to break from that tradition of success.

Senior attack **Alberta Neilson (Devon, PA/St. Paul's)**, a second team All-NCAC performer in 1990, heads the list of returnees. Neilson tied for the team lead in goals last year with 29. She will be joined on the front line by sophomores **Melissa Wood (Devon, PA/Baldwin)** and **Kelly Raymond (Akron, OH/Western Reserve)**. Wood was third on the team in scoring last season with 19 goals and six assists, while Raymond was fifth with 13 goals and one assist. Defensively, sophomore **Katie Beller (Akron, OH/Firestone)** and senior **Meredith Johnston (Baltimore, MD/Roland Park)** lead a unit that allowed the second fewest goals (109) in the Conference in 1990. Junior **Patty Latta (Phoenixville, PA/Episcopal)** is expected to take over in goal for the graduated Cathie Herrick, a first-team All-NCAC selection last spring.

OBERLIN

Second-year head coach Lynda Kansdell will try to build on 1990's positive finish that saw the Yeowomen (6-6; 6-8) close the season with three straight victories, including a win over a strong Wittenberg team. Oberlin will look to senior attack **Amy Succop (Pittsburgh, PA/Ellis)** for offensive leadership this season. Succop scored 24 points and earned honorable mention All-NCAC honors last year. Juniors **Bonnie Scranton (East Hartford, CT/Kingswood-Oxford)** and **Betsy Johnson (Mt. Hermon, MA/Northfield Mt. Hermon)** will provide additional scoring punch after tallying 25 and 17 points, respectively, last season.

Leading a young defensive unit will be junior **Jennifer Skulte (Sudbury, MA/Lincoln-Sudbury)** and sophomores **Nora Healy (Freeport, ME/Northfield Mt. Hermon)** and **Erin Klett (Saxtons River, VT/Bellows Falls Union)**, all of whom were starters last season. Sophomore **Randa Kayyali (Coral Gables, FL/Cheltenham)** and freshman **Margaret Lewis (Asheville, NC/Asheville)** will battle for the starting spot in goal.

OHIO WESLEYAN

Ohio Wesleyan (7-5; 7-5) is looking to string together three consecutive winning seasons for the first time since 1974-76. With 13 returning letterwinners, including four previous All-West Region honorees, veteran head coach Mary Parker feels that her squad will be able to continue building on the momentum of the past two years.

The Bishops return a strong foundation on defense and in goal. Sophomore defender **Debbie Graeber (Mansfield, CT/Walker)** was a first team All Region and second team All NCAC selection last season, while senior **Sarah Camp (South Salem, NY/Masters)** was an honorable mention All-Region pick in 1989. In goal, Ohio Wesleyan will rely on sophomore **Katy Anderson (Greenwich, CT/Hotchkiss)**, who took over as the starter in the second game of the 1990 season and went on to finish second in the North Coast with a .618 saves percentage. Sophomore **Franny Smith (Montville, NJ/Worthington (OH))** and senior **Kendall Brewer (Chattanooga, TN/Brimmer & May)** are back to lead the offense. Smith had 15 goals and nine assists last spring and was a second-team All-NCAC pick, while Brewer had 20 goals and four assists. Smith received honorable mention All-Region honors last year and Brewer was a third-team selection in 1989.

WITTENBERG

Fifth-year head coach Nancy Beck hopes to have Wittenberg (8-4; 12-5) back in the thick of the NCAC race in 1991 after tying for second and posting the Conference's best overall record last spring. The Tigers' ability to challenge for the top spot may well depend on Beck's success in finding replacements for honorable mention All-America/career scoring leader Jodi Bennyhoff and career saves leader Jenny Weiss, both of whom were seniors last season.

Heading the list of returnees is first team All NCAC center **Ramsay Muhly (Towson, MD/Towson)**. Muhly, a senior, was one of six Wittenberg players selected to the All-Conference team in 1990. Junior defender **Lolly Hart (Riverside, CT/Greenwich)** and senior attack **Janet Kirkpatrick (Springfield, PA/Springfield)** also are back after earning second team and honorable mention honors, respectively.

WOOSTER

The way second year head coach Brenda Meese sees it, things have to get better for her team in 1991. Wooster (3-9; 5-11) struggled last spring, but four of the 11 losses were by two goals or less. One of the main reasons for Meese's optimism is that all seven of last season's top scorers will return this year.

The top returning scorer is junior **Martha Lange (Etna, NH/Hanover)**, a first team All West Region and second team All NCAC selection a year ago after scoring 42 goals and adding 12 assists. Joining Lange on the attack are senior **Minna Jinn (Brecksville, OH/Western Reserve)** and junior **Jen Mabie (Mahwah, NJ/Green Meadow)**. Jinn, who scored 38 goals and had five assists, was named first-team All-Region and was the team's only first-team All-Conference performer in 1990. Mabie, who had 33 goals and 10 assists, was a second-team All-NCAC selection. Senior **Maria Theophilis (Jamaica Plain, MA/Winsor)**, who missed most of the 1990 season with mononucleosis, and sophomore **Tammy Barnes (Elkins, NH/Kearsarge Regional)**, a second-team All-Conference honoree, also return.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Men's Tennis Preview

If the preseason polls are accurate, Kenyon College should prevail by a hair over The College of Wooster and win its first outright North Coast Athletic Conference men's tennis championship. Kenyon, which placed fourth at the 1990 NCAC Championships after compiling a best-ever overall record of 14-11, is ranked 14th in the Volvo Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches of America (ITCA) preseason poll. Wooster, which captured its first outright North Coast title a year ago after sharing the crown in 1985 (with Denison University) and 1989 (with Denison and Kenyon), is ranked 15th by the ITCA. Whether or not those rankings will hold true throughout the season, of course, remains to be seen.

Although unranked nationally and thought by some to be facing a rebuilding year, Denison, which finished second last season, can never be discounted in North Coast action. The Big Red have netted at least a share of five of the six NCAC titles. Oberlin College, with two All-Americans returning to a solid squad that went 20-9 and placed third in the Conference a year ago, also will be a major factor. Allegheny College and Wittenberg University will be looking to break from the middle of the pack and challenge, while Ohio Wesleyan University, Case Western Reserve University and Earlham College also hope to make their presence felt.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

With his top three seeds intact and a talented freshman class joining the squad, seventh year head coach Mark Fleming believes his Gators should improve on their 11-10 record and sixth-place NCAC finish of a year ago. Junior **Doug Rohner** (Mt. Laurel, NJ/Lenape), a second-team All-Conference performer last season, returns to the #1 slot for a third consecutive campaign. Junior **Glenn Diamond** (Hollywood, FL/Escola Rio de Janeiro), who hopes to regain his 1989 All-NCAC form, will play second singles after finishing 10-10 at #3 last year. Rounding out the trio of returning veterans is senior **Matt Michalski** (Williamsville, NY/St. Joseph's), one of only two seniors on this year's squad. Michalski will play at #3 singles after having earned Allegheny's Most Valuable Player award with a 12-9 record at the #2 spot in 1990.

CASE RESERVE

What a difference a year makes! This time last season, head coach Jon Hall had only one letterman on a squad of 13. This year's team features much more experience -- Hall is in his second season as coach and seven letterwinners appear on the 15-man roster -- leaving everyone optimistic about the Spartans' ability to improve upon a 5-9 record and an eighth-place finish at the NCAC Championships. In addition to the returnees, two new players are expected to make immediate contributions -- freshman **Razlan Nizaruddin** (K.L. Malaysia) will start the season at #1 singles and will team with sophomore **Joe Dea** (Mayfield Heights, OH/Mayfield) at #1 doubles, while junior **Dave Caldwell** (Norwalk, OH/Norwalk), who sat out last season due to illness, will compete with his #2 doubles partner, sophomore **Chris Selan** (Wickliffe, OH/Wickliffe), for the second and third singles spots.

DENISON

After five years of winning (or sharing) NCAC titles, the Big Red relinquished the crown to Wooster last year, dropping a 5-2 decision to the Scots in the championship finals after storming through the regular season with a record of 21-6 overall and a 7-0 mark against Conference foes. The scenario could be quite different in Granville this year, as new head coach Peter Burling inherits a squad that has lost its top three players. In order to reclaim the North Coast crown, Denison's underclassmen must be ready to play at elevated heights. The Big Red's fortunes will depend heavily upon three returning lineup players -- sophomore **Brian Maebius** (San Antonio, TX/Alamo Heights), a second-team All-NCAC performer last year at #1 doubles; sophomore **Eric Getzinger** (Toledo, OH/St. John's), who had a 15-5 overall slate and was the Conference's second-rated player at #4 singles; and senior captain **Jaan Douma** (Kalamazoo, MI/Central), who was 15-4 overall and ranked second in the NCAC at #6 singles. Denison also will look for contributions from junior newcomer **Dave Fleming** (Newark, OH/Silver (NM)) and for improved play from juniors **Will Knox** (Erie, PA/Erie Academy) and **Matt Watson** (Orchard Park, NY/Orchard Park).

EARLHAM

The Quakers, who struggled to a 1-10 record in 1990, will feature experience at the first three singles positions and then rely on freshmen down the rest of the lineup in an attempt to turn things around this season. Second year head coach Pat Williams' squad has only six players, so injury or illness could play a major role. Key to Earlham's rebuilding plans is its 1990 Most Valuable Player, junior **David Young** (Portland, IN/Jay County), who compiled a 4-7 mark last season at #1 singles. Junior **Jeff Keller** (Wakefield, RI/South Kingston) is expected to move up to #2 singles, while senior **Eric Patel** (River Forest, IL/River Forest) will once again swing his racquet in the #3 spot. Freshman **Stephen Stoneburner** (Greensboro, NC/Grimsley), a ranked player in North Carolina last year, will start at #4 singles, but could challenge for a higher position as the season progresses.

KENYON

Most teams would be delighted to have compiled a 14-11 overall record and placed fourth in a conference as competitive as the NCAC. But Kenyon, while pleased with last season's win-loss mark, hopes to peak during tournament time this year and net its first outright NCAC championship after sharing the title with Wooster and Denison in 1989. Leading the charge for second-year head coach Paul Wardlaw's 14th-ranked squad will be junior **Bill Jonas** (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends), a first-team All-NCAC selection in singles and a second-team honoree in doubles in 1990. Junior **Devin Stauffer** (Kalamazoo, MI/Central), the 1989 NCAC champion at #4 singles who also earned second-team All-Conference honors in doubles last spring, is back, as are senior **David**

Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville) and junior **Greg Ganter (Larchmont, NY/Lyce Francais)**, who combined for a record of 11-5 at #3 doubles in 1990. In singles, Register was 18-7 at spots three through five last year, while Ganter was 22-3 in the fifth and sixth positions.

OBERLIN

Head coach Don Hunsinger returns for his ninth season at the Oberlin helm with his strongest team to date and realistic visions of an NCAC championship. In their title drive, the Yeomen will attempt to break the school record for victories in a season for the third consecutive year. In 1990, they compiled a record of 20-9 and placed third at the NCAC Tournament. Oberlin will be led by junior All-Americans **George Barth (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch)** and **Moustapha Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, who posted a 17-9 record at #1 doubles last year and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III Championships. Barth also advanced to the NCAA Championships in singles and finished the year with an 18-12 record at the #1 spot. Diop, meanwhile, finished the 1990 season with a 16-9 record in the #2 position. The ITCA preseason rankings have Barth 39th in the nation in singles and the Barth/Diop duo 10th in doubles. Two highly-touted freshmen with familiar surnames will also help to determine the Yeomen's fortunes. **Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)**, an Ohio high school state qualifier whose brother Erik was an All NCAC performer for Oberlin in 1989, and **Ousmane Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, the younger brother of Moustapha, will play at #3 and #4 singles, respectively.

OHIO WESLEYAN

Ohio Wesleyan head coach Gene Meliaffey likes his team's chances of improving upon last season's 6-11 record and seventh-place finish at the NCAC Championships. The Bishops have lost only one of last year's top five players and have added two talented freshmen. Leading the way will be senior **Bill DuBois (West Hartford, CT/Kingswood-Oxford)**, who returns to the #1 singles position he has held since his freshman year. DuBois, who teamed with the graduated Jim Croner to go 11-5, earn first-team All-NCAC honors and reach the NCAA Tournament at #1 doubles last year, will hook up with freshman **Luke Chapman (Portsmouth, OH/Portsmouth)** at that spot this spring. Chapman and fellow freshman **Brad Moore (Galion, OH/Galion)** hold down the #2 and #3 singles slots, respectively, while senior **Nick Johnson (Columbus, OH/St. Charles)** will play at #4 after going 8-7 in the third spot last year. Senior **Ed Brooks (Ambler, PA/Hathoro-Horsham)** returns at #5 singles after compiling an 8-5 mark -- the team's best singles record -- a year ago.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg's 1990 debut into North Coast tennis was not as smashing a success as head coach Ron Murphy had hoped. The Tigers, who had reigned atop the OAC for five consecutive years, finished last season 8-7 overall and in fifth place at the NCAC Championships. But Murphy, in his eighth year as head coach, feels confident of upward mobility in 1991. Wittenberg returns a strong nucleus of performers and should be improved if it can overcome the injuries that hampered its success last season. The leading returnee is sophomore **Martin Bulow (Gotheburg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))**, who is coming off a spectacular rookie campaign which saw him compile an 11-5 record and earn first-team All-NCAC honors -- he was the only freshman voted to the first team. Also back are seniors **Scott Russell (Kettering, OH/Alter)**, who should start at #2 singles, and **Tony Lloyd (Philadelphia, PA/Chestnut Hill)**, as well as junior **Todd Friend (Mansfield, OH/Senior)**.

WOOSTER

Wooster head coach Hayden Schilling's primary objective this year will be to find replacements for Steve Kuri and Adam Brewer, whose spectacular play led the Scots to their first outright NCAC title last season. Not an easy assignment, even for the reigning NCAC Coach of the Year. Kuri, who graduated, compiled a career record of 73-24 in singles and was a two-time All-America and the 1990 NCAC Player of the Year, while Brewer, who transferred to Emory, boasted a two-year slate of 45-10 and advanced to nationals in both seasons. Depth, however, is what wins in tennis and quality depth helped Wooster to a 21-6 record and a North Coast championship in 1990. That depth also has led to the Scots being ranked 15th in this year's ITCA Division III preseason poll. Expected to move into the #1 and #2 singles slots, respectively, are juniors **Dan Rosenbaum (Washington, DC/Field)** and **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)**. Rosenbaum owns a 39-10 collegiate record, including a 21-6 mark at #4 singles last year, while Fernandez was 41-13 in his first two seasons and 24-3 at the #5 spot last year. Juniors **Eric Hicks (Newark, NY/Senior)**, 11-9 at #6 singles last season, and **Bill Hoover (Canton, OH/Western Reserve)** also should find spots at the top of the lineup.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Women's Tennis Preview

Kenyon College bounds onto the courts this spring hoping to prove it has a smash, as well as a splash, that can be heard around the collegiate athletic world. Generally known for its swim dominance, Kenyon's women's tennis team also has developed a national reputation. This season, the Ladies are out to win their sixth consecutive North Coast Athletic Conference championship and earn a fifth straight trip to the NCAA Division III Tournament, where they placed 10th last year after finishing in the runner-up spot in 1988 and 1989. Kenyon is ranked eighth in the Volvo Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches' Association (ITCA) preseason poll.

Some of Kenyon's stiffest competition may come from within the NCAC, as seven of the nine squads had winning seasons in 1990. Perennial power Denison University, which has finished every North Coast season in the runner-up position, is ranked 15th nationally and is tired of always being the bridesmaid and never the bride. Another team intent on dethroning the Ladies is Oberlin College, which knows its team is better than the fifth-place 1990 Conference finish indicates and has its top six netters back and bent on proving this point. Wittenberg University, the surprise squad of a season ago, also returns its entire starting lineup and believes it is in grabbing range of the NCAC crown from its third-place 1990 standing. The College of Wooster, which has been steadily improving each year, also feels it is ready to move up from the fourth place spot it has anchored the last two campaigns. Allegheny College and Ohio Wesleyan University also hope to improve on their 1990 winning records, while Case Western Reserve University and Franklin College each shows definite signs of progress.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

A roster featuring six letterwinners who have each posted more than 20 career victories as well as a promising 8-3 fall season give seventh-year head coach Mark Fleming reason to believe that his Gators will surpass last year's 14-9 overall record and sixth place finish at the NCAC Championships. Key to the Gators' 1991 fortunes will be sophomore **Kristen Barclay** (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland), whose 10-6 play at #1 singles last season earned her Allegheny's Most Valuable Player award. Barclay's freshman success does not seem to be a case of beginner's luck, since she netted a 10-1 slate at the top seed this fall. Senior **Diane Cullen** (Frogmore, SC/Suffield) will move up to #2 singles after compiling an 8-6 record at #4 last spring. Sophomore **Pam Grabinski** (McKees Rocks, PA/Montour), who finished 1990 with a 10-4 mark at #4 singles, will fill the #3 slot this season, while sophomore **Kristen Kachurak** (McDonald, PA/South Fayette), senior **Jacki Rudolph** (Gibsonia, PA/Richland) and junior **Gayle Ishler** (Allison Park, PA/North Allegheny) figure to round out Allegheny's singles lineup.

CASE RESERVE

The season has just begun and Case Reserve has already posted a number of firsts. The Spartans made an inaugural spring trip and for the first time in recent memory feature the experience of a three-year letterwinner, senior **Sabitha Rajan** (Mansfield, OH/Lexington). These factors, along with the exciting addition of freshman **Victoria Terekhov** (Brooklyn, NY/Olympic Reserve), a native of the USSR who trained at a Soviet sports academy, give sixth-year head coach Nancy Gray confidence that her fast-maturing squad will show vast improvement from last season's 6-9 overall record and ninth-place NCAC finish. Terekhov has taken over the #1 singles spot held the past three seasons by Rajan, who will move to #2. Junior **Heather Graddock** (Allendale, NJ/Englewood) and sophomore **Jennifer Lewis** (Oklahoma City, OK/Putnam City North) figure to handle the #3 and #4 positions.

DENISON

Tenth year head coach Cathy Benton feels this year's squad possesses all the ingredients necessary to break Kenyon's string of five consecutive NCAC titles -- experience, depth and more experience. Denison, ranked 15th nationally in the ITCA preseason poll, is in the enviable position of having suffered no graduation losses; the entire team that went 16-7 and placed second in the NCAC (after a 5-4 loss to Kenyon in the championship finals) returns. Five All-Conference netters will lead the Big Red's title drive -- sophomore **Carey White** (Toledo, OH/Ottawa Hills), who was Denison's only first-team All-NCAC performer after going 15-5 at #2 singles a year ago; senior **Catly Taylor** (Racine, WI/Prairie), a second team selection in singles (16-4 at #5) and in doubles (13-5 at #2) while teaming with junior **Winnie Enloe** (Rome, GA/Darlington), who also garnered second-team singles honors; junior **Anne Williamson** (Little Rock, AR/Garrison Forest (MD)), who was 14-4 at #3 singles and was named second-team All-Conference for her play at #1 doubles with White; and sophomore **Katie Fowles** (Grand Island, NE/Senior), who earned second team honors after compiling a 14-1 mark at #6 singles.

EARLHAM

Second-year head coach Gail Delaney approaches the 1991 season with a sense of guarded optimism after the Quakers struggled in their first year of NCAC play with a record of 1-10 and an eighth-place finish in the Conference. Delaney is optimistic because she welcomes back three starters and has brought in an impressive group of recruits who should have an immediate impact. However, she is guarded because the squad is currently plagued with injuries. Freshman **Sue Trezvant** (Oak Park, IL/River Forest), a regionally-ranked player while in high school, will take over the #1 singles slot. Junior **Claire Poggenburg** (Sewanee, TN/St. Andrews) is slated to hold down the #2 singles position, while classmate **Mika Osakabe** (Hamamatsu, Japan/Seien), a ranked player in her native Japan, will join the Quakers at the #3 spot if she can recover from a preseason back injury. Junior **Holly Michaelson** (Chester Springs, PA/Westtown), who is suffering from shoulder problems, has been penciled into the #4 slot, while freshman **Kathy Stoffel** (Terre Haute, IN/West Vigo) and senior **Karen Hart** (Sewanee, TN/Franklin City) figure to complete the lineup if healthy.

NCAC Women's Tennis Preview-- 2

KENYON

Second-year head coach Paul Wardlaw is confident that Kenyon can win its sixth consecutive North Coast title and go on to make a serious run at the national championship. The Ladies, who posted a 20-7 record and placed 10th nationally a year ago, are ranked eighth in the ITCA preseason poll. Leading the way will be junior **Kathryn Lane** (Nashville, TN/St. Cecilia), a 1989 All-America who is ranked 16th nationally in singles after earning first-team All NCAC honors for her play at the #1 spot last spring. Lane also earned first team All Conference honors in doubles, splitting time with **Brennan Harbin** (Rome, Ga/Phillips (MA)) and **Lisa Weisman** (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)) -- both of whom are sophomores. The return of Weisman, who missed much of last year due to illness, will be a boost as she was the only NCAC player to go to the Rolex Regional Championships this fall. Junior **Stacy Bear** (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi), another first-team All-NCAC singles player from 1990, also is back, as are sophomores **Britt Harbin** (Rome, Ga/Phillips (MA)) and **Sara Fousekis** (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce).

OBERLIN

With the return of their top six singles players from 1990, the Yeowomen of ninth-year head coach Michelle Ennis expect to climb the NCAC ladder after posting an overall record of 12-11 and finishing fifth a year ago. The top racquet for Oberlin indisputably belongs to senior **Kavita Varma** (Chickasha, OK/Chickasha), who has a preseason ranking of 10th in Division III and who was named NCAC Player of the Year in 1989 and 1990. Varma will begin her fourth straight season at the #1 position this spring after compiling an impressive 22-2 mark last year and earning a second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid. In addition to her honors in singles, Varma was named to the North Coast's second team in doubles on the basis of an 11-7 record at the #1 slot with senior partner **Lynn Gardner** (Portola Valley, CA/Menlo-Atherton). Gardner also figures to handle the #2 spot in singles after going 10-10 from that position in 1990. Junior **Joyce Stickney** (Wheaton, IL/North) and sophomore **Anne Bather** (Maple Grove, MN/Breck) round out the Yeowomen's top four. Bather was 9-8 at #4 last season.

OHIO WESLEYAN

With five returning letterwinners and a trio of talented freshmen, Ohio Wesleyan head coach Margie Shade believes the Bishops should be able to improve two notches and finish in the North Coast's first division. Ohio Wesleyan had a solid 9-6 overall record in 1990, but closed with a disappointing seventh place finish at the NCAC Championships. Junior **Allison Plowman** (Little Rock, AR/Central), who has been the Bishops' top player her entire career, will return to the #1 singles slot. Freshman **Margie Schultz** (Media, OH/Medina) is expected to move into the #2 position, while senior **Carrie Bond** (Pittsburgh, PA/Upper St. Clair), a standout doubles player who has seen only limited singles action, swings from the #3 spot. Senior **Becki Broman** (Snyder, NY/Amherst Senior) and junior **Kelli Kitchen** (Twinsburg, OH/Chamberlin) also return.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg's first North Coast campaign was quite successful, resulting in a third-place finish at the NCAC Championships and a 9-4 overall record. With a veteran team returning, eighth year head coach Dotty Lemieux expects to do just as well, if not better, this season. Leading the way for the Tigers will be sophomore sensation **Sheryl Myers** (Dublin, OH/Watterson), who, in her first year of intercollegiate tennis, went 8-5 at #1 singles and was named first team All NCAC. Myers also earned first team All NCAC honors in doubles, where she teamed with senior **Mendy Wells** (Springfield, OH/Shawnee) for a 7-3 mark at the top spot. Wells also went 8-5 at #2 singles to garner second-team All NCAC recognition. Other top returnees include sophomore **Beth Ann Young** (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington), senior **Kappy Boudeman** (Richmond, MI/Gull Lake) and junior **Holly Boyd** (Akron, OH/Firestone).

WOOSTER

Three consecutive winning seasons, with an improved record each year, have brought added respect and recognition for Wooster and fourth year head coach Chris Hart. Although Hart must replace three key players from last year's squad, which finished fourth at the NCAC Championships after compiling an overall record of 14-8, she will have a number of strong returnees around which to build her team. Sophomore **Liz Richards** (Northfield, IL/New Trier), a first-team All-NCAC selection in singles after going 12-6 at #1 last season, should lead the way again this year. Other key returnees include senior **Shannon Day** (Bloomfield Hills, MI/Kingswood-Oxford (CT)), who was 11-5 at #6 singles last year, junior **Helen Shepard** (Paducah, KY/Firestone (OH)), who was 10-5 at #4 and 15-7 overall, and senior **Katherine Fleming** (Washington, DC/Sidwell Friends), who was 8-7 overall.

NCAC Spring Sports Update
SPRING SEASON IN FULL SWING AS EIGHT
NORTH COAST SPORTS BEGIN PLAY

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Denison (4-0; 8-4) has jumped out to early lead in the NCAC, but Ohio Wesleyan (5-1; 9-4-1) would appear to be in the driver's seat after taking three of four from Wooster (3-3; 10-4) over the weekend. The Bishops won the first three games of the series, with junior righthander **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)** picking up the save in each game. Junior third baseman **George Powell (Westerville, OH/North)** was 6-12 with a double and a home run in the four-game set to lead the Ohio Wesleyan offense. Wooster avoided the sweep with an 8-6 win in game four. Senior lefthander **Mark Bricker (Wooster, OH/Wooster)**, 3-0 on the year, was the winner for the Scots after allowing just three hits and one earned run in five and two-thirds innings.

Wittenberg (2-2; 8-3) and Allegheny (2-2; 3-8) split their season-opening series, with each team winning one game on Friday and Saturday. Junior first baseman **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** slammed a home run, his third of the year, and had nine runs batted in over the four games to pace Wittenberg, while Allegheny was led by senior lefthander **Dave Weimer (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline)**, who started both ends of Friday's doubleheader and allowed just two earned runs in 10 innings of work. Weimer was the winner in game one, going five innings and allowing two runs on just two hits. He then came back to start the second game and went five more innings and did not allow an earned run before departing without a decision.

Elsewhere in the North Coast over the weekend, Case Reserve (3-3; 4-10) took three of four from Oberlin (1-3; 1-9) and Kenyon (2-4; 2-12) took both games of its rain-shortened series with Earlham (0-4; 2-10). Denison, which had the NCAC bye, built its 4-0 league record with a sweep of Kenyon on Mar. 23-24. The Big Red will be at Wooster to headline this weekend's Conference schedule. Allegheny will travel to Oberlin, Case Reserve will be at Ohio Wesleyan and Kenyon will host Wittenberg in the remaining four-game sets.

GOLF REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan placed three individuals in the top eight to win the 10-team Refrigerator Open at Wooster, Mar. 30. The Bishops totaled 315 for 18 holes to outdistance runner-up Kenyon by nine strokes. Wooster's "Gold" squad tied for third with Walsh at 330, while the Scots' "Black" team finished sixth at 333. Denison (338) and Case Reserve (358) also competed and finished seventh and ninth, respectively.

The NCAC's top individual was Ohio Wesleyan senior **Barry Pry (Findlay, OH/Findlay)**, who placed second overall with a four-over par 76. Denison junior **Steve Buecking (Barrington, IL/Barrington)**, Kenyon senior **Andrew Art (Williamstown, MA/Mount Greylock)** and Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Brad Garrett (Beaver Falls, PA/Blackhawk)** were part of a four-way tie for third at 77, while Wooster junior **Paul Wagstaff (Carmel, CA/Carmel)** and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Matt Roth (Sidney, OH/Sidney)** tied for seventh with 78s. This week, the majority of the NCAC activity will be in either the Muskingum (Apr. 5-6) or Hiram (Apr. 6) Invitationals.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Wins by Ohio Wesleyan (1-0; 3-3), Denison (1-0; 3-3) and Oberlin (1-1; 2-1) highlighted the first week of NCAC action. Ohio Wesleyan, ranked sixth in Division III by the USILA, beat Kenyon (0-2; 1-4) 15-3 in its North Coast opener on Wednesday before taking an 18-11 decision from eighth-ranked Washington & Lee on Saturday. Junior **Bill Bishop (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** had four goals and two assists against Kenyon, while senior **Mike Arfin (Suffern, NY/Suffern)** had five goals and two assists and senior goalie **Rich Flynn (Williston Park, NY/Mineola)** had 18 saves to lead the way against Washington & Lee. Of the Bishops' three losses this spring, two have come against Division I competition (Loyola and Penn St.) and the other to third-ranked Gettysburg.

Denison, ranked 12th in the nation, got past Oberlin 16-11 on Wednesday before falling to 16th-ranked Roanoke, 12-5, on Saturday. Two of the Big Red's three losses have come against ranked opponents (Gettysburg was the other). Oberlin, meanwhile, came back from its loss to Denison to edge Kenyon on Saturday by an 8-6 score. The win was the Yeomen's first over the Lords in the NCAC's seven seasons. Junior **Darren Bosch (Spring Valley, NJ/Green Meadow)** was the offensive star against Kenyon with three goals and two assists, while freshman **Alex Graf (Newcastle, ME/Northfield Mt. Herman)** stopped 15 shots in goal.

This week's North Coast schedule has Denison at Wittenberg (0-0; 0-0) and Ohio Wesleyan at Oberlin on Wednesday, Apr. 3. Wooster (0-0; 6-0), off to its best start ever and ranked 17th in the nation, hosts Ohio State on Saturday in its only game. The Scots won twice last week, 20-7 over Marietta and 13-12 in overtime over Hamilton. Ohio Wesleyan goes on the road to face 11-time defending national champion Hobart on Saturday to headline the week's non-conference action.

NCAC Spring Sports Update..... Add One

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (2-0; 2-1) began defense of its NCAC crown with a pair of wins last week. The Big Red, who have won all six North Coast championships, defeated Earlham 17-7 on Wednesday before edging Ohio Wesleyan 8-7 on Saturday. Junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)**, back in the lineup after missing the entire 1990 season with a knee injury, has fired in 14 goals to pace Denison. She also has 4 assists and leads the Conference in scoring with an average of 6.0 points per game.

Kenyon (1-0; 1-2) has the other NCAC win to date, a 12-4 decision over Wooster (0-1; 0-1). Freshman **Cary Loomis (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan)** and sophomore **Melissa Wood (Devon, PA/Baldwin)** had five goals apiece to pace the Ladies in that game. Loomis is third in the North Coast scoring race with an average of 3.3 goals per game. Ohio Wesleyan also cracked the win column last week with a 9-4 victory against Slippery Rock. Senior **Kendall Brewer (Chattanooga, TN/Brimmer & May)** had four goals to pace the Bishops.

The NCAC schedule hits full stride this week with eight games on tap.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Six of the nine NCAC squads have begun 1991 with winning overall records. Perennial Conference powerhouses Denison (1-0; 5-2) and Kenyon (1-0; 7-3) share the early lead. The Big Red, which had netted at least a share of every NCAC title until finishing second last season, ran their two-year NCAC undefeated string to eight games with a 7-2 victory over Wittenberg last week. The Lords, ranked 14th nationally in the Volvo Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association's preseason poll, began the season slowly at 0-3, but have won seven in a row, one short of their best 1990 winning streak. Kenyon has been led so far by senior **David Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville)**, who sports a Conference best #1 singles record of 6-2.

Reigning NCAC champion Wooster, ranked 15th in the ITCA poll, is also in high gear with a 7-2 slate. Wielding strong racquets for the Scots, who will face their first Conference opponents Apr. 5-6 at the Ohio-Indiana Tournament at Wabash College, have been junior **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)**, who owns the NCAC's second-best #1 singles mark at 5-4, and freshman **Warren Cham-A-Koon (Great Falls, MT/Great Falls)**, who leads the #2 slot with a 4-1 record. An early-season surprise has been the play of Ohio Wesleyan (0-0; 4-0) and Case Reserve (0-1; 4-1), who are already just two wins and one win, respectively, shy of their victory totals of a year ago. Making the difference for the Bishops have been freshmen **Brad Moore (Galion, OH/Galion)**, who is a perfect 4-0 at #3 singles, and senior **Ed Brooks (Ambler, PA/Hatboro Horsham)**, who is 4-0 at #5. The Spartans have performers with undefeated records -- sophomores **Chris Selan (Wickliffe, OH/Wickliffe)**, 3-0 at #4, and **Sheriff Sahadulla (Ras Tanura, Saudi Arabia/Kodaikanal International)**, 4-0 at #6.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Denison has bounded onto the courts like a team in mid-season form, compiling an early record of 5-1 as it attempts to unseat perennial NCAC champion Kenyon (1-0; 3-3). The Big Red, ranked 15th nationally in the ITCA preseason poll, have finished each of the six North Coast seasons as runners-up to the Ladies. Denison looks very balanced this season, having a player among the top three in six of the nine positions. Denison has three netters with unblemished record thus far -- sophomore **Katie Fowles (Grand Island, NE/Senior)**, who is atop #6 singles with a 4-0 mark; senior **Cathy Taylor (Racine, WI/Prairie)**, who is 4-0 at #3 singles; and freshman **Hallie King (Cazenovia, NY/Berkshire (MA))**, with a similar mark at #5. Kenyon, ranked eighth by the ITCA, is trying for its seventh consecutive Conference crown and sixth straight trip to the NCAA Championships, where it placed 10th last year and second in both 1988 and 1989. The Ladies have seized early control of three positions with 5-0 slates -- sophomores **Sara Fousekis (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce)** and **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** lead #4 and #5 singles, respectively, while classmates **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** and **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** are atop #2 doubles.

Allegheny (0-0; 10-6) and Case Reserve (0-0; 5-2) look as if they will make serious runs at the NCAC's first division. The Spartans will try to surpass their 1990 victory total of six when they meet Earlham and Ohio Wesleyan Apr. 6 in Delaware. The top player for the Gators has been sophomore **Kristen Barclay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland)**, who leads #1 singles play with a 13-3 slate, while sophomore **Jennifer Lewis (Oklahoma City, OK/Putnam City North)** has keyed the Spartans' fortunes with a 5-0 mark at #3.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: A total of 10 NCAC squads were involved in two meets over the holiday weekend. Ohio Wesleyan swept the men's and women's fields at a quadrangular event in Delaware on Friday, Mar. 29, while Kenyon, Earlham and Wittenberg placed third, fourth and fifth, respectively, in the men's and women's fields at the Earlham Invitational on Saturday.

The Ohio Wesleyan men won nine of 15 events to total 71 points in beating Ohio Northern (52), Baldwin-Wallace (30) and Heidelberg (6). On the women's side, the Bishops claimed seven of 14 events and totaled 78 points to top Baldwin-Wallace (32), Heidelberg (28) and Ohio Northern (22). Ohio Wesleyan qualified two individuals for the NCAA Championships at the meet. Senior **Juli Althoff (Sylvania, OH/Northview)** cleared 5' 5 1/4" to win the high jump and qualify for nationals, while junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))**, the defending Division III indoor and outdoor champion in the shot put, took that event and surpassed the qualifying standard with a throw of 55' 8 1/2". Junior **Doug Pierson (Great Falls, VA/Ridgewood)** won the long jump (20' 6 1/2") and triple jump (41' 7") for the men, while senior **Kelly McNamara (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park)** took the 100 hurdles (15.8) and 400 hurdles (66.6) for the women.

At the Earlham Invitational, Kenyon sophomore **Kelley Wilder (Victor, NY/Victor)** led the women with first-place finishes in the 1500 (5:03.8) and 800 (2:29.0). Kenyon senior **Ken Cole (Boardman, OH/Boardman)** was the top performer in the men's field with a first in the triple jump (43' 1 1/2") and seconds in the high jump (6' 0") and the 400 hurdles (57.3).

**WITTENBERG'S BROWN, OHIO WESLEYAN'S KAISER
NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Wittenberg University's **Jeff Brown** (Springfield, OH/North) and Ohio Wesleyan University's **Greg Kaiser** (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton) have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Brown, a junior first baseman, was 6-13 (.461) with a home run and nine runs batted in as Wittenberg split a four-game weekend series with Allegheny. On the year, Brown leads the NCAC in batting average (.500) and is at or near the top in doubles (5), home runs (3), runs batted (17) and runs scored (13). The Tigers are 8-3 overall and 2-2 in the North Coast.

Kaiser, a junior righthander, picked up saves in each of Ohio Wesleyan's three wins against Wooster over the weekend. He also threw two innings of scoreless relief to close out the Bishops' 8-1 victory against Division I Ohio on Wednesday. In four and two-thirds innings on the week, Kaiser did not allow a run and gave up only two hits, while striking out five. He is 1-0 on the year with five saves (ties Ohio Wesleyan's single-season and career records). The Bishops are 9-4-1 overall and 5-1 in the NCAC.

TIDAL WAVE: Kenyon continued its dominance of Division III swimming this winter, capturing its 12th consecutive men's championship and its eighth straight women's title on back-to-back weekends in mid-March. Head coach **Jim Steen** has led the Lords and Ladies to all 20 championships, giving him more national crowns than any other coach in NCAA (any sport, any division) history. Kenyon also is the first school in NCAA history to win 12 consecutive national championships in any sport. The Lords had been tied for the all-division record with Hobart, which has won 11 straight in Division III men's lacrosse.... As has become tradition, a number of NCAC schools kept Kenyon company atop the national leaderboard. In the women's event, Allegheny was fourth, followed by Denison in seventh, Wooster in 16th and Ohio Wesleyan in 20th. Allegheny has been in the top five in three of the last four years and Denison has been in the top 10 for five straight seasons. In addition, it is the second time in five years that the NCAC has placed five women's teams in the top 20. On the men's side, Denison was fifth, followed by Allegheny in 12th and Oberlin in 23rd. Denison has been in the national top 10 in each of the NCAC's seven seasons, while Allegheny has posted five top 20 finishes in that span.

DYNAMIC DUO: Wittenberg's **Brad Baldrige** (Dublin, OH/Dublin) and Oberlin's **Ann Gilbert** (Elyria, OH/Elyria) have been named NCAA Division III Men's and Women's Basketball Players of the Year, respectively. Baldrige, a 6-9 senior center and a three-time All-America, averaged 20.1 points and 10.2 rebounds during the Tigers' 26-3 season. The two-time NCAC Player of the Year ended his career with 1,852 points and 1,030 rebounds, both second in Wittenberg history.... It is the second time an NCAC man has earned the award, Ohio Wesleyan's Scott Tedder was honored in the 1987-88 season.... Gilbert, a 5-5 senior guard and a two-time All-America, averaged 31.2 points per game this season as Oberlin posted its best record ever at 13-11. The two-time NCAC Player of the Year averaged 31.1 points per game last year and is one of only two Division III women to average over 30 points a game twice in a career.

GLOBETROTTING: Ohio Wesleyan men's soccer coach **Jay Martin** is one of five soccer coaches in the United States selected to join an exchange program with the Dutch National team this spring. Martin will visit Holland for 10 days in April, meeting national coach Thijs Libregts and getting involved with the Dutch team's training for games and European Cup matches. Martin has compiled a record of 225-49-23 (.796) in 14 seasons at Ohio Wesleyan and his teams have made 13 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a national second-place finish in 1990.

CLEVELAND, OH -- The 1990-91 season has been an outstanding one for the North Coast Athletic Conference in a number of ways. Allegheny College began the year by winning the national championship in football and, over the winter, Kenyon College continued its dominance in Division III swimming by taking its 12th and eighth consecutive men's and women's crowns, respectively. Those three national championships give the North Coast a total of 16 in its seven seasons.

In addition, Allegheny's **Ken O'Keefe** has been named Division III Coach of the Year in football, while Kenyon's **Mike Pilger** and **Jim Steen** have earned the award in men's soccer and women's swimming, respectively.

NCAC Spring Sports Update

NCAC COMPETITION HEATS UP WITH THE WEATHER;
OHIO WESLEYAN MEN'S LACROSSE DROPS HOBART

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (9-1; 14-5-1) will have a chance to solidify its hold on first place this week as it hosts Wittenberg (6-2; 12-5) in a four-game set on Saturday and Sunday, Apr. 13-14. Wittenberg is currently tied for second in the NCAC with Allegheny (6-2; 9-8), two games behind the Bishops. Allegheny is home for four games this weekend against Kenyon, while fourth-place Wooster (7-3; 14-5) has the Conference bye.

Sweeps were the name of the game last week as each of the North Coast's top four teams made it through the weekend's four contests without a stumble. Ohio Wesleyan took the measure of Case Reserve (3-7; 4-16); Wittenberg knocked off Kenyon (2-8; 2-16); Allegheny defeated Oberlin (1-7; 1-15); and Wooster got past Denison (4-4; 9-8). Wittenberg continues to lead the NCAC in hitting (.356) and scoring (9.2 rpg), while Wooster is on top in pitching (2.93 ERA) and fielding (.954). Allegheny and Wooster are the only teams in the top four in all four team categories.

Individually, Wittenberg junior **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** kept up his torrid pace last week and continues to lead the circuit in hitting (.518), home runs (8) and runs batted in (29). Brown, a left-handed hitting first baseman, was 12-22 (.545) with five home runs and seven RBI in six games. Denison junior **Steve Schott (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit)** is second in the NCAC batting race at .444, followed by Wittenberg junior **Chris Tillotson (Glenview, IL/Glenbrook)** at .419 and Case Reserve junior **Ken Holloway (St. Clairsville, OH/St. Clairsville)** at .418. Junior righthanders **Gerry Sagerman (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** of Wooster and **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)** of Ohio Wesleyan have been the top pitchers to date. Sagerman is 2-2 with a Conference-leading 1.42 earned run average and a dazzling 21/1 strikeout:walk ratio, while Kaiser is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA and seven saves, just one short of the NCAC single-season record.

GOLF REPORT: The North Coast's top five teams dominated a pair of events over the weekend, with Ohio Wesleyan leading four NCAC finishers in the top five at the 16-team Muskingum Invitational on Friday and Saturday, Apr. 5-6, and an Allegheny split squad taking the championship at the nine-team Hiram Invitational on Saturday.

At Muskingum, Ohio Wesleyan's 36-hole total of 601 was good enough to win the event for the second consecutive season. Wooster shot a fine 604 to place second, while Wittenberg was fourth at 613 and Kenyon fifth at 618. Denison (653) also competed in the event and placed 12th. Individually, Ohio Wesleyan senior **Barry Pry (Findlay, OH/Findlay)** carded a two-over par 146 to earn medalist honors and lead four Bishops in the top 10. Pry was joined at the top of the leaderboard by Wooster junior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)**, who tied for second at 148, and Kenyon senior **Alex Hinrichs (Houston, TX/St. John's)**, who was fifth at 149. Hinrichs scorched the par-72 Cambridge Country Club layout for a course-record 69 in the second round.

Allegheny's "Blue" squad shot 317 to set the pace at the Hiram Invitational, winning by 10 strokes over the host Terriers and Division II Ashland. Allegheny "Gold" recorded a 331 to finish fifth, while Case Reserve had a 342 to place sixth. Gator junior **Jim Swanson (Millersville, PA/Millersville)** was the medalist after shooting a 76.

Six of the eight NCAC squads will be in action this week at Wooster's Parlor Invitational on Friday and Saturday. Division II Ferris State edged Ohio Wesleyan to win the prestigious event last spring. Allegheny will be the only top NCAC squad missing from the Wooster field. The Gators will travel east this weekend to take part in the Penn State Tournament on Saturday and Sunday.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Three North Coast teams reside in the latest (Apr. 8) USILA Division III poll, led by Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 5-3) in the second position. The Bishops, who received one of 11 first-place votes (Hobart got the other 10), had been in a tie for fifth in the poll before edging 11-time defending national champ Hobart, 18-17, on Saturday, Apr. 6. Denison (2-0; 5-4) is ranked 16th and Wooster (0-0; 6-1), off to one of its best starts ever, is 19th.

Ohio Wesleyan built a three goal lead over Hobart midway through the fourth quarter and withstood a last-minute rally to defeat the Statesmen for the third time in the last five meetings. Senior **Rich Franz (Hamburg, NY/Nichols)** led the Bishops with four goals and an assist. Ohio Wesleyan got six goals from senior **Greg Sullivan (Scarsdale, NY/Scarsdale)** in a 21-10 triumph over Oberlin (1-2; 3-2) earlier in the week.

Denison took two of three games last week, including an 18-5 victory against NCAC rival Wittenberg (0-1; 0-3) on Apr. 3. Kenyon (0-2; 3-4), which had lost four of its first five, came back with a pair of wins last week, 16-9 over Marietta and 7-2 over St. Bonaventure. Junior **John Carpenter (Towaco, NY/Montville Township)** had the hot stick for the Lords with five goals and an assist in the two games. Oberlin drubbed St. Vincent (17-1), Ohio State topped Wooster (13-7) and Lake Forest stopped Wittenberg (14-8) in other action last week.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (3-0; 4-2) holds a slim one-half game lead over Ohio Wesleyan (3-1; 4-1) and Kenyon (3-1; 3-3) in what is shaping up to be an exciting race. Denison, which has won all six NCAC women's lacrosse titles, will be tested this week at Kenyon on Wednesday and Wittenberg (1-1; 2-4) on Thursday. The Big Red come home after that difficult road swing to face Wooster (1-2; 1-2) Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan's only contest of the week is at home against Earlham (0-3; 0-4) on Thursday, while Kenyon also is in action at Wittenberg on Saturday.

Ohio Wesleyan was the Conference's big winner last week, topping three NCAC opponents. Freshman **Jessica Battle (Potomac, MD/Holy Child)** led the Bishops with 10 goals and two assists in the three games. Battle exploded for seven goals in an important 16-12 victory against Kenyon, Apr. 4. Denison junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** has 24 goals and six assists and leads the NCAC with an average of 5.0 points per game. Earlham sophomore **Fin Lehman (Spring City, PA/Kimberton Waldorf)** is second with an average of 4.3 points per game. Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Katy Anderson (Greenwich, CT/Hotchkiss)** leads the way in goal with a .702 saves percentage.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan continues to be the surprise of the 1991 season with the only undefeated record among NCAC teams. The Bishops won three more times last week to increase their overall slate to a sparkling 7-0. Keying Ohio Wesleyan's early-season fortunes have been freshman **Brad Moore (Galion, OH/Galion)** and senior **Ed Brooks (Ambler, PA/Hatboro Horsham)**, neither of whom has lost a match yet this year. Moore is 7-0 to lead #3 singles and 7-0 with senior partner **Nick Johnson (Columbus, OH/St. Charles)** at #2 doubles, while Brooks leads the way at #5 singles with the same 7-0 mark.

Kenyon (8-3) equaled its longest 1990 winning streak of eight games last week with a 5-4 victory against Oberlin. Reigning North Coast champion Wooster (9-2) kept pace with a pair of victories, while Denison (7-3) won twice and lost once. Wittenberg (4-1) finished its first full week of action with impressive wins over Allegheny (2-7), Oberlin (7-5) and Case Reserve (4-2). Wittenberg sophomore **Martin Bulow (Gotheburg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))** leads #1 singles with a 4-1 mark, followed closely by Kenyon senior **David Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville)** at 7-2 and Oberlin junior **George Barth (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch)** at 8-3. Wooster freshman **Warren Cham A Koon (Great Falls, MT/Great Falls)** leads #2 singles with a 6-1 slate, while Oberlin freshman **Ousmane Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))** has the best mark at #4 at 9-1.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Defending NCAC champion Kenyon (7-3), ranked eighth in the nation in the ITCA preseason poll, continued to flex its muscles last week, beating Division I Bowling Green, 5-4, for the first time ever and claiming the Great Lakes Colleges Association title with outstanding wins over Wooster, 8-1, DePaul, 5-1, and Denison, 9-0. Ohio Wesleyan (7-2) also added four victories to its win column last week, including a first ever triumph over Wright State. Before falling to Kenyon, Denison (7-2) scored two wins at the GLCA Tournament, beating always-tough Kalamazoo and Albion. In another significant GLCA match, Oberlin (8-8) defeated Wooster (2-4), 7-2. Away from the GLCA, Case Reserve (7-4) overpowered Cleveland State, 9-0, and Allegheny (12-6) scored a pair of wins against Division I competition, beating Youngstown State, 9-0, and Pittsburgh, 6-3.

Individually, Allegheny sophomore **Kristen Barclay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland)** sits atop #1 singles with a 14-4 record, followed closely by Oberlin senior **Kavita Varma (Chickasha, OK/Chickasha)** at 10-5; Denison junior **Anne Williamson (Little Rock, AR/Garrison Forest (MD))** leads #2 singles at 5-1; Case Reserve sophomore **Jennifer Lewis (Oklahoma City, OK/Putnam City North)** wields a 6-0 racquet at #3; Kenyon sophomore **Sara Fousekis (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce)** is first at #4 with a 5-1 slate; Kenyon sophomore **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** is a perfect 9-0 to lead the way at #5; and Denison sophomore **Katie Fowles (Grand Island, NE/Senior)** leads #6 with a 6-1 mark. In doubles, the Kenyon #2 tandem of sophomores **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** and **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** is 7-0.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: North Coast squads participated in five different meets last weekend as the outdoor season kicked into high gear. The Denison women left Kenyon and Wittenberg in the dust to win the Denison Invitational. The Big Red scored 112.5 points to 49 for the Ladies and 21.5 for the Tigers. The Denison men won just as handily, claiming first by a 124 point margin and winning 16 of 18 events. Chief among the Big Red heroes were senior **Terry Smith (Gary, IN/Roosevelt)**, who qualified for nationals in the long jump (23' 10 3/4") and also won the triple jump (44' 4") and the 100 (10.97); senior **Mark Kapostasy (Gibsonburg, OH/Gibsonburg)**, who qualified for nationals in the javelin (165' 4"); and senior **Rob Schubert (Chesterhill, OH/Chesterhill)**, who won the shot (39' 4") and discus (128' 8"). Both Case Reserve's squads joined the Kenyon men at the non-scoring Mount Union Invitational. Spartan freshman **Marc Anderson (Alliance, OH/Alliance)** became the second NCAC shot putter to qualify for the NCAA Championships with a heave of 51' 5 1/2". Senior **Chris Fedele (Euclid, OH/St. Joseph)** brought home the gold for Case Reserve in the 110 high hurdles (14.9), while Kenyon senior **Joe Youngblood (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier)** copped a first in the 200 (23.3). Earlham's men ran third of six and the women ran fourth of five at the Anderson Invitational. Freshman **Shannon Ferguson (Coatesville, IN/Cascade)** came in third with school-record performances in the long (14' 11 3/4") and high jump (4'10") to lead the way. Allegheny's men and women both came in second in fields of four at the Ithaca Invitational, Apr. 6. Sophomore **Stan Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** set a Gator record while winning the 200 (22.3) and classmate **Fletcher Brooks (Simsbury, CT/Westminster)** outdistanced all competitors in the shot (47' 10"). First-place finishers among the Gator women included senior **Lynda Kohl (Cedar Knolls, NJ/St. Elizabeth)** in both the 1500 (4:49.2) and the 3000 (10:20.6), junior **Alyce Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River)** in the 800 (2:27.4), freshman **Shawna Harrison (Stratford, CT/Bunnell)** in the 5000 (20:27.7) and junior **Carey Boyce (New Manchester, WV/Oak Glen)** in the shot (32' 3/4"). Ohio Wesleyan's men and women posted victories at home quadrangulars. The Bishop men won five events, the women 11.

NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Ohio Wesleyan University's **Mark Glaser (Westerville, OH/North)** and The College of Wooster's **Gerry Sagerman (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Glaser, a senior outfielder, compiled an incredible .704 (19-27) on-base percentage as Ohio Wesleyan won five of six games on the week. He batted .556 (10-18), walked five times and was hit by pitch four times. In addition, he was a perfect 11-11 in stolen bases and scored 11 runs. During the Bishops' four-game sweep of NCAC rival Case Reserve, Glaser was 6-8 from the plate and reached base 14 of 16 times, scoring nine runs and stealing eight bases. He leads Ohio Wesleyan in hitting (.364), runs scored (24) and stolen bases (17). The Bishops are 14-5-1 overall and in first place in the NCAC with a 9-1 mark.

Sagerman, a junior righthander, allowed just one unearned run as Wooster defeated Denison 5-1 in game three of the Scots' four-game weekend sweep. He struck out four and allowed eight hits and one walk in upping his record to 2-2. Sagerman also improved his NCAC-leading earned run average to 1.42. In addition, he has an outstanding strikeout to walk ratio of 21/1 in 25 and one third innings pitched. Wooster is 14-5 overall and in fourth place in the Conference at 7-3.

DIAMOND DANDYS: Wittenberg junior **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** was 12-22 (.545) with five home runs and 12 runs batted in as the Tigers won four of six games last week. He currently has a seven-game hitting streak and leads the NCAC in average (.518), home runs (8) and runs batted in (29).... Ohio Wesleyan stopper **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)** had another outstanding week, earning his second win to go with saves six and seven. The junior righthander pitched eight innings on the week, striking out eight and allowing no earned runs to lower his ERA to 1.54.... Wooster's **Tom Flynn (Youngstown, OH/Mooney)**, a senior centerfielder, was 8-16 as the Scots won four of five games. He scored six runs, had three stolen bases and reached base 12 times in 20 plate appearances.... Wooster senior righthander **Jason Weiner (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)** improved his record to 5-1 with a complete game five-hitter against Denison. He struck out five, walked none and allowed only one earned run.... Allegheny junior **Jim Huston (Youngstown, OH/Boardman)** hit .435 (10-23) with three doubles, two home runs and 12 RBI to lead the Gators to six straight victories last week.

DENISON NAMES AD: Denison has announced that **Larry Scheiderer** will become the school's first Director of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation. In the newly created position, Scheiderer will oversee all facets of Denison's curricular program in the department of physical education, as well as co-curricular programs in intercollegiate athletics, intramurals, club sports and general student recreation. He has been chair of the department of health and sport sciences at Capital University for the past five years and the school's director of athletics for the past four years. A 1977 graduate of Ohio University with a bachelor of science in education, Scheiderer holds a master's degree in health education from Central Michigan University (1978) and a Ph.D. in educational leadership from Ohio University (1986).

LAX FACTS: Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 5-3) kept its place in the national spotlight with an impressive 18-17 win over 11-time defending Division III champion Hobart on Saturday, Apr. 6. The victory was the Bishops' third in the last five regular-season meetings between the two teams, and was just the fourth loss (three to Ohio Wesleyan) Hobart has suffered to a Division III team in 11 years. With the win, the Bishops moved up to the second position (with one of 11 first-place votes) in the USILA poll. Denison (2-0; 5-4) and Wooster (0-0; 6-1) are ranked 16th and 19th, respectively, giving the North Coast three teams in the national top 20.

NCAC Spring Sports Update

**RACES TIGHTEN AS NORTH COAST HEADS
INTO SECOND HALF OF SPRING SEASON**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: The NCAC's top four teams -- Allegheny (9-2; 15-8), Wittenberg (9-3; 16-7), Ohio Wesleyan (10-5; 15-8-1) and Wooster (7-3; 15-5) -- will battle for position in a pair of crucial four-game sets on Saturday and Sunday, Apr. 20-21. Allegheny, which has used a school-record 12-game winning streak to vault into first place in the Conference standings, will travel to third-place Ohio Wesleyan, while second-place Wittenberg (9-3; 16-7) hosts fourth-place Wooster (7-3; 15-5). One and one-half games is all that separates the top four teams.

Allegheny, which swept three games (the fourth was canceled) from Kenyon (2-11; 2-19), and Wittenberg, which took three of four at Ohio Wesleyan, were last week's big winners. Allegheny, which also won three non-conference contests last week, was led by junior third baseman **Jim Huston (Youngstown, OH/Boardman)**, who was 8-13 with two home runs and 10 runs batted in. Sophomore **Pat Broadwater (West Seneca, NY/Orchard Park)** led the Gators on the mound, firing a no-hitter for nine innings before settling for a one-hitter in a 10-inning, 1-0 win over Fredonia State. The 5'10" righthander also struck out 17 in the game. Wittenberg, meanwhile, split 7-3 decisions with Ohio Wesleyan on Saturday before taking a pair of 4-3 wins in extra innings on Sunday. Sophomore second baseman **Toby Bost (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge)** knocked in the game-winner in Sunday's opener with a one-out single in the ninth inning, while junior first baseman **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** provided the difference in the nightcap with a long home run leading off the eighth. Brown, who leads the NCAC in hitting (.486) and home runs (9), and junior shortstop **Jeff Baller (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)**, who is hitting .371, are two of the reasons why the Tigers lead the Conference in batting (.334) and scoring (7.9 rpg).

Denison (4-4; 9-8), which is still very much in the running for a berth in the post-season NCAC Tournament, has an important four-game series at Earlham (0-4; 2-10) this weekend. The Big Red's four-game set with Case Reserve (3-7; 4-18) was washed out last weekend, as was the Earlham-Oberlin (1-7; 1-16) series. Oberlin is at Kenyon to round out this week's Conference schedule.

GOLF REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan recorded its third consecutive tournament championship by taking the 19-team Wooster Parlor-Bank One Invitational over the weekend. The Bishops, who have won four consecutive NCAC titles and placed among the top 10 nationally in each of the last five seasons, came from eight strokes back after the first round to overtake defending champion Ferris State and win the event with a 36-hole total of 626. Ohio Wesleyan's 306 in round two was the tournament's low score. Rochester totaled 631 to place second, followed by Wooster (635) in third, first-round leader Ferris State (636) in fourth and Wittenberg (642) in fifth. Kenyon (652) was part of a two-way tie for seventh to give the North Coast four teams in the top eight.

Individually, Ohio Wesleyan junior **Galen Eckland (Lake Geneva, WI/Badger)** and Wittenberg senior **Scott Allen (Akron, OH/Firestone)** tied for fourth at 153 to lead all NCAC performers. Ohio Wesleyan also got top 10 performances from freshman **J.W. Wilson (Zanesville, OH/Rosecrans)**, who tied for seventh at 156, and senior **Jon Whithaus (Findlay, OH/Findlay)**, who tied for ninth at 157. Wooster, which has placed third, second and third over the past three weeks, was led by junior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)**, who was part of the three-way tie for ninth.

Allegheny, which placed 16th of 30 as the only Division III school at Penn State's Rutherford Invitational this weekend, will join Denison, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster at the Denison/Capital Invitational on Sunday and Monday, Apr. 21-22. Ohio Wesleyan is the defending champion.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (3-0; 6-5) and Wooster (1-0; 8-1) will square off on Saturday, Apr. 20 to determine who will challenge Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 7-3) for the 1991 NCAC title. Denison holds a 23-4 advantage in the all-time series between the two teams and Wooster has not defeated the Big Red since 1983. The Scots, however, are off to the finest nine-game start in their history and have an excellent chance to break the school record of 12 victories in a season. Ohio Wesleyan, which has won four consecutive North Coast championships and is ranked third in Division III, will face both teams at home later in the spring. Denison and Wooster join the Bishops in the latest USILA poll in the 16th and 18th positions, respectively.

Denison topped Kenyon (0-3; 3-6), 9-4, and Wooster defeated Wittenberg (0-2; 0-5), 15-6, in NCAC action last week. Ohio Wesleyan led the way in non-conference competition by knocking off Michigan State, 15-9, and highly-regarded Cortland State, 13-10. Individually, Wooster senior **Andy Fox (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris)** leads the circuit scoring with 21 goals and 34 assists for an average of 6.1 points per game. Oberlin junior **Darren Bosch (Spring Valley, NY/Green Meadow)** and Wooster senior **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor (MA))** stand second and third at 5.3 and 5.2 ppg, respectively.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (5-1; 6-1) has emerged as the top threat to the six-year hold Denison (6-0; 7-2) has had on the NCAC crown. The Bishops, who host Denison on Thursday, Apr. 18, have won five consecutive games since a narrow 8-7 loss to the Big Red early in the season. Denison also hosts Earlham (1-4; 1-5) and Oberlin (0-5; 0-7) this week, while Ohio Wesleyan travels to Oberlin in its only other action.

Denison notched three more North Coast wins last week, taking decisions from Kenyon (3-3; 3-5), Wittenberg (2-3; 3-6) and Wooster (2-3; 2-3) by a combined score of 42-23. Junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** exploded for 19 goals in the three games, including 10 versus Wooster and seven against Kenyon. She leads the Conference in scoring this spring with 44 goals and nine assists (5.9 ppg). The Big Red also are getting outstanding goalkeeping from sophomore **Christy Polumbus (Englewood, CO/Colorado)**, who is second in the NCAC with a 67.0 saves percentage. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, won twice last week, 15-7 over Oberlin and 17-9 over Earlham. Sophomore goalie **Katy Anderson (Greenwich, CT/Hotchkiss)**, who leads the North Coast with a .882 saves percentage, heads the Bishop defense, which has allowed a Conference-low 7.3 goals per game. In other action, Earlham got five goals from freshman **Cate Mac Lachlan (Byfield, MA/Dummer)** in its first victory of the season, 12-9 over Wittenberg, and Wooster topped Oberlin, 13-5, behind four goal outbursts from junior **Martha Lange (Etna, NH/Hanover)** and senior **Minna Jinn (Brecksville, OH/Western Reserve)**.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon (3-0; 11-4) remained on course in its quest for a first outright NCAC title as it handed defending champion Wooster (1-1; 10-4) its first Conference setback, 6-2, on Apr. 9. The Lords, ranked 14th nationally, continued their winning ways at the Great Lakes Colleges Association Tournament, handily defeating 10th-ranked DePauw, 7-2, in the semifinals before losing to top-ranked Kalamazoo, 9-0, in the finals. Denison (2-0; 9-5) also played well at the GICA Tournament, finishing fourth among the 13 teams. On Apr. 9, the Big Red became the first team this season to beat Ohio Wesleyan (1-1; 8-2). Wittenberg (3-1; 5-1), Oberlin (2-2; 9-6) and Allegheny (0-2; 4-7) also had winning weeks.

Wittenberg now has players with the best records in the NCAC at three of the six singles positions, as sophomore **Justin Russell (Vienna, VA/Blue Ridge)** and freshman **Ryan Carter (Sciotoville, OH/Portsmouth East)** jumped to the top at the #2 and #5 slots, respectively, to join sophomore **Martin Bulow (Gotheburg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))**, who is the leader at #1. All three are 5-1 in the early going. Allegheny senior **Matt Michalski (Williamsville, NY/St. Joseph's)** also has been impressive, turning in a 4-2 mark at #1 after moving up from the #3 spot, where he was 8-0. Oberlin freshman **Ousmane Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, who sports an 11-2 mark at #3, has the most wins of anyone in the NCAC at one position.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Four NCAC squads - Oberlin (3-0; 10-8), Wittenberg (1-0; 3-0), Denison (1-0; 9-2) and Kenyon (1-0; 8-3) -- were unbeatable on the week as the 1991 season continues to shape up as a very competitive one. Six-time defending Conference champion Kenyon continued to grab the headlines by beating St. Mary's (Ind.), 8-1, for its eighth straight victory. The Ladies have been getting phenomenal play from sophomores **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** and twins **Brenned and Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))**. Weisman leads #6 singles with an unblemished 7-0 slate (8-3 overall), while Brennen is 10-0 at #5 singles (11-0 overall) and 6-0 with junior **Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi)** at #3 doubles. Britt has been just as flawless, going 8-0 (9-0 overall) with Weisman at #2 doubles.

Wittenberg continued its perfect 1991 play with wins over Otterbein, 9-0, and Case Reserve, 7-2. Senior **Mendy Wells (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** and sophomore **Beth Ann Young (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** jumped to the top of singles positions #2 and #3, respectively, with 3-0 slates. Oberlin scored an important 5-2 win over Allegheny and Earlham picked up its first victory of the year, 9-0 over Bluffton. Quaker freshman **Sue Trezvant (Oak Park, IL/River Forest)** has taken over the lead at #1 singles with a 3-1 record.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Denison, Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg fared well at the Ohio Wesleyan Invitational, Apr. 12. Denison won the men's title with 138 points, followed by a solid second-place showing by the host Bishops (96). In the women's event, Ohio Wesleyan tallied 134 points and Denison 81 to finish second and third, respectively, behind front-running Baldwin-Wallace (159). Wittenberg checked in at eighth place in both races. The three NCAC men's squads won 11 of 16 individual events, led by Ohio Wesleyan junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))**, who won the discus (159' 8") and the shot (54' 9"). In addition, Wittenberg freshman won the 110 high hurdles (14.73) in NCAA qualifying time. The women had two double winners -- Denison senior **Kate Fechtel (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline)**, who won the 1500 (4:48.5) and the 800 (2:22.5), and Ohio Wesleyan senior **Kelly McNamara (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park)**, who took the 400 IM hurdles (63.5) and the 100 hurdles (15.76).

In other NCAC track action, Case Reserve's men won the nine team CWRU Invitational on Apr. 13 with 112 points, while Wooster placed third (88), Kenyon sixth (50) and Oberlin (22), which sent just three runners, eighth. Case Reserve freshman **Marc Anderson (Alliance, OH/Alliance)** won both the hammer and the shot, while Wooster senior **Rob Noble (Pepper Pike, OH/Orange)** prevailed in the 1500 and 5000. John Carroll won the seven-team women's meet (114), followed by Wooster in fifth place (71), Case Reserve in sixth (49) and a partial squad from Kenyon in seventh (8). Spartan junior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** won both hurdling events. Kenyon sent most of its Ladies to compete in the Miami University Invitational, Apr. 13, where sophomore **Kelley Wilder (Victor, NY/Victor)** placed sixth in the 3000 (10:23.54) in a field of 16 runners from all three NCAA divisions. At an Oberlin quadrangular on Apr. 12, the Yeomen amassed seven first-place finishes to score an 11-point victory over Wooster (60-49), while the Yeowomen recorded 48 points to finish second to Heidelberg (81). A final North Coast cinder headliner is Allegheny senior **Lynda Kohl (Cedar Knolls, NJ/St. Elizabeth)**, who triumphed in the 5000 at the Clarion Invitational in an NCAA Division III qualifying time of 17:36.6.

NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Allegheny College teammates **Jim Huston (Youngstown, OH/Boardman)** and **Pat Broadwater (West Seneca, NY/Orchard Park)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Huston, a junior third baseman, went 8-13 (.615) with two doubles, two home runs and 10 runs batted in as the Gators won all six of their games last week. His best performance came in the opener of Saturday's doubleheader with Kenyon, when he went 3-4 with a pair of home runs and five RBI. Huston is among the leaders in the NCAC in four offensive categories -- tied for third in hitting (.443), tied for first in doubles (8), second in home runs (6) and tied for second in RBI (29). Allegheny, which has won a school-record 12 consecutive games, is 15-8 overall and in first place in the Conference with a 9-2 mark.

Broadwater, a sophomore righthander and Allegheny's fifth starter, pitched a dream game in the Gators' 1-0, ten-inning victory against Fredonia State on Tuesday, Apr. 9. Broadwater pitched a no-hitter through the first nine innings and allowed only a two-out single in the top of the 10th. He also struck out 17, just two shy of the school record, and walked only two. On the year, Broadwater is 1-0 with a 2.65 earned run average and 22 strikeouts in 17 innings pitched.

DIAMOND DOINGS: Wittenberg junior first baseman **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** already has broken the school's single season home run record with nine. The Tigers only hit six home runs as a team in 1990 and Brown had just two extra base hits, both doubles, in 28 at bats.... Wittenberg turned eight double plays in winning three of four from Ohio Wesleyan over the weekend.... Junior **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** had a big week for the Tigers, going 8-19 (.421) with three doubles.... Wooster's **Tim Pettorini** and Allegheny's **Rick Creehan** stand 16th and 19th, respectively, among active Division III head coaches in winning percentage (five or more years). Pettorini entered the 1991 campaign at .669 (252-124-3) in nine years, while Creehan was at .662 (159-81-1) in six seasons.

SPRING SENSATIONS: Wooster's women's lacrosse "M" Line has accounted for 39 of the team's 50 goals. Junior **Martha Lange (Etna, NH/Hanover)** leads the Lady Scots with 15 goals, while senior **Minna Jinn (Brecksville, OH/Western Reserve)** and junior **Jen Mable (Mahwah, NH/Green Meadow)** are second and third with 13 and 11, respectively.... Kenyon sophomore **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips)** is 10-0 at #4 singles and 11-0 overall for the Ladies so far this spring. Brennen's twin sister **Britt**, meanwhile, has teamed with sophomore **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** for an 8-0 record at #2 doubles and a 9-0 mark overall. Britt was 23-4 in doubles last year and has a 33-4 career record.

MAKING WAVES: Allegheny senior **Melissa Moody (Farrell, PA/Farrell)**, who was named Division III Diver of the Year after winning the three meter board at the NCAA Championships with a meet record score of 462.70, will be featured in "Faces in the Crowd" in the Apr. 29 issue of *Sports Illustrated*. Moody won both the one- and three-meter boards at the NCAC Championships and earned North Coast Diver of the Year honors.... Oberlin men's basketball coach **Earl Reed** has resigned, effective June 30, to accept a tenure track, physical education instructor position with the option to coach at the College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, Ill. Reed had compiled an overall record of 19-58 in three years as the Yeomen's head coach.

NORTH COAST RACES TIGHTEN AS SPRING **April 22, 1991**
SEASON HEADS INTO STRETCH DRIVE

CLEVELAND, OH Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wittenberg (12-4; 21-8), on the strength of six wins in eight games against Ohio Wesleyan (13-5; 19-9-1) and Wooster (8-6; 16-9) over the past two weeks, has moved into the driver's seat in the race to host the first NCAC Baseball Tournament, which will be held at the site of the regular-season percentage champion Friday-Sunday, May 10-12. The Tigers, who rallied after a loss in the opener to take three of four from Wooster over the weekend, have four-game sets at ninth-place Oberlin (1-11; 1-20) and at home against sixth-place Earlham (3-5; 5-16) left on their schedule in the season's final two weeks. Ohio Wesleyan, which took three of four from Allegheny (10-5; 18-11) last weekend, is solidly in second, but the Bishops close out the NCAC portion of their schedule with a four-game series against Denison (5-7; 10-13) this weekend and could be hurt by a pair of rainouts earlier in the spring. Allegheny and defending Conference champ Wooster, who will play this week, each have eight games remaining and need to win them all to put the pressure on Wittenberg. Seven teams are still alive in the chase for a spot in the NCAC Tournament field, which will go to the top four finishers during the regular season.

Wittenberg, which has won nine of its last 11 games, came into last week's Wooster series as the top offensive team in the North Coast. It was pitching, however, that proved to be the difference as the Tigers limited Wooster to three runs over the final three games. Freshman righthander **Craig Isaac (S. Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** fired a one-hit shutout to wrap up the weekend with a 3-0 victory in game four. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, showed off its offensive firepower by scoring 40 runs in its series against Allegheny, including 10 or more in its three wins. Sophomore leftfielder **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** was the hitting star for the Bishops, going 6-12 with four home runs and nine runs batted in. In other NCAC action over the weekend, Kenyon (6-11; 6-20) swept four at home from Oberlin and Earlham took three of four at home against Denison. The Kenyon pitching staff never allowed more than three runs in a game and senior shortstop **Jason Bertsch (Pelham, NY/Memorial)** was 6-11 with eight RBI to lead the offense. Earlham, meanwhile, posted its first NCAC victories in its two years in the Conference behind the solid relief pitching of freshman **Rod Hawes (Hartford City, IN/Blackford)**, who won both ends of Saturday's doubleheader in his first appearances of the season coming off an injury.

GOLF REPORT: Allegheny and Wooster placed fourth and fifth at the 16 team Indiana (Pa.) Invitational, Apr. 17, to highlight a rainy week of action. The NCAC's top individual was Allegheny senior **George Geregach (Coraopolis, PA/Montour)**, whose 72 was just two strokes off the lead. Case Reserve, meanwhile, placed fourth of seven at the UAA Championships. Junior **Eric Zahn (Sparks, MD/Hereford)** finished ninth to lead the Spartans, firing a tournament-low 77 in the second round after opening with a 91. It is the second year in a row that Zahn has carded the best round in the event.

Five NCAC teams are represented in the latest Division III Top 20. Four-time defending Conference champ Ohio Wesleyan is third, followed by Allegheny in sixth, Wooster in 10th, Wittenberg in 12th and Kenyon in a tie for 20th.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 9-3) and Wooster (2-0; 10-2) sit atop the North Coast standings as the 1991 season reaches the final turn. Ohio Wesleyan, which has advanced to six straight NCAA Tournaments and nine of 11 overall, is no surprise. The Bishops are ranked second in Division III and own a victory against 11-time defending national champion Hobart this spring. Wooster, on the other hand, is new to the glorified air at the top. The 12th ranked Scots jumped out to a 6-0 start but what really turned heads was their 12-9 triumph over Denison (3-1; 7-6) on Apr. 20. They had not defeated the Big Red since 1983 and Denison led the all-time series 23-4. Wooster senior **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor (MA))**, who recently became the school's all-time leading scorer, had three goals and senior **Andy Fox (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris)** added four assists to key the victory.

Ohio Wesleyan hosts Denison Apr. 27, in what has been a straight-up battle for the NCAC title in each of the previous six seasons. That matchup still could have great deal to say about this year's champion, but Wooster can solidify its position in the race by defeating Oberlin (1-2; 5-3) and Kenyon (0-3; 4-6) this week. The Scots host Oberlin on Wednesday and travel to Kenyon on Saturday. Wittenberg (0-2; 0-5) is at Kenyon Tuesday in the week's remaining contest. In other action last week, Ohio Wesleyan dropped Ohio State, 22-7, and Notre Dame, 14-9. Senior **Rich Franz (Hamburg, NY/Nichols)** led the Bishop attack with six goals and 10 assists. Oberlin won for the third time in four games, topping St. Bonaventure 10-9. Sophomore **Dan Murphy (Montclair, NJ/Kimberly)** paced the Yeomen with four goals and two assists. Kenyon also won in its only outing, taking a 13-6 decision from Lake Forest behind a five-goal performance from junior **Eric Brockett (North Haven, CT/Hamden Hall)**.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Two weeks and 14 games remain on the 1991 schedule, but the three contests Denison (8-1; 9-3) takes part in will go the furthest towards determining the NCAC champion. The Big Red have won all six North Coast titles and two wins in their final three games will lock up at least a share of a seventh. Denison hosts fourth-place Wittenberg (4-4; 5-7) Saturday in its only action this week. The Tigers must be watched, however, after dispatching Ohio Wesleyan (7-2; 8-2) from a share of first place with an 11-10 win on Apr. 20. Ohio Wesleyan had crept into a tie for first just two days earlier with an 11-10 victory against Denison. It was the Bishops' first win over the Big Red in the NCAC's seven seasons.

Ohio Wesleyan senior **Kendall Brewer (Chattanooga, TN/Brimmer & May)** scored the game-winner and sophomore goalie **Katy Anderson (Greenwich, CT/Hotchkiss)** had 24 saves, including three in the final minute, to key the Bishops' triumph over Denison. Ohio Wesleyan's stay in first place was short-lived, though, as Wittenberg senior **Ramsay Muhly (Baltimore, MD/Towson)** had six goals, including the game-winner with 30 seconds to play, in leading a come from behind victory over the Bishops. Third place Kenyon was the NCAC's lone unbeaten last week, stopping Wooster, 18-13, and Earlham, 14-8. Sophomore **Melissa Wood (Devon, PA/Baldwin)** keyed the Ladies' wins with five goals in each game. In other action, Wooster slipped past Wittenberg, 10-9 in overtime, behind a five goal performance from junior **Jen Mable (Mahwah, NJ/Green Meadow)**.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon (5-0; 14-4) and Denison (4-0; 11-5) remain as the only undefeated teams in NCAC dual competition. Both won a pair of matches last week. Defending champ Wooster (3-1; 12-5) also had a successful week, dropping Oberlin (3-4; 10-8) and Ohio Wesleyan (1-3; 8-5). Ohio Wesleyan, which had enjoyed unprecedented early success, has now lost three in a row inside the Conference. This week's top match pits Wooster against Denison in Granville on Tuesday. The Scots stopped the Big Red's five year string of NCAC championships (shared and outright) last spring.

Wittenberg sophomores **Martin Bulow (Gotheburg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))** and **Justin Russell (Vienna, VA/Blue Ridge)** remain on top in #1 and #2 singles with 6-2 and 7-1 records, respectively, while Oberlin freshman **Ousmane Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))** holds on at #4 with an 11-2 mark (20-8 overall). Wooster junior **Dan Rosenbaum (Washington, DC/Field)** won three times last week to take over the lead with an 11-1 record at #3, while Denison juniors **Matt Watson (Orchard Park, NY/Orchard Park)** and **Dave Fleming (Newark, OH/Silver (NM))** also used undefeated weeks to up their position-leading records to 12-3 and 9-2 at #5 and #6, respectively. Kenyon now leads at all three doubles positions as the junior tandem of **Bill Jonas (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends)** and **Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)** have improved to 7-3 to take over the top spot at #1.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Defending NCAC champion Kenyon (2-0; 12-4) and six time runner up Denison (1-0; 11-4) had big weeks on the courts, with both teams flexing their national muscles by finishing third and fourth, respectively, in the prestigious Midwest Regional Invitational in Madison, Wisc., Apr. 19-20. Kenyon beat Denison, 5-1, in a quarterfinal match before falling in the semifinals to St. Thomas, 5-4. Oberlin (4-0; 11-8) beat Wooster (1-2; 5-6) to retain its perfect Conference record. Allegheny made a big jump in the standings on the merits of victories over Wittenberg, (2-3, 4-3), Ohio Wesleyan (2-4, 9-4) and Case Reserve (1-4, 8-6). Seven of the nine NCAC squads have overall records above .500.

In individual play, only singles positions #3 and #4 saw a shift in leadership, as Oberlin junior **Joyce Stickney (Wheaton, IL/North)** took over the #3 lead with a 10-1 record, while Allegheny sophomore **Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette)** zoomed to the top spot at #4 with a 13-4 slate.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan, whose men handily won the 1990 NCAC outdoor title and whose women ran a close second to Allegheny, are beginning to look like the teams to beat this season. Junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))**, the North Coast's 1990 Most Valuable Field Athlete, led the Bishops to 11th place in a field of 20 NCAA Division I, II and III squads at the All-Ohio Invitational at Miami University, Apr. 20. Rucker won the shot put, his premier event, with a throw of 54' 7" and placed fourth in the discus (155' 7"). In the women's event on Apr. 19, Ohio Wesleyan finished in a tie for 13th out of 24. Also running well this spring is Allegheny, whose men and women each upped their records to 6-1 with double-dual meet victories over Grove City and Clarion. Sophomore **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** won three events -- the 100 (10.7), 200 (21.6) and long jump (21' 10"), qualifying for nationals in the latter. The Gator mile relay team of freshman **Michael Penn (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)**, senior **Mike Goodelle (Erie, PA/McDowell)**, sophomore **Darren Hudson (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** and Drayton set a school record of 3:22.1 at the Kent State Invitational, Apr. 20. In other NCAC track action, Wooster's men won the eight-team Wooster Invitational with 163 points. Oberlin finished sixth (35) and a partial squad from Kenyon finished seventh (8). Wooster's women beat out four other squads to take the title with 158 points, followed by runner up Oberlin (99) and a partial squad from Kenyon, which placed fifth (14). Multiple event winners for the women included Oberlin senior **Susan VanGundy (Elkins, WV/Elkins)**, who claimed the long jump (14' 8 3/4") and the high jump (4' 10"), and Wooster freshman **Diane Burtch (Lockport, NY/Newfane)**, who captured the 100 (14.6) and the 100 hurdles (17.59). Denison's men won seven of 18 events to total 108 points and take the title at its own Invitational on Apr. 20. Earlham traveled to Kentucky for the Centre Invitational, Apr. 20, where the men finished fifth of six (38) and the women fourth of four (37). Freshman **Shannon Ferguson (Coatesville, IN/Cascade)** won the long jump (4' 10"). Case Reserve's men finished fifth and the women seventh out of eight teams at the UAA Championships in Rochester, N.Y., Apr. 20-21. Junior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** won both hurdle events (15.74 in the 100 and 1:09.12 in the 400).

**KENYON'S BERTSCH, WITTENBERG'S ISAAC
NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND, OH Kenyon College's **Jason Bertsch (Pelham, NY/Memorial)** and Wittenberg University's **Craig Isaac (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Bertsch, a senior shortstop, went 8-15 (.533) as Kenyon had its best week of the season, winning four of five games. Bertsch added two doubles, a triple, a home run and 10 runs batted in on the week. His biggest performance came in Saturday's opener of a four-game set with Oberlin, when he went 3-3 with a double and four RBI to key a 12-3 Lord victory. On the year, Bertsch leads the team in hitting (.352), runs scored (15), runs batted in (21) and triples (4) -- he is 10th in the NCAC in hitting and first in triples. Kenyon is 6-20 overall and in seventh place in the Conference with a 6-11 mark.

Isaac, a freshman righthander, hurled a one hit shutout in the final game of the weekend series with Wooster as Wittenberg defeated the Scots, 3-0, for its third win in four games. He struck out seven and walked three in pitching his third complete game of the season. Isaac is 6-2 on the year with a 3.72 earned run average for the Tigers, who are 21-8 overall and in first place in the NCAC at 12-4.

DIAMOND DANDIES: Case Reserve junior third baseman **Ken Holloway (St. Clairsville, OH/St. Clairsville)** went 3-5 in the Spartans' doubleheader split with PSU-Behrend on Apr. 16 to up his batting average to .455, second in the NCAC. He leads the team in 10 offensive categories, including batting average, hits (30), slugging percentage (.727) and on-base percentage (.558)... Wittenberg junior **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** continued his hot hitting last week by going 10-19 (.526). He has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games and has reached base in all but one game this year.... Kenyon senior righthander **Steve Wrinn (Wallingford, CT/Choate Rosemary)** picked up his first collegiate win by throwing six and two-thirds innings of four-hit baseball in a 3-2 victory against Oberlin. He struck out 10 and did not allow an earned run in the game.... Allegheny senior centerfielder **Jeff Filkovski (Penn, PA/Penn-Trafford)** was 7-18 (.388) in six games with two doubles, three home runs and 11 runs batted in. The three home runs upped his career total to 22, giving him the school record.... Earlham's **Rod Hawes (Hartford City, IN/Blackford)** debuted with a bang over the weekend, winning both ends of the Quakers' doubleheader sweep of Denison. The freshman righthander had been injured and was making his first appearances of the season. Ohio Wesleyan sophomore leftfielder **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** capped an outstanding series against Allegheny with two home runs in the finale to pace an 11-8 Bishop win. In the four games, Senkowitz was 6-12 (.500) with a double, four home runs and nine RBI.... Ohio Wesleyan stopper **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)**, a junior righthander, had two more saves last week to break the NCAC record and bring his season total to nine.... Bishop centerfielder **Mark Glaser (Westerville, OH/North)** tied two of his own school records over the weekend when he stole his 23rd base and was hit by pitch for the 10th time.

HIGH-SCORING SCOT: Wooster senior **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor (MA))** has become the school's all-time leading scorer in men's lacrosse. Davidow has 37 goals this spring to increase his career total to 143, breaking the previous record of 127, which was set by three-time All-NCAC selection Frank Windsor between 1985-88.

A WORLDLY EXPERIENCE: **Erwin Grabisna (Parma, OH/Parma)**, a 1988 graduate of Case Reserve, is listed as a 6-2, 276-pound defensive end on the roster of the Raleigh-Durham Skyhawks in the World League of American Football. Grabisna, a three-time All-NCAC and two-time All-America selection, was selected in the sixth round of the 1988 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Raiders.

PIN SHOTS: Five NCAC golf teams have cracked the top 20 in the latest (Apr. 15) Division III poll. Ohio Wesleyan, runner-up at the NCAA Championships a year ago, leads the North Coast contingent in the third position, followed by Allegheny in sixth, Wooster in 10th and Wittenberg in 12th. Those four are joined by Kenyon, which has broken into the poll for the first time this season in a tie for 20th.... The NCAC has had at least two teams finish in the national top 20 in each of its six seasons, with a high of four in 1989.... Allegheny (1983) and Wooster (1975) are two of only five schools to have ever won a Division III golf championship.

WOOSTER SELECTS AD: Wooster has announced that **Bill McHenry** will take over as the school's Director of Physical Education, Athletics and Recreation on July 1, replacing **Al Van Wie**, who is retiring from the position he has held for 17 years. McHenry, a 1954 graduate of Washington & Lee, has spent the past 20 years at his alma mater as Director of Athletics (1971-89) and Director of Physical Education (1989-present). He has been very active on the national level, chairing the NCAA Football Committee (1983-89), the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects in Sports (1980-85), and the NCAA Committee on Committees (1988-90). McHenry also has served on the Board of Directors for the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (1985-89) and was named Man of the Year by the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association in 1988.

DIRECTORY CHANGES: Ohio Wesleyan has announced that field hockey coach **Nan Carney-DeBord** and women's lacrosse coach **Mary Parker** have resigned those duties. Carney-DeBord will remain as the school's women's basketball coach and assistant athletic director. Parker, recently promoted to full professor, will continue to serve as volleyball coach while increasing her teaching responsibilities. Carney-DeBord has coached the Bishop field hockey team for the past six seasons, leading her squads to four consecutive NCAC championships and NCAA Tournament appearances, while Parker, a co-founder of the Midwest Women's Lacrosse district, is the only coach the Ohio Wesleyan women's lacrosse program has known since its inception in 1966.

NATIONAL ACCLAIM: The Allegheny women's cross country team was featured in the Apr. 10 issue of the *NCAA News* for its outstanding combination of athletic and academic performance. The Gators won their third consecutive NCAC and Mideast Regional titles last fall and went on to place seventh at the NCAA Championships. The 18-member squad also had a collective grade point average of 3.31 for the fall semester, eighth-best out of 226 Division III squads. Allegheny alone finished in the national top 10 on and off the course. Under head coach **Ralph White**, the Gators have recorded four straight top 10 finishes at the NCAA Championships while maintaining at least a 3.10 team GPA.

ACADEMIC HONORS: Case Reserve juniors **Ken Holloway (St. Clairsville, OH/St. Clairsville)** and **Michelle Sabick (Dayton, OH/Carroll)** have been chosen to receive the school's Arthur P. Leary and Dorothy L. Hoza Awards, respectively. The Leary and Hoza Awards are presented annually to a CWRU freshman, sophomore or junior man and woman who demonstrate outstanding scholarship, leadership, participation and service. Holloway, a mechanical engineering major, is a standout performer on the Spartan football and baseball teams. Sabick, meanwhile, is a biomedical engineering major and a three-year letterwinner in soccer. Oberlin seniors **Melissa Merrill (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** and **Dave Stevenson (Tulsa, OK/Summit (NJ))** are the 1991 recipients of the school's John Stern Scholar-Athlete Award, which is presented annually to a female and male student-athlete with an overall grade-point average of at least 3.2 who performs with distinction as a member of a varsity team. Merrill, a Russian studies major with a 3.57 GPA, is a four-year letterwinner and a three-time All-NCAC selection as a goalkeeper in field hockey. Stevenson, a religion major with a 3.49 GPA, owns two NCAC individual titles and is an 11-time All-America in swimming.

HOOP HAPPENINGS: Oberlin senior **Ann Gilbert (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** has been named NCAA Division III women's basketball Player of the Year by the American Women's Sports Federation. Last month, she was named Division III Player of the Year by Champion USA and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association. Gilbert, a 5-5 guard, averaged 31.2 points per game this season as the Yeowomen posted their best record ever at 13-11. She also broke the Division III single-game scoring record with a 61-point performance versus Allegheny, Feb. 6. The two-time NCAC Player of the Year averaged 31.1 points per game in 1989-90 and is one of only two Division III women to average over 30 points in a game twice in a career.... Ohio Wesleyan's **Krista Jacobs (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** joins Gilbert on the AWSF All-America team. Jacobs, a junior wing, was named to the second team after averaging 18.2 points and 10.6 rebounds per game and leading the Bishops to a fine 20-8 record.

CLEVELAND, OH -- Eighteen outstanding student-athletes have been honored for their achievements on the playing fields and in the classroom as the first North Coast Athletic Conference Scholar Athlete Award winners. Two student athletes, one man and one woman, from each NCAC member will be recognized each year.

Founded in 1983, the NCAC brings together a group of institutions who share a common allegiance to academic quality and to the conduct of athletics so as to support the educational purpose. This type of academic commitment has been fostered by the nine school Presidents, who have a unique and active leadership role in the direction of the Conference. "What sets the North Coast Athletic Conference apart from other intercollegiate sports conferences is its earnest belief in and leadership in the promotion of athletic competition within the context of the educational mission," says Allegheny College President Daniel F. Sullivan, current President of the NCAC. "Athletics holds critically important benefits for the education and development of young people and I can think of no better examples of this than our 18 Scholar-Athlete Award winners."

The NCAC believes that intercollegiate athletics can and should complement academic life, rather than compete with it, and that sports should enhance the college experience. "The Scholar-Athlete Award symbolizes the North Coast's philosophy," says Ohio Wesleyan University assistant athletic director Nan Carney-DeBord, chair of the NCAC Women's Athletic Directors. "It gives us a great opportunity to recognize the model student-athletes, who show how well athletics can complement academics in our Conference."

"It is important to remember that these outstanding individuals are premier examples of hundreds of top performers in the classrooms and on the playing fields around the North Coast," adds Gordon Collins, psychology professor at The College of Wooster and chair of the NCAC Men's Faculty Representatives. "These student-athletes demonstrate that you can do both well, and that was the original concept behind intercollegiate athletics."

Following is a capsule summary of each of the NCAC Scholar-Athlete's achievements.

DON SHUFRAN
Allegheny College
Tennis

Shufran (Bradford, PA/Bradford), a senior chemistry major, is a three-year letterwinner on the Gator tennis team. A regular at sixth singles, Shufran has also seen varsity action in doubles this season and has helped lead Allegheny to a 9-11 record, including a 5-0 mark during the fall. A member of Phi Beta Kappa, he carries an overall GPA of 3.88 and has been an Alden Scholar (3.2 GPA or better) in each of his three years.

KATIE TIEDEMANN
Allegheny College
Cross Country/Track

Tiedemann (Skaneateles, NY/Skaneateles), a senior psychology major, earned All-America honors in cross country this fall with a 16th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. In addition, she was a national qualifier in the 3,000- and 5,000-meter runs during the 1990 outdoor track season and has received a total of 14 All-NCAC honors in track and cross country. In the classroom, Tiedemann has an overall GPA of 3.69 and has earned a 4.0 in each of the last five semesters. She has been an Alden Scholar (3.2 GPA or better) in each of her three years and was recognized as the outstanding junior in the psychology department last year.

Luthy (Sullivan, OH/Black River), a senior computer engineering major with a 3.08 GPA, is the defending NCAA Division III champion in the decathlon. He also received All-America honors in the high jump (indoors) as a junior and the decathlon as a sophomore, when he was the national runner-up. In addition, Luthy was named Most Valuable Field Performer at the 1990 NCAC Indoor Track & Field Championships and he placed third in the decathlon at the prestigious Penn Relays this spring, where he was one of only two Division III athletes in a 13-man field. Luthy recently received Case Reserve's Nip Heim Award, which goes annually to a senior man who demonstrates outstanding scholarship, leadership, participation and service.

Sabick (Dayton, OH/Carroll), a junior biomedical engineering major, is a three year letterwinner in soccer. She captained the 1990 squad and was the team's third leading scorer (eight points) from her midfield position. Sabick has earned All-NCAC honors in each of her three seasons and is a two-time, first-team Academic All-Ohio selection. She is President of Case Reserve's Circle K Club and carries a 3.69 GPA. In addition, she recently received the school's Dorothy L. Hoza award, which is presented annually to a freshman, sophomore or junior woman who demonstrates outstanding scholarship, leadership, participation and service.

DAVE DUKAT

Dukat (Canton, OH/Central Catholic), a senior geology major with an overall GPA of 3.59, has earned a total of eight letters in football and track at Denison. A three-year starter at cornerback in football, he has six career interceptions. In track, Dukat has been a top scorer in sprints, jumps and relays, helping lead the Big Red to three NCAC championships (two outdoor and one indoor). NCAC Spring Sports Update

LACROSSE CHAMPIONS TO BE CROWNED THIS WEEK;
REMAINING SIX SPORTS PREPARE FOR NCAC TOURNAMENTS

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Heading into the final week of the regular season six teams are still alive in the chase for NCAC Tournament berths, which go to the Conference's top four finishers. The four-team, double elimination tournament will be played Friday-Sunday, May 10-12, at the site of the first place team Wittenberg (14-6; 23-10) can lock up the home-field advantage with three wins in its four-game set against Earlham (4-8; 6-21) on Saturday and Sunday. With second-place Ohio Wesleyan (14-8; 20-13-1) finished with its NCAC schedule, third-place Wooster (11-7; 20-10) is the only team with a realistic chance of catching the Tigers. Wooster hosts Oberlin (3-11; 3-23) this weekend and would need a four-game sweep along with two Wittenberg losses to grab first place and earn the right to host the Tournament.

Fifth place Denison (8-8; 13-14) is at fourth place Allegheny (11-8; 19-14) for four games on Friday and Saturday in the week's key series. Two wins can clinch a Tournament berth for Allegheny, while Denison must take all four to guarantee a spot. Sixth-place Case Reserve (6-8; 8-21), which hosts Kenyon (6-11; 7-22) this weekend, could slip in with a sweep and three Denison wins.

Case Reserve, Denison and Wooster won three of four to highlight last week's North Coast play. Case Reserve exploded for 41 runs in its three victories against Earlham. Sophomore leftfielder **Dwayne Johnson (Jefferson, OH/Jefferson)** was 6-12 in the series to lead the Spartans. Denison threw a wrench into the post-season picture by taking three from Ohio Wesleyan. Junior righthander **Randy Young (Dover, DE/Dover)** picked up a pair of wins for the Big Red to improve his record to 5-0. Wooster, meanwhile, continued to get outstanding pitching as it took three from Allegheny. The Scots, who lead the NCAC with a 3.15 earned run average, got another stellar performance from senior righthander **Jason Weiner (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)**, who upped his record to 7-1 with a two-hit shutout in Saturday's first game. In last week's remaining series, Oberlin forced a split with Wittenberg, taking one game each day. Sophomore first baseman **Brent Eastwood (Washington, MO/Iowa City)** was 5-11 with three runs batted in and two game-winning hits for the Yeomen.

GOLF REPORT: Allegheny proved that it is ready to challenge for the NCAC title it last won in 1986 by taking first at the 21 team Denison/Capital Tournament, Apr. 21-22. Wittenberg and four-time defending Conference champ Ohio Wesleyan completed a North Coast trifecta by finishing second and third, respectively. Wittenberg junior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** had a 36-hole total of 150 to earn medalist honors.

In other action, Allegheny was third of eight (first among Division III entries) at its own Griffen Classic, Apr. 26-27, and Case Reserve placed fifth of 12 at the Malone Invitational, Apr. 27. Case Reserve junior **Eric Zahn (Sparks, MI/Hereford)** was the medalist at Malone after carding a 79. Five NCAC squads are involved in the 16 team Wittenberg Invitational, Apr. 28-29, which is an important showcase for teams hoping to attract NCAA bids. The North Coast currently has five teams ranked in the Division III Top 20: Ohio Wesleyan (3), Allegheny (6), Wooster (10), Wittenberg (12) and Kenyon (120).

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (3-0; 10-3) and Wooster (4-0; 12-2) will meet in Delaware on Saturday to determine the 1991 NCAC champion. Ohio Wesleyan, which also faces Wittenberg (0-3; 0-6) this week, set up the championship confrontation by downing Denison (3-2; 7-7), 18-6, on Apr. 27. Wooster, meanwhile, did its part last week with a 23-6 victory against Oberlin (1-3; 5-4) and a 15-5 triumph over Kenyon (1-4; 5-7). The Bishops continue to be ranked second in Division III, while the Scots have moved up one spot to 11th. Ohio Wesleyan owns a 25-1 advantage in the all-time series between the two teams, but the Scots defeated Denison earlier this spring after entering the contest with only four victories in 27 games against the Big Red.

In other action this week, Oberlin can wrap up sole possession of fourth place with a victory against Wittenberg on May 4. The Tigers, meanwhile, could climb out of the basement and into a three-way tie for fourth (with Kenyon and Oberlin) with a win. Individually, Wooster senior **Andy Fox (Hanover, NH/Hanover)** continues to lead the NCAC in scoring with 29 goals and 53 assists for an average of 5.9 points per game. Wooster sophomore **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** made the biggest move on the scoring charts last week with 14 goals in two games (seven versus Oberlin and Kenyon) to improve his average to 4.1 ppg and move from seventh to fifth. Ohio Wesleyan senior **Rich Franz (Hamburg, NY/Nichols)** also had a big week, scoring two goals and adding seven assists in the win over Denison to improve his average to 4.7 ppg and hold onto fourth in the scoring race. Wooster sophomore **Rob Vosburgh (West Chester, PA/East)** has taken over the lead in goal with a .042 saves percentage.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (9-1; 10-3) can clinch its seventh consecutive outright NCAC title with a pair of wins this week -- home versus Kenyon (6-4; 6-6) on Wednesday and at Wooster (4-5; 4-6) on Saturday. Second place Ohio Wesleyan (9-2; 11-2), which split its two game series with Denison this spring, is the only team within striking distance of the Big Red. The Bishops must win at Earlham (1-8; 1-10) on Wednesday and hope for Denison to lose at least once. Third place will likely be decided by Saturday's matchup between Kenyon and Wittenberg (5-5; 6-8), with Wooster also having a shot.

Last week, Denison trimmed its magic number to one with a 10-2 victory against Wittenberg. The Big Red are led by junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)**, who has 51 goals and 13 assists for an NCAC-leading average of 5.3 points per game. Ohio Wesleyan also had a successful week, winning in all three of its outings. The Bishops were led by senior **Franny Smith (Montville, NJ/Worthington (OH))**, who had 14 goals in the three games, including seven in a 14-13 victory against Rochester and five in a 21-14 triumph over Wooster. Smith now ranks second in the Conference with an average of 4.2 ppg. In other NCAC action, Wooster defeated Earlham, 14-3, and Oberlin (0-9; 0-12) dropped a pair of tough decisions, 7-5 to Wittenberg and 11-8 to Kenyon.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: The NCAC race is finally beginning to take the shape preseason prognosticators indicated it would, as Wooster (6-1; 16-5), ranked 15th in the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches' Association poll, bolted past Denison (4-1; 11-6) into second place in the Conference standings on the strength of a 4-0 week. The Scots have just one remaining regular season match remaining, May 2 versus Allegheny (1-5; 5-13), before they try and defend their NCAC championship against the likes of league-leading Kenyon (5-0; 15-4), which is ranked 14th nationally, Denison, Wittenberg (3-3; 7-3) and Oberlin (4-4; 13-8). Kenyon hosts Denison on Friday in the coming week's top attraction. Wooster's climb in the standings was led by the outstanding play of juniors **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)** and **Dan Rosenbaum (Washington, DC/Field)**, who were 4-0 and 3-0, respectively, on the week. Fernandez now has the NCAC's second best record at #1 singles (14-7), while Rosenbaum leads the way at #3 (14-1; 16-3). Kenyon retained its perfect Conference record by blanking Allegheny, 0-0, in its only North Coast action. Oberlin had a fine 3-0 week, evening its NCAC record with an 8-1 win over Ohio Wesleyan (3-4; 10-6). Upward mobility was the secret for the Yeomen, as freshmen **Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)**, the second-leading player at #3, and **Ousmane Diop (Fies, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, the leader at #4, each went 3-0 while playing up one spot. Erikson and Diop, who rank third at #2 doubles, were 3-0 last week in the #1 position. Elsewhere, Earlham (0-3; 1-7) scored its first victory of the season, edging Wilmington 5-4.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: The 1991 NCAC season, which started out looking like a three-way race rather than the perennial battle between Kenyon and Denison, shifted dramatically this past week as Oberlin (2-2; 12-10) lost Conference matches to the Ladies and the Big Red to fall from the ranks of the undefeated in North Coast play, while Kenyon (4-0; 14-4) and Denison (2-0; 12-4) remained unvanquished in the league. By this time next week, there will be only one squad undefeated in NCAC action, as this week's headliner features Denison at Kenyon on Friday. The Yeowomen did have one happy note on the week as 1989 and 1990 NCAC Player of the Year **Kavita Varma (Chickasa, OK/Chickasa)**, a senior who is ranked 10th in Division III, defeated Kenyon sophomore **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** and Denison sophomore **Carey White (Toledo, OH/Ottawa Hills)** to run her #1 singles' slate to 16-5. Varma is second at her position to Earlham freshman **Sue Tezvant (Oak Park, IL/River Forest)**, who was 3-1 on the week. Ohio Wesleyan (3-4; 10-4) won its only match of the rain-shortened week, beating Wooster (3-3; 7-7) for the first time since 1983. There was only one change in individual leaders on the week, with Case Reserve sophomore **Seetha Shivashankar (Cleveland, OH/Brecksville)** taking over the lead at #4 singles with a 7-2 slate.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: It was a record-smashing week for Allegheny as the Gators ran at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia, Apr. 25, and at non-scoring invitationals at Edinboro, Apr. 23, and Carnegie Mellon, Apr. 28. Cinder sensations for Allegheny included sophomore **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** and senior **Lynda Kohl (Cedar Knolls, NJ/St. Elizabeth)**, both of whom qualified for the NCAA Championships. Kohl qualified for her second event at nationals with a time of 36:41.44 in the 10,000 at the Penn Relays. She had qualified in the 5000 earlier in the spring. Drayton qualified while setting a school record of 21.3 in the 200 at Edinboro. He also eclipsed the Allegheny standard in the 100 at the same meet with a dash of 10.7, and teamed with freshman **Eugene Calhoun (Cleveland, OH/St. Joseph)**, freshman **Mike Penn (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** and senior **Jeff Stone (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit)** to break the school record in the 4x100 relay (43.1) and the mile relay (3:21.6) at the Penn event. At the Carnegie Mellon meet, senior **Andy Wright (Cleveland Heights, OH/Cleveland Heights)** set a Gator record in the pole vault (14' 9"). In other Conference action, Denison was not a very gracious host this past weekend, winning both titles at a quadrangular meet at its own Deeds Field. The Big Red men (88 points) surprised defending NCAC champion Ohio Wesleyan (72), by taking 10 of the meet's 18 events. Muskingum finished third (25) and Kenyon fourth (11). Seniors **Terry Smith (Gary, IN/Roosevelt)** and **Mike Behrendt (Columbus, OH/American (Stuttgart, Germany))** were Denison's big scorers, with Smith taking the gold in the triple jump (44' 8") and the 100 (10.97), while Behrendt clocked best times in the 1500 (3:59.31) and the 5000 (15:49.3). Ohio Wesleyan junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))** once again displayed his dominance in field events, winning the shot (54' 3") and the discus (160'). Denison's women also were fleet of feet, scoring 60.5 points to run ahead of Muskingum (48), Ohio Wesleyan (47.5) and Kenyon (28). Senior **Kate Fechtel (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline)** was the NCAC's only double-winner, finishing first in the 800 (2:21.2) and the 1500 (4:46.16). Case Reserve junior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** won both hurdle events for the third meet in a row as a partial squad of Spartans competed in the All-City Meet at John Carroll, Apr. 23.

CLEVELAND, OH Oberlin College's **Brent Eastwood (Washington, MO/Iowa City)** and The College of Wooster's **Jason Weiner (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Eastwood, a sophomore leftfielder/first baseman, went 5-11 (.455) as Oberlin took two of four games from first place Wittenberg. He added a triple, a home run and three runs batted in and drove in the go ahead runs in both victories. His biggest performance came in Sunday's nightcap, an 8-4 Yeomen win, when he went 2-3 with an RBI and three runs scored. Eastwood is hitting a team-high .287 for Oberlin, which is 3-23 overall and 3-13 in the NCAC.

Weiner, a senior righthander, hurled a two-hit shutout as Wooster defeated Allegheny, 7-0, in the first game of their weekend series. He struck out four and walked only one in pitching his second shutout and fourth complete game of the season. On the year, Weiner is 7-1 with an outstanding 2.38 earned run average. He ranks first in the NCAC in wins, second in winning percentage (.875) and third in ERA. The Scots are 20-10 overall and in third place in the Conference with an 11-7 mark.

SPRING SENSATIONS: Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** was 9-15 (.600) with two home runs in five games last week.... Wooster third baseman **Matt Sherrieb (Sarver, PA/Freeport)** was 8-15 (.400) as the Scots won four of five games on the week.... Sophomore righthander **Matt Roussel (Youngstown, OH/Chaney)** fired a five inning one hitter as Case Reserve defeated Earlham, 14-2, in the fourth game of their weekend series. Neither of the runs Roussel allowed were earned and he has improved his ERA to 2.83, fifth in the NCAC.

TRACK FACT: Case Reserve senior **Kevin Luthy (Sullivan, OH/Black River)** will have the opportunity to defend his national title in the decathlon this spring after qualifying for the NCAA Championships with a third-place finish at the prestigious Penn Relays, Apr. 23-24. HORSING AROUND: Earlham freshman **Katie Graeser (Wadsworth, IL/Warren)** will participate in the National Intercollegiate Horse Show Association (IHSA) Championships at Hollins College on May 4-5. Graeser took first place in the open over-fence division regionals at Taylor University, Apr. 6, and second in the "zones" conducted at Purdue University, Apr. 13. The IHSA regionals brought together competitors from 14 schools in Indiana, Illinois and Iowa, while the zones were made up of high-placing finishers from two regions.

COACHES CORNER: Denison has named **Mike Sheridan** interim men's basketball coach for the 1991-92 season. Sheridan, a 1985 Wooster graduate, has been an assistant coach at Denison for the past two years after spending four seasons as an assistant at Davis & Elkins (W.V.). He will finish his master's degree requirements in health, physical education and recreation at Ohio State this summer. A national search for a permanent head coach will be conducted by Denison the spring of 1992.... Earlham has announced the appointment of two head coaches, **Cathy Klein** in women's soccer and **Tony Ferraro** in baseball. Klein is a graduate of the State University of New York at Cortland, where she was a Division I All-America selection in soccer in 1985 and 1986. She served as the head women's soccer coach at Utica College for two seasons before moving on to earn her master's degree at Kent State this year. Ferraro, a graduate assistant coach in baseball and football for the Quakers, came to Earlham last fall after serving as defensive coordinator and assistant baseball coach at Bishop Carroll High School (Ohio) for six years. NCAC Spring Sports Update

**SIX NCAC CHAMPIONSHIPS SET FOR THIS WEEKEND;
DENISON, OHIO WESLEYAN CLAIM LACROSSE TITLES**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: By virtue of its first place finish during the regular season, Wittenberg (16 7; 25 12) has earned the right to host the first NCAC Tournament, which will be held Friday-Sunday, May 10-12 at Municipal Stadium in Springfield. The Tigers used eight victories in 12 games against chief rivals Allegheny, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster to claim the top spot in the standings and earn the tournament's first seed. Defending champion Wooster (15 7; 25-10) came on strong late in the spring, winning seven of its final eight North Coast contests, to take second place and the second seed. Ohio Wesleyan (14 8; 22 14 1), meanwhile, dropped seven of its last 12 after a fast start in Conference play to fall to third, while Allegheny (13 10; 22-17) split four games with Denison (10-10; 15-17) on the season's final weekend to hold onto the fourth spot. The four team, double-elimination tournament will get underway with a doubleheader Friday afternoon -- second-seeded Wooster will play third-seeded Ohio Wesleyan at 12:30 p.m., followed by top seeded Wittenberg against fourth seeded Allegheny at 4:00.

Wittenberg secured its hold on first place by taking two of three from Earlham (5-10; 7-23) over the weekend (game four was canceled due to rain). Junior outfielder **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** led the Tiger attack, going 7-11 with three doubles, a home run and eight runs batted in. Wooster kept the pressure on Wittenberg by sweeping four from Oberlin (3-17; 3-17) by a combined score of 39-9. The Scots, who closed the regular season just one-half game behind the Tigers, were led by senior second baseman **Chris Bell (Brookpark, OH/Olmsted Falls)**, who was 10-13 with two home runs and six RBI. Allegheny, meanwhile, got the two wins it needed against Denison by scores of 4-3 and 3-2 on the second day of their four-game series. Sophomore catcher/designated hitter **Ryan Jurkovic (Mt. Pleasant, PA/Mt. Pleasant)** capped the victory in game three for the Gators with a two-run home run in the bottom of the eighth. Kenyon (9-12; 10-24) took three of four from Case Reserve (7-11; 9-24) in other NCAC action. Senior shortstop/pitcher **Jason Bertsch (Pelham, NY/Memorial)** had a big week for the Lords, going 9-16 at the plate and getting a win and a save on the mound over five games.

GOLF REPORT: Four-time defending champion Ohio Wesleyan heads the eight-team field at the 1991 NCAC Golf Championships, which will be held Friday and Saturday, May 10-11. The 36-hole event will be played at the 6,946-yard, par 72, Apple Valley Golf Course in Howard, Ohio. The Bishops have had at least a six-stroke margin in each of their four championships, but will face stern challenges from Allegheny, host Kenyon, Wittenberg and Wooster this year. All five of those teams are represented in the latest NCAA Division III poll -- Ohio Wesleyan is third, followed by Allegheny in sixth, Wooster in 10th, Wittenberg in 12th and Kenyon in a tie for 20th.

Individually, Wittenberg junior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** leads NCAC full-time players with an outstanding average of 77.2 strokes per round. A trio of Allegheny players -- senior **George Geregach (Coraopolis, PA/Montour)**, junior **George Laskey (Hopwood, PA/Geibel)** and junior **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** -- are tied for second at 77.8, while Ohio Wesleyan junior **Galen Eckland (Lake Geneva, WI/Badger)** is fifth at 77.9. Wooster junior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** and Allegheny junior **Marc Voytko (Johnstown, PA/McCort)** average 78.5 and are tied for sixth, followed by Ohio Wesleyan junior **Matt Roth (Sidney, OH/Sidney)** in eighth at 78.7, Ohio Wesleyan senior **Barry Pry (Findlay, OH/Findlay)** in ninth at 79.3 and Wittenberg senior **Scott Allen (Akron, OH/Firestone)** in 10th at 79.5.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (5 0; 12 3) claimed its fifth consecutive NCAC title with a 27-5 victory against Wooster (4-1; 12-4), May 4. The Bishops broke open a 2-1 game with eight straight goals to close out the first period. Senior **Rich Franz (Hamburg, NY/Nichols)** led the onslaught with seven goals, including five in the first period. Wooster's second-place finish is its best in the North Coast's seven-year history, while Denison (3-2; 7-7) dropped to third after four consecutive seasons in second. Kenyon (1 4; 5 8), Oberlin (1-4; 5-5) and Wittenberg (1-4; 1-7) round out the standings in a tie for fourth. Wittenberg created the three-way tie with an 11-8 triumph over Oberlin, May 4 -- its first NCAC win in two seasons in the Conference.

Ohio Wesleyan, ranked second in Division III, has received an invitation to participate in its seventh consecutive NCAA Tournament. The Bishops will host Washington & Lee (11-3) on Wednesday, May 8, in the first round of the eight-team national tournament. Ohio Wesleyan defeated the sixth-ranked Generals, 18-11, earlier in the season. The winner of that contest will advance to the semifinals (May 12 or 13) and face the winner of the first round game between top-ranked Salisbury State (13-0) and eighth-ranked Ithaca (9-2). Wooster, which had its finest season since going 12-4 in 1983, was ranked 13th in the final Division III poll.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (11-1; 12-3) captured its seventh consecutive NCAC crown with a pair of wins last week -- 18-6 over Kenyon (7-5; 7-7) on May 1 and 17-5 over Wooster (4-8; 4-10) on May 4. The Kenyon men's and women's swimmers are the only other North Coast teams to claim championships in each of the NCAC's seven seasons. Denison was led in the final week of the regular season by juniors **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** and **Niki Stone (Old Greenwich, CT/Greenwich)**. Monacelli, the Conference's leading scorer, had four goals against Kenyon and eight more versus Wooster, while Stone had six goals in the Kenyon game and seven on the week. The Big Red will be making their third NCAA Tournament appearance in the last four years when they travel to Franklin & Marshall on Saturday, May 11, for a first round contest.

Ohio Wesleyan (10-2; 12-2), which split its two game season series with Denison, closed out the year in second place, followed by Kenyon in third and Wittenberg in fourth. The Ladies edged Wittenberg 9-8 on May 4 to secure sole possession of third. Sophomore **Melissa Wood (Devon, PA/Baldwin)** led Kenyon in that game with three goals and two assists. Wooster (4-8; 4-10), Oberlin (3-9; 3-12) and Earlham (1-11; 1-13) round out the North Coast standings in positions five through seven, respectively. Oberlin ended its season on a positive note with three wins in the final week -- 19-13 over Wooster, 16-7 over Earlham and 17-14 over Earlham. Junior **Bonnie Scranton (East Hartford, CT/Kingswood-Oxford)** exploded for 21 goals in the three games to pace the Yeowomen.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon (7-0; 18-4) and Wooster (7-1; 17-5) are the favorites to claim the title the seventh NCAC Men's Tennis Championships, May 10-11 at Wooster. The Lords have won 18 of their last 19 matches and the 18 wins eclipses the school record of 16 set in 1988. Kenyon's season won't end this coming weekend, since the Lords, ranked 13th nationally, have been invited to the NCAA Division III Tournament, which begins Sunday, May 12, at Claremont Mudd Scripps in Claremont, Calif. The North Coast also will be represented at nationals by seven individuals: Kenyon senior **Dave Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville)**; Denison junior **Will Knox (Erie, PA/Academy)**; Wooster junior **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)**; the 19th-ranked Kenyon doubles tandem of junior **Bill Jonas (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends)** and senior **Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)**; and the Denison duo of Knox and sophomore **Brian Maebius (San Antonio, TX/Alamo Heights)**.

In the final week of regular-season play, Kenyon scored a key 8-1 triumph over third-place Denison (5-2; 12-7), while Wooster tightened its hold on second with a win over Allegheny (1-6; 6-14). Wittenberg (5-3; 10-3), meanwhile, had an undefeated week with wins over Ohio Wesleyan (3-5; 11-7) and Earlham (0-6; 1-10) to keep pace. In individual play, Kenyon continues to dominate the doubles scene, leading at all three positions, while the Lords' Stauffer (15-5; 16-5) has taken over the top spot at #5 singles after winning six matches in a row.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon (5-0; 15-5) and Denison (4-0; 14-4) head into the seventh NCAC Women's Tennis Championships, to be held May 10-11 in Granville, Ohio, undefeated in league play. Their much-awaited showdown scheduled for Friday, May 3 was rained out. Kenyon will attempt to earn a sixth consecutive Conference title, but should face stiff competition from host Denison and Oberlin (6-2; 16-10), both of whom wrapped up the final week of the regular season in winning style, taking two and four matches, respectively. Kenyon will compete in its fifth consecutive NCAA Division III Tournament, to begin Monday, May 13, at Emory University in Atlanta. Oberlin senior **Kavita Varma (Chickasa, OK/Chickasa)**, who won five matches last week to vault into the NCAC lead at #1 singles with a 20-5 record (24-5 overall), also has received a bid to nationals. Other aces peaking just before the NCAC Championships include Wittenberg senior **Mendy Wells (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)**, Allegheny sophomore **Kristen Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/S. Lafayette)** and Wittenberg sophomore **Beth Ann Young (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)**, who lead at #2, #3 and #4 singles, respectively.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: The distance running of Allegheny and the sprinting of Ohio Wesleyan will highlight the 1991 NCAC Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships, while the Men's Championships should feature a familiar confrontation between Denison and Ohio Wesleyan. Both events will be held this weekend, May 10-11, at Case Reserve's Finnigan Field. The Allegheny women claimed their first outdoor title last spring and finished second indoors this winter to 1990 outdoor runner-up Ohio Wesleyan. The two squads have split a pair of Conference outdoor titles since breaking a four-year stronghold by Wooster in 1989. Co-favorites in the men's lanes are Denison, which won the first five NCAC outdoor titles and claimed its fourth indoor crown this winter, and Ohio Wesleyan, the defending outdoor champ and a two time winner indoors.

In final warm-ups before the Conference Meet, Allegheny's record books were assaulted for the second week in a row at a non-scoring quadrangular hosted by Oberlin, May 4. Sophomore **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** set a new Gator record in the 100 (10.6); the 4x400 relay team of senior **Milke Goodelle (Erie, PA/McDowell)**, Drayton, sophomore **Darren Hudson (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** and senior **Jeff Stone (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit)** set a new mark of 3:21.1; and sophomore **Jennifer Ugine (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)** eclipsed the triple jump standard with a leap of 34' 6". Oberlin freshman **Megan Schulte (Upland, CA/Upland)** established a new school mark of 121' 9" in the discus. Ohio Wesleyan junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights OH)** looks as if he should be able to defend his 1990 NCAC discus title after launching the best Division III throw this season (171' 9") in a meet at Otterbein, May 2. The Bishops also are looking good in the 4x400 relay as the squad of junior **Chris Apel (Portsmouth, OH/Portsmouth)**, senior **Doug Pierson (Great Falls, VA/Ridgewood)**, junior **Brad Warren (Lima, OH/Bath)** and freshman **Jeff Linn (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge)** set a school record (3:21.5). Senior **Kelly McNamara (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park)**, with wins in the 100 (15.5) and the 400 (1:05.03), led Ohio Wesleyan's women to a second place finish (79.5 points) behind the host Yellow Jackets (88) at the five-team Baldwin-Wallace Invitational.

NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND, OH Ohio Wesleyan University's **Steve Mitchell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** and Allegheny College's **Jeff Filkovski (Penn, PA/Penn-Trafford)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

Mitchell, a junior leftfielder, was 8-13 as the Bishops won two of three games in non-conference action. His week was highlighted by a 4-5 performance with a home run, double and two runs batted in against Division I Ohio State, May 2. The Buckeyes, who entered the game with a 40-9 record, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 16-7. In addition, Mitchell went 3-4 with two home runs and four RBI in an 11-1 triumph over Bellarmy, May 5. He also fired a complete game four-hitter and struck out nine in that game. Mitchell is hitting .297 this season with team-highs of 10 home runs and 42 RBI, while posting a 5-2 record with a 4.80 earned run average on the mound. The Bishops enter this week's NCAC Tournament with an overall record of 22-14-1 and a 14-8 mark in the Conference.

Filkovski, a senior righthander, was 2-0 on the week, earning the victory versus Division I Youngstown State on Apr. 30 and coming back to defeat Denison in game four of a crucial NCAC series on May 4. For the week, he went 10 1/3 innings and allowed just two earned runs to raise his record to 4-3 and lower his earned run average to 4.06. A two-sport standout, Filkovski quarterbacked the Gator football team to the national championship in the fall. He also is hitting .347 with eight home runs and 38 runs batted as the team's starting centerfielder. Allegheny enters this week's NCAC Tournament with an overall record of 22-17 and a 13-10 mark in the Conference.

RECORD BREAKERS: Allegheny senior **Penny Whiteman (Erie, PA/Villa Maria)**, a centerfielder on the Gator softball team, broke the school's career record for hits (179) and tied the career mark for doubles (31) as she went 9-10 with two doubles in a season-ending doubleheader versus Edinboro, May 2. Allegheny finished the season at 13-21 and will miss the NCAA Tournament for the first time in nine years.... Wooster senior lacrosseman **Andy Fox (Hanover, NH/Hanover)**, the NCAC's leading scorer with 33 goals and 56 assists for an average of 5.6 points per game, has broken the single-season school record for assists.... Wittenberg junior outfielder **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** has tied the single-season school record for doubles with 14. He is hitting .376 with four home runs and 33 runs batted in.

CAGE CLIPS: Eight NCAC men's and women's basketball players were ranked in the top 10 in the final 1990-91 Division III statistics, which were released last week. Oberlin senior guard **Ann Gilbert (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** led the North Coast contingent by finishing second in scoring with an average of 31.2 points per game -- the fourth-highest in Division III women's history. Other top-five finishes were turned in by Ohio Wesleyan junior wing **Krista Jacobs (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** and Denison junior guard **Lisa Attebery (Granville, OH/Granville)**, who were second (85.6) and third (85.0), respectively, in free throw percentage. Ohio Wesleyan senior wing **Dirk Miller (Westerville, OH/North)** and Allegheny senior guard **Perry Junius (Akron, OH/Kenmore)** led the men with seventh-place finishes in free throw percentage (89.6) and three-point field goals per game (3.5), respectively.... NCAC men's teams were represented in the top 10 eight times, led by Wittenberg's second-place showing in defensive field goal percentage (39.2) and fourths by Wooster in field goal percentage (52.2) and Wittenberg in scoring margin (22.1).

COACHES CORNER: Wooster lacrosse coaches **Jon Hind** and **Brenda Meese** have been selected to coach in post-season all-star games. Hind will coach in the Division III North/South All-Star Game, which will be held in Baltimore, June 8. Meese, meanwhile, will coach the Midwest III team at the USWLA National Tournament, which is scheduled for May 24-27 in Philadelphia.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Baseball Championship Preview

By virtue of its first-place finish during the regular season, Wittenberg University has earned the right to host the first North Coast Athletic Conference Baseball Championships. The four-team, double-elimination tournament will be held Friday-Sunday, May 10-12, at Municipal Stadium in Springfield, Ohio.

Wittenberg used eight victories in 12 games against chief rivals Allegheny College, Ohio Wesleyan University and The College of Wooster to claim the top spot in the standings and earn the tournament's first seed. Defending champion Wooster came on strong late in the spring by winning seven of its final eight NCAC contests to take second place and the second seed. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, dropped seven of its last 12 after a fast start in Conference play to fall to third, while Allegheny split four games with Denison University on the season's final weekend to hold onto the fourth spot.

The NCAC Tournament will get underway with a doubleheader Friday afternoon. Second-seeded Wooster will play third-seeded Ohio Wesleyan at 12:30 p.m., followed by top-seeded Wittenberg against fourth-seeded Allegheny at 4:00. The winners of Friday's games will square off Saturday at 9:30 a.m. for the right to advance to Sunday's championship contest. The three remaining squads will try and avoid elimination in Saturday's final two games (1:00/4:30 p.m.), with the team that emerges from the loser's bracket having to defeat the unbeaten team twice in the finals to claim the North Coast title.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the four teams involved in this year's NCAC Tournament.

ALLEGHENY

Allegheny (13-10; 22-17) has struggled of late, losing nine of 14 since putting together a school-record 14-game winning streak midway through the season. The Gators did regroup in time, however, to split four games with Denison on the season's final weekend to clinch a spot in the NCAC Tournament field. Eighth-year head coach Rick Creehan's young squad is second in the Conference in pitching (4.00 ERA) and fourth in scoring (6.8 rpg), but only sixth in hitting (.283) and fielding (.929).

Junior first baseman **Jim Huston (Youngstown, OH/Boardman)** and senior centerfielder **Jeff Filkovski (Penn, PA/Penn-Trafford)** head the Allegheny offense. Huston is hitting .354 with nine home runs and 38 runs batted in, while Filkovski, who doubles as the team's fourth starter, is at .347 with eight home runs and 38 RBI. Sophomore catcher/designated hitter **Ryan Jurkovic (Mt. Pleasant, PA/Mt. Pleasant)** also has performed well offensively with a team high .358 average to go with four home runs and 29 RBI. Senior leftlander **Dave Welmer (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline)** and sophomore righthander **Jason Cuomo (Follansbee, WV/Brooke)** give the Gators an excellent one-two punch on the mound. Welmer is 4-4 with a fine 2.97 earned run average, while Cuomo is 4-2 with a 4.88 ERA. Freshman righthander **Dean Peterson (Cortland, OH/Mathews)** has taken over as the team's closer, earning a school-record five saves to go with a 2-1 record and a team-best 2.12 ERA.

Allegheny was 4-8 against the other three tournament teams during the regular season, splitting four games with Wittenberg and dropping three of four to both Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster. The Gators have now had five consecutive 20 win seasons, during which time they have made two NCAA Tournament appearances (1985 and 1989).

OHIO WESLEYAN

The Bishops (14-8; 22-14-1) sat atop the NCAC standings at the midway point of the season, but losses in seven of their final 12 Conference games dropped them to the third position. Pitching is eighth-year head coach Roger Ingles' primary concern. Ohio Wesleyan is fifth in the North Coast with a 5.50 team earned run average. If the pitching holds, the Bishops will be a major factor with an explosive offense that is first in the North Coast in scoring (7.5 rpg) and second in hitting (.318).

Individually, sophomore catcher **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** leads the team in batting average (.377) and is second in home runs (7) and third in runs batted in (33). Junior **Steve Mitchell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)**, who plays left field when he is not pitching, has team highs of 10 home runs and 42 RBI to go with his .297 average. Sophomore second baseman **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** and senior centerfielder **Mark Glaser (Westerville, OH/North)** are hitting .371 and .344, respectively. Justice also has eight doubles, three triples and four home runs, while Glaser leads the team in stolen bases (31), walks (27) and times hit by pitch (10). Junior righthander **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)** has been the workhorse of the Ohio Wesleyan staff, earning a NCAC-record nine saves in 23 appearances, 22 of them out of the bullpen. Kaiser has posted a 3-4 record and a 3.78 ERA. Senior righthanders **John Nye (Columbus, OH/St. Charles)** and **Jim Miller (Seven Hills, OH/St. Ignatius)** are joined in the starting rotation by the southpaw Mitchell and freshman righthander **Ryan Burton (Cincinnati, OH/Glen Este)**. Mitchell leads that group with a 5-2 record and a 4.80 ERA.

Ohio Wesleyan was 7-5 against the other three tournament teams during the regular season, taking three of four from Allegheny and Wooster and dropping three of four to Wittenberg. The Bishops have won 20 or more games for six consecutive years and have made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1986, 1987 and 1990) since 1986.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg (16-7; 25-12), which came within one run of sharing the North Coast crown with Wooster last year, has established itself as the favorite in 1991 by claiming first place during the regular season to earn the right to host the NCAC Tournament. The Tigers, who won 12 of 14 Conference games during one critical stretch (against Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster) this spring, boast a potent offense that averages 7.4 runs per game, second-best in the North Coast. In addition, Wittenberg leads the NCAC in hitting at .326. The pitching, which was a major question mark heading into the season, has been dependable, ranking fourth in the Conference (4.98 ERA) despite a heavy reliance on five pitchers who had a combined record of 3-1 in 1990.

NCAC Baseball Championship Preview -- 2

First-year head coach Rick Willis has received excellent production from sophomore first baseman **Jeff Brown** (Springfield, OH/North), who leads the NCAC in batting average (.422), home runs (11) and runs batted in (tie, 43). Brown also has drawn 16 walks and has struck out just four times in 116 at bats. Junior outfielders **Matt Callahan** (Columbus, OH/Watterson) and **Chris Tillotson** (Glenview, IL/Glenbrook) also have provided offensive punch. Callahan is hitting .376 with 14 doubles, four home runs and 33 RBI, while Tillotson is at .354 with two home runs and 15 RBI. Sophomore shortstop **Jeff Baller** (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood) has chipped in with a .316 average and a team-high 23 walks. While no particular pitcher stands out, the Tigers' four man rotation of junior **Paul Salay** (Pepper Pike, OH/Orange), sophomore **Jeff Black** (Springfield, OH/North) and freshmen **Craig Isaac** (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern) and **Rob Wickard** (Jerry City, OH/Elmwood) has combined for a 21-10 record. Isaac (6-4, 4:27 ERA), who tossed a one-hit shutout in the decisive game of the Wooster series, and Salay (5-3, 4.33 ERA) have been the staff's leaders.

Wittenberg was 8-4 against the other three tournament teams during the regular season, splitting four games with Allegheny and taking three of four from Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster. The Tigers have recorded six consecutive 20-win seasons and are looking to advance to their first NCAA Tournament since a Division II appearance in 1968.

WOOSTER

The Fighting Scots (15-7; 25-10) have battled back from a mid-season slump to emerge as leading contenders for the 1991 title. Wooster closed out the regular season with nine wins in 10 games after dropping eight of the previous 15. Head coach Tim Pettorini's teams have won or shared four of the six NCAC championships, most often with dominating offenses. Pitching, however, has been the key this season as the Scots have posted far and away the lowest earned run average (3.02) of any team in the Conference. Wooster also leads the NCAC in defense (.955) and is third in hitting (.285) and scoring (6.2 rpg).

Seniors **Chris Bell** (Brookpark, OH/Olmsted Falls), **Matt Sherrieb** (Sarver, PA/Freeport) and **Tom Flynn** (Youngstown, OH/Mooney) are the cornerstones of the Scot offense. Bell, a second baseman, leads the team in batting average (.381), doubles (9), home runs (6) and runs batted in (43). Sherrieb, a third baseman, is hitting .342 with five home runs and 27 RBI, while Flynn, a centerfielder, is at .331 with team highs of 34 runs scored and 11 stolen bases. Junior leftfielder **Matt Burdette** (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Cuyahoga Falls) also has been a major contributor and is hitting .348 with 22 RBI. The four-man rotation of senior righthander **Jason Weiner** (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights), junior lefthander **Jeff Woller** (Butler, PA/Knoch), junior righthander **Gerry Sagerman** (Olmsted Fall, OH/Olmsted Falls) and senior lefthander **Mark Bricker** (Wooster, OH/Wooster) has been outstanding. Weiner (8-1, 2.25 ERA) leads the NCAC in wins, while Woller (4-2, 2.22 ERA) leads the way in ERA. Sagerman (3-3, 2.98 ERA) and Bricker (5-2, 3.18 ERA) also are among the Conference's stingiest pitchers.

The Scots were 5-7 against the other three tournament teams during the regular season, taking three of four from Allegheny and dropping three of four to Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg. Wooster, which has made six straight NCAA Tournament appearances, is working on its seventh consecutive 25-win season.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Golf Championship Preview

With five nationally recognized programs in the field, traffic atop the leaderboard at the 1991 North Coast Athletic Conference Golf Championships should resemble rush hour on I-71 north of Columbus. Four-time defending champion Ohio Wesleyan University heads the eight-team field, which will come together for the 36-hole event on Friday and Saturday, May 10-11, at the 6,946-yard, par 72 Apple Valley Golf Course in Howard, Ohio.

The Bishops, who have had at least a six-stroke margin in each of their four championships, will face stern challenges from Allegheny College, host Kenyon College, Wittenberg University and The College of Wooster. Case Western Reserve University, Denison University and Earlham College complete the NCAC scorecard and figure to battle for the final three positions. Ohio Wesleyan overcame a two-stroke deficit with an outstanding 301 in the second round to win last year's event. First-round leader Wittenberg fell to second despite trimming four strokes off its opening score, while Allegheny placed a solid third. Each of the top three finishers received bids to the NCAA Championships, where Ohio Wesleyan finished in a tie for second, Wittenberg in a tie for fourth and Allegheny 21st.

Ohio Wesleyan, which is ranked third in latest NCAA Division III poll, is joined in the rankings by Allegheny (sixth), Wooster (10th), Wittenberg (12th) and Kenyon (tie, 20th). In six seasons, current North Coast teams have compiled a total of 20 national top 20 finishes. Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster lead the way with five, followed by Allegheny and Wittenberg with four, and Denison and Kenyon with one. Allegheny (1983) and Wooster (1975) are two of only five schools to have ever won a Division III golf championship.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's eight teams

ALLEGHENY

Allegheny showed that it will be a contender for this year's title by besting three other NCAC squads and winning the 22-team Denison/Capital Invitational, Apr. 21-22. The Gators, in fact, have finished ahead of each of the Conference's top teams at one point during the season. Depth is the key to Allegheny's success as six players currently boast sub-80 averages. Heading into a final tuneup at the Baldwin-Wallace/Hiram Invitational on May 4-5, juniors **George Laskey (Hopwood, PA/Geibel)** and **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** lead the team with 77.5 averages. Junior **Alex Davis (Newton, MA/Rivers)** also averages 77.5 in part-time duty, but may have created a spot in veteran head coach Norm Sundstrom's lineup with his recent play. Senior **George Geregach (Coraopolis, PA/Montour)**, junior **Marc Voytko (Johnstown, PA/McCort)** and freshman **Dave Stockman (Washington, PA/McMillan)** also have been impressive with averages of 77.8, 78.5 and 79.0, respectively. Swanson was the team's top performer at the Gator Golf Classic, Apr. 26-27, finishing in a tie for sixth. Allegheny was third in the eight-team event, but only two of the teams were from Division III -- the other, ninth-ranked Rochester, placed fourth. Swanson, Geregach, Stockman and Voytko swept positions three-six to pace the Gators' victory at the Denison/Capital Invitational.

CASE RESERVE

The Spartans have never placed higher than fifth at the NCAC Tournament, but fourth-year head coach Ron Stuckey's squad could turn some heads this spring if they can put back-to-back rounds together. Juniors **Dean Kohmann (Fairlawn, OH/Copley)** and **Eric Zahn (Hampstead, MD/Hereford)** highlight the Case Reserve lineup. Kohmann leads the team with an 85.0 stroke average, while Zahn is next at 86.0. Zahn fired a 79 to earn medalist honors at the 12-team Malone Invitational, Apr. 27, where the Spartans placed fifth. He also led the team to a fourth-place finish (of seven) at the UAA Championships (Apr. 18-19), placing ninth and carding a tournament-low 77 in the second round. Freshman **Shawn Chartrand (Lima, OH/Senior)** has been an important addition and should contribute.

DENISON

Denison was the surprise of the 1990 NCAC Championships, firing a fine 318 on the second day to finish fifth overall. The Big Red, whose most recent NCAA Tournament berth came in 1984, is hoping to build on last year's solid finish and return to the top of the North Coast. Three of last spring's top four performers are back in juniors **Steve Buecking (Barrington, IL/Barrington)**, **Scott Thomas (St. Louis, MO/Burroughs)** and **Chris Walling (Kingsville, OH/Marian (IN))**. Walling was 16th at last season's NCAC Championships, while Buecking and Thomas both cracked the top 25. Seniors **David Gillies (Springfield, IL/Southeast)** and **Keith Schulz (Wilmette, IL/New Trier)** also could be factors for head coach Sam Dixon's squad.

EARLHAM

Fourth-year head coach Frank Carr is looking to improve upon last spring's eighth-place NCAC finish. The Quakers' sophomore-laden lineup has shown signs of improvement in 1991, but the North Coast's first division is still a ways off. Included in that group of sophomores are this year's top two performers -- **Mark Wheeler (Spencer, IN/Owen Valley)** and **Ken Huus (Evansville, IN/Day)**. Huus owns the squad's best round (86) to date, while Wheeler and fellow sophomore **Stan Hill (Decatur, IN/Adams Central)** also are capable of putting up solid numbers.

KENYON

Kenyon has quietly built an outstanding program, having placed second, third and fourth, respectively, in the North Coast over the past three seasons. Included in that successful string was the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1980. Second-year head coach Mike Pilger's squad is led by a talented trio of seniors -- **Matt Alcorn (Irwin, PA/Penn-Trafford)**, **Andrew Art (Williamstown, MA/Mt. Greylock)** and **Alex Hinrichs (Houston, TX/ST. John's)**. All three players average in the sub-80 range and are capable of shooting low scores, as is evidenced by the Lords' outstanding 298 in the second round of the Muskingum Invitational on

Apr. 6. Hinrichs led the way by scorching the par-72 Cambridge Country Club layout with a course record 69 on his way to a fifth-place finish. Kenyon has posted three top-five finishes this spring, including a fourth at the 14-team Wittenberg Invitational (Apr. 28-29) and a fifth at the 16-team Muskingum event. Art has the team's best individual finish to date, earning medalist honors at Wittenberg with a two-day total of 150. Seniors **Daryl Hultquist (Ann Arbor, MI/Greenhills)** and **Simon Yoo (South Euclid, OH/Normandy)** round out the Lords' lineup

OHIO WESLEYAN

With three tournament victories in six starts this spring, four-time defending champ Ohio Wesleyan must be considered the favorite heading into the NCAC Tournament. The Bishops tied for second nationally last season and have finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships in each of the past five years. Veteran head coach Dick Gordin's lineup features three players with sub-80 averages -- junior **Galen Eckland (Lake Geneva, WI/Badger)** leads the way at 77.9, followed by junior **Matt Roth (Sidney, OH/Sidney)** at 78.6 and senior **Barry Pry (Findlay, OH/Findlay)** at 79.3. Eckland and Roth are new to the NCAC scene, having transferred to Ohio Wesleyan last fall from Duke and Methodist, respectively. Pry finished in a tie for 12th at the 1990 NCAC Championships and went on to earn first-team All-America honors with a second-place national showing. Pry, who also was an All-America selection (third team) in 1989, has posted the Bishops' best individual finish this spring, claiming medalist honors at the Muskingum Invitational (Apr. 5-6) with a two-over par 146. Freshman **J.W. Wilson (Zanesville, OH/Rosecrans)** and senior **Jon Whithaus (Findlay, OH/Findlay)** round out the Ohio Wesleyan lineup and are averaging 80.3 and 81.2, respectively.

WITTENBERG

The Tigers tuned up for the NCAC Championships with an impressive six-stroke victory at the Wittenberg Invitational, Apr. 28-29. It was the fourth consecutive year that the Tigers have won the event, which featured Ohio Wesleyan, Wooster and Kenyon in the 14-team field. Junior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** leads head coach Dave Maurer's squad and all of the NCAC with a sparkling 77.2 stroke average. Lyons, a two-time All-America, was the medalist at the 22-team Denison/Capital Invitational on Apr. 21-22 before placing second at the Wittenberg event. He was the individual champion at the 1990 NCAC Tournament after jumping out to three-stroke lead in the first round with a two over par 72, the best score of the Tournament. Lyons went on to finish third at the NCAA Championships and earn first-team All-America honors. Senior **Scott Allen (Akron, OH/Firestone)**, who has a fine 79.5 average and has been the team's top finisher in two events this spring, joins Lyons at the top of the Tiger lineup. He finished ninth at the NCAC Tournament last year to earn second team All-Conference honors. Senior **Karl Postler (Rochester, NY/Sutherland)**, a third-team All-America selection in 1990, also should be a factor.

WOOSTER

Wooster will be looking to bounce back from its worst NCAC finish ever -- sixth -- in 1990. The Scots, who also failed to advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in eight years last spring, appear to have pushed aside those troubles and will be looking to reclaim the North Coast title they last won in 1985. Head coach Bob Nye's troops have posted a pair of second-place finishes this spring, including one at the 14-team Wittenberg Invitational, Apr. 28-29. Junior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)**, who finished fifth at the Wittenberg event, leads the team with a 78.5 stroke average. He is joined by sophomores **Darren Schubert (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** and **Randy Pitts (Jacksonville, FL/Episcopal)**, who are at 79.9 and 80.2, respectively. Schubert is in his first year at Wooster, while Pitts led the squad with an outstanding 76.3 average a year ago and earned second-team All-Conference honors with a ninth place finish at the NCAC Championships. Junior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** completes the Scots' top four with an average of 80.9. He owns the team's low score with a 70 in the first round at the Muskingum Invitational, Apr. 5-6, where Wooster placed second of 16 teams.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Men's Track & Field Championship Preview

The 1991 North Coast Athletic Conference Men's Outdoor Track & Field Championships, to be held May 10-11 at Case Western Reserve University's Finnigan Field, will feature a familiar confrontation. Denison University, which won the first five NCAC outdoor titles and claimed its fourth indoor championship this winter, and Ohio Wesleyan University, the defending outdoor champ and a two-time winner indoors, are co-favorites at this year's meet.

Allegheny College, host Case Reserve, Earlham College, Kenyon College, Oberlin College, Wittenberg University and The College of Wooster round out the field. Each of the seven have contenders in a number of events that will make the meet more than just a two-team show. Wooster, which claimed an NCAC indoor title in 1988, is the only team other than Denison and Ohio Wesleyan to win a North Coast men's track championship.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

The Galois have a string of third-place finishes in both the outdoor and indoor championships that make them the leading candidate to break up the top two of Denison and Ohio Wesleyan. At the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships, Allegheny again finished third, just five points behind second-place Ohio Wesleyan. Sophomore **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** is a favorite in the sprints after he won the 300 at last winter's indoor meet. In addition, he already has qualified for the NCAA Championships in the 200 (21.3) and owns the Conference's top time in the event by a full second. The mile relay combination of freshman **Mike Penn (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)**, Drayton and seniors **Jeff Stone (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit)** and **Mike Goodelle (Erie, PA/McDowell)** set an indoor championship record (3:26.95). Senior **Andy Wright (Cleveland Heights, OH/Cleveland Heights)** has the NCAC's top effort in the pole vault (14' 9") so far this season.

CASE RESERVE

The Spartans have finished lower than fourth only once in six NCAC Outdoor Championships, and with more national qualifiers (three) than all of the other North Coast squads combined during the past indoor season, Case Reserve appears ready to challenge again this spring. Freshman **Marc Anderson (Alliance, OH/Alliance)**, who has qualified for nationals in the shot put both indoors and outdoors this year, has the second best toss (51' 5 1/2") in the Conference this season. Senior **Kevin Luthy (Sullivan, OH/Black River)**, the defending NCAA Division III decathlon champion and the 1991 NCAC Indoor Most Valuable Field Performer, will look to defend his pole vault and high jump titles. Luthy recently placed third and qualified for nationals in the decathlon at the prestigious Penn Relays, where he was one of only two Division III athletes in a 13-man field. He also posted the NCAC's top high jump (6' 8") at that event.

DENISON

At last winter's indoor championships, the Big Red claimed a total of 16 All-NCAC honors, more than any other team, on the way to their fourth title in seven years. Denison, which has five firsts and a second in six North Coast Outdoor Championships, has one of the Conference's top performers in nearly every event so far this spring. Senior **Terry Smith (Gary, IN/Roosevelt)** won the triple jump (43' 7 3/4") and was runner up in the long jump (22' 2") and high jump (6' 4") at this year's indoor meet. Smith has qualified for the NCAA Championships and has the Conference's best effort in the long jump (23' 10 3/4") this season, as well as the fastest time in the 100 (10.7) and the best triple jump (44' 8"). Senior **Dave Dukat (Canton, OH/Central Catholic)** returns to defend his outdoor title in the 400 and improve upon his third-place finish in the 200. Dukat was named Most Valuable Track Performer at the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships after earning All-Conference honors in the 440 (first, 51.24), 300 (second, 32.38) and long jump (third, 21' 7 1/4"). Senior **Mike Behrendt (Columbus, OH/American (Stuttgart, Germany))**, who was third in the steeplechase and the 10,000 in last year's outdoor meet, was the mile champion indoors (4:24.2) this season and holds the fastest Conference time in the 1500 this spring (3:59.1). Freshman **Tim Dunham (Larimie, WY/Larimie)** has burst onto the NCAC scene, recording the spring's fastest time in the 3000 steeplechase (9:44.4).

EARLHAM

Two of the five athletes who earned All NCAC honors at last season's outdoor championships return for the Quakers, who placed sixth in 1990. Sophomore **Tim Doyle (Kettering, OH/Fairmont)** was second in the steeplechase last spring and is the top returning finisher in that event. Sophomore **Karim Hamud (Ramallah, Palestine/Richmond, IN)**, who was runner-up in the 1500 last season, also is back but is coming off an injury and may not be a factor. Junior **Scott Pearson (Cincinnati, OH/Finneytown)**, who has far and away the Conference's best time in the 10,000 (33:27.0) this spring, also has the second best mark in the 5000 (15:18.4) and should be a big scorer for Earlham.

KENYON

Senior **James Fleming (Newark, OH/Silver (NM))** and sophomore **Eli Thomas (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** lead the Lords' bid to improve upon last season's eighth place finish. Fleming and Thomas were champions in the 600 (1:15.04) and 880 (1:58.17), respectively, at this year's NCAC Indoor Championships. Fleming also anchored Kenyon's second-place mile relay team (3:31.67) at that event, while Thomas has posted the Conference's second-fastest time in the 800 (1:55.1) this spring. Senior **Ken Cole (Boardman, OH/Boardman)**, who has the second-best triple jump (44' 7 1/2") and the fourth best time in the 400 hurdles (56.6) in the North Coast this season, also will be a factor.

NCAC Men's Track & Field Championship Preview -- 2

OBERLIN

Standout sprinter **Delfon Curlpepper (Detroit, MI/Western)** is back to lead the Yeomen after winning both the 100 and 200 titles and anchoring the second-place 4x100 relay team in 1990. In this winter's NCAC Indoor Championship, Curlpepper, a senior, won the 60 (6.64) and anchored the second-place 880 relay (1:34.78). He has broken the 11-second barrier in the 100 (10.9) and 23-second mark in the 200 (22.5) this spring, both among the top four times in the Conference. In the distance events, All NCAC senior **Nate Pawelek (Hamden, CT/Hamden)** is back and looking to improve upon his third-place finish in the 800 last spring. Pawelek, who won the 1000 (2:16.05) indoors this season, has the NCAC's top time in the 800 (1:54.0) this year.

OHIO WESLEYAN

The Bishops remain strong and appear poised to defend their title against challenges from indoor champion Denison and a host of others. En route to winning the outdoor championship in 1990, Ohio Wesleyan picked up a total of 13 All NCAC honors and followed that with 11 at the indoor meet earlier this year. Junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))** is a heavy favorite in the shot put and discus. He won both titles last year and is the defending Division III indoor and outdoor champion in the shot. Rucker has the top throws in the NCAC in both events -- 55' 8 1/2" in the shot and 160' in the discus -- this spring. The Bishops swept the top three places in the discus last year and senior **Jeff Court (Galion, OH/Galion)** and sophomore **Chuck Bernatos (Mantua, OH/Crestwood)** are back after finishing second and third, respectively. That trio also has accounted for three of the top five distances in the discus this season. Senior **Darby Buroker (Lima, OH/Shawnee)**, the 1990 NCAC Outdoor Most Valuable Track Performer, is the defending 800 and 1500 champion and was runner up in the 880 (1:58.80) and the mile (4:25.0) indoors this year. Ohio Wesleyan always performs well in the relays, winning both the 880 and the mile last spring and taking the 880 indoors this winter.

WITTENBERG

Freshman **Dwight Carter (Columbus, OH/Linden-McKinley)** was runner-up in the 60 hurdles (7.94) at this year's indoor championships and became the Tigers' first-ever All-NCAC performer. Carter is among the favorites in the 110 hurdles after recording the fastest time in that event this spring (14.7) and qualifying for nationals. He also should show well in the 400 hurdles and the 200. Other individual contenders include sophomores **Anthony Allen (Cincinnati, OH/Mt. Healthy)** in the discus, javelin and shot put, and **Eric Dowell (Huntsville, OH/Indian Lake)**, who is tied for the second best performance in the NCAC in the high jump (6' 6") this spring. Wittenberg also will provide challenges in the sprints with sophomore **Matt Fogarty (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** and freshman **Brian Boyed (Lima, OH/Senior)** in the 100 and 200. Carter and Fogarty ran two legs of Wittenberg's third-place mile relay (3:31.89) at the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships.

WOOSTER

The Scots, who placed either second or third at the first four NCAC Outdoor Championships, will be looking to get back to that level after falling to sixth and fifth, respectively, over the past two years. Individually, junior **Mark Marrando (Pittsburgh, PA/Mt. Lebanon)** hopes to add an outdoor long jump title to go with the indoor championship (22' 4 1/2") he earned this winter. Wooster is strongest in the distance events and will depend on that strength to break into the top four. Sophomore **Jason Kelley (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** has top-six times in the 1500 (4:01.3) and 5000 (15:52.0) this spring. He finished second in the three-mile (15:21.4) and third in the mile (4:28.9) at the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships and was a national qualifier in cross country in the fall. Senior **Rob Noble (Pepper Pike, OH/Orange)** also figures to be a contender in the 1500 and 5000. The Scots have two of the spring's top four performers in the 3000 steeplechase with junior **Mike Rachita (Massillon, OH/Jackson)** in second (9:53.1) and senior **Joel McBurney (Boardman, OH/Boardman)** holding down fourth (10:07.0).

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Women's Track & Field Championship Preview

The distance running of Allegheny College and the sprinting of Ohio Wesleyan University will highlight the 1991 North Coast Athletic Conference Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships, to be held May 10-11 at Case Western Reserve University's Finnigan Field. Allegheny claimed its first outdoor title last spring and finished second indoors this winter to 1990 outdoor runner up Ohio Wesleyan. The two squads have split a pair of NCAC outdoor championships since breaking a four-year stronghold by The College of Wooster in 1989. Denison University, Oberlin College and Kenyon College have all had top-four finishes in recent years and should join Wooster as the meet's top challengers. Earlham College, Wittenberg University and host Case Reserve round out the field and will look to make a move in the standings.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

Leading a strong crew of distance runners is senior **Katie Tiedemann (Skaneateles, NY/Skaneateles)**, who won the 3000 and was runner up in the 5000 and 10,000 last year. Tiedemann won the mile (5:12.8) at the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships and was second in both the 1000 (2:49.05) and the two mile (11:16.2). At the outdoor meet last year, the Gators swept the top three places in the 3000, 5000 and 10,000 with five different runners, and they all finished within two one-hundredths of a second from each other each time. Senior **Lynda Kohl (Cedar Knolls, NJ/St. Elizabeth)**, who was the 5000 winner and the third-place finisher in the 10,000, has the top time in the Conference in the 3000 (10:16.8), 5000 (17:36.6) and 10,000 (36:41.7) this spring. Sophomore **Jean McKinney (Cumberland, ME/Greely)** is the team's top sprinter, holding the NCAC's second best times in the 100 (12.8) and 200 (26.8). In addition, she is tied for the best mark in the long jump (16' 8"). In the field events, sophomore **Jennifer Ugine (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)** returns to defend her triple jump title and improve on her third-place finish in the long jump.

CASE RESERVE

Junior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)**, the defending 100 hurdles champion and runner-up in the 400 hurdles, is the Spartan most likely to draw some attention at the meet. She has the Conference's second best time to date in the 100 hurdles (16.1) and the fifth-fastest in the 400 hurdles (67.9). Case Reserve's 4x100 relay time is the second best in the NCAC (52.7). Freshman **Carol Lorimor (Warren, NJ/Watchung Hills)** will lead the squad in 5000, while classmate **Janet Linnatta (Millersville, MD/Millersville)** should challenge in the discus and shot put as the Spartans try to improve upon their sixth place finish of a year ago.

DENISON

Denison hopes to rid itself of the tag, "the best of the rest," in NCAC women's track. The Big Red have, however, taken third behind Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan in the latest indoor and outdoor championships. Senior **Kate Fechtel (Youngstown, OH/Ursuline)** has a number of North Coast titles to her credit, including the 800 outdoors last year and the 880 (2:25.01) and 1000 (2:46.42) indoors last winter when she was named Most Valuable Track Performer. Fechtel has the Conference's top times in the 1500 (4:41.4) and 800 (2:21.2) this spring. Sophomore **Caroline Hill (Kensington, NH/Exeter Area)** has the NCAC's best time in the 400 (59.2) this season and was runner-up in the 600 (1:30.3) at this year's indoor meet. Freshman **Stacie Molnar (Leechburg, PA/Kiski Area)** and senior **Kris Dellapina (Springfield, OH/South)** figure to challenge in both hurdle events, while senior **Tasha Cranell (Silver Spring, MD/Springbrook)** is a favorite in the discus and shot put.

EARLHAM

On a squad made up almost exclusively of freshmen and sophomores, freshman **Kassandra Wright (Richmond, IN/Richmond)** stands out with the NCAC's third best time this spring in the 100 (12.0). Wright also could be a factor in the 200. Junior **Vanessa Hildebrand (Boulder, CO/Boulder)** is among the leaders in the 5000 (19:49.2), while sophomore **Stephanie Miller (Defiance, OH/Defiance)** has the seventh-best time in the 800 (2:25.8). The Quakers should be fairly strong in the field events, where they will be well-represented by freshmen **Shannon Ferguson (Coatesville, IN/Cascade)**, in the high jump and long jump, and **Erika Schlaak (Huron, OH/Huron)**, in the shot put and discus.

KENYON

A pair of sprinters, freshman **Amy Cook (Jasper, TX/Jasper)** and sophomore **Rani Woodard (St. Louis, MO/Clayton)**, earned All-NCAC honors in leading the Ladies to a fourth-place finish at the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships. Cook was third in the 60 (7.80), while Woodard took the title in the 300 (38.69) and finished third in the 440 (63.13). Cook has the Conference's fifth-best time in the 100 (13.4) this spring, while Woodard is third in the 200 (27.1). Freshman **Colleen Severance (Wadsworth, OH/Wadsworth)** should be a factor in both hurdle events -- she has the fifth-best time in the 100 (16.5) and the sixth best in the 400 (68.2). Sophomore **Kelley Wilder (Victor, NY/Victor)** will be a strong scorer in the distance events. She finished third in both the mile (5:16.2) and two mile (11:23.6) at this year's indoor meet and was a national qualifier in cross country during the fall. She has the second-fastest time in the NCAC this season in the 1500 (4:43.8) and 3000 (10:23.5). Senior **Karen Adams (Pittsburgh, PA/Chartiers Valley)**, who shares the Conference's top mark in the long jump (16' 8"), leads the way in the field events.

BERLIN

The Yeowomen finished fourth at last year's outdoor meet, but have lost all but one of their All-NCAC performers. Oberlin's strongest contenders come in the field events, although distance runners **Becky Woodward**

(St. Louis, MO/Westtown (PA)), a sophomore, and Liz Maurice (East Massapequa, NY/Amityville), a senior, could be factors. Senior Susan Van Gundy (Elkins, WV/Elkins) anchors the field events as the team's top high jumper (4' 10") and long jumper (16' 7"). Her effort in the long jump is the third-best in the Conference this year. Freshman Megan Schulte (Upland, CA/Upland) also should bring in some points as she owns the NCAC's third- and fifth best throws in the discus (111' 6") and shot (34' 10 1/2"), respectively.

OHIO WESLEYAN

The defending NCAC indoor and outdoor champions look to make another run at the outdoor title this season. Although Audrey Neely, the NCAC's Most Valuable Field Performer in 1990, did not return to defend her championships in the discus and shot put, the Bishops do have sophomore Amy Yothers (Powell, OH/Olentangy) back after she finished second in the shot and third in the discus as a freshman. Yothers has the best NCAC throw of the season in the shot put (37' 7 1/2") and second-best in the discus (123' 3"). Always strong in the field events, Ohio Wesleyan has senior Juli Althoff (Sylvania, OH/Northview) for one more meet. Althoff has won seven North Coast high jump titles and needs this one for a clean sweep of the indoor and outdoor championships for her career. She has posted the Conference's best effort to date (5' 5 1/4") and will be the favorite once again. Freshman Kerry Kirkland (Akron, OH/Revere) won the indoor 60 (7.73) last winter and has the top time in the NCAC this spring in the 100 (12.6) and 200 (26.3). Senior Kelly McNamara (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park) finished second in the 100 hurdles last season and won the 60 hurdles (9.15) at this year's indoor meet. She has the top time in the NCAC in the 100 hurdles (15.3) and 400 hurdles (62.5) this season. Senior Leigh Sears (Dublin, OH/Dublin) has the North Coast's top triple jump (34' 1"), rounding out the list of Bishop highlights.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg brings a roster made up primarily of freshmen and sophomores to this year's NCAC Outdoor Championships. Distance runner Leigh Pawling (Dallas, PA/Dallas), the team's lone senior, should perform well in the 5000. Sophomores Kelly Garbig (Greenville, OH/Greenville) and Kim Johnston (Fairport, NY/Fairport) will have to continue their fine performances for the Tigers to improve upon their eighth-place finish of a year ago. Garbig has the Conference's third-best throw in the javelin (99' 7") this spring, while Johnston has the fourth best effort in the long jump (16' 5 3/4") and the ninth-best in the triple jump (32' 1 3/4"). Garbig also could score in the 100 hurdles, where she has posted the North Coast's seventh-best time (17.8).

WOOSTER

The Lady Scots finished in fifth place at both the 1991 NCAC Indoor Championships and last year's outdoor meet. Three individual champions from those meets will appear at this year's event. Sophomore Tammy Berger (Beavercreek, OH/Beavercreek), indoor long jump (16' 10") champion, sophomore Krista Hicks (Rockville, MD/Rockville), outdoor long jump champion, and freshman Shannon O'Neill (Rochester, NY/Mercy), indoor 440 (61.82) champion, will try to dominate their events once again. A trio of Wooster distance runners should show well in the 5000 and 10,000. Juniors Beth Blakemore (Golden, CO/Wheat Ridge), Karen Aeberli (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny) and Anna Scherzer (Berea, OH/Berea) have three of the NCAC's top four times in the 10,000 and three of the top six in the 5000. Junior Jannette Link (Crestline, OH/Colonel Crawford), who has the Conference's top throw in the javelin (107' 7"), and senior Kristen Larke (Carrollton, OH/Malvern), who is fourth in the shot put (35' 4"), lead Wooster in the field events.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Men's Tennis Championship Preview

The 1991 North Coast Athletic Conference Men's Tennis Championships will be held Friday and Saturday, May 10-11, at The College of Wooster. A year ago, Wooster hosted the men's tourney and took the title with a 5-2 decision over Denison University in the championship final.

Parity has reached the upper echelon of the NCAC in the late '80s and early '90s. For several years now, Kenyon College, Wooster, Denison and Oberlin College have been fighting amongst themselves for the Conference title, and more often than not, the outcome has been in question right up to the last service ace or cross-court winner. Last year's addition of Wittenberg University to the NCAC has provided even more competition to the championship race.

Denison had a monopoly on the first four NCAC Championships through 1988, sharing its crown only once with Wooster in 1985. In 1989, the Big Red were forced to split the title three ways, with Wooster and Kenyon, while Oberlin settled for a close fourth place finish. The 1990 tournament saw Wooster claim its first outright championship, with Denison, Oberlin and Kenyon following in places two, three and four, respectively.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

The Gators (1-6; 6-14), always a solid NCAC entry, have been hurt by injuries and defections this spring but still figure to make a good showing. Head coach Mark Fleming returns senior **Matt Michalski (Williamsville, NY/St. Joseph's)** to the top of the lineup, moving from #2 a year ago to #1 this season. Michalski is 6-0 at the top position and 14-9 overall. Freshman **Joe Gette (Girard, PA/Girard)** fills the #3 position, where he is 8-8 (15-10 overall). Junior **Eric Morrow (Windham, NH/Pinkerton)** also has been playing well and is 7-7 at #4 and 14-10 overall. The Gators' top doubles team is Michalski and sophomore **Tony Faso (Pittsburgh, PA/North Allegheny)**, who are 7-8 at #1 and 12-9 overall.

CASE RESERVE

The Spartans (0-5; 6-6) have not won any NCAC matches this season, but they have come close a number of times, losing to both Ohio Wesleyan and Allegheny by a 5-4 scores. Having gained more experience under second-year head coach Jon Hall, Case Reserve's young squad has a chance to reverse those decisions and/or other outcomes from earlier in the season. The Spartans most productive players to date have been #5 **Raja Nalluri (Canfield, OH/Boardman)** with a 5-2 record and #6 **Sheriff Sahadulla (Ras Tanura, Saudi Arabia/Kodaikanal)** with a 4-2 ledger.

DENISON

After failing to win a conference title for the first time in 12 years (including a streak of six in the OAC) last spring, Denison (5-2; 12-7) would like to climb back into the winner's circle in 1991. So far, however, the likes of Kenyon and Wooster have taken advantage of the Big Red's inexperience. First year head coach Peter Burling's squad is led by **Will Knox (Erie, PA/Academy)**, who is in his first year as a full-time player as a junior. Knox has parlayed a 10-7 record at #1 singles into a national ranking of 41st and an invitation to the NCAA Tournament. Sophomores **Brian Maebius (San Antonio, TX/Alamo Heights)** and **Eric Getzinger (Toledo, OH/St. John's)** hold down the #2 and #3 positions, respectively, while senior **Jaan Douma (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)** has earned Denison's #4 slot. Depth is an attribute common to the NCAC's top teams, and Denison's #5, **Matt Watson (Orchard Park, NY/Orchard Park)**, and #6, newcomer **Dave Fleming (Newark, OH/Silver (NM))**, have been the Big Red's big winners this spring. Watson is 12-5 (14-5 overall) and Fleming is 9-4 (10-5). Maebius and Knox, 10-8 at #1 doubles, also have been invited to compete in the NCAA Tournament later this spring.

EARLIHAM

Earlham (0-6; 1-10) is winless in NCAC competition this season, but should get its first shot at Case Reserve in the preliminary round of the tournament. Head coach Pat Williams' Quakers are led by senior **Dave Young (Portland, IN/Jay County)** at the #1 position. Junior **Jeff Keller (Wakefield, RI/South Kingston)** at #2 and freshman **Steve Stoneburner (Greensboro, NC/Grimsley)** at #3 also have been productive this spring. Stoneburner owns the team's best record at 5-6.

KENYON

Kenyon (7-0; 18-4) appears to be the favorite entering this year's championship competition. The Lords currently stand 12th in the Division III poll and will be competing in the NCAA Tournament later in the spring. Led by #1 singles player **David Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville)**, second-year head coach Paul Wardlaw's squad has gone undefeated in the NCAC round robin to reserve the first seed in this year's tournament. Register, a senior, is 14-6 at #1 singles and ranked 46th nationally. With junior **Bill Jonas (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends)** playing #2 and freshman **Scott Sherman (Western Springs, IL/Lyons Township)** at #3, Kenyon is loaded at the top of the lineup. Jonas is 13-6 at his position, while Sherman has won his last seven matches to improve to 11-3 at #3 and 18-4 overall. Juniors **Greg Ganter (Larchmont, NY/Lyce Francais)** and **Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)** add both experience and depth to the already strong lineup. Ganter is 10-3 at #4 (14-7 overall) and Stauffer is 12-5 at #5 (14-5 overall). In addition, Jonas and Stauffer join forces as the 19th-ranked doubles teams in Division III. They are 9-4 this year and have been invited to play in the NCAA Tournament, where Stauffer also will participate in singles. Register and Sherman, meanwhile, are 12-1 at #2 doubles. Earlier this season, the Lords took second in the prestigious GLCA Tournament in Greencastle, Ind., upsetting 10th-ranked host DePauw in the semifinals before bowing to top-ranked Kalamazoo in the finals.

NCAC Men's Tennis Championship Preview -- 2

OBERLIN

Oberlin (4-4; 14-9) is a lot tougher than its .500 North Coast record might imply. With 5-4 losses to Kenyon and Wittenberg, and 6-3 losses to Wooster and Denison, the Yeomen, guided by 1990 NCAC Co-Coach of the Year Don Hunsinger, are always within striking distance. Junior **Moustapha Diop (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))** and his younger brother **Ousmane (Ties, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, a freshman, hold down the #1 and #3 spots, respectively. Both have collected impressive records over the season -- Moustapha is 23-12 overall, while Ousmane is 24-8. Freshman **Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** also been outstanding for the Yeomen, piling up an overall record of 27-8. Oberlin's #1 doubles team of Erikson and the younger Diop are playing remarkably well at 14-5 overall, especially considering that they are both just freshmen.

OHIO WESLEYAN

Ohio Wesleyan (3-5; 11-7), under the direction of veteran head coach Gene Mehaffey, has recorded North Coast wins over Allegheny, Case Reserve and Earlham this spring. As the NCAC Tournament's sixth seed, the Bishops are only one upset away from the Conference semifinals. Ohio Wesleyan's #1 netter is senior **Bill DuBols (Hartford, CT/Kingswood-Oxford)**, who played in the NCAA Tournament in doubles a year ago. He is supported by freshman **Brad Moore (Gallon, OH/Gallon)**, who is 11-7 at #3, and senior **Ed Brooks (Ambler, PA/Hatboro Horsham)**, who is 11-6 at #5. Freshman **Luke Chapman (Portsmouth, OH/Portsmouth)** has the squad's best record, 13-4 at #6. Moore and senior **Nick Johnson (Columbus, OH/St. Charles)** lead the way in doubles with a 12-5 mark at the #2 spot.

WITTENBERG

Wittenberg (5-3; 10-3) finds itself in the top four going into the NCAC Tournament after defeating Oberlin in a hard fought 5-4 match last month. Sophomore sensation **Martin Bulow (Gothberg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))** has posted a fine 9-3 record at #1. At #2, sophomore **Justin Russel (Vienna, VA/Blue Ridge)** has been nearly flawless with an 11-1 record. Senior **Scott Russell (Kettering, OH/Alter)** fills the #3 spot in head coach Ron Murphy's lineup, while sophomore **Jack Miller (Hudson, OH/Hudson)** plays at #4. Junior **Joe Hooker (Grand Rapids, MI/Westminster)**, who did not play in 1990, has been a key addition and is 8-3 at #6 and 10-3 overall.

WOOSTER

Wooster (7-1; 17-5) is back with a vengeance this season and finds itself ranked among the nation's top 20. The second seed heading into the NCAC Championships, the Scots have their eye on an upset of Kenyon in the finals, which would run their championship streak to three. Earlier this season, Wooster dropped a 6-2 decision to the Lords, but the Scots have been gaining momentum as the tournament approaches. A good illustration of how Wooster, under 1990 NCAC Co Coach of the Year Hayden Schilling, has come on of late is its 8-1 win over Denison two weeks ago after suffering a 5-4 loss to the Big Red at the GICA Tournament earlier in April. Junior **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)** leads the way for Schilling with a 15-7 record at #1. His record has been improving throughout the season and he has been invited to the 1991 NCAA Tournament. Freshman **Warren Cham-A-Koon (Great Falls, MT/Great Falls)** has also contributed greatly, compiling a 13-5 record at #2. Juniors **Dan Rosenbaum (Washington, DC/Field)** and **Eric Hicks (Newark, NY/Newark Senior)** also have been outstanding. Rosenbaum is 15-1 at #3 and 17-3 overall, while Hicks is 8-3 at #4 and 16-5 overall.

North Coast Athletic Conference 1991 Women's Tennis Championship Preview

Kenyon College and Denison University figure to battle for the title once again at the 1991 North Coast Athletic Conference Women's Tennis Championships, to be held Friday and Saturday, May 10-11, at Denison. Kenyon is the five-time defending champion, having edged host Denison in last year's championship match by a 5-4 score. Denison, in fact, has been the runner-up in all seven NCAC Tournaments. Allegheny College, which claimed the inaugural title in 1985, is the only other team to wear the North Coast crown. The Gators will be joined by Oberlin College as this year's top threats to break the Kenyon-Denison hold on the first two positions.

Following is a capsule outlook on each of the NCAC's nine teams.

ALLEGHENY

Allegheny (5-2; 18-8), NCAC champs in 1985, is enjoying a resurgence of sorts in 1991. After placing sixth a year ago, head coach Mark Fleming's young squad has shown improvement on the court this spring and has posted impressive 6-3 victories against Wooster and Wittenberg as well as a 7-2 triumph over Ohio Wesleyan. Sophomore **Kristen Barclay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland)** leads the Gators with an impressive 18-8 record at the #1 position. Classmate **Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette)** also has been outstanding, compiling a 20-3 mark at #4, as have sophomore **Pam Grabinski (McKees Rocks, PA/Montour)**, who is 16-6 at #3, and junior **Gayle Ishler (Allison Park, PA/North Allegheny)**, who is 14-5 at #6. The #1 doubles team of Barclay and sophomore **Diane Cullen (Frogmore, SC/Suffield)** is one of the best in the Conference with a 16-6 mark, while Ishler and Grabinski are 15-5 at #3.

CASE RESERVE

The Spartans (1-5; 8-8), under the tutelage of veteran head coach Nancy Gray, have shown definite signs of improvement in 1991. Even though its only NCAC victory has been against ninth-seeded Earlham, Case Reserve has produced a 7-3 non-conference mark. Freshman **Victoria Terekhov (Brooklyn, NY/Olympic Reserve)** has taken over the #1 singles position and has responded with a 6-12 record against outstanding competition. Last year's #1, senior **Sabitha Rajan (Mansfield, OH/Lexington)**, is 7-9 at #2 this spring. Sophomores **Jennifer Lewis (Oklahoma City, OK/Putnam City North)** and **Seetha Shivashankar (Cleveland, OH/Brecksville)** have the team's best singles records to date. Lewis is 7-4 at #3, while Shivashankar is 7-2 at #4.

DENISON

Denison (4-0; 14-4) came within a heartbeat of upsetting Kenyon in last year's NCAC Tournament final. After a 7-2 regular-season loss to the Ladies, the Big Red split the singles 3-3 and needed two doubles wins for the upset and the title. With Denison's #2 doubles winning and Kenyon's #3 doubles winning and both matches off the court, the championship was decided when the Ladies' #1 doubles won by a 6-4 score. Upset-minded Denison has its sights set on the same type of dramatic championship final, with perhaps a different outcome, in 1991. Head coach Cathy Benton's squad is led by sophomore **Carey White (Toledo, OH/Ottawa Hills)** at #1 singles. White's record of 8-6 comes against some very strong NCAC and non conference competition. Junior **Anne Williamson (Little Rock, AK/Garrison Forest)** has compiled a solid 7-5 record at #2, while senior **Cathy Taylor (Racine, WI/Prairie)** is having her best year with a 10-3 mark at #3 (13-3 overall). Junior **Winnie Enloe (Rome, GA/Darlington)** was Denison's #1 player last year, but has settled into the #4 spot with an 8-4 record this spring. Playing at #5 is freshman **Halle King (Cazenovia, NY/Berkshire (MA))**, the only newcomer to the experienced Big Red lineup. King has been Denison's most consistent winner with a 14-1 combined record at #4 and #5. Sophomore **Katie Fowles (Grand Island, NE/Grand Island)** has returned this year to her #6 position and has again made winning a habit with a 9-3 record. The most productive doubles team has been the duo of White and Enloe, who are 10-3 at #2 and 12-3 overall.

EARLHAM

Earlham (0-7; 3-10) has improved throughout the season under second-year head coach Gail Delaney. The Quakers, 3-3 in non-conference competition, are getting impressive play from their #1 player, **Sue Trezvant (Oak Park, IL/River Forest)**. Trezvant, a freshman, is 8-4 and has one of the NCAC's top records at the #1 position. She also has joined forces with junior **Holly Michaelson (Chester Springs, PA/Westtown)** to form Earlham's #1 doubles team, which is 3-5. Michaelson is 3-8 in singles, while freshman **Kathy Stoffel (Terre Haute, IN/West Vigo)** is 4-8 at the #2 spot.

KENYON

Kenyon (5-0; 15-5) enters the NCAC Tournament with an undefeated Conference record, as well as two tournament wins over chief rival Denison. Second-year head coach Paul Wardlaw's Ladies served notice of their '91 intentions with a 9-0 win over the Big Red in the GLCA Tournament, and again with a 5-1 triumph over Denison in the consolation finals of the Midwest Region Invitational. Kenyon, which will be making its fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance later in the spring, features a strong, experienced lineup again this spring. Leading the way is sophomore #1 singles player **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips)**, who jumped to the top spot after playing #4 last season. Junior **Kathryn Lane (Nashville, TN/St. Cecilia)** has dropped from #1 to #2 this season and has responded with an outstanding 12-3 record (14-5 overall). Sophomore **Sara Fousekis (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce)** handles the #3 spot well with a 7-2 record (16-4 overall), while junior **Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi)** is 9-1 at #4 and 16-3 overall. Kenyon's depth really begins to show out the #5 and #6 positions, where sophomores **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips)**, Britt's twin sister, and **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** have combined for a 25-1 record. Harbin is 13-1 at #5, while Weisman is 12-1 at #6 and 17-3 overall. The

Ladies' doubles records are equally impressive -- Lane and Fousekis are 7-3 at #1, Britt Harbin and Weisman are 12-0 at #2 (17-0 overall), and Bear and Brennen Harbin are 10-1 at #3.

OBERLIN

Oberlin (6 2; 16 10) will be looking to improve upon last season's disappointing fifth place NCAC finish. The Yeowomen have defeated all of their Conference foes with the exception of Kenyon and Denison. Included on Oberlin's slate is a 5-2 win over Allegheny, a 9-0 triumph over Wooster and a 6-3 victory against Wittenberg. Head coach Michelle Ehnis' lineup is led by the North Coast's premier player, senior **Kavita Varma (Chickasha, OK/Chickasha)**. Varma, who will return the NCAA Tournament this spring for the third consecutive year, is currently ranked 10th in the nation. The two-time NCAC Player of the Year is 20-5 at the #1 spot in 1991. Oberlin also relies upon the talent and experience of two more veterans -- senior **Lynn Gardner (Portola Valley, CA/Menlo Atherton)** and junior **Joyce Stickney (Wheaton, IL/North)**. Gardner is 16 10 at #2, while Stickney is 13 5 at #3. The #1 doubles team of Varma and Gardner has again been a consistent winner, compiling an impressive 19-5 mark.

OHIO WESLEYAN

The Bishops (3 5; 10 5) scored an important 5 4 win over Wooster recently and they may be peaking at the right time of the season. Head coach Margie Shade's lineup features junior **Allison Plowman (Little Rock, AK/Central)** at the top spot and freshman **Margie Schultz (Medina, OH/Medina)** at #2. Schultz has been very effective, compiling a 10 4 record in her rookie season. Senior **Julie Denison (Arden, NC/Roberson)** has returned to her #3 position this year and is 7 5, while another freshman, **Lisa Kerson (Greenwich, CT/Holy Child (NY))**, has been impressive with an 8 3 record at #4. Senior **Becki Broman (Snyder, NY/Amherst)** and junior **Kelli Kitchen (Twinsburg, OH/Chamberlain)** are 9 3 and 7 5 at the #5 and #6 positions, respectively. Broman and Denison, 9-4 at #3, have been the Bishops' most successful doubles entry.

WITTENBERG

After an impressive third place finish in its first NCAC Tournament in 1990, Wittenberg (3 4; 6 4) is looking for another positive showing this spring. This season, veteran Dottie Lemieux's last as the Tigers' head coach, Wittenberg has recorded an important 8 1 win over Ohio Wesleyan. Only a tough 5 4 loss to Wooster and a 6 3 loss to Allegheny are keeping the Tigers out of the Conference's top four. Sophomore **Sheryl Myers (Dublin, OH/Watterson)** is back at #1 and has posted a 5-5 record to date. The next two positions in the lineup return intact as well, with senior **Mendy Wells (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** 9-1 record at #2 and sophomore **Beth Ann Young (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** 8-2 at #3. Freshman **Jennifer Pranskevich (Wickliffe, OH/Wickliffe)** also is on the plus side with a 6-4 mark at #6. The #1 doubles team of Myers and Wells is Wittenberg's best, recording an 8-2 record.

WOOSTER

Wooster (3-5; 8-9) has had an up and down year, posting an important 5-4 victory against Wittenberg, but dropping a 5-4 decision to Ohio Wesleyan. The Lady Scots, under the direction of fourth-year head coach Chris Hart, are getting excellent play from sophomore **Liz Richards (Northfield, IL/New Trier)**, who is 12 6 at #1 singles. She also teams with freshman **Rebecca Springer (Barrington, IL/Barrington)** in the squad's top doubles duo, which is 8-3 at #2 and 11-5 overall. Junior **Helen Shepard (Paducah, KY/Firestone (OH))** also is playing well for Wooster, compiling a 9-8 record at #3 singles.

Policies and Procedures

SECTION 1 -- CONFERENCE CHAMPION, LENGTH OF SEASON1.1 Determination of Conference Champion

A post season team tournament, hosted by a member institution with twelve (12) courts available, will decide the Conference champion. Regular-season Conference play will be used for seeding prior to the Tournament.

1.2 Number of Contests/Playing Dates

There shall be a maximum of 24 dates, including not more than four individual singles and/or doubles tournaments that are counted as single dates of competition.

1.3 Practice Season Regulations

The length of an institution's playing season (traditional and non-traditional combined) shall be limited to a maximum of 21 weeks.

SECTION 2 -- MATCH OPERATIONS2.1 Rules

United States Tennis Association (USTA) rules shall govern play during all Conference matches. Coaches will follow Intercollegiate Tennis Association rules.

2.2 Warm-up

A ten-minute warm-up will be allowed prior to each match, with the serve call occurring at eight minutes.

2.3 Scoring

Regular scoring and a twelve-point tiebreaker will be used for all Conference play.

2.4 Order of Play

Singles shall be played first, followed by doubles, unless playing with less than six courts.

2.5 Lineup

Both coaches will submit a complete lineup for both singles and doubles before competition begins. Doubles may be changed with the consent of the opposing coach. Singles and doubles substitution will follow Intercollegiate Tennis Association rules.

2.6 Balls

The host institution shall provide three balls per match. A player may request a new can of balls for the third set.

2.7 Inclement Weather

Every effort should be made to move the competition indoors in the event of inclement weather. If not possible, the match should be re-scheduled for the next open date. If indoor courts are used, each participating institution shall split the court fees.

SECTION 3 -- CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

3.1 Tournament Format

The tournament (team format with consolation) shall be single-elimination with the consolation played out to nine places. Men and women will play at different sites.

3.2 Tournament Committee

Each Tournament Committee shall include the Tournament Official, current Tournament Director, previous year Tournament Director, future year Tournament Director, and the chairs of the NCAC Tennis Coaches' Association.

3.3 Seeding

Regular-season Conference play shall be used for the seeding of the tournament. Seeding will be done the night before the tournament begins, with all coaches present. The following criteria will be used:

- A. Head-to-head competition.
- B. If teams played two matches, the last one will be used.
- C. Two-of-three -- winner.
- D. All nine teams will be seeded (bracketing as shown in Appendix A).

3.4 Tournament Official

An official will be assigned to each site in the tournament. The official will enforce the default rule, make decisions on weather conditions, and rule on behavior problems by using the point-penalty system. An official's fee will be paid plus expenses for the tournament.

3.5 Line Judges

Extra team players from neutral teams, or the umpire, shall be used to call appealed shots only.

3.6 Trainer

A trainer shall be present throughout the tournament.

3.7 Balls

Host institutions shall provide balls and then will be reimbursed by the Conference Office.

3.8 Indoor Courts

Host Institutions shall pay for indoor courts and then will be reimbursed by the Conference Office.

3.9 Format (Men and Women)

See Appendix A.

Indoor courts, when available, and outdoor courts can be used simultaneously as determined by the Tournament Committee.

3.10 Default

Fifteen minute default will be used.

SECTION 4 HONORS AND AWARDS

4.1 All-Conference Team

Each coach will nominate players in ranked order at the coaches' meeting prior to the tournament (see Appendix B).

A ballot (Appendix C) will be distributed to all coaches at the tournament for future vote. Coaches may not vote for their own players. Ballots are due in the Conference Office no later than three (3) days after the completion of the tournament.

Stipulation: When voting, rank players 12 through 1. The six (6) singles players and three (3) doubles teams with the most votes will be the first team. Singles players 7-12 and doubles teams 4-6 will be the second team. Honorable mention will be the next players (up to a total of nine) receiving votes. Any team without an All-Conference player will automatically receive one place on the honorable mention team. This player will be that team's highest ranked (by coaches' nomination) player.

4.2 Player-of-the-Year

The Player-of-the-Year (both men and women) shall be the person receiving the most All-Conference votes.

4.3 Coach of the Year

On the ballot, each coach shall vote for a Coach of the Year. Selection shall be based upon team records, improvement, sportsmanship, and professionalism.

APPENDIX A -- NCAC Tennis Championship Format

The nine-team, feed-in, single-elimination format utilized for the North Coast Athletic Conference Championship Tournament requires 14 men's matches and 14 women's matches in order to place all teams.

Because of the odd number of teams competing in the tournament, a preliminary match must be played to determine the eighth position in the quarterfinals. As the brackets are drawn, all nine teams must be seeded in order to ensure the proper placement of the #8 and #9 teams in the preliminary round. The winner of the #8 #9 match (Match A) will proceed to play the #1 seed (in Match B), while the loser will be positioned in the backdraw against the loser of the match between the #2 and #7 seeds (Match F)

Seeding is imperative, because the losers of Match A and Match E are automatically placed at a disadvantage in the backdraw in the preliminary consolation match (Match J -- the loser of which places ninth in the tournament). Every team in the tournament has a chance of placing first through eighth. The #2, #7, #8, and #9 seeds, however, are the only teams which have a chance of placing ninth. The remaining five seeds are protected from that preliminary consolation pairing (Match J) in the backdraw.

Losers in Matches A through E (the quarterfinals, plus the preliminary match) will go to the backdraw and be able to place no higher than fifth in the tournament. Quarterfinal winners can place no lower than fourth. Losers in the backdraw semifinals (Matches K and L) will be able to place no higher than seventh.

The places in the NCAC Tournament will be determined as follows:

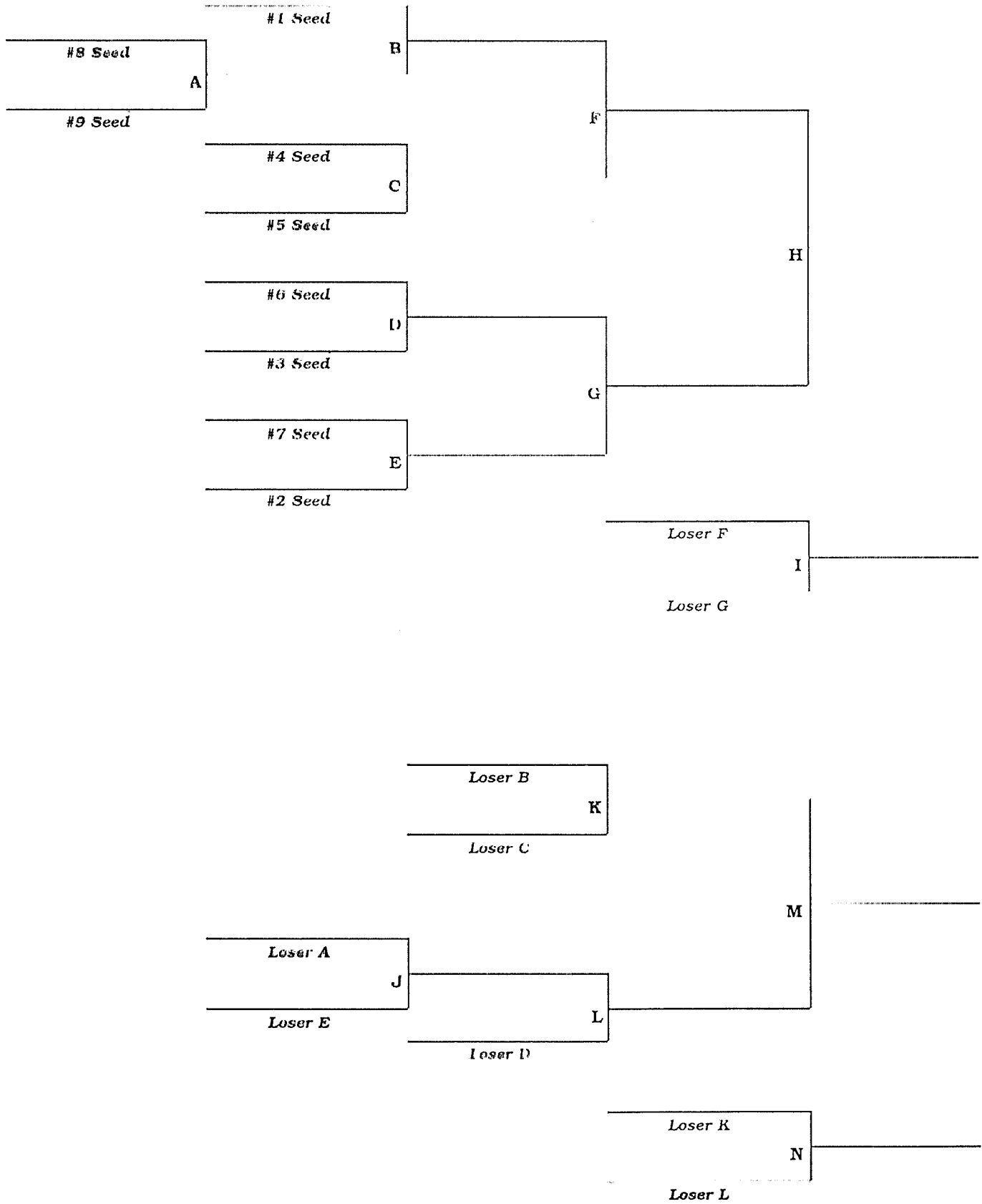

CLEVELAND, OH -- For the sixth time in seven seasons, two North Coast Athletic Conference baseball teams will be playing in the NCAA Tournament. The College of Wooster will be making its seventh straight post season appearance, while Ohio Wesleyan University is in for the fourth time in six years.

Wooster (28-10) is coming off a championship at the inaugural NCAC Tournament, May 10-12 in Springfield, Ohio. The Scots have claimed two consecutive North Coast titles and have won or shared the crown in five of the Conference's seven seasons, winning 25 or more games each year. Wooster will be participating in the NCAA Midwest Regional, which will be held in Marietta, Ohio, from Wednesday to Saturday, May 15-18. Baldwin-Wallace (25-17-2), Ferrum (30-6) and Marietta (39-4) round out the four-team Midwest field. The Scots open against Baldwin-Wallace at noon on Wednesday at Marietta's Pioneer Park. Wooster, which won the Midwest Regional title in 1989 to advance to the Small College World Series, is 20-23 in 11 Division III Tournament appearances.

Ohio Wesleyan (24-16-1) has been sent to the NCAA Central Regional, which will be held in Geneva, Ill., May 15-18. Illinois Benedictine (29-7-1), North Central (32-10), Simpson (24-3), William Penn (26-7) and host Aurora (22-9-1) round out the six-team Central field. The Bishops open with North Central at noon (Central Time) on Wednesday at the Kane County Events Center. Ohio Wesleyan, which has won 20 or more games for six consecutive seasons and has two NCAC titles to its credit, finished second in the North Coast this spring, dropping a 6-3 decision to Wooster in the NCAC Tournament final. The Bishops are 1-6 in their three previous Division III Tournament appearances.

NCAC Spring Sports Update
FIVE DIFFERENT SCHOOLS CLAIM TITLES
IN NORTH COAST CHAMPIONSHIP WEEKEND

CLEVELAND, OH -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (28-10) took a 6-3 decision from Ohio Wesleyan (24-16-1) to claim the championship at the first NCAC Baseball Tournament, which was held May 10-12 in Springfield. The Scots have earned two consecutive North Coast titles and have won or shared the crown in five of the Conference's seven seasons. The Tournament opened with Wooster defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 11-4, and Allegheny (23-19) dropping host Wittenberg (25-16), 10-6. Wooster then advanced to the finals with an 11-5 triumph over Allegheny in the second round. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, emerged from the loser's bracket with a 15-5 victory against Wittenberg and a 15-13 win over Allegheny.

Wooster junior **Gerry Sagerman (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** was named Tournament Most Valuable Player after allowing just three hits and two unearned runs in eight innings of work in the championship contest. Sagerman was joined on the All-Tournament team by four other Scots -- sophomore catcher **Mark McKinney (Sidney, OH/Lehman)**, sophomore first baseman **Erik Hagen (Lima, OH/Shawnee)**, senior second baseman **Chris Bell (Brookpark, OH/Olmsted Falls)** and senior outfielder **Tom Flynn (Youngstown, OH/Mooney)**. The remainder of the team consisted of Ohio Wesleyan junior shortstop **Mike Royer (Columbus, OH/Westland)**, Ohio Wesleyan junior third baseman **George Powell (Westerville, OH/North)**, Allegheny senior outfielder **Jeff Filkovski (Penn, PA/Penn-Trafford)**, Wittenberg junior outfielder **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** and Allegheny freshman designated hitter **Craig Rinker (Manlius, NY/Fayetteville-Manlius)**. Filkovski, who was 8-12 with three home runs and nine runs batted in, and Bell, who was 5-12 with two home runs and seven RBI, were the Tournament's leading hitters.

Wooster and Ohio Wesleyan will represent the North Coast in NCAA Tournament play. It is the sixth time in seven years that the NCAC has been represented by two teams. Wooster, which has won 25 or more games for seven straight seasons, will be making its seventh consecutive NCAA Midwest Regional appearance. Ohio Wesleyan, which is making its fourth post-season appearance in six years, has been sent to the Central Regional.

GOLF REPORT: Allegheny outdistanced Wittenberg by five strokes at the NCAC Golf Championships, May 10-11, reclaiming the title it last won in 1986. The Gators moved out to a five-stroke lead with a fine 306 in the first round and then cut six strokes off that total in round two to win at the par-72 Apple Valley Golf Club in Howard, Ohio. Wittenberg's 294 in the second round was the Tournament's best score and it enabled the Tigers to jump from fourth place after 18 holes to second. Host Kenyon totaled 624 to slip into third, just in front of four-time defending champ Ohio Wesleyan, which carded a 625 for fourth. Wooster, which was second after the first round, fell to fifth at 629, followed by Denison (660), Case Reserve (675) and Earlham (810) in places six through eight, respectively.

Individually, Kenyon senior **Matt Alcorn (Irwin, PA/Penn-Trafford)** claimed medalist honors in a playoff with Allegheny junior **George Laskey (Hopwood, PA/Geibel)** -- both players came in at two over par 146 to force the tiebreaker. Alcorn's 70 in round two was the Tournament's best score. Wittenberg senior **Karl Postler (Rochester, NY/Sutherland)** also posted a sub-par round, a 71 in the second round, and placed third at 148, followed by Allegheny juniors **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** and **Marc Voytko (Johnstown, PA/McCort)** in fourth and fifth at 150 and 151, respectively.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: NCAC champion Ohio Wesleyan (13-4) closed out another outstanding season by advancing to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament for the sixth consecutive year. The Bishops, who have appeared in 10 of the 12 Division III Tournaments, knocked off Washington & Lee by a 19-10 score in the quarterfinals, May 8, before dropping an 18-12 decision to Salisbury State in the semifinals, May 12. Senior **Rich Franz (Hamburg, NY/Nichols)** had six goals and five assists for an NCAA Tournament-record 11 points in the win over Washington & Lee. Franz also led the way against Salisbury State with three goals and five assists.

Wooster senior **Andy Fox (Long Valley, NJ/West Morris)** won the NCAC scoring title with 33 goals and 56 assists for 89 points, an average of 5.6 per game. Fox's totals for assists and points were single-season Scot records. Ohio Wesleyan's Franz finished second in the scoring race with 48 goals and 45 assists for 5.5 ppg, while Wooster senior **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor (MA))** was third with 49 goals and 34 assists for 5.2 ppg. Kenyon senior **Phil Wilson (Lawrenceville, NJ/Lawrenceville)** had a .634 saves percentage to lead the way in goal. Wooster sophomore **Rob Vosburgh (West Chester, PA/East)** was second at .619, followed Ohio Wesleyan senior **Rich Flynn (Williston Park, NY/Mineola)** in third at .604.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: North Coast champ Denison (12-4) wrapped up its season with an 11-7 loss at Franklin & Marshall in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament, May 11. The Big Red, who have won all seven NCAC titles, were making their third post-season appearance in the last four years.

Individually, Denison junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** led the Conference in scoring with 67 goals and 19 assists for 86 points, an average of 5.7 per game. Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Franny Smith (Montville, NJ/Worthington (OH))** was second with 33 goals and 29 assists for 62 points (4.4 ppg), followed by Wooster junior **Martha Lange (Etna, NH/Hanover)** in third with 43 goals and 11 assists for 54 points (3.9 ppg) and Oberlin junior **Bonnie Soranton (East Hartford, CT/Kingswood Oxford)** in fourth with 44 goals and 12 assists for 56 points (3.7 ppg). Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Katy Anderson (Greenwich, CT/Hotchkiss)** set the pace in goal with a fine .622 saves percentage. Kenyon junior **Patty Latta (Phoenixville, PA/Episcopal)** and Wittenberg senior **Becky Wartluft (Philadelphia, PA/Irwin)** were second and third at .588 and .567, respectively.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Top-seeded Kenyon, ranked 12th in the nation, gained its first outright North Coast title at the 1991 NCAC Men's Tennis Championships, May 10-11 at Wooster. The host Scots, seeded second heading into the Tournament, lost their bid to retain the crown they won in 1990 by losing a close championship match, 5-4, to the Lords. Denison finished in third place, followed by Oberlin, Wittenberg, Ohio Wesleyan, Case Reserve, Allegheny and Earlham in places four through nine, respectively. En route to the finals, Kenyon defeated Case Reserve, 8-1, and Oberlin, 6-3. Wooster, meanwhile, blanked Allegheny, 9-0, and then beat Denison, 6-3, to earn the right to face the Lords. In the championship match, Kenyon came back to sweep the three doubles matches after winning only two of six in singles. Denison defeated Oberlin, 6-3, in the third-place match, while Wittenberg gained fifth with a 6-3 triumph over Ohio Wesleyan.

Individually, the following players closed the regular season with the top records at their respective singles flights: Wittenberg sophomores **Martin Bulow (Gotheburg, Sweden/Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia))**, 12-4 at #1, and **Justin Russell (Vienna, VA/Blue Ridge)**, 15-1 (16-1) at #2; Wooster juniors **Dan Rosenbaum (Washington, DC/Field)**, 17-1 (20-3) at #3, and **Eric Hicks (Newark, NY/Newark)**, 10-3 (19-5) at #4; Kenyon junior **Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)**, 16-6 (18-6) at #5; and Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Doug Caldwell (Norwalk, OH/Norwalk)**, 15-5 (15-6) at #6. In doubles, Denison junior **Will Knox (Erie, PA/Academy)** and sophomore **Brian Maebius (San Antonio, TX/Alamo Heights)** combined for a 14-8 mark at #1, Kenyon senior **David Register (Malibu, CA/Lawrenceville)** and freshman **Scott Sherman (Western Springs, IL/Lyons Township)** were 15-1 (16-1) at #2, while the Lord duo of junior **Greg Ganter (Larchmont, NY/Lyce Francais)** and freshman **Tyler Rigg (Riverside, CT/Choate-Rosemary)** came in at 18-2 (19-2) at #3.

Denison's Knox, 14-8 at #1, Kenyon's Register, 15-8 (15-9) at #1, and Wooster junior **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)**, 18-7 at #1, have received invitations to participate in the singles portion of the NCAA Tournament, May 12-18. Knox and Maebius from Denison and Stauffer and junior **Bill Jonas (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends)** from Kenyon will compete in doubles. Kenyon will represent the North Coast in the team portion of the national tournament.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon continued its dominance of the North Coast by winning its sixth consecutive title at the 1991 NCAC Championships, May 10-11 at Denison. The Ladies defeated Case Reserve, 7-2, and Allegheny, 8-1, en route to the finals, where they edged Denison, 5-4. Denison, which has finished second in all seven North Coast seasons, made the finals by beating Ohio Wesleyan, 9-0, and Oberlin, 6-2. Oberlin defeated Allegheny, 5-1, to claim third place, and was followed in the standings by Wittenberg in fifth and Wooster, Ohio Wesleyan, Case Reserve and Earlham in places six through nine, respectively. Kenyon was led by junior **Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi)**, who won all three of her matches at #4 singles, sophomore **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))**, who went 2-0 at #1 singles, and the tandem of Bear and sophomore **Brennan Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))**, who were 3-0 at #3 doubles.

Individually, the following players closed the regular season with the top records at their respective singles flights: Oberlin senior **Kavita Varma (Chickasa, OK/Chickasa)**, 24-5 (28-5) at #1; Wittenberg senior **Mendy Wells (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)**, 13-1 at #2; Denison senior **Cathy Taylor (Racine, WI/Prairie)**, 11-4 (15-4) at #3; Allegheny sophomore **Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette)**, 22-4 (22-7) at #4; Denison freshman **Hallie King (Cazenovia, NY/Berkshire (MA))**, 12-1 (17-1) at #5; Kenyon sophomore **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)**, 12-0 (17-3) at #6. In doubles, Wittenberg sophomore **Sheryl Myers (Dublin, OH/Watterson)** and Wells lead the way with a 10-3 record at the top spot, while Kenyon's Weisman and Britt Harbin are 12-0 (17-0) at #2 and Bear and Brennan Harbin are 11-1 (13-1) at #3.

Kenyon will represent the North Coast in the NCAA Championships, May 15-21. It is the Ladies fifth consecutive national appearance -- they came in second in 1988 and 1989. Oberlin's Varma will be competing in the individual tournament for the third straight year.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Denison's men and Ohio Wesleyan's women claimed titles at the seventh NCAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships, May 10-11 at Case Reserve's Finnigan Field. Allegheny sophomore sprinter **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** and Earlham junior distance runner **Scott Pearson (Cincinnati, OH/Finneytown)** shared the Men's Most Valuable Track Athlete award, while Case Reserve senior **Kevin Luthy (Sullivan, OH/Black River)** was named Men's Most Valuable Field Athlete. On the women's side, Allegheny senior distance runner **Lynda Kohl (Cedar Knolls, NJ/St. Elizabeth)** and Ohio Wesleyan sophomore thrower **Amy Yothers (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** were chosen Most Valuable Track and Field Athletes, respectively.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT (cont.): In the men's event, Denison won its sixth NCAC title in seven years by a comfortable margin of 42 points over runner up Case Reserve. The Big Red racked up four first place finishes, seven seconds and three thirds for 151 points, while the host Spartans surprised the field with five firsts, four seconds and two thirds for 109 points to skyrocket from seventh place in 1990 to second place this year. Defending champion Ohio Wesleyan ran third (74.5), followed by Allegheny (73), Wooster (65), Wittenberg (37.5), Kenyon (35), Earlham (28) and Oberlin (15) in places four through nine, respectively. Individually, three meet records were set as Case Reserve senior **Matt Medford (Salem, OH/Salem)** mastered the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 53.68, Luthy cleared 15' 1" in the pole vault and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH))** heaved the shot an NCAA-qualifying distance of 55' 3". The top three finishers in the 100-meter high hurdles -- Denison senior **Doug Taylor (Nashville, TN/McCallie)** at 14.73, Case Reserve senior **Chris Fedele (Euclid, OH/St. Joseph)** at 14.75 and Wittenberg freshman **Dwight Carter (Columbus, OH/Linden McKinley)** at 14.78-- also qualified for nationals. Luthy came away with the most hardware, winning the pole vault, the javelin (176' 4") and the high jump (6' 6"), placing third in the long jump (22' 4") and running a leg of the Spartans' second-place 4 x 400 (3:21.59) relay. Allegheny's Drayton broke the tape in the 100 (10.86) and 200 meters (21.77) and ran the second leg of the Gators' 4 x 400 relay (3:18.88) victory. Besides his record-setting throw in the shot, Rucker won the discus with a toss of 164' 8". Pearson was the meet's distance king, taking both the 5,000- (15:30.09) and 10,000-meters (32:28).

Ohio Wesleyan used the momentum of its 1991 indoor championship to dethrone Allegheny for this spring's outdoor title. It is the third outdoor championship for the Bishops, who totaled 168.5 points to outdistance second-place Allegheny, which had 112. Denison ran third (81.5), followed by Kenyon (73), Wooster (52), Case Reserve (30), Oberlin (21), Earlham (13) and Wittenberg (6) in places four through nine, respectively. Allegheny and Ohio Wesleyan dominated the meet, as the Bishops recorded an impressive eight first place finishes to go with four seconds and four thirds, while the Gators took seven firsts, three seconds and two thirds. Only three events were won by a team other than Allegheny or Ohio Wesleyan -- Denison sophomore **Carolyn Hill (Kensington, NH/Exeter Area)** took the 400 meter dash (59.10), Case Reserve junior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** won the 100-meter hurdles (15.03) and Denison freshman **Elizabeth Anderson (Willoughby Hills, OH/South)** came out on top in the shot put (36' 6 1/2"). The dry, warm weather set the stage for five record setting performances, three of them by Allegheny's Kohl in the 3,000 (10:20.81), 5,000 (18:00) and 10,000 meters (37:46); Encarnacion in the 100-meter hurdles (15.03); and Ohio Wesleyan senior **Kelly McNamara (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park)** in the 400-meter hurdles (63.10). Kohl's times in the 3,000 and 10,000 were good enough to qualify for nationals, as was McNamara's run in the 400 hurdles and Encarnacion's efforts in the 100. Encarnacion also qualified for the NCAA Championships with a second-place finish in the 400-meter hurdles (64.18). Besides Kohl, other multiple-event winners were Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Kerry Kirkland (Akron, OH/Revere)** in the 100- (12.89) and 200 meter dashes (26.44), Allegheny junior **Alyse Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River)** in the 800 (2:20.56) and 1,500-meter runs (4:40.04) and the Bishops' Yothers in the javelin (112' 3") and the discus (123' 2").

OHIO WESLEYAN'S RINGERS, DENISON'S MONACELLI
NAMED NORTH COAST PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

CLEVELAND, OH Ohio Wesleyan University senior **Neil Ringers (Ridgefield, CT/Ridgefield)** and Denison University junior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Players of the Year, headlining the 1991 All-NCAC men's and women's lacrosse teams.

Ringers, a senior midfielder and a two-time All-America selection, scored 27 goals and added 12 assists in leading Ohio Wesleyan to another outstanding campaign. The Bishops (13-4) won their fifth consecutive North Coast championship this spring and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in 12 years, making their sixth straight semifinal appearance. A three-time All-America in football, Ringers was the North Coast's Defensive Player of the Year in 1989 and 1990. He is the only person in NCAC history to earn Player of the Year honors in two team sports.

Monacelli, a junior attack, led the North Coast in scoring this season with 67 goals and 19 assists for an average of 5.7 points per game. Her 67 goals established a new single season NCAC record. Denison (12-4) won its seventh straight North Coast title this spring and made its third post-season appearance in four years.

Wooster's **Jon Hind** and Ohio Wesleyan's **Mary Parker** have earned NCAC Coach of the Year honors after leading their teams to second-place Conference finishes. Hind, in his fifth year at Wooster, guided the Scots to a 12-4 record and a ranking of 13th in the final Division III poll. The 12-4 mark was Wooster's finest since 1983 and the second-place finish was the team's best in the North Coast's seven seasons. Parker, who has been the only coach Ohio Wesleyan's program has ever known, led the Bishops to a 12-2 record in her 26th and final season. Ohio Wesleyan was the only NCAC team to beat Conference champ Denison this year, splitting a two-game series.

The men's first team features three repeat selections -- Ringers, Wooster senior **Steve Davidow (Sewickley, PA/Tabor (MA))** and Ohio Wesleyan senior **Rich Flynn (Williston Park, NY/Mineola)**. Ringers and Flynn are on the team for the third consecutive year. The women's first team, meanwhile, features four repeat selections -- Denison junior **Sharon Dewey (Alexandria, VA/St. Agnes)**, Wooster senior **Minna Jinn (Brecksville, OH/Western Reserve)**, Wittenberg senior **Ramsay Muhly (Baltimore, MD/Towson)** and Denison sophomore **Chrissy Talarico (Spring Lake, NJ/Suffield (CT))**.

**OHIO WESLEYAN TAKES THIRD STRAIGHT ALL-SPORTS TITLE;
 NCAC REPRESENTED NATIONALLY IN 20 OF 21 SPORTS**

May 20, 1991

CLEVELAND, OH -- Ohio Wesleyan University used five top-three finishes in the spring season to overcome a two point deficit and win its third consecutive North Coast Athletic Conference All-Sports Championship. The Bishops won or shared five NCAC titles in the 1990 91 season, including outright championships in men's lacrosse and women's outdoor track & field during the spring

Ohio Wesleyan, which had five second-place finishes and three thirds to go with its five firsts, totaled 141 points, five better than Denison University's 136. Allegheny College, which sat atop the standings after the winter season, finished third with 127 points, followed by Kenyon College (124.5) in fourth and The College of Wooster (119.5) in fifth. Wittenberg University (101.5), Oberlin College (77.5), Case Western Reserve University (57) and Earlham College (46) round out the final standings in places six through nine, respectively

The All Sports award is given annually to the school that performs best across the NCAC's 21 sports. Nine points are awarded for a first place finish, eight for a second, seven for a third and so on. Men's and women's performances are combined, exemplifying the North Coast's commitment to equity and balance among programs. Wooster won the NCAC's inaugural championship in the 1984-85 season, followed by Denison in 1985-86 and Wooster again for the next two years leading up to Ohio Wesleyan's current three year run.

Aside from its spring championships in men's lacrosse and women's outdoor track, Ohio Wesleyan claimed outright NCAC titles in field hockey and women's indoor track. The Bishops also shared the North Coast women's soccer crown with Wooster. In addition, Ohio Wesleyan's 141 points eclipsed the record of 140 it established last year, the Conference's first with nine teams.

Second-place Denison came away with four team championships -- men's cross country, men's indoor track, women's lacrosse and men's outdoor track. The Big Red also posted three second-place finishes and six thirds. Allegheny, which does not field a team in three of the Conference's 21 sports, won NCAC titles in women's cross country, football, volleyball and golf and had a total of 12 top-three performances on its way to third place. Kenyon, meanwhile, fashioned its fourth-place finish with team championships in men's soccer, men's and women's swimming, and men's and women's tennis. Wooster won an outright title in baseball to go with its co-championship in women's soccer, while Wittenberg took the remaining crowns in men's and women's basketball.

The NCAC is just now putting the finishing touches on its finest season on the national level, with over 50 teams in 20 of 21 sports advancing/sending individuals to NCAA Championship competition or finishing in the Division III Top 20. Allegheny's football team and the Kenyon men's and women's swimmers, all of which won national titles, head that list. All eight spring sports have been or will be represented at the NCAA level this spring, as the North Coast looks to improve upon its seven-year total of 16 national championships.

**ALLEGHENY'S FILKOVSKI, WOOSTER'S WEINER NAMED
NORTH COAST PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

CLEVELAND, OH -- Allegheny College's **Jeff Filkovski (Penn, PA/Penn-Trafford)** and The College of Wooster's **Jason Weiner (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively, to highlight the 1991 All-NCAC baseball team.

Filkovski, a senior centerfielder, hit .381 with 11 home runs and 47 runs batted in this spring to lead the Gators to a 23-19 record and a third place finish in the North Coast. His 11 home runs established an Allegheny single season record and allowed him to break the school's career mark with 26 over four years. Filkovski was the starting quarterback on the Gators' national championship football team last fall, earning Division III Offensive Player of the Year honors from the *Football Gazette*.

Weiner, a senior righthander, posted a 9-2 record with a fine 3.24 earned run average to lead Wooster (29-11) to its second straight North Coast crown and a seventh consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In 72.1 innings of work, he struck out 46 and allowed 65 hits and 22 bases on balls. Weiner has been on the All-NCAC first team in each of the past two seasons and is a three time All-Mideast Region selection.

Kenyon's **Bob Bunnell** and Earlham's **Doug Welsh** share NCAC Coach of the Year honors for their work in rebuilding their programs. Bunnell, in his first season at Kenyon, led the Lords to eight wins in their final 12 games, a 10-24 overall record and a sixth-place finish in the Conference with a solid 9-12 mark. Welsh, in his sixth and final year at Earlham, took a team that went 3-30 and failed to win an NCAC contest in 1990 to a 7-23 overall record and an eighth-place finish in the Conference with a 5-10 mark this spring.

The All-NCAC first team features six juniors and four sophomores to go with just six seniors. Underclassmen also dominate the second team, with seven juniors, two sophomores and two freshmen joining three seniors. Repeat first-team selections include Wooster's Weiner, Ohio Wesleyan sophomores **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** and **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)**, Wittenberg junior **Matt Callahan (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** and Wooster senior **Chris Bell (Brookpark, OH/Olmsted Falls)**.
