**NCAC Spring Sports Update**

**SPRING SPORTS DODGE RAINDROPS, SNOWFLAKES TO  
BEGIN NCAC SCHEDULES; OWU POSTS BIG BASEBALL WINS**

**CLEVELAND --** Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (7-1; 11-6) has gotten the jump on the remainder of the NCAC over the first two weeks of the season by playing all eight of its scheduled Conference contests and winning seven. Denison (2-0; 5-6) also appears to be in good shape after taking two games from Kenyon (1-2; 2-7) on Mar. 21. The Big Red had the NCAC bye this past weekend and will host Wooster (2-3-1; 7-10-1) in an important four-game series, Apr. 4-5. Ohio Wesleyan is at CWRU (0-1-1; 1-7-1), Oberlin (0-0; 0-3) travels to Allegheny (0-0; 2-4-1) and Wittenberg (0-0; 4-2) hosts Kenyon to round out this weekend's action.

The weather permitted only five games to be played last weekend, four in Delaware where the Bishops came back from a loss in the opener to take three of four from Wooster. The turning point in the series came in the bottom of the seventh inning in the third game, when Ohio Wesleyan rallied from a two-run deficit to pull out a 6-5 win. Junior centerfielder **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** capped the three-run rally with a one-out, two-run single. The Bishops went on to win the finale 11-3 with senior designated hitter **Steve Mitchell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** going 3-for-5 with a home run and three runs batted in. Senior righthander **Mike Hudy (Kirtland, OH/Kirtland)** scattered six hits and went the distance to up his record to 3-0.

Kenyon took a 16-10 decision from Earlham in the only other NCAC game played last week. The remaining three games of that series as well as the entire Allegheny-Wittenberg and CWRU-Oberlin weekends were wiped out due to inclement weather. A number of teams did complete spring trip action last week, with Wittenberg winning four of six games to lead the way. The Tigers wrapped up their trip with a 6-2, 6-3 doubleheader sweep at Emory, Mar. 24. Junior shortstop **Toby Bost (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge)** leads Wittenberg in the early going with a .500 average, two home runs and eight RBI.

**GOLF REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan rolled to its first victory of the spring season at Wooster's Refrigerator Open, Mar. 28. The Bishops posted a four-man total of 320 to win the event for the second consecutive year. Denison totaled 329 and placed third in the 10-team field, followed by the host Scots in fourth at 331. Wooster senior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** toured the par-72 L.C. Boles Memorial Course in 74 strokes to claim medalist honors. Denison senior **Scott Thomas (St. Louis, MO/Burroughs)** carded a 78 to finish third, followed by Ohio Wesleyan senior **Matt Roth (Sidney, OH/Sidney)** in fourth at 79. Roth leads the Bishops this spring with a 78.0 average.

Five of the NCAC's eight squads are expected to participate in the 36-hole Muskingum Invitational, Apr. 3-4. Ohio Wesleyan is the defending champion.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Wins by Ohio Wesleyan (1-0; 3-3), Denison (1-0; 3-4) and Oberlin (1-1; 1-1) highlighted the first week of NCAC action. The defending North Coast champion Bishops, ranked eighth in Division III by the USILA, beat Kenyon 21-4 in their NCAC opener, Mar. 25, before taking an 8-7 decision from fourth-ranked Roanoke on Mar. 28. Junior attack **Audy Greaves (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)** scorched the nets for eight goals and two assists on the week to lead Ohio Wesleyan. Senior **Bill Bishop (Wilton, CT/Wilton)**, an All-NCAC performer in 1991, had the game-winner against Roanoke with 7:11 remaining, while junior goalie **David Breslin (Mountain Lakes, NJ/Mountain Lakes)** posted a career-high 23 saves.

Denison defeated Oberlin 21-3 on Mar. 25 before falling to Franklin & Marshall 7-2 on Mar. 29. Oberlin, meanwhile, rebounded from its loss to Denison to edge Kenyon 11-7 on Mar. 28. Senior captain **Darren Bosch (Spring Valley, NY/Green Meadow)** had five goals and two assists to pace the Yeomen, while junior **Dan Murphy (Montclair, NJ/Montclair Kimberly)** chipped in with three goals and two assists. In other action, Wooster prepared to open its Conference schedule with a pair of wins -- 18-3 over Marietta and 8-5 over St. Bonaventure. Junior **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)**, the NCAC's leader scorer with an average of 5.5 points per game, pumped in 10 goals on the week to lead the Scots.

This week will see only limited North Coast action with Wittenberg (0-0; 0-0) opening its season at Denison on Apr. 1. The week's non-conference schedule is highlighted by an Ohio Wesleyan home date with 12-time defending Division III champ Hobart, Apr. 4.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Denison (2-0; 3-0) began defense of its NCAC crown with a pair of wins last week. The Big Red, who have won all seven North Coast championships, defeated Wooster, 19-3, on Mar. 25 and Earlham, 16-2, on Mar. 28. Senior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)**, the 1991 NCAC Player of the Year, accounted for eight goals and a pair of assists on the week.

Kenyon (1-0; 2-0) and Ohio Wesleyan (1-0; 1-2) also finished the first week of Conference play with perfect NCAC slates. The Ladies beat Wittenberg 17-3 on Mar. 25 behind the seven goal, one assist performance of sophomore Cary Loomis (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan). Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, rebounded from a 12-6 setback to Frostburg State on Mar. 27 to get past Oberlin 14-11 the next day. Sophomore attack Jessica Battle (Potomac, MD/Holy Child) had five goals to lead the Bishop victory. Wittenberg (1-1; 1-2) also had an NCAC victory on the week, slipping past Wooster 16-13 on Mar. 28. The Tiger attack was paced by junior Lisa Ginocchio (Simsbury, CT/Simsbury), who had four goals and two assists.

The North Coast schedule hits full stride this week with nine games on tap.

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Six of the seven NCAC squads that have begun play this spring have done so in winning fashion, combining for an outstanding 31-12 (.721) record. This week, the North Coast portion of the schedule swings into action and the battle for the championship should be fierce as three different schools -- Denison, Kenyon and Wooster -- have won or shared titles over the past three seasons. Ohio Wesleyan (0-0; 4-0), which owns the NCAC's only unblemished slate thus far, travels to Fairham (0-0; 0-0) for the Quakers' season opener on Mar. 30, while perennial powerhouse Denison (0-0; 6-2) hosts CWRU (0-1; 0-1) the same day. The Big Red, off to another fast start, blanked Bowdoin and Ohio Northern by identical 9-0 scores last week. In other action, Oberlin (0-0; 7-2) will take a four-match winning streak to Allegheny (0-0; 3-1) on Apr. 4. The Gators have won three in a row. Wooster (0-0; 7-3) also is off to a fast start and this past week the Scots posted wins over Butler, 8-1, and Washington & Lee (ranked 10th in Division III), 6-3.

Not only is Ohio Wesleyan undefeated this year, but so is two of its singles players and one of its doubles team. Sophomore Luke Chapman (Portsmouth, OH/Portsmouth) is 4-0 atop #3 singles, while junior Doug Caldwell (Norwalk, OH/Norwalk) has an identical mark to lead the way at #5. In addition, the #2 doubles tandem of sophomore Kevin Hinkle (Findlay, OH/Findlay) and freshman John Jonesco (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin) have a 4-0 mark. Competition at that position is intense, as the Wooster tandem of sophomores Warren Cham-a-Koon (Great Falls, MN/Great Falls) and James Weaver (Miami, FL/Ransom Everglades) are 7-0 and the Allegheny duo of senior Doug Rohner (Mt. Laurel, NJ/Lenape) and freshman Jeremy Zabell (Solon, OH/University) are 3-0. Other individual leaders include Oberlin senior Moustapha Diop (Tides, Senegal/Phillips (MA)), who is 9-1 at #1; Cham A Koon and Oberlin sophomore Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin), 7-2 at #2; Kenyon senior Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central), 5-1 at #4; and Allegheny's Zabell, 8-1 at #6.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Defending NCAC champ Kenyon (1-0; 6-1) has served notice in the early going that all roads to the championship must again travel through Gambler. The Ladies have claimed six straight North Coast titles and are working on a string of five consecutive national top-10 finishes. Junior Katja Zerck (Dusseldorf, Germany/Hulshoff) has been impressive for Kenyon, posting an NCAC-best mark of 6-1 at #1 singles. Zerck also has teamed with senior Kathryn Lane (Nashville, TN/St. Cecilia) for a 5-2 record and the top spot at #1 doubles, while senior Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi) and junior Brennan Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips) lead the way at #3 doubles with a 5-0 mark.

Denison (1-0; 6-4) and Allegheny (0-0; 7-3) figure to be two of Kenyon's top competitors this spring. Both teams are off to fine starts after finishing second and fourth, respectively, at the 1991 NCAC Championships. Denison is led by sophomore Hallie King (Cazenovia, NY/Berkshire), who is 5-2 at #1 singles and 6-4 overall, and senior Katherine-Anne Merick (Bethesda, MD/Whitman), who is 4-1 at #4 and 5-4 overall. The doubles tandem of King and junior Katie Fowles (Grand Island, NE/Grand Island) also is doing well with an 8-2 record at the #2 position. Allegheny, meanwhile, has five of six singles players above the .500 mark, led by junior Kristen Barolay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland), who is 10-4 at #1. Elsewhere, CWRU (0-0; 2-3) expects to be much improved this season and sophomore I Hsuan Shen (Lyndhurst, OH/Brush) has more wins (4 at #4) without a loss than any other NCAC performer. Junior Jennifer Lewis (Oklahoma City, OK/Chillicothe) also is off to a good start for the Spartans with a 3-1 mark at #3.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** NCAC tracksters have headed outdoors to build on their winter successes after a stellar indoor season which saw three men's and women's teams crack the Division III top 20 and a trio of performers win All America honors. At the NCAA Division III Indoor Track & Field Championships, held March 13-14 at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, NCAC champion Allegheny totaled 12 points to finish in 10th place nationally and CWRU scored four points to tie for 20th in the women's field, while the Ohio Wesleyan men garnered eight points to tie for 14th. All-America honors (for top-six finishes) were earned by Allegheny senior Alyse Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River), who placed third in the 800-meter dash (2:17) and the 1500 meter run (4:37); Ohio Wesleyan senior Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH)), who was second in the shot put (54' 3 1/2"); and CWRU senior Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge), who was fourth in the 55-meter hurdles (8.47).

The NCAC outdoor season got underway this past weekend as Kenyon junior Kelley Wilder (Victor, NY/Victor) finished fourth (4:50.14) in the 1500-meter run at the Eastern Kentucky Invitational, Mar. 28. Wilder was the only non-Division I runner to record a top-six finish at the meet.

**OHIO WESLEYAN'S JUSTICE AND HUDY NAMED  
NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK**

**CLEVELAND** - Ohio Wesleyan University junior **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** and senior teammate **Mike Hudy (Kirtland, OH/Kirtland)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

**Justice**, a 6-0, 185-pound centerfielder, went 6 for 12 with four walks to lead Ohio Wesleyan to three wins in a four game set with two time defending NCAC champ Wooster, Mar. 28-29. His weekend was highlighted by a two-run single that capped a three-run rally in the bottom of the seventh inning in the Bishops' 6-5 victory in Sunday's first game. **Justice**, a first-team All NCAC performer in each of his first two seasons, currently leads the North Coast with a .508 batting average.

**Hudy**, a 6-2, 195-pound righthander, scattered six hits as Ohio Wesleyan defeated Wooster, 11-3, in the finale of the four-game weekend series. **Hudy** struck out three and walked only one in improving his record to 3-0. The Bishops are off to a fine start this season at 11-6 overall and 7-1 in the NCAC.

**NATIONAL NEWS:** NCAC Executive Director **Dennis Collins** has been elected to serve a three year term on the NCAA Interpretations Committee, effective Sept. 1, 1992. **Collins** is one of three Division III representatives on the 10-person committee, which is chaired by Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner Thomas Yeager.... Ohio Wesleyan men's basketball coach **Gene Mehaffey** has been elected to a three-year term on the NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee.... Wittenberg women's athletic director and field hockey coach **Linda Arena** has been appointed by the NCAA Council to serve a three-year term on the NCAA Field Hockey Committee.

**CAGE CLIPS:** Wooster senior **Stan Aukamp (Clover, SC/Canton South OH)** has been named second-team All-America by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. **Aukamp**, a 6-9, 210-pound center, averaged 14.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.1 blocked shots per game this season for the 26-3 Scots. A three-year starter, **Aukamp** appeared in a school-record 113 consecutive games and finished his career as the NCAC's all-time leading rebounder with 827.... **Aukamp** was earlier named to the All-Great Lakes Region first team. He was joined on the All-Region squad by a trio of second-team selections -- Wittenberg senior forward **Kris Spriggs (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge)**, Oberlin senior guard **Cory Hodge (Oberlin, OH/Elyria Catholic)** and Wooster senior guard **Erich Riebe (Wooster, OH/Waynedale)**.

**HONOR ROLL:** Wooster field hockey standout **Carissa Conner (Yarmouth, ME/Freeport)** has been named Sportswomen of the Year by the Maine Sports Hall of Fame. **Conner**, a senior forward, led the Lady Scots in scoring this season with 20 goals and one assist on her way to receiving NCAC Player of the Year and first team All-America honors.... Kenyon has won 13 consecutive Division III titles in men's swimming and nine straight in women's swimming, but the success of the Lords and Ladies is not limited to the pool. Both Kenyon squads have been named to the College Swimming Coaches Association all-academic honor roll for 1991. The Lords qualified for the honor with a 2.94 team grade-point average, while the Ladies compiled a 3.19 aggregate GPA. Kenyon was one of only six Division III schools to have its men's and women's teams represented on the honor roll.

**DIAMOND NOTES:** Allegheny sophomore pitcher **Dean Peterson (Cortland, OH/Mathews)** broke the school's career record for saves when he recorded his seventh in a 4-2 win over Charleston Southern on Mar. 21. The Gators posted a 2-4-1 record against predominantly Division I competition on their southern swing.... Junior shortstop **Toby Bost (Springfield, OH/Kenton Ridge)** led Wittenberg to four wins in six games on its spring trip by going 6 for 12 with two home runs and eight runs batted in. The two home runs were the first of his career after 249 at bats.... Wooster senior outfielder **Matt Burdette (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Cuyahoga Falls)** went 7 for 14 in the Scots' four game series at Ohio Wesleyan. He was 5 for 5 in Wooster's 14-7 win in the opener.... Ohio Wesleyan leads the NCAC in three of four team statistical categories - batting (.367), runs (8.9 per game) and fielding (.943).... CWRU freshman **Ryan Rogers (Canton, OH/GlenOak)** is off to an outstanding start for the Spartans, allowing just one earned run over 12 2/3 innings pitched for an NCAC-best 0.71 earned run average.

**NCAC Men's Swimming & Diving Update**  
**KENYON CLAIMS 13TH STRAIGHT DIVISION III CROWN;**  
**FOUR NORTH COAST MEMBERS FINISH IN TOP 20**

**BUFFALO** -- North Coast Athletic Conference champ Kenyon College claimed its 13th consecutive national title at the 1992 NCAA Division III Men's Swimming & Diving Championships, which were held Mar. 19-21 at the State University of New York at Buffalo. Kenyon won 11 of 20 events, including four of five relays, to compile 646 points and a record setting 285 point victory margin over second place UC-San Diego (361).

The NCAC powered its way to two other top five finishes, with Denison University totaling 297 points for third place and Allegheny College scoring 226 points to finish fifth, just strokes behind fourth place Hope (235). Case Western Reserve University placed 14th with 81 points to give the North Coast a fourth team in the top 20. In its eight-year history, the NCAC can boast of 19 men's teams with top 10 finishes and 25 with top 20 finishes. Denison's third-place standing marks the sixth time in the last eight seasons that the Big Red have been in the national top five and the 10th consecutive year that they have finished in the top 10.

The North Coast also took a pair of individual awards. Kenyon senior **John Landreth (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** was named Division III Swimmer of the Year and **Tom Erdos** capped his 15th year at the Allegheny helm by being chosen Division III Coach of the Year. Landreth defended his 200 individual medley title in 1:50.46 in addition to winning the 100 butterfly in 49.69 and finishing second in the 200 butterfly in 1:50.62. He also swam a leg of each of the Lords' four winning relays -- the 200 and 400 medleys, the 400 freestyle and the 800 freestyle.

The remainder of Kenyon's victories were turned in by sophomore **Chad Stedman (Aurora, CO/Mullen)** in the 1650 free (15:51.80), freshman **John Cave (Pittsford, NY/Pittsford Mendon)** in the 200 breaststroke (2:05.63) and junior **Brian Dowdall (East Aurora, NY/East Aurora)**, who retained his crowns in the 50 free (20.58) and 100 free (45.46), while adding a title in the 100 backstroke (50.77). Dowdall also set a meet record of 50.77 in the 100 back time trials and joined teammates Cave, Landreth and senior **Patrick Kearney (West Hartford, CT/Loomis-Chaffee)** for a meet record of 3:21.62 in the 400 medley relay.

Denison, which finished in the top five in four relays, was led by junior **Dave DeWitt (Holland, MI/Holland)**, who was second in the 100 back (51.32), third in the 200 back (1:52.66) and fifth in the 50 free (21.05). The Big Red also benefited from third-place performances by junior **John deHart (Greenville, DE)** in the 100 breast (58.45) and freshman **Doug Day (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** in the 400 IM (4:04.75). Allegheny, meanwhile, was paced by fourth-place finishes from junior **T.J. Erdos (Meadville, PA/Meadville)** in the 200 IM (1:53.64) and senior **Doug Tucker (Lake Forest, IL/Lake Forest)** in three-meter diving (469.65), and by fifth-place finishes from Tucker on the one-meter board (411.10) and freshman **Brian Amen (Greenwich, CT/Bolles)** in the 100 back (51.81). The Gators also had four relays place in the top six.

CWRU senior **Jay Gindin (Mercer Island, WA/Mercer Island)** gave the NCAC a 12th event win by taking the 200 fly in 1:50.53. Gindin added a fourth in the 100 fly (50.51), while senior teammate **Steve Polmert (Kokomo, IN/Culver)** came up with a seventh in the 1650 free (16:12.19). Other top individual showings were turned in by College of Wooster junior **Tom Hungerford (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)**, who was fourth in the 1650 free (16:03.56), and Oberlin College freshman **Michael Heithaus (Mt. Vernon, OH/Mt. Vernon)**, who was sixth in the 200 back (1:54.07).

Kenyon's streak of 13 straight national championships is the longest in NCAA history (Hobart is working on a 12-year string in Division III men's lacrosse). Additionally, Kenyon head coach **Jim Steen** has claimed 22 national championships (including nine in women's swimming), more than any other collegiate coach in any sport, any division.

**LAX FACTS:** Ohio Wesleyan and Denison are ranked fourth and 16th, respectively, in the Division III men's lacrosse preseason poll conducted by the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association. Ohio Wesleyan is working on a string of five consecutive NCAC championships and seven straight NCAA Tournament appearances. The Bishops were ranked second in the final USILA poll last year. Denison took the first two North Coast titles in 1985 and 1986 and has made three post-season appearances in the last seven seasons.... Wooster junior attackman **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** set a school record for goals in a game when he scored nine in an 18-13 win over Dickinson, Mar. 21.

**NCAC Spring Sports Update**  
**SPRING SPORTS IN FULL SWING; FOUR NORTH  
COAST GOLF SQUADS IN DIVISION III TOP 20**

**CLEVELAND** — Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT:** Wittenberg (4-0; 8-3) puts its unbeaten NCAC record on the line with a four game series against second-place Ohio Wesleyan (10-2; 14-8) in Springfield, Apr. 11-12. Both teams are leading candidates to take first place in the regular season standings and earn the right to host the North Coast's four team post season tournament, which determines the Conference champion. Denison (3-1; 6-7) travels to CWRU (1-4-1; 2-10-1), Allegheny (3-1; 6-5-1) is at Kenyon (1-6; 2-11) and Earlham (0-5; 1-8) hosts Oberlin (1-3; 1-7) in the remainder of next weekend's action. Allegheny and Denison are tied for third place, while Wooster (3-4-1; 8-12-1), which has the NCAC bye this week, stands fifth.

Wittenberg opened its NCAC schedule with a four-game sweep of Kenyon, Apr. 4-5. The Tigers were led by senior first baseman **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)**, who went 8-for-10 with a home run in the 12-2, 13-5, 4-2 and 12-2 victories. Wittenberg's pitching staff limited the Lords to a total of 17 hits on the weekend. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, won three of four at CWRU. Junior centerfielder **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)** had nine hits in 16 at bats to lead the Bishop attack, while senior righthander **Greg Kaiser (Coshocton, OH/Coshocton)** set the pace on the mound with a win and a save. CWRU avoided the sweep with a 2-1, eight-inning win in game three. In other North Coast action, Allegheny took three of four from Oberlin and Denison split a doubleheader with Wooster on Sunday after Saturday's games were canceled. Wooster senior **Gerry Sagerman (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** allowed one unearned run and struck out six to pace a 5-1 Scot victory in the opener, while junior **Mike Tissot (Hillsboro, OH/Hillsboro)** went the distance with a four-hitter in Denison's 4-0 triumph in the nightcap.

**GOLF REPORT:** Wooster claimed its first team title of the spring with a win at the weather shortened Muskingum Invitational, Apr. 3. The Scots put an outstanding 294 on the leaderboard Friday and it held up as Saturday's final round was canceled. Wittenberg carded a 304 to place fourth and Ohio Wesleyan totaled 305 for fifth, giving the NCAC three of the top five finishers in the 17-team event. Denison (325) and Kenyon (367) rounded out the North Coast contingent in 11th and 17th, respectively. Wooster senior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** led all NCAC performers with an outstanding round of 70 to finish second. Scot senior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** fired a 72 to tie for third, while Wittenberg freshman **Niclas Arvidsson (Rodeby, Sweden/Klippans)** shared fifth with a 73.

Six NCAC squads will invade Wooster for the Parlor Invitational, Apr. 10-11. Ohio Wesleyan is the defending champion. Defending North Coast champ Allegheny will participate in the Dickinson Tournament, Apr. 11-12. The latest Golf Coaches Association of America Division III poll has Ohio Wesleyan third, Allegheny fifth, Wittenberg seventh and Wooster 11th. It is the third consecutive year that the NCAC has had four teams in the national top 20 at one time.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (1-0; 3-5) visits Wooster (0-0; 4-5) on Saturday, Apr. 11, in a showdown between last year's top two NCAC finishers. Ohio Wesleyan is working on a string of five consecutive North Coast titles, while the steadily improving Scots have moved up from fourth in 1989 to third in 1990 and second last spring. Wooster opens the week at Wittenberg (0-1; 1-1) on Wednesday, while the Bishops travel to East Lansing, Mich., for a meeting with Michigan State on Thursday. Kenyon (0-2; 3-3) is at Wittenberg on Saturday to round out this week's NCAC schedule.

Denison (2-0; 5-5) took a 16-5 decision from Wittenberg, Apr. 1, in last week's only Conference contest. In other action, Kenyon dropped Marietta 15-3 behind four-goal outbursts from sophomore **Aaron Kilbourne (Denver, CO/Colorado)** and freshman **Mike Costanzo (Mt. Lebanon, PA/Sewickley)**; Wittenberg earned its first win of the year, 12-11 over Lake Forest, with junior **Ed Bafford (New York, NY/Trinity Pauling)** accounting for five goals and senior **Paul Collins (Cleveland Heights, OH/Western Reserve)** getting the game-winner in overtime; and Oberlin topped Northwood Institute, 19-3, on the strength of a four-goal, four assist performance by sophomore **Anthony Tartaglia (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Delbarton)**. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, had a tough week with narrow losses to Notre Dame (11-5) and 12-time defending Division III champ Hobart (12-11). Wooster also dropped a pair of close games, to Ohio State (14-10) and Franklin & Marshall (15-11), before closing the week with a 14-12 triumph over Swarthmore. Junior **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** led the Scot win with four goals.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Seven-time defending NCAC champ Denison (3-0; 4-0) will have a chance to put some distance between itself and its nearest competitors with games at Wittenberg (1-4; 1-5) on Wednesday, Apr. 8, and at home against second-place Kenyon (3-1; 4-1) on Saturday, Apr. 11. The Big Red picked up a pair of wins last week, 12-2 over Ohio Wesleyan on Mar. 31 and 9-4 over Northwestern on Apr. 4. Senior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)**, the North Coast's leading scorer with an average of 6.0 points per game, paced Denison with six goals and seven assists. Kenyon hosts Oberlin (1-1; 2-2), Apr. 8, and Earlham (2-2; 3-5) is at Ohio Wesleyan (2-2; 2-5), Apr. 11, in other key NCAC action this week.

Kenyon rebounded from a 12-11 loss at Wooster on Tuesday to post a 10-8 win over Earlham and a 12-11 triumph over Ohio Wesleyan later in the week. The Ladies were led by sophomore **Cary Loomis (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan)**, who had five goals in each victory. Wooster's triumph over Kenyon was highlighted by a seven goal outburst from freshman **Meg Wood (Alpine, NJ/Englewood)**. Earlham won twice in three games to jump from a tie for fifth in the NCAC standings to a tie for third. The Quakers sandwiched a 14-5 victory against Wittenberg and a 17-12 win over Wooster around their narrow loss at Kenyon. Earlham sophomore **Cate MacLachlan (Byfield, MA/Drummer)** exploded for nine goals against Wittenberg and 10 more against Wooster. Oberlin rounded out last week's schedule with a 13-10 win over Wittenberg. Senior **Bonnie Scranton (East Hartford, CT/Kingswood-Oxford)** had six goals to lead the Yeowomen.

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (1-0; 5-0) remained the only undefeated NCAC men's squad by winning its first Conference match of the season, 9-0, against Earlham. Denison (1-0; 8-2) continued its smashing 1992 success by racking up another pair of wins last week, besting CWRU, 6-2, and Cedarville, 6-2, behind the play of freshman **Matt Smucker (Grosse Pointe, MI/South)** and senior **Dave Fleming (Newark, OH/Silver (NM))**, who are 8-1 at #3 doubles, and freshman **Mark Leighton (Bryn Mawr, PA/Radnor)**, who leads all NCAC performers at #6 singles with a 6-1 mark. Oberlin (1-0; 9-3) extended its winning streak to six matches by beating Baldwin-Wallace, 6-1, and Allegheny, 6-3. Swinging hot racquets for the Yeomen have been senior **Moustapha Diop (Thies, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, who leads the NCAC at #1 singles with a record of 11-1, sophomore **Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)**, whose 9-2 mark is tops at #2 singles, and sophomore **Ousmane Diop (Thies, Senegal/Phillips (MA))**, who is 10-1 at #3. Erikson and Ousmane Diop are the top #1 doubles pair at 11-0. Five NCAC teams will travel to Kalamazoo, Mich., Apr. 10-11, for the annual GLCA Tournament. This week's schedule also features Kenyon at Wooster and CWRU at Allegheny on Tuesday, Apr. 7, and Denison at Ohio Wesleyan the next day.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Allegheny (2-0; 11-4), Denison (2-0; 9-5) and Kenyon (1-0; 9-1) continued to wield hot racquets on the women's courts. Defending NCAC champion Kenyon had a deja vu week, defeating Division I Bowling Green for the second time ever, 5-4, on Mar. 31 (its first victory was in 1991 by that identical score), and defending its title at the annual GLCA Tournament, Apr. 3-4 at Kalamazoo, Mich. The Ladies posted a convincing 9-0 win over Denison in the GLCA finals. The Big Red posted a 9-0 NCAC win over CWRU on Mar. 31 and placed second among the seven teams competing for the GLCA crown with wins over always-tough Albion, 8-1, and Kalamazoo, 6-3. Allegheny notched a big win over Division I Pittsburgh, 7-0, before scoring Conference victories over Ohio Wesleyan, 9-0, and Earlham, 8-1.

Individually, Kenyon got winning performances against Bowling Green from senior **Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi)** at #3 singles, junior **Sara Fousekis (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce)** at #4, junior **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** at #5, Britt Harbin and Fousekis at #2 doubles and Bear and junior **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips (MA))** at #3. Allegheny junior **Kristen Barclay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland)** leads play at #1 singles with a 13-4 record, while classmate **Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette)** leads at #2 singles with an 11-6 mark. As a tandem, they sit atop #1 doubles with a 13-4 mark.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** About one-third of the NCAC squads saw action this past weekend as the 1992 outdoor season slowly gains momentum. Ohio Wesleyan's women completely outdistanced the field as they amassed 126 points to overwhelm Rio Grande (26) and Oberlin (17) at their own triangular meet, Apr. 5. Oberlin was paced by first-place finishes by freshman **Meagan Cocks (Manhattan, KS/Manhattan)** in the triple jump (32' 3") and senior **Sarah Schwartz (Dobbs Ferry, NY/Dobbs Ferry)** in the 5000 (19:52.9). Ohio Wesleyan's men were somewhat more hospitable hosts, scoring 69 points to come in second behind Rio Grande (82) and in front of the Yeomen (36). Oberlin freshman **David Day (North Ganby, CT/Memorial)** won the 5000 (15:55.5)... CWRU senior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** qualified for nationals in the 100 hurdles with a second-place time of 14.99, while freshman **Leslie Kindling (Erie, PA/Fairview)** qualified in the high jump with a first-place leap of 5' 6" at the non-scoring Mount Union Open, Apr. 4. In the men's field, Spartan freshman **Ed Kalaher (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch)** finished second in both the shot (47' 11") and the discus (139' 1")... Earlham's men finished third (86) and women finished fourth (67) at the six-team Anderson Invitational, Apr. 4. The men had three individual winners -- junior **Steve Longenecker (Elkhart, IN/Bethany Christian)** in the 400 (51.8), freshman **Sean Walker (Stafford, OH/Skyvue)** in the 10,000 (34:52) and senior **Scott Pearson (Cincinnati, OH/Finneytown)** in the 5000 (16:10). In the women's lanes, junior **Tiffany Harris (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** won the 1500 (5:26.7)... All Conference teams are scheduled to run this week, with the big meets being the Ohio Wesleyan Invitational on Friday, Apr. 10, and the CWRU Invitational on Saturday, Apr. 11.

NAMED NCAC PLAYER AND PITCHER OF THE WEEK

CLEVELAND -- Wittenberg University senior **Jeff Brown** (Springfield, OH/North) and Allegheny College sophomore **Mike Madigan** (Orchard Park, NY/Hamburg) have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

**Brown**, a 6-2, 230 pound first baseman, went 10 for 13 (.769) with nine runs batted in as Wittenberg won four of five games on the week to improve its record to 8-3. He keyed the Tigers' four-game sweep of Kenyon, Apr. 4-5, by getting eight hits in 10 at bats, including a grand slam. Brown, a first team All NCAC selection last spring, currently leads the North Coast with a .581 batting average.

**Madigan**, a 6-2, 210-pound righthander, picked up a pair of victories as Allegheny won four of five games to up its record to 6-5-1. He went three innings in a 13-0 triumph over Penn St.-Behrend, Apr. 2, allowing no runs and only one hit while striking out five. Madigan came back in game three of the Gators' weekend series with Oberlin, Apr. 5, going the distance in an 11-1 victory. He yielded one unearned run and three hits while striking out four.

**NCAC INTERNATIONAL:** A group of 32 graduating seniors from seven North Coast Athletic Conference schools will participate in a football game in the former Soviet Union, May 24. The opposition will be the Moscow Bears, a semi-professional team that toured the United States in 1990. In addition to the actual contest, the NCAC players will conduct clinics with their Russian counterparts and participate in sight seeing tours in and around Moscow. The game is the brainchild of Allegheny football coach **Ken O'Keefe**, who explored the possibility after a conversation with one of his players who had taken a year off from football to study abroad. After identifying several potential sites, including China, Ireland and Italy, O'Keefe turned the final selection over to his seniors. "The Soviet Union had the most appeal to the kids because it offered a chance to witness history in the making," O'Keefe said. "How often do you get the opportunity to see things that your children will read about in their history books years later?" Long-time Denison coach **Keith Piper** also will be making the trip, as will 12 graduating seniors from Allegheny, five from Kenyon and Wooster, four from Ohio Wesleyan, three from Denison, two from Wittenberg and one from CWRU. The group leaves Cleveland on Tuesday, May 19, and returns Thursday, May 28 (complete roster listed on reverse side).

**TIDAL WAVE:** NCAC men's and women's swimmers once again dunked the rest of the field and posted amazing statistics at the NCAA Division III Championships last month. Ninety North Coast swimmers won a total of 273 All-America honors. At the men's championships, held Mar. 19-20 at SUNY-Buffalo, 51 Conference swimmers and divers reaped 143 All-America honors. Kenyon, which won its 13th consecutive national title, led the NCAC pack with 15 men earning 45 awards. Third place Denison had 11 men win 35 honors, fifth place Allegheny featured nine men splashing to 29 honors, and 14th-place CWRU had eight men win 18 honors. In addition, Ohio Wesleyan had six men grab 19 honors and Oberlin and Wooster had one All American win two and one honors, respectively. At the women's championships, held Mar. 12-14 at SUNY-Buffalo, 39 North Coast swimmers and divers earned a total of 130 All-America honors, led by 14 Kenyon Ladies who garnered 50 All-America awards en route to winning a ninth consecutive national title. Kenyon shattered meet records for points in recording the most lopsided victory in the history of the event. Strongly supporting Kenyon in the quest for All-America honors were sixth-place Denison with 12 women and 36 honors, 11th-place Allegheny with six All Americas winning 23 awards, 20th place Wooster with six women grabbing 19 honors, and Wittenberg with one All-American copping two awards.

**SOCCER SCOOP:** The NCAA Division III men's soccer subcommittee has recommended that the North Coast Athletic Conference have its automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championships renewed. Approval of the recommendation is expected at the NCAA Executive Committee meeting in May. The NCAC had three teams in the post-season field for the second consecutive season last fall, led by Ohio Wesleyan (22-2), which received the automatic qualifier by claiming its fifth North Coast title in eight years. The Bishops, who advanced all the way to the national semifinals before falling to eventual champion UC-San Diego, were joined in the 32-team field by Kenyon (15-3-1) and Wittenberg (13-5-1). The NCAC posted an impressive 59-32-6 (.639) record against non-conference opposition in 1991.

**DENISON EYES EIGHTH STRAIGHT WOMEN'S LACROSSE  
TITLE; OWU, ALLEGHENY TIED FOR FIRST IN BASEBALL.**

**CLEVELAND** - Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (14-2; 19-8) travels to Allegheny (7-1; 14-5-1) for a four-game series on Friday and Saturday, Apr. 17-18, that should go a long way towards determining the site for this year's NCAC Tournament, which will be hosted by the first place team in the regular season standings. The Bishops and Gators are in a percentage tie for first after sweeping four game sets last weekend. Fourth-place Wittenberg (4-4; 8-8) is at fifth-place Wooster (3-4-1; 10-12-1) and second-place Denison (6-2; 9-10) hosts sixth-place Earlham (3-6; 4-11) in other key North Coast matchups this weekend.

Ohio Wesleyan continued its heavy hitting last week, winning five games by a combined score of 49-19. The Bishops currently lead the NCAC in batting (.359) and runs scored (8.2 per game). Allegheny, meanwhile, has stretched its win streak to 10 behind an outstanding pitching staff that has a Conference-best 2.97 earned run average. Individually, Earlham senior **Todd Hawkins (Casstown, OH/Miami East)** leads the circuit in hitting with a .477 average. Ohio Wesleyan junior **Scott Govoni (Medfield, MA/Noble & Greenough)**, meanwhile, is the only player to lead the NCAC in more than one offensive category -- doubles (16) and runs batted in (34). On the mound, Allegheny sophomores **Mike Madigan (Orchard Park, NY/Hamburg)** and **Mike Pennington (New Philadelphia, OH/New Philadelphia)** are first and second in ERA at 2.37 and 2.45, respectively. Ohio Wesleyan senior **Mike Hudy (Kirtland, OH/Kirtland)** is the North Coast's winningest pitcher at 5-0.

**GOLF REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan posted rounds of 316 and 305 for a 36-hole total of 621 to win Wooster's Parlor-Bank One Invitational, Apr. 10-11. The Bishops trailed by four strokes after the first day of competition, but came back with the tournament's best score on day two to win the event for the second consecutive year. First round leader Wittenberg finished second at 624 and host Wooster totaled 633 to place third and complete an NCAC sweep of the top three positions in the 18-team field. Denison (669) was 12th, CWRU (671) 13th and Kenyon (732) 18th to round out the North Coast contingent.

Individually, Wittenberg senior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** earned medalist honors with a three-over par 147. Lyons, a three-time first-team All-America, leads the NCAC this spring with a 73.5 stroke average. Sophomore **J.W. Wilson (Zanesville, OH/Rosecrans)** tied for second at 151 and senior **Galen Eckland (Lake Geneva, WI/Badger)** tied for fifth with a 154 to pace Ohio Wesleyan. Other top finishers included Wittenberg freshman **Niclas Arvidsson (Rodeby, Sweden/Klippans)**, who was fourth at 153, Wooster senior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)**, who tied for fifth at 154, and Denison senior **Scott Thomas (St. Louis, MO/Burroughs)**, who was seventh at 155.

The upcoming schedule is highlighted by the Denison-Capital Invitational, Apr. 20-21, where Allegheny is the defending champion. The Gators are coming off a third-place finish in the 20-team Dickinson Tournament, Apr. 11-12. Senior **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** leads Allegheny with a 77.8 stroke average.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Denison (2-0; 6-6) will look to move atop the NCAC standings this week with games against Kenyon (1-2; 4-3) on Wednesday and Wooster (1-1; 5-6) on Saturday. Wooster defeated the Big Red last spring to drop them below second place for the first time in the North Coast's seven seasons. Denison needs wins in both games to set up an Apr. 25 battle for the NCAC championship with Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 5-5). The Bishops host Oberlin (1-1; 4-2) on Saturday in the week's remaining Conference contest.

Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster were winners in North Coast play last week. Kenyon took a 12-6 decision from Wittenberg behind a 24-save performance by sophomore goalie **Chip Riegel (Montchanin, DE/Westminster)**. Offensively, the Lords got five goals from freshman **Mike Costanzo (Mt. Lebanon, PA/Sewickley)** and three more from sophomore **Aaron Kilbourne (Denver, CO/Colorado)**. Ohio Wesleyan dropped Wooster 19-4 behind the four goal performance of junior **Andy Greaves (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)**, while the Scots used a four-goal outing by sophomore **Andrew Windsor (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** to notch a 17-7 victory against Wittenberg.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Denison (5-0; 6-0) will look to extend its one and one-half game lead with a trio of road games this week. The Big Red are at Oberlin (1-3; 2-5) on Monday, Earlham (2-3; 3-7) on Thursday and Ohio Wesleyan (4-2; 4-5) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan is currently tied for second place with Kenyon (4-2; 5-2). The Bishops begin their week at Oberlin on Thursday, while Kenyon travels to Wittenberg (1-5; 1-9) on Tuesday and hosts Wooster (2-4; 2-6) on Saturday.

Denison and Ohio Wesleyan posted two wins apiece to highlight last week's action. Denison continued to play outstanding defense in a 17-2 victory against Wittenberg and a 10-4 triumph over Kenyon. Junior goalie **Christy Polumbus (Englewood, CO/Colorado)** had 20 saves on the week, while seniors **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** and **Amy Bradley (Longboat Key, FL/Nichols (NY))** each had seven goals to lead the offense. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, got five goals from senior **Denise Goldman (Somerset, NJ/Rutgers)** in a 16-7 win over Wooster and five more from sophomore **Jessica Battle (Potomac, MD/Holy Child)** in a 10-7 victory against Earlham.

**MEN'S TENNIS:** Undefeated NCAC records will be on the line this week as Oberlin (1 0; 10 5) faces Denison (2 0; 10 3) on Tuesday and Wooster (1 0; 8 4) on Saturday. In other key action, Ohio Wesleyan (1 1; 6 2) hosts Wooster on Tuesday, one day before travelling to Gambier to take on defending champion Kenyon (1-1; 8 5). Wittenberg (0 0; 2 1), meanwhile, opens its North Coast schedule with matches at Denison on Thursday and Kenyon on Friday.

Five NCAC squads took part in last weekend's GLCA Tournament in Kalamazoo, Mich. Kenyon advanced to the championship game on the strength of a 5-4 win over Wooster in the semifinals. The Lords dropped a 5-0 decision to defending Division III champ Kalamazoo in the finals. Kenyon's victory against Wooster avenged a 5-4 loss to the Scots earlier in the week. In other GLCA action, Denison defeated Albion (5-0), Wooster topped Hope (5 0), Ohio Wesleyan nipped Wabash (5 4) and Kenyon beat Denison (5 2). On the debit side, Kalamazoo knocked off Oberlin (6-0) and DePauw defeated Ohio Wesleyan (5-0).

**WOMEN'S TENNIS:** Allegheny (4-0; 13-4), Denison (3-0; 12-5) and Kenyon (2-0; 10-1) have been able to keep their unblemished NCAC records intact, but one or more will be tarnished by this time next week as Denison invades Gambier on Tuesday and Allegheny travels to Granville on Saturday.

Allegheny kept rolling last week with a pair of North Coast victories -- 6-3 over Wooster and 8-1 over Oberlin. The Gators got back to back wins from juniors **Kristen Barclay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland)** at #1 singles, **Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette)** at #2, **Pam Grabinski (McKees Rocks, PA/Montour)** at #3 and the Barclay-Kachuriak tandem at #1 doubles. Denison and Kenyon each posted an NCAC win last week, with the Big Red blanking Wittenberg and the Ladies shutting out Oberlin.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** Allegheny's men and women had quality weeks as both squads ran second to Slippery Rock at the five-team Allegheny Invitational on Apr. 8, before placing second at the 11-team CWRU Invitational on Apr. 11. The Gators also had a number of performers qualify for nationals at the non scoring Carnegie Mellon Invitational, Apr. 12. Junior **Fletcher Brooks (Simsbury, CT/Westminster)** led five Gators with first-place finishes at the Allegheny Invitational with a national-qualifying toss of 52' 7" in the shot put. At CWRU, senior **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)** was named Outstanding Athlete for his performances, which were highlighted by a first in the 100 (10.9). The Allegheny men capped the week when the 4x100 relay of sophomore **Gene Calhoun (Cleveland, OH/St. Joseph)**, Drayton and freshmen **Chuck Bremer (Cleveland Heights, OH/Cleveland Heights)** and **Ron Street (Barberton, OH/Barberton)** qualified for nationals with a time of 41.4 at Carnegie Mellon. This meet also proved sweet for Denison junior **James McClair (Ann Arbor, MI)**, who tied a field record in the high jump at 6' 6". In the women's lanes, the Gators took first in four individual events and two relays at the Allegheny Invitational. Senior **Alyse Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River)** led a trio of Gator winners as she was named Outstanding Athlete at the CWRU Invitational after establishing the fastest time in the nation this season in the 1,500 (4:35). Holden has qualified for the NCAA Division III Championships in seven events. Qualifying for nationals at Carnegie Mellon were sophomore **Serena Fraser (Clarence, NY/Clarence)** in the 10,000 (37:10) and freshman **Sue McQuiston (Sandy Lake, PA/Lakeview)** in the javelin (125' 1").

The CWRU men topped the 11 team field in winning its own invitational on Apr. 11. The Spartan women finished third. First-place finishes for the men were turned in by sophomore **Shaun Brown (East Cleveland, OH/St. Joseph)** in the 1,500 (4:08.2) and 5,000 (11:02.1), and freshman **Ed Kalaher (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch)** in the discus (145' 3"). For the women, freshman **Leslie Kindling (Erie, PA)** won the high jump (5' 4"), while senior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** captured the 100 high hurdles (15.51) and the 400 intermediate hurdles (1:06.66). Her time in the 400 hurdles broke the track record (1:07.58) dating back to 1985.

In other NCAC action, the Ohio Wesleyan women totaled 158 points to run second at the seven team OWU Invitational, Apr. 10. The Bishops were led by senior **Shellee Laine (Rome, NY/Rome Catholic)**, who hurdled the field in the 400 intermediates (1:04.51) and the 100 highs (16.06), and sophomore **Cindy Geiss (East Palestine, OH/East Palestine)**, who broke the ribbon in the 3,000 (10:42.6). The Bishops ran fifth in the men's field, getting a first-place performance from senior **Doug Pleison (Great Falls, VA/Ridgewood)** in the triple jump (42' 2"). Wittenberg placed seventh with sophomore **Dwight Carter (Columbus, OH/Linden McKinley)** taking the 110 hurdles (15.22). Oberlin's men tallied 69 points to squeeze past Wooster (68) for the top spot at a triangular at Oberlin, Apr. 8. The Yeomen got first-place finishes from junior **Fred Mikulec (Morton Grove, IL/Loyola)** in the 110 (17.0) and 400 (59.0) hurdles. Wooster scored 74 points to win in the four-team women's field.

Ohio Wesleyan moved closer to clinching the top spot with a two game sweep at Allegheny, Apr. 17. The Bishops, who have won nine games in a row, took a 7-5 decision in the opener as sophomore **Brad Roser (Delaware, OH/Buckeye Valley)** upped his record to 5-1 with a nine-strikeout performance. Junior catcher **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** had a pair of home runs and five runs batted in to key Ohio Wesleyan's 6-5 win in game two. Elsewhere, Wittenberg and Wooster split a four-game series with Wittenberg taking games one and two by 4-2 and 5-3 scores behind outstanding pitching performances from sophomore **Craig Isaac (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern)** and freshman **Kevin Espelage (Cincinnati, OH/Elder)**. Isaac fired a four-hitter in game one, while Espelage yielded just five hits in the nightcap. The Scots came back with a 10 9 win in game three on the strength of a seven run first inning, and an 8 2 victory in the finale behind the seven hit pitching of junior righthander **John Ramsler (Rittman, OH/Rittman)**. Ramsler also picked up a mid week win with four innings of no-hit pitching in an 11-0 victory against John Carroll. In other action last week, Denison won three games in three outings, including a doubleheader sweep of Earlham, Apr. 17. The Big Red have won six of their last seven games.

**GOLF REPORT:** Wooster highlighted a limited week of action with a win at the 17-team Indiana (Pa.) Invitational, Apr. 15. The Scots totaled 373 in the five man event, with senior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** and junior **Darren Schubert (Wooster, OH/Wooster)** sharing medalist honors with rounds of 72. Allegheny also was in the field and carded a 391 to take third place. Senior **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** finished fourth with a 73 to pace the Gators. Elsewhere, CWRU was second of seven at its Spartan Invitational, Apr. 16. Senior **Kermit Pollori (Middlefield, OH/Cardinal)** fired a 79 to finish in a three-way tie for first.

The majority of this week's action is at the Denison-Capital Invitational, Apr. 20-21. Five NCAC squads will be on hand and Allegheny is the defending champion. The Gators also will host the Griffin-Country Club Classic, Apr. 24-25.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** For the seventh time in eight years, the NCAC championship figures to be determined by a head-to-head meeting between Denison (4-0; 8-6) and Ohio Wesleyan (3-0; 7 5). Denison defeated the Bishops in 1985 and 1986 to take the first two North Coast titles, but since then Ohio Wesleyan has rolled to five consecutive championships. The Bishops have secured the title with wins over the Big Red four times during that span. This year's meeting will be Saturday, Apr. 25, in Granville. In other NCAC action, Wooster (1 2; 5 8) is at Oberlin (1 2; 4 3) on Wednesday before coming home to close the season against Kenyon (1-3; 4-5) on Saturday. The Scots need wins in both games to clinch third place in the standings.

Denison won twice in North Coast play last week, toppling Kenyon 18-7 and Wooster 10-4. Junior **Jon Tyack (Worthington, OH/Worthington)** had five goals and two assists and freshman goalie **Marc Jacobson (Ridgewood, NJ/Ridgewood)** came up with 27 saves to pace the Big Red victories. The win over the Scots avenged a 1991 loss that dropped Denison below second place in the Conference for the first time. Ohio Wesleyan also had a 2 0 week, dropping Ohio State 10 8 and Oberlin 20-4. Junior **Andy Greaves (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)** led the Bishops with five goals against the Buckeyes, while freshman **William Costello (Fayetteville, NY/Fayetteville Manlius)** had five to go with a pair of assists against Oberlin. Wittenberg took a 16-6 decision from Northwood Institute, Michigan State beat Wooster 13-7, and Lake Forest topped Kenyon 12 5 to round out last week's schedule.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Denison (8 0; 9 0) can clinch at least a share of its eighth consecutive NCAC championship with a pair of wins this week. The Big Red host Wooster (2-6; 2-8) on Monday, Apr. 20, and Oberlin (1-6; 2-8) on Wednesday, Apr. 22. Second-place Kenyon (6-2; 7-2) trails Denison by two games and needs wins at Earlham (3-4; 4-8) on Wednesday and at Ohio Wesleyan (5-3; 5-6) on Saturday to remain a factor.

Denison powered its way through last week's schedule with wins over Oberlin, 18-1, Earlham, 13-5, and Ohio Wesleyan, 15-5. Sophomore **Cheryl Connelly (Bedford, NY/Berkshire (MA))** and seniors **Christina**

Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal) and Niki Stone (Old Greenwich, CT/Greenwich) each had nine goals on the week to pace the Big Red. Kenyon kept pace with a pair of wins, squeaking past Wittenberg 11-10 on Tuesday before exploding for 16 first-half goals en route to an 18-10 triumph over Wooster on Saturday. Sophomore Cary Loomis (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan) led the Ladies' attack against Wooster with five goals and one assist, giving her nine goals on the week. Ohio Wesleyan and Earlham went 1-1 for the week, each losing to Denison and beating Oberlin. Ohio Wesleyan senior Denise Goldman (Somerset, NJ/Rutgers) had six goals in the Bishops' 17-10 win over Oberlin, while Earlham sophomore Cate MacLachlan (Byfield, MA/Governor Dummer) racked up eight goals on the week. Wittenberg rebounded from its one goal loss to Kenyon with a 13-6 victory against Wooster on Thursday.

**MEN'S TENNIS:** Denison (5-0; 13-3) and Wooster (3-0; 11-6) will put their unbeaten NCAC records on the line this Tuesday, Apr. 21, in a North Coast headliner at Wooster. It will be an important week for the Big Red as they must then come back two days later to host third place Kenyon (3-1; 10-5). Denison, Kenyon and Wooster have accounted for all seven NCAC championships, with Kenyon taking the title in 1991. Another key North Coast contest will take place Wednesday when Oberlin (2-2; 11-7) hosts Ohio Wesleyan (2-3; 7-4).

Denison posted a trio of wins last week -- 6-3 over Oberlin, 5-4 over Wittenberg and 5-0 over Allegheny. Senior Will Knox (Erie, PA/Academy) and junior Brian Maebius (San Antonio, TX/Alamo Heights) had three victories to remain undefeated atop #1 doubles at 10-0. Wooster and Kenyon kept pace with a pair of Conference wins as the Scots defeated Ohio Wesleyan 7-2 and Oberlin 8-1, while the Lords topped the Ohio Wesleyan 9-0 and Wittenberg 7-2. Leads changed hands in three individual flights as Oberlin sophomore Ousmane Dlop (Thies, Senegal/Phillips (MA)) jumped to the top at #3 singles with a 13-3 record, Allegheny freshman Jeremy Zabell (Solon, OH/University) now leads at #6 singles with a 12-4 slate, and the Earlham tandem of senior Jeff Keller (Wakefield, RI/South Kingstown) and freshman Tim Taylor (Middleburg, IN/Northridge) are atop #2 doubles at 2-1.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS:** Kenyon (4-0; 16-1) firmly established itself as the team to beat at the upcoming NCAC Championships with 9-0 wins over Denison (4-1; 13-6) and Wittenberg (3-3; 3-4) last week. The Ladies also looked good at the Midwest Regional Tournament, Apr. 17-18, in Madison, Wis., cruising through four straight matches to win the event for the first time. Kenyon dumped Augustana, Wisconsin-LaCrosse, St. Olaf and Gustavus Adolphus by a combined score of 34-1 to take the Midwest title.

Kenyon owns the NCAC's best records to date at all nine individual positions. Freshman Katja Zerck (Dusseldorf, Germany/Hulshoff) has been outstanding at #1 singles with an 11-2 mark, while senior Kathryn Lane (Nashville, TN/St. Cecilia) has posted a 10-1 record at #2. Zerck and Lane also have combined for an 11-3 mark at the top doubles slot. Allegheny (5-1; 14-5), meanwhile, has individuals in the top three at six positions. The Gators are led by juniors Kristen Barolay (Scottsdale, PA/Southmoreland), who is 16-5 at #1, and Kristie Kachuriak (McDonald, PA/South Fayette), who is 14-7 at #2. Denison, which defeated Allegheny 9-0 last week, also has players among the top three at six spots. Junior Katie Fowles (Grand Island, NE/Grand Island) and freshman Paige Telan (Altamonte Springs, FL/Trinity) are 11-6 at #3 and #6, respectively.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** Seven NCAC schools participated in the 16-team All-Ohio Championships at Ohio Wesleyan on Friday, Apr. 17. The host Bishops put together the best team finish with a second in the women's field, while CWRU led the men with a third-place showing. Baldwin-Wallace won the women's title with 113 points, followed by Ohio Wesleyan (111.5) in second, Mount Union (88.5) in third and Wooster (67) in fourth. CWRU (40) finished seventh, Denison (35.5) eighth, Kenyon (35) ninth, Oberlin (14.5) 13th and Wittenberg (13) tied for 14th to round out the North Coast contingent. Mount Union totaled 163 points to take the men's championship, followed by Baldwin-Wallace (99.5) in second, CWRU (73) in third, Ohio Northern (72) in fourth, Wooster (68) in fifth and Ohio Wesleyan (63) in sixth. Denison (37.5) placed ninth, Oberlin (26) 11th, Wittenberg (12) 12th and Kenyon (0) tied for 14th to fill out the NCAC scorecard.

Individually, five North Coast women won a total of seven events. CWRU senior Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge) took the 100 high hurdles (14:64) and the 400 intermediate hurdles (62:43), while Kenyon junior Kelley Wilder (Victor, NY/Central) claimed the 1500 (4:47.2) and 3000 (10:35.1). The remaining wins were picked up by CWRU freshman Leslie Kindling (Erie, PA/Fairview) in the triple jump (34' 9 3/4"), Denison sophomore Caroline Hill (Kensington, NH/Exeter Area) in the 400 (59:84), and Wooster senior Beth Blakemore (Gordon, CO/Wheat Ridge) in the 5000 (19:05.7). Five men also took individual titles, with Ohio Wesleyan senior Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights (OH)) doubling up in the shot put (53' 6") and discus (154). CWRU had a trio of winners with freshman Brian Casselberry (Seven Hills, OH/Normandy) taking the 10,000 (33:23.5), junior Matt Medford (Salem, OH/Salem) the 400 inter-mediate hurdles (54.33), and sophomore Mike Schaffer (Grafton, OH/Midview) the javelin (170' 3"). Wooster freshman Eric Rogers (Washington, DC/Landon) took the 400 (49:08) to complete the list of men's winners.

In other action, Allegheny's women placed third of seven in the predominantly Division I Kent State Invitational, Apr. 18. Freshman Susan McQuilston (Sandy Lake, PA/Lakeview) won the javelin (117' 6") and sophomore Serena Fraser (Clarence, NY/Clarence) copped the 5000 (18:00.6) to pace the Gators. Allegheny's men were sixth of eight at KSU. Earlham's men and women, meanwhile, each placed fourth of five at the Centre Invitational, Apr. 18. Senior Scott Pearson (Cincinnati, OH/Finneytown) remained undefeated in the 5000 this spring in winning with an NCAC season-best time of 15:44.1. Sophomore Kassondra Wright (Richmond, IN/Richmond) led the Quaker women with victories in the 100 (13.5) and 200 (27.9).

CLEVELAND Wittenberg University senior **Chris Tillotson** (Glenview, IL/Glenbrook South) and College of Wooster junior **John Ramsier** (Rittman, OH/Rittman) have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for their play last week in the NCAC.

**Tillotson**, a 6-0, 170-pound outfielder, went 12-for-20 (.600) with four doubles and a home run as Wittenberg won three of six games on the week, including a split in its four-game series at Wooster, Apr. 17-18. He also scored seven runs and drove in five, while improving his batting average to .400.

**Ramsier**, a 6-0, 175 pound righthander, picked up a pair of victories as the Scots won three of five on the week. He pitched four no-hit innings in Wooster's 11-0 triumph over John Carroll, Apr. 15, and then went the distance on a seven-hitter in an 8-2 victory against Wittenberg, Apr. 18. The two wins upped Ramsier's season record to 3-3.

**OBERLIN ACTION:** Oberlin has named **Kim Oren** head coach for women's basketball and soccer, and **Lisl Prater-Lee** head coach for women's swimming. Oren comes to Oberlin from Avon Lake High School, where she compiled a 53-14 record in three years as girl's basketball coach. Her 1991-92 squad reached the district finals and she was named Lorain County Division II Coach of the Year. Oren is a 1986 graduate of Slippery Rock with a degree in physical education. Prater-Lee will take over the women's swimming program on a full-time basis after filling the position in an interim capacity this past season. She is a 1989 graduate of Oberlin, where she earned four letters in swimming and a degree with a double major in psychology and sociology.... Oberlin also announced that **George Hammill** will join the football program as an offensive assistant. He comes to Oberlin from Brookside High School, where he was head coach for four seasons. Hammill is a 1980 graduate of Edinboro with a degree in education. He served two tours of duty in Vietnam in the U.S. Marine Corps and was awarded the Bronze Star and Purple Heart.

**HONOR ROLL:** A pair of Ohio Wesleyan basketball standouts -- senior **Krista Jacobs** (Delaware, OH/Hayes) and junior **Karen Porath** (Solon, OH/Gilmour) -- have been named to the American Women's Sports Federation All-America squad. Jacobs was a third-team selection, while Porath earned fourth-team honors. CWRU senior **Ken Holloway** (St. Clairsville, OH/St. Clairsville) has homered in four of his last six games. Holloway, who is 9-for-26 during that span, leads the Spartans in batting average (.348), home runs (4) and runs batted in (13).... Wooster sophomore first baseman **Chris Cingolani** (Transfer, PA/Kennedy Christian) went 7 for 15 and scored six runs as the Scots won three times in five outings last week... Wittenberg's **Craig Isaac** (South Charleston, OH/Southeastern) had a 2-0 week on the mound. The sophomore righthander picked up the win with one inning of relief in a 9-8 victory against Wilmington, Apr. 14, and then fired a complete game four-hitter in a 4-2 triumph over Wooster, Apr. 17.... Earlham sophomore outfielder **Jay Dace** (Cincinnati, OH/Forest Park) had six hits in 12 at bats in four games last week, including a double, triple and a home run.... Ohio Wesleyan junior **Mark Senkowitz** (Warren, OH/Champion) was back in the Bishop lineup on a full-time basis last week after missing 12 games with a knee injury. Senkowitz, who splits time behind the plate and at designated hitter, went 5-for-8 with two doubles, two home runs and six runs batted in as Ohio Wesleyan won three straight games to bump its win streak to nine.

### **NCAC Spring Sports Update**

**OHIO WESLEYAN, DENISON CLAIM MEN'S AND WOMEN'S  
LACROSSE TITLES; OWU TO HOST BASEBALL TOURNEY**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (20-2; 27-8) has clinched first place in the regular-season standings and will host the four-team NCAC Tournament, May 8-10. With one weekend of play remaining, four teams are fighting for the final three spots in the field. Wittenberg (10-6; 17-12) appears to have a solid hold on second place with Allegheny (8-6; 18-11-1) and Denison (8-6; 13-14) tied for third, just in front of fifth place Wooster (8-7-1; 19-15-1). Allegheny travels to Denison for a four-game set on Saturday and Sunday, May 2-3, to highlight this week's schedule. In other action, Wittenberg is on the road against seventh place Earlham (3-10; 4-17), while two time defending NCAC champ Wooster plays at eighth-place Oberlin (2-10; 2-15). With a successful weekend at Oberlin, the Scots should slide into the tournament as Allegheny and Denison battle for the fourth spot.

Red-hot Ohio Wesleyan ran its win streak to 14 with five victories last week, including a four-game sweep of Denison over the weekend. Sophomore righthander **Brad Roser (Delaware, OH/Buckeye Valley)** went the distance and upped his record to 6-1 in a 7-3 win in the opener, while senior shortstop **Mike Royer (Columbus, OH/Westland)** had the game-winning single in the bottom of the seventh as the Bishops battled back from a six-run deficit to win game two by an 8-7 count. Ohio Wesleyan took a 12-2 decision in game three and then won the finale 6-5 in eight innings as Royer contributed his second game winning hit of the series with a two-out single in the final frame. Elsewhere, Wooster took three of four from Allegheny. Senior outfielder **Matt Burdette (Cuyahoga Falls, OH/Cuyahoga Falls)** coaxed a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the seventh to give the Scots an 8-7 win in Saturday's opener and senior lefthander **Jeff Woller (Butler, PA/Knoch)** completed the sweep with six shutout innings in a 10-0 victory in game two. Allegheny came back to win game three on the strength of a six-run seventh. The Gators parlayed six singles, a walk and a sacrifice into the six runs, making a winner of sophomore relief ace **Dean Peterson (Cortland, OH/Mathews)**. Wooster, however, put together a six-run third in the finale on the way to a 9-3 win behind the solid pitching of junior righthander **John Ramsier (Rittman, OH/Rittman)**, who won for the third straight time to up his record to 4-3. Wittenberg swept four from Oberlin and CWRU took a pair from Earlham in the remainder of last week's NCAC action.

**GOLF REPORT:** Allegheny will defend its title at the 1992 NCAC Golf Championships on Friday and Saturday, May 1-2, at the Quail Hollow Country Club in Concord Township, Ohio. The Gators, who have won two of seven North Coast titles, put together a five-stroke victory over Wittenberg last spring. Four-time champion Ohio Wesleyan and 1985 champ Wooster join Allegheny and Wittenberg as this season's favorites. Allegheny seniors **George Laskey (Hopwood, PA/Geibel)**, **Jim Swanson (Murraysville, PA/Franklin Regional)** and **Marc Voytko (Johnstown, PA/McCort)** are the top returnees from last year's event, having placed second, fourth and fifth, respectively.

Wittenberg highlighted last week's action with a win at the 25 team Denison Capital Invitational, Apr. 20-21. The Tigers totaled 622 in the 36 hole event, edging Otterbein by one stroke. Allegheny (625) placed third, Ohio Wesleyan (628) fourth, Denison (673) 16th and Kenyon (722) 24th to fill out the NCAC scorecard. The Wittenberg duo of senior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)** and freshman **Niclas Arvidsson (Rodeby, Sweden/Klippan)** were the North Coast's top performers, finishing in a tie for second at 149. Lyons' even-par 71 at the Granville Golf Course in round two was a key factor as the Tigers overcame a six stroke Allegheny lead after the first day of competition. In other action, Allegheny hosted the Griffin Country Club Classic, Apr. 24-25, and placed fourth of eight. Laskey and Voytko placed fourth and eighth, respectively, to pace the Gators.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (4-0; 8-5) can wrap up sole possession of its sixth consecutive NCAC championship with a win over Wittenberg (0-3; 3-3) on Wednesday, Apr. 29, in Delaware. The North Coast season will conclude on Saturday when Wittenberg hosts Oberlin (1-3; 4-4). Ohio Wesleyan, ranked sixth nationally, closes out the regular-season portion of its schedule at Alfred on Saturday.

Ohio Wesleyan assured itself of a portion of the NCAC title with an 18-6 win over Denison on Saturday, Apr. 25. The Bishops got four goals from freshman **William Costello (Fayetteville, NY/Fayetteville Manlius)** and junior **Jed Cronin (Boston, MA/Avon Old Farms (CT))** plus 17 saves in goal from junior **David Breslin (Mt. Lakes, NJ/Mt. Lakes)**. Denison (4-1; 8-7) will be the North Coast runner-up for the fifth time in six years since winning back-to-back championships in 1985 and 1986. Wooster, meanwhile, clinched third place with a pair of wins last week. The Scots got three goals from freshman **Rich Field (Far Hills, NJ/Trinity Pawling)** in a 12-8 triumph over Oberlin on Wednesday and seven goals and three assists from junior **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** in an 18-7 victory against Kenyon on Saturday. Oberlin needs a win over Wittenberg this week to claim fourth place outright, while a Wittenberg victory forges a three-way tie for fourth that also includes Kenyon.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Denison (10-0; 13-0) has joined the Kenyon men's and women's swimmers as the only teams to win all eight NCAC championships to date. The Big Red locked up this year's title last week by topping Wooster and Oberlin by 21-4 and 20-5 scores, respectively. Three teams -- Ohio Wesleyan (7-3; 7-6), Kenyon (6-4; 7-4) and Earlham (6-4; 7-8) -- are still alive in the race for second place. Ohio Wesleyan is on the road to face Wooster (2-8; 2-10) and Earlham this week, while Kenyon plays at Oberlin (1-9; 2-11) and at home against Denison, and Earlham travels to Wittenberg (3-7; 3-11).

Denison solidified its position as a national power by winning the Haverford Tournament over the weekend. The Big Red, who are ranked eighth in Division III, edged fourth ranked Frostburg State 6-5 in the opener on Saturday and came back to defeat Haverford 6-1 in Sunday's finals. Senior **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** continued her outstanding play by scoring four goals against Frostburg State and three more against Haverford. She also had five goals and three assists in the NCAC win over Oberlin earlier in the week. Denison's four wins also were keyed by the play of junior goalie **Christy Columbus (Englewood, CO/Colorado)**, who had 27 saves and is allowing an average of just over three goals per game. Elsewhere in the North Coast, Earlham had a 3-0 week and Ohio Wesleyan posted a pair of wins without a loss. Earlham sophomore **Cate MacLachlan (Byfield, MA/Drummer)** had three goals in a 6-4 win over Kenyon and five more in a 9-7 triumph over Oberlin, while senior **Fin Lehman (Spring City, PA/Kimberton Waldorf)** poured in seven in a 15-8 victory against Wooster. Senior **Lisa Wood (Orrtanna, PA/Gettysburg)** was outstanding in goal in the three Quaker wins with 46 saves. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, got past Wittenberg 13-6 and Kenyon 15-9. Senior **Denise Goldman (Somerset, NJ/Rutgers)** had six goals against Wittenberg, including five in a 10 minute stretch late in the first half, and four more versus Kenyon. Sophomore **Jessica Battle (Potomac, MD/Holy Child)** chipped in for the Bishops with three goals against Wittenberg and five against Kenyon.

**TENNIS REPORT:** Kenyon is set to defend its titles at the 1992 NCAC Men's and Women's Tennis Championships on Friday and Saturday, May 1-2. The men's event will be held at Denison, with the women's competition at CWRU. Wooster, which is undefeated in NCAC play this spring, will be the top seed in the men's field. The Scots will be looking for their fourth North Coast championship. Second-seeded Denison and third-seeded Kenyon should also be major factors, with fourth-seeded Oberlin close behind. The women's tournament features one of the best teams in all of Division III in the Kenyon Ladies. Kenyon is 17-1 this season and is looking for its seventh straight NCAC title as well as a sixth consecutive national top-10 finish. Second-seeded Denison will push the Ladies, while third-seeded Allegheny figures to battle for position with Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** Denison's men and Ohio Wesleyan's women will defend their titles at the 1992 NCAC Men's and Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships on Friday and Saturday, May 1-2, in Granville. The Big Red men have won six of the seven NCAC titles, including a 42-point triumph over runner-up CWRU last spring. This year's favorite, however, appears to be Allegheny, which claimed the North Coast indoor title back in late February. Denison should be a factor along with CWRU, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster. In the women's field, Ohio Wesleyan will be gunning for its fourth straight championship and the Bishops figure to go head-to-head with last spring's runner-up, Allegheny. The Gators edged Ohio Wesleyan by four points to take this year's indoor crown.

North Coast squads were spread across the region this past weekend in their final tune-ups for the Conference meet. Ohio Wesleyan's women ran in a 17-team, non-scoring invitational at Ball State, Apr. 24-25, featuring top midwestern Division I schools. The Bishop contingent was led by a second-place finish from senior **Shellee Lamie (Rome, NY/Rome Catholic)** in the triple jump (32' 9 3/4") and a third from freshman **Sheila Gisbrecht (Brunswick, OH/Brunswick)** in the javelin (105' 1"). Denison's women scored 74 points to win the Big Red Invitational on Apr. 25 over Kenyon (47) and Muskingum (24). In the men's lanes, OWU came in second (51) to Muskingum (73), while Denison (39) placed third and Kenyon (31) fourth. Denison sophomores **Elizabeth Anderson (Willoughby Hills, OH/Willoughby South)** and **Megan Whiteside (Kettering, OH)** set school records in the shot put (38' 1/2") and the high jump (5' 2"), respectively. Multiple-event winners included Anderson in the shot, javelin (88' 1") and discus (108'), Kenyon junior **Vani Meesala (Westlake, OH/Westlake)** in the long jump (15' 9") and the triple jump (34' 1 1/4"), and Kenyon sophomore **Colleen Severance (Wadsworth, OH/Wadsworth)** in the 110 high hurdles (16.56) and the 400 hurdles (1:08.34). CWRU senior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** won the 100 hurdles (15.42), the 100 (13.28) and the 400 hurdles (1:02.9) to score 34.5 points and earn MVP honors as the Spartan women placed fourth in an eight-team meet at Carnegie Mellon, Apr. 25-26. CWRU ran fifth in the men's side of the meet. The Spartans also competed in the Cleveland City Colleges meet, where the men ran second and the women third. To the east, Allegheny senior **Alyse Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River)** won the 3000 (9:49) and ran the first leg of the winning 4x400 relay (4:02) at the Penn Relays, Apr. 23-24. To the west, both Wittenberg squads finished second and both Earlham squads third at the Earlham Invitational, Apr. 24. Wittenberg is the second school in NCAA Division III history to have its men's and women's teams lead the nation in the same statistical category. The Tigers did it this season in scoring defense, with the men holding the opposition to 56.9 points per game and the women 48.8. The men's and women's teams from the now-defunct Bishop College (Texas) led Division III in scoring offense in 1983 and 1987.

**MORE HOOPS:** Wooster senior **Stan Aukamp** (Clover, SC/Canton South (OH)) has earned third team All America honors from the *Basketball Gazette*. Aukamp, a 6-9 center, averaged 14.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game this season as the NCAC champion Scots compiled a 26-3 record. He recently received second-team All-America honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches.... Former Allegheny standout **Suzanne Helfant** has been named women's basketball coach at Marietta. A two-time, first-team All-NCAC selection, she was the North Coast's Player of the Year in 1988 after leading the Gators to a Conference title and a 19-6 record.

**DIAMOND NOTES:** Ohio Wesleyan (20-2; 27-8) is ranked 13th in the latest American Baseball Coaches Association Division III poll. The Bishops, who have won 14 consecutive games, are ranked second in the Mideast Region.... Wooster head coach **Tim Pettorini** picked up his 300th career victory when the Scots topped Allegheny 9-3 on Sunday, Apr. 26. In 11 years, Pettorini has compiled an outstanding 300-151-5 (.663) record with five NCAC championships.... Wooster junior third baseman **Erik Hagen** (Lima, OH/Shawnee) went 12-for-25 with two doubles, a triple and five runs batted in as the Scots won six of seven games last week. The converted catcher also was errorless in the field.... Ohio Wesleyan senior lefthander **Steve Mitchell** (Delaware, OH/Hayes) picked up his first collegiate save by getting the last four outs in the Bishops' 4-1 win over Muskingum, Apr. 23. Mitchell also pitched a five-hitter with six strikeouts in a 12-2 triumph over Denison, Apr. 25.... CWRU's freshman righthander **Ryan Rogers** (Canton, OH/GlenOak) struck out 10 and did not allow an earned run as the Spartans defeated Earlham 4-3 in the second game of their doubleheader, Apr. 26. Rogers, who is 2-2 on the year, lowered his earned run average to 2.73 with the six-inning stint.... Another freshman righthander, Wittenberg's **Jerome Stewart** (Bryan, OH/Bryan), had a fine week with two wins, allowing just two earned runs while striking out 14 in 12 innings of work.

CLEVELAND - Eighteen outstanding student athletes have been honored for their achievements on the playing fields and in the classroom as the second North Coast Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete Award winners. Two student athletes, one man and one woman, from each NCAC member are recognized each year.

Founded in 1983, the NCAC brings together a group of institutions which share a common allegiance to academic quality and to the conduct of athletics so as to support the educational purpose. This type of academic commitment has been fostered by the nine school Presidents, who have a unique and active leadership role in the direction of the Conference. "What sets the North Coast Athletic Conference apart from other intercollegiate sports conferences is its earnest belief in and leadership in the promotion of athletic competition within the context of the educational mission," says Allegheny College President Daniel F. Sullivan, current President of the NCAC. "Athletics holds critically important benefits for the education and development of young people and I can think of no better examples of this than our 18 Scholar-Athlete Award winners."

The NCAC believes that intercollegiate athletics can and should complement academic life, rather than compete with it, and that sports should enhance the college experience. "The Scholar-Athlete Award symbolizes the North Coast's philosophy," says Ohio Wesleyan University assistant athletic director Nan Carney DeBord, chair of the NCAC Women's Athletic Directors. "It gives us a great opportunity to showcase the very best student-athletes, those who set the standard for academic and athletic excellence."

"It is important to remember that these outstanding individuals are premier examples of hundreds of top performers in the classrooms and on the playing fields around the North Coast," adds Gordon Collins, psychology professor at The College of Wooster and chair of the NCAC Men's Faculty Representatives. "These student-athletes demonstrate that you can do both well, and that was the original concept behind intercollegiate athletics."

Following is a capsule summary on the achievements of each of the eighteen North Coast Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete Award winners.

She was an All-Mideast Region honoree in cross country last fall as the Gators claimed their fourth consecutive regional title. Talbot also has picked up a pair of All-NCAC awards after placing 10th at the 1991 Cross Country Championships and third in the 5-000 meter run at the 1992 Indoor Track & Field Championships.

### NCAC Spring Sports Update

SEVEN NORTH COAST CHAMPIONS DETERMINED; OHIO  
WESLEYAN TO HOST NCAC BASEBALL TOURNEY, MAY 8 10

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the North Coast Athletic Conference's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT:** By virtue of its first-place finish during the regular season, Ohio Wesleyan (20-2; 28-8) will host the second annual NCAC Tournament, May 8-10 in Delaware. The Bishops will be joined in the four-team field by Wittenberg (14-6; 21-14), Allegheny (12-6; 22-13-1) and Wooster (12-7-1; 24-15-1). Second-seeded Wittenberg and third-seeded Allegheny will open the tournament Friday at noon, followed by top-seeded Ohio Wesleyan and fourth-seeded Wooster at 4:00 p.m. Friday's winners will come back to play the first of three games on Saturday at 9:30 a.m., with the winner advancing to the finals. Saturday's remaining games will complete the consolation bracket and determine the second championship competitor. The championship game (two games if necessary) will begin at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday. Wooster is the defending champion, having defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 6-3, in the last year's final. The Scots have won two consecutive NCAC titles and five of seven overall. Ohio Wesleyan is a two-time North Coast champ (1986, 89), while Allegheny picked up a co-championship with Wooster in 1984.

**GOLF REPORT:** Wittenberg posted the best score on both days of competition on its way to a four-stroke victory at the 1992 NCAC Golf Championships, May 1-2 at the Quail Hollow Resort in Concord, Ohio. The North Coast title is the first for the Tigers, who had been runner-up in each of the past two seasons. Wittenberg won with a 36-hole total of 625 on the 6,712-yard, par 72 layout. Wooster finished second at 629, followed by Ohio Wesleyan in third at 633 and defending champ Allegheny in fourth at 634. Denison (674), CWRU (677), Kenyon (729) and Earlham (803) rounded out the field in places five through nine, respectively.

Individually, Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **J.W. Wilson (Zanesville, OH/Rosecrans)** took medalist and NCAC Player of the Year honors with a 149 after rounds of 77 and 72. His 72 in the second round was the tournament's best score. Wittenberg had the second- and third-place finishers in junior **Dave Fisher (Muncie, IN/Central)** and senior **Rick Lyons (Dayton, OH/Oakwood)**, who totaled 153 and 154, respectively. Wooster senior **Dave Mottice (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** was all alone in fourth at 155, followed by Allegheny senior **Jim Swanson (Murrysville, PA/Franklin Regional)**, Wittenberg freshman **John Vollmer (Springfield, OH/Catholic Central)** and Wooster senior **Scott Miksch (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** in a three-way tie for fifth at 156. The top five finishers (plus ties) earned first-team All-NCAC honors. Wittenberg's **Dave Maurer** was named NCAC Coach of the Year.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** Ohio Wesleyan (5-0; 9-6) wrapped up its sixth straight NCAC championship with a 15-4 win over Wittenberg, Apr. 29. The Bishops got two goals from senior captain **Bill Bishop (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** and a goal and five assists from freshman **William Costello (Fayetteville, NY/Fayetteville-Manlius)**. Ohio Wesleyan, which was ranked sixth nationally entering the final week of the season, dropped out of contention for an eighth consecutive NCAA Division III Tournament berth with a 16-6 loss at Alfred, May 2.

Denison (4-1; 8-7) closed out the North Coast campaign in second place for the fifth time in six years, followed by Wooster (3-2; 7-8) in third and Kenyon (1-4; 4-7), Oberlin (1-4; 4-6) and Wittenberg (1-4; 4-4) in a three-way tie for fourth. Wittenberg forged the logjam in fourth by defeating Oberlin, 9-7, in the season finale, May 2. The Tigers were led by a three-goal performance from senior **Paul Collins (Cleveland Heights, OH/Western Reserve)**. Individually, Wooster junior **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** led the NCAC in scoring with 48 goals and 17 assists for an average of 4.33 points per game. Kenyon sophomore **Aaron Kilbourne (Denver, CO/Colorado Academy)** finished second in the scoring race at 3.91 ppg, followed by Oberlin senior **Darren Bosch (Spring Valley, NY/Green Meadow)** in third at 3.90. Oberlin sophomore **Alex Graf (Newcastle, ME/Northfield Mt. Hermon (MA))** led the way in goal with a .634 saves percentage, followed by Ohio Wesleyan junior **Dave Breslin (Mt. Lakes, NJ/Mt. Lakes)** in second at .604.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT:** North Coast champion Denison (12-0; 15-0) completed the regular season portion of its schedule in perfect fashion with a pair of wins last week - 19-2 over Wittenberg and 16-6 over Kenyon. Seniors **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** and **Amy Bradley (Longboat Key, FL/Nichols (NY))** each had four goals against Wittenberg, while Monacelli came back to lead the way with seven more against Kenyon. The Big Red, who have won all eight NCAC titles, will make their seventh NCAA Division III Tournament appearance in eight years on Saturday, May 9, at Trenton State. Denison is ranked fourth nationally, while the 13-0 Lions are ranked first.

Elsewhere in the North Coast, Earlham (8-4; 9-8) climbed into a share of second place with a dramatic

13-12 overtime victory against Ohio Wesleyan (8-4; 8-7), May 2. The Quakers, who closed the season with six consecutive wins, received a four-goal performance from senior **Fintje Lehman (Spring City, PA/Kimberton Waldorf)**. Lehman had two goals in the overtime period, while junior **Chris Seelaus (Drexel Hill, PA/Penn Wood)** accounted for the game-winner. Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, secured its share of second with a 17-9 win over Wooster, Apr. 29. Sophomore **Jessica Battle (Potomac, MD/Holy Child)** had five goals to lead the Bishops. Kenyon (7-5; 8-5) closed the year in fourth place, followed by Wittenberg (3 0; 3 13) in fifth and Oberlin (2 10; 3 12) and Wooster (2 10; 2 12) in a tie for sixth.

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Kenyon successfully defended its crown at the 1992 NCAC Men's Tennis Championships, May 1-2 at Denison University in Granville. The Lords took a 5-4 decision from Wooster in this year's championship match after topping the Scots by the same score in the 1991 final. Kenyon, seeded third entering the tournament, defeated sixth-seeded Ohio Wesleyan, 8-1, and second seeded Denison, 6-2, on its way to the finals. Top-seeded Wooster, meanwhile, posted a 9-0 win over eighth seeded Allegheny in the first round and a 7-2 victory against fourth seeded Oberlin in the semifinals. In consolation play, Denison defeated Oberlin, 6-3, for third place, Wittenberg defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 5-4, for fifth, and CWRU defeated Allegheny, 5-0, for seventh.

Kenyon's 5-4 championship win over Wooster featured four victories in singles and one in doubles. The Lords won with sophomore **Scott Sherman (Western Springs, IL/Iyons Township)** at #2 singles, senior **Bill Jonas (Elkins Park, PA/Germantown Friends)** at #3, freshman **Ed Peterson (Birmingham, AL/Carroll)** at #4, junior **John Foster (Lynchburg, VA/Virginia Episcopal)** at #6, and the duo of Jonas and senior **Devin Stauffer (Kalamazoo, MI/Central)** at #1 doubles. Sherman, Peterson and Foster led Kenyon throughout the tournament with 3-0 singles records. Other top individual performances were turned in by Wooster senior **Anthony Fernandez (Naples, FL/Pinecrest)** at #1, Oberlin sophomore **Carl Erikson (Oberlin, OH/Oberlin)** at #2, Denison freshman **Mark Leighton (Bryn Mawr, PA/Radnor)** at #5 and Wooster senior **Eric Hicks (Newark, NY/Newark)** at #5, all of whom went 3-0 in the championship bracket.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT:** Kenyon dropped just four points on its way to a seventh consecutive title at the 1992 NCAC Women's Tennis Championships, May 1-2 at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. The top seeded Ladies took an 8-1 decision from second-seeded Denison in the championship match after topping Oberlin, 8-1, in the first round and Wittenberg, 7-2, in the semifinals. Denison made its way to the finals with an 8-1 win over CWRU in the opening round and a 9-0 triumph over Allegheny in the semis. In the consolation bracket, Allegheny defeated Wittenberg, 6-3, for third place, Wooster defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 7-2, for fifth, and CWRU defeated Oberlin, 7-2, for seventh.

Kenyon, which is ranked first in the Midwest Region and considered a challenger for the Division III title, took all three doubles matches and five of six in singles against Denison in the finals. The Ladies' wins went to freshman **Katja Zerck (Dusseldorf, Germany/Hulshoff)** at #1 singles, senior **Stacy Bear (Leslie, MI/Lumen Christi)** at #3, junior **Sara Fousekis (Berkeley, CA/Head-Royce)** at #4, junior **Britt Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips MA)** at #5, junior **Brennen Harbin (Rome, GA/Phillips MA)** at #6, Zerck and senior **Kathryn Lane (Nashville, TN/St. Cecilia)** at #1 doubles, Britt Harbin and junior **Lisa Weisman (Del Mar, CA/Torrey Pines)** at #2, and Bear and Brennen Harbin at #3. Bear, Fousekis and both Harbins posted 3-0 singles records during the tournament. Denison sophomore **Hallie King (West Cazenovia, NY/Berkshire)** also was 3-0 in singles play, winning twice at #1 and once at #2.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT:** Allegheny became the first school to win both the men's and women's titles the same season at the eighth annual NCAC Track & Field Championships, May 1-2 at Denison's Deeds Field. Earlham senior distance ace **Scott Pearson (Cincinnati, OH/Finneytown)** repeated as Men's Track Athlete of the Year, while Ohio Wesleyan three-sport senior **Keith Rucker (University Park, IL/Shaker Heights OH)** copped Men's Field Athlete of the Year honors. On the women's side, Allegheny senior **Alyse Holden (Shoreham, NY/Wading River)** and CWRU freshman **Leslie Kindling (Erie, PA/Fairview)** were named Track Athlete of the Year and Field Athlete of the Year, respectively. Fifth year Allegheny head coach **Ralph White** was named Coach of the Year for leading the men to their first and the women to their second NCAC outdoor titles.

Times and distances were, in general, faster and farther this year than last, particularly in the women's events, where five NCAC records were broken. Allegheny, which finished second last year after claiming its first women's championship in 1990, racked up six first-place finishes, five seconds and three thirds for 145 points to narrowly dethrone defending champ Ohio Wesleyan, which totaled 134 points on three firsts, four seconds and six thirds. Wooster used four wins to finish third (84), while CWRU claimed the other five individual wins for fourth place (56). Kenyon finished fifth (49), followed by Denison (44), Oberlin (25), Earlham (12) and Wittenberg (9) in places six through nine, respectively. CWRU's Kindling and Allegheny's Holden merited their MVP awards by winning three individual events apiece. Kindling set an NCAC record in the long jump (18' 1/2") and also won the triple jump (36' 11") and the high jump (5' 4"). Holden captured the 3,000 (10:21.19) and defended her titles in the 1,500 (4:41.45) and the 800 (2:16.2), setting an NCAC standard in the latter. She also ran the third leg of the winning 1,000 relay (4:08.2). Other North Coast records were set by Wooster sophomore **Shannon O'Neill (Brighton, NY/Our Lady of Mercy)** in the 200 (26.00), Ohio Wesleyan junior **Amy Yothreis (Powell, OH/Olentangy)** in the discus (132' 11"), and CWRU senior **Lisa Encarnacion (Tallmadge, OH/Tallmadge)** in the 100 high hurdles (14.98). Encarnacion also finished first in the 400 hurdles (1:03.3), while O'Neill snared another gold in the 100 (12.66) and anchored the Scots' winning 400 relay (50.92). The other multiple winner was Wooster sophomore **Claire Roberts (North Olmsted, OH/North Olmsted)**, who captured the 400 (59.13) and ran the second leg of the 400 relay.

In the men's events, Allegheny parlayed seven first place finishes and a pair of seconds into 130 points to leap from fourth place in 1991 to a comfortable 21-point victory over runner-up Ohio Wesleyan, which recorded three firsts and six seconds for 109 points. Defending champion Denison used four firsts to finish third (94), followed by CWRU in fourth (73), Wooster (66) in fifth and Wittenberg (49), Earlham (27), Oberlin (21) and Kenyon (20) in places six through nine, respectively. Individually, the meet was dominated by MVPs Rucker and Pearson, as well as Allegheny junior **Stanley Drayton (Cleveland, OH/Marshall)**. Ohio Wesleyan's Rucker repeated as champ in the discus (159' 10") and the shot put (54' 2"). Earlham's Pearson also successfully defended two titles, the 10,000 (33:16.0) and the 5,000 (15:48.2), while Drayton, who last season shared Track Athlete of the Year honors with Pearson, won the 100 (11.04), the 200 (21.92) and ran the second leg of the winning 400 relay (42.54). CWRU junior **Matt Medford (Salem, OH/Salem)** repeated as champion in the 400 intermediate hurdles (55.39), as did Denison sophomore **Tim Dunham (Laramie, WY/Laramie)** in the 3,000 steeplechase (9:32.94).

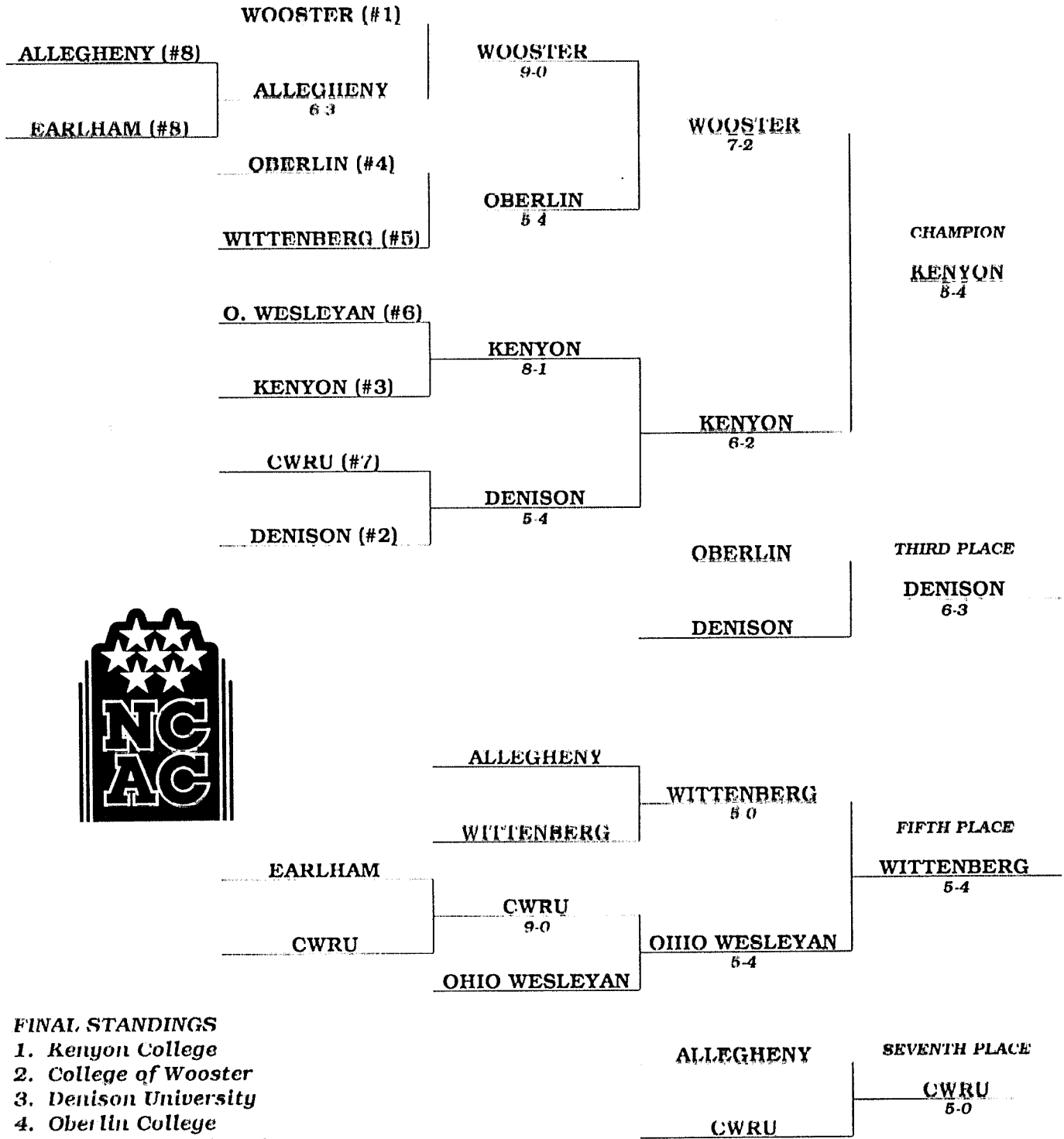

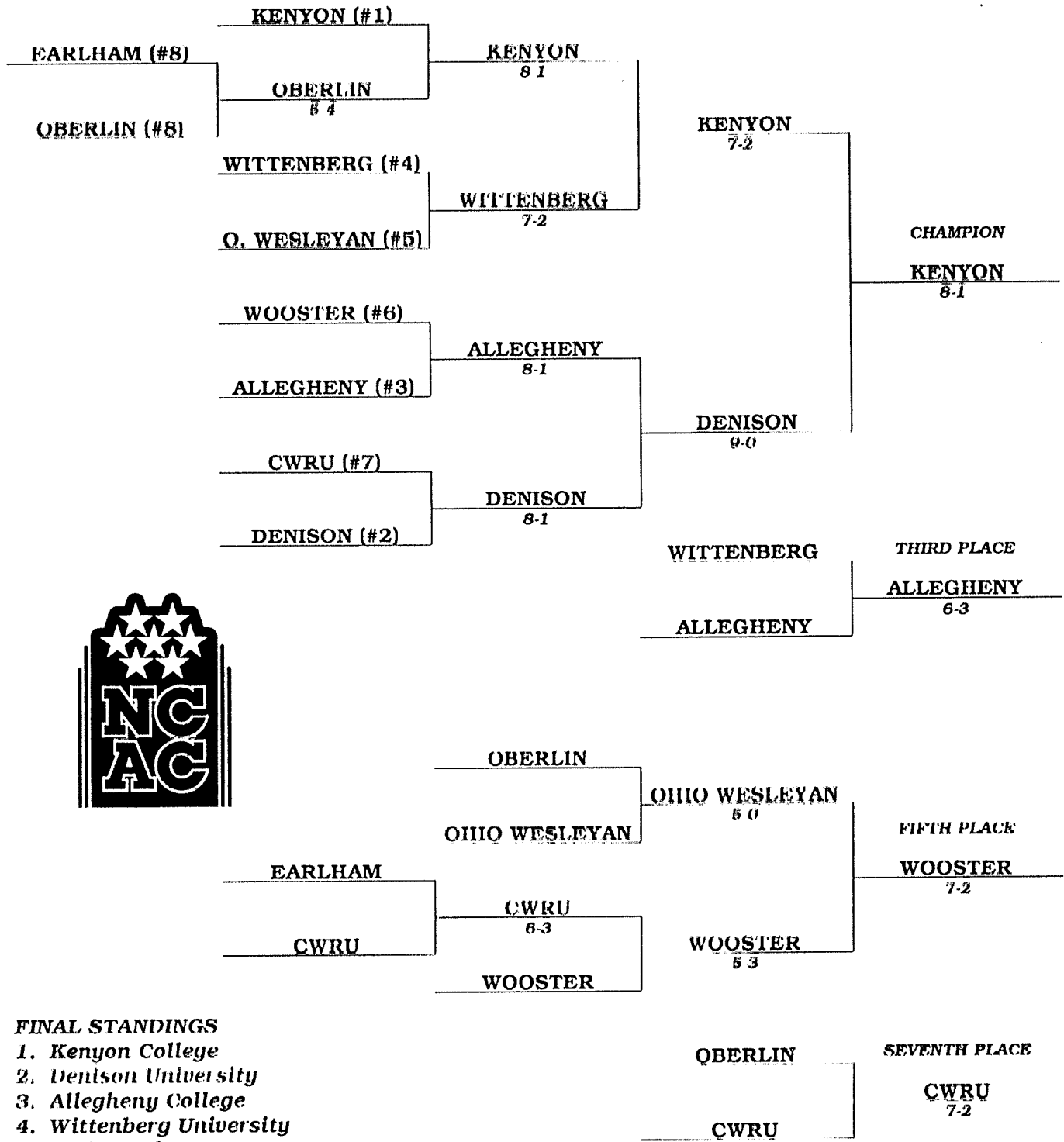

**OHIO WESLEYAN TAKES FOURTH STRAIGHT ALL SPORTS TITLE;  
 NORTH COAST REPRESENTED NATIONALLY IN ALL 21 SPORTS**

**CLEVELAND** -- Ohio Wesleyan University used six top three finishes in the spring season to overcome a four-point deficit and win its fourth consecutive North Coast Athletic Conference All-Sports Championship. The Bishops won or shared five NCAC titles in the 1991-92 season, including outright championships in baseball and men's lacrosse during the spring.

Ohio Wesleyan, which had five second-place finishes and three thirds to go with its five firsts, totaled 138 points. Denison University compiled 130.5 points to finish second for the third time in the last four years, edging third-place College of Wooster (130) by one half point. Allegheny College, which led the All-Sports standings after the winter season, finished fourth with 125.5 points, followed by Wittenberg University (108) in fifth, Kenyon College (100.5) in sixth and Case Western Reserve University (78), Oberlin College (62.5) and Earlham College (57) in positions seven through nine, respectively.

The All-Sports award is given annually to the school that performs best across the NCAC's 21 sports. Nine points are awarded for a first-place finish, eight for a second, seven for a third and so on. Men's and women's performances are combined, exemplifying the North Coast's commitment to equity and balance among programs. Wooster won the NCAC's inaugural championship in the 1984-85 season, followed by Denison in 1985-86 and Wooster again for the next two years leading up to Ohio Wesleyan's current four year run.

Aside from its spring championships in baseball and men's lacrosse, Ohio Wesleyan claimed outright NCAC titles in field hockey and men's soccer. The Bishops also shared the North Coast women's basketball crown. Second-place Denison came away with championships in men's cross country and women's lacrosse. The Big Red also posted five second-place finishes and five thirds. Wooster, meanwhile, forged its third-place finish with an outright title in women's soccer, a co-championship in men's basketball and five seconds.

Allegheny, which does not field a team in three of the Conference's 21 sports, led the way with seven championships -- women's cross country, football, volleyball, men's indoor track, women's indoor track, men's outdoor track and women's outdoor track. The Gators added five third-place finishes. Wittenberg won an outright title in golf and co-championships in men's and women's basketball, with Kenyon claiming the remaining four crowns in men's and women's swimming and tennis.

The NCAC is just now putting the finishing touches on another outstanding season at the national level, with 52 teams in all 21 sports advancing/sending individuals to NCAA Championship competition or finishing in the final Division III Top 20. Kenyon's men's and women's swimmers head that list after claiming their 13th and ninth consecutive national titles, respectively. Kenyon narrowly missed out on a national championship in women's tennis as well, placing second after dropping a 5-4 decision to Pomona-Pitzer in the finals.

Other top performances were turned in by Ohio Wesleyan in men's soccer (semifinalist) and baseball (regional finalist), Denison in men's swimming (third) and women's swimming (sixth), and Allegheny in football (second round), men's swimming (fifth), women's cross country (10th) and women's indoor track (10th). A number of spring highlights are still to come as four North Coast teams participate in this week's NCAA Golf Championships at Wooster. The NCAC is looking to improve upon its eight-year total of 18 national titles.

CLEVELAND -- Ohio Wesleyan University junior **Greg Justice (Ostrander, OH/Buckeye Valley)**, Wittenberg University senior **Jeff Brown (Springfield, OH/North)** and Ohio Wesleyan senior **Steve Mitchell (Delaware, OH/Hayes)** earned top individual honors to highlight the 1992 All North Coast Athletic Conference baseball selections. Justice and Brown shared Player of the Year honors, while Mitchell was named Pitcher of the Year.

Justice, a junior centerfielder, is hitting .430 with team-highs of 46 runs scored and 11 stolen bases for the Bishops, who will be competing in the NCAA Midwest Regional at Marietta, May 14-17, after claiming their third North Coast title last weekend. Justice, a three-time first-team All-NCAC selection, also has 17 doubles, three triples, three home runs and 33 runs batted in.

Brown, a senior first baseman, hit .500 in 116 at bats this spring to establish a new North Coast record. He led Wittenberg in eight offensive categories, including doubles (14), home runs (5) and runs batted in (50). Brown is a two-time first-team All-NCAC pick.

Mitchell, a senior lefthander, has compiled a 5-3 record in 10 appearances for Ohio Wesleyan. His sparkling 2.41 earned run average leads the North Coast and he is third in strikeouts with 51 in 56 innings pitched. Mitchell has won five of his last six decisions, including a complete game three-hitter against Wittenberg in the semifinals of last weekend's NCAC Tournament. A first-team All Conference selection as an outfielder as well, he is hitting .333 with 10 home runs and 38 runs batted in.

Justice, Brown and Mitchell are joined on the All-NCAC first-team by junior catcher **Brett Scott (Holland, OH/Springfield)** of Denison, senior first baseman **George Powell (Westerville, OH/North)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior second baseman **Steve Cook (Buffalo, NY/Kenmore West)** of Allegheny, senior shortstop **Mike Royer (Columbus, OH/Westland)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior third baseman **Erik Hagen (Lima, OH/Shawnee)** of Wooster, sophomore outfielder **Jay Dace (Cincinnati, OH/Forest Park)** of Earlham, senior outfielder **Steve Schott (Rochester, NY/McQuaid Jesuit)** of Denison, senior outfielder **Chris Tillotson (Glenview, IL/Glenbrook South)** of Wittenberg, junior designated hitter **Mark Senkowitz (Warren, OH/Champion)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior pitcher **Pat Broadwater (West Seneca, NY/Orchard Park)** of Allegheny, sophomore pitcher **Brad Roser (Delaware, OH/Buckeye Valley)** of Ohio Wesleyan and senior pitcher **Gerry Sagerman (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** of Wooster. Senkowitz and Sagerman join Justice and Brown as repeat selections from last year's first team, with Senkowitz and Justice filling a spot for the third straight season.

Ohio Wesleyan's **Roger Ingles** was voted Coach of the Year for guiding the Bishops to a 31-9 record and an NCAC championship. His squad also has received its third consecutive post-season bid and fifth in seven years. Ingles has compiled a 212-155-5 (.577) record in his nine seasons at Ohio Wesleyan, making him the winningest coach in school history. He also was named North Coast Coach of the Year in 1986 and 1989.

CLEVELAND -- Ohio Wesleyan University's **Kevin Wall (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** and the Denison University duo of **Amy Bradley (Longboat Key, FL/Nichols (NY))** and **Christina Monacelli (Haverford, PA/Episcopal)** have been named North Coast Athletic Conference Players of the Year to highlight the 1992 All-NCAC men's and women's lacrosse selections.

Wall, a senior defenseman, spearheaded an Ohio Wesleyan unit that allowed just 22 goals in five NCAC contests. He started all 15 games as the Bishops compiled a 9-6 overall record and captured their sixth consecutive North Coast title with a 5-0 mark. A three year starter, Wall is a two time first team All-NCAC selection. He also earned second-team All-America honors in 1991.

Wall is joined on the All-NCAC first team by junior attacker **Tom Bennett (Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** of Wooster, senior attacker **Bill Bishop (Wilton, CT/Wilton)** of Ohio Wesleyan, freshman attacker **William Costello (Fayetteville, NY/Fayetteville-Manlius)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior attacker **Andy Greaves (Rochester, NY/Irondequoit)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior midfielders **Jed Cronin (Boston, MA/Avon Old Farms (CT))** and **Tim James (Worthington, OH/Worthington)** of Ohio Wesleyan, junior midfielder **Phil McIntyre (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** of Denison, junior defenseman **Brian Cook (Yonkers, NY/Palm Beach (FL))** of Wooster, sophomore defenseman **Ethan Ewing (Upperco, MD/Gilman)** of Denison, junior defenseman **Mike Tiedemann (New York, NY/Middlesex)** of Ohio Wesleyan and junior goalie **Dave Breslin (Mountain Lakes, NJ/Mountain Lakes)** of Ohio Wesleyan. Bishop, Ewing, James and Tiedemann join Wall as repeat selections from last year's first team.

Wittenberg's **Steve Ritzenthaler** was voted Coach of the Year after leading the Tigers to a 4-4 record and a tie for fourth in the NCAC standings. The 500 season was Wittenberg's first since it revived lacrosse as a varsity sport in 1983.

Bradley, a senior defender, and Monacelli, a senior attacker, led Denison to a North Coast title this spring. Bradley anchored a defense that allowed just 62 goals in 16 games, less than half the total allowed by any other NCAC team. She also chipped in offensively with 41 goals and eight assists to rank 10th in the North Coast scoring race. Monacelli, meanwhile, led the Conference in scoring for the second consecutive season, totaling 58 goals and 36 assists for an average of 5.88 points per game. She also was named NCAC Player of the Year in 1991.
