NCAC Spring Sports Update

**KENYON, WITTENBERG MEET IN FIRST NORTH COAST
 SOFTBALL GAME; WOOSTER #1 IN DIVISION III BASEBALL**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (4-0; 18-3) and Ohio Wesleyan (2-0; 19-0) are off to outstanding starts as evidenced by their respective rankings in the latest ABCA Division III poll (Mar. 23). Wooster remains in the top spot, a position it has held since the preseason poll. The Scots, who placed second nationally last spring, have already swept NCAC doubleheaders from Kenyon (0-4; 10-10) and Earlham (1-3; 8-6). Ohio Wesleyan, meanwhile, has stretched its school record win streak to 19 games and moved up to the fifth position. The Bishops, who took a twinbill from Denison (2-2; 4-5) on Mar. 28, visit CWRU (1-0; 6-6) on Saturday to highlight this weekend's schedule.

GOLF REPORT: All seven NCAC squads will participate in the 12-team Kenyon Invitational on Friday and Saturday to anchor this week's schedule. The 36-hole event will be held at the Apple Valley Golf Course in Howard, Ohio. Denison and Ohio Wesleyan placed fourth and fifth, respectively, in last year's event.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Two of the finest teams in Division III will square off in Granville on Saturday as 11th-ranked Denison (0-0; 2-2) entertains top-ranked Ohio Wesleyan (0-0; 5-1). The two teams have accounted for all 13 NCAC championships -- nine for Ohio Wesleyan and four, including the 1997 title, for Denison. Both teams open their conference schedules earlier in the week as Denison hosts Kenyon (0-0; 3-2) on Tuesday and Ohio Wesleyan welcomes Wooster (0-1; 2-4) on Wednesday.

Ohio Wesleyan has won five consecutive matches since a season-opening loss to Division I Butler. The Bishops moved into the top spot in the USILA Division III poll with victories against third-ranked Salisbury State and eighth-ranked Cortland State over the past two weeks. Senior **Dave Maguire (Broomall, PA/Marple Newtown)** had four goals versus Cortland State to increase his conference-leading total to 19.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (2-0; 2-1) has a pair of key contests this week as it looks to solidify its position atop the NCAC standings. The Big Red host Ohio Wesleyan (0-0; 0-1) on Tuesday and visit Wittenberg (0-0; 5-3) on Saturday. Freshman **Laura Peace (Lutherville, MD/St. Paul's)** had seven goals and an assist in Denison's 19-9 win over Oberlin (0-1; 0-3) on Mar. 29. The Big Red have won 11 of 13 North Coast championships.

SOFTBALL REPORT: Wittenberg (0-0; 3-9) will host Kenyon (0-0; 0-8) on Wednesday in the first conference contest in NCAC history. Five schools -- Allegheny (0-0; 7-5), CWRU (0-0; 6-2-1) and Denison (0-0; 1-7) are the others -- are fielding teams this spring as softball gains championship status within the NCAC for the first time. Preseason favorite Allegheny, which has made 12 NCAA Tournament appearances over the past 15 seasons, opens North Coast play at Wittenberg on Saturday.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Five NCAC squads -- Denison (0-0; 6-3), Kenyon (1-0; 7-4), Oberlin (0-0; 2-4), Ohio Wesleyan (0-0; 4-1) and Wooster (0-0; 5-5) -- with a combined record of 24-17 are scheduled to compete at the 10-team GLCA Tournament on Friday and Saturday at Oberlin. Denison and Kenyon placed third and fourth, respectively, at last year's event. Denison, which claimed its seventh North Coast championship last spring, is coming off an impressive second-place finish at the Washington & Lee Invitational over the weekend. The Big Red took 5-2 decisions from Swarthmore and Claremont-Mudd-Scripps before falling to 1997 national runner-up Kalamazoo in the finals.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Defending NCAC and NCAA Division III champion Kenyon (0-0; 7-4) opens conference play this week at Oberlin (0-0; 4-5) on Tuesday and Ohio Wesleyan (3-0; 5-0) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan, which had placed second or third in the NCAC for three straight seasons before falling to sixth a year ago, remained unbeaten with wins over Allegheny (1-1; 12-1) and Earlham (0-2; 0-2) last week. Sophomores **Kristen Farrell (Fremont, OH/Ross)** and **Ruth Tincher (Cincinnati, OH/St. Ursula)** have been perfect for the Bishops, compiling 5-0 records at #2 and #6 singles, respectively, and teaming for a 5-0 mark at #3 doubles.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Wooster won five events and placed second in six others to defend its team title at the seven-team Wooster Invitational on Mar. 28. The Scots totaled 181 points to outdistance Walsh (117), CWRU (96) and Denison (90). Sophomore **Reggie Ray (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** won the 100 (10.8), 200 (21.9) and ran a leg of the winning 4x100 relay (43.4) to pace Wooster.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Five different individuals won events as the host Lady Scots claimed the team title for the second consecutive year at the seven-team Wooster Invitational on Mar. 28. Wooster totaled 168.5 points to 144.5 for second-place Walsh. Denison (115), Kenyon (93.5) and CWRU (79.5) took positions three through five. Senior **Melissa Eging (Parma, OH/Padua Franciscan)** won the 100 (13.0) and placed second in the 200 (26.7) to pace the Lady Scots. Other winners include juniors **Deidra Reid (Maple Heights, OH/Maple Heights)** in the shot put (39' 0"), **Sarah Kruse (Savannah, OH/Crestview)** in the triple jump (32' 10-3/4"), **Beth Huffman (Rocky River, OH/Rocky River)** in the 1500 (5:06.5) and **Katherine Rath-Coursey (Riverdale, MD/Roosevelt)** in the 3000 steeplechase (13:08.6). In other action over the weekend, freshman **Kristy Keiser (Arcanum, OH/Arcanum)** won the 800 (2:39.75) and 1500 (5:20.80) as Earlham placed second in a triangular meet at Centre, and senior **Alison Albrecht (Norwich, VT/Hanover (NH))** won the discus (148' 3") and finished second in the shot put (43' 1/4") as Ohio Wesleyan tied for ninth at the 28-team Emory Invitational.

NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

BASEBALL -- Wooster junior designated hitter **Chris Mihm (Youngstown, OH/Mooney)** and Ohio Wesleyan senior pitcher **Ty Langenderfer (Wauseon, OH/Wauseon)**. Mihm was 10-for-12 with two home runs and nine runs batted in during the Scots' four-win week. Both home runs and all nine RBI (the second-highest total in school history) came in a 21-10 win over Tiffin on Mar. 26. Langenderfer, meanwhile, picked up a pair of victories to raise his record to 4-0. He allowed three earned runs and struck out eight over 11 innings versus John Carroll on Mar. 24 and Denison on Mar. 28.

MEN'S LACROSSE -- Wittenberg freshman attacker **Mario Cassani (Chesterfield, MO/Desmet)**. Cassani had eight goals and three assists in wins over Oberlin and Wooster. He scored five goals to power a 9-4 victory against Wooster on Mar. 25.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE -- Wooster sophomore attacker **Maggie Buckingham (Boylston, MA/Williston Northampton)**. Buckingham totaled 11 goals and three assists in victories against Earlham, LeMoyne and Wittenberg. Six of the goals, including the game-winner with 1:40 remaining in regulation, came in a 16-15 win over LeMoyne on Mar. 28.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD: Wooster sophomores **Reggie Ray (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** and **Shane Bartholomew (Chardon, OH/Chardon)**. Ray won the 100 (10.8), 200 (21.9) and ran a leg of the winning 4x100 relay (43.4) at the Wooster Invitational on Mar. 28, while Bartholomew won the discus (146' 2") and placed third in the shot put (44' 1") at the same meet.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD: Allegheny junior **Amy Shuckert (North Canton, OH/GlenOak)** and Ohio Wesleyan senior **Alison Albrecht (Norwich, VT/Hanover (NH))**. Shuckert won the 800 (2:24.0) and 1500 (4:48.0) at the Slippery Rock Open on Mar. 27, while Albrecht won the discus (148' 3") and placed second in the shot put (43' 1/4") at the Emory Invitational on Mar. 28. Albrecht broke a school record and qualified automatically for the NCAA Championships in the discus.

**OHIO WESLEYAN, WOOSTER TIED FOR SECOND IN NCAA
BASEBALL POLL; BISHOPS POST 10 7 WIN AT OHIO STATE**

April 6, 1998

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (4-0, 22-0) and Wooster (4-0; 22-3) remain unbeaten in NCAC play after the first two weeks of conference competition. The two teams also are tied for second in this week's ABCA/Collegiate Baseball Division III poll. Wooster has a crucial week ahead with doubleheaders at home against Denison (4-2; 8-7) on Tuesday and Allegheny (4-2; 16-5) on Saturday. Ohio Wesleyan hosts Oberlin (1-3; 2-16) on Saturday.

Ohio Wesleyan ran its school-record win streak to 22 with three victories last week, highlighted by a 10-7 triumph at Ohio State on Mar. 31. Senior third baseman **Ryan Missler (Powell, OH/Dublin)** went 3-for-5 with two home runs to lead the way against the Buckeyes as head coach **Roger Ingles** recorded his 400th career win. Allegheny and Wooster also are coming off perfect weeks. **CWRU FACES CRITICAL SOFTBALL DOUBLEHEADERS;
OHIO WESLEYAN RUNS MEN'S LAX STREAK TO NINE**

April 13, 1998

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (8-0, 26-3) and Ohio Wesleyan (6-0; 25-2) have jumped out to a substantial lead at the halfway point of the NCAC schedule. Both teams will be tested this week as Ohio Wesleyan visits Wittenberg (4-3; 16-7-1) on Tuesday and Wooster travels to CWRU (4-3; 9-10) on Saturday. CWRU and Wittenberg are joined by Denison (6-4; 10-9) and Allegheny (5-5; 17-8) in a four-way battle for third place and the final two slots in the NCAC Tournament.

Wooster increased its win streak to 14 with impressive doubleheader sweeps of Denison and Allegheny last week. Senior righthander **Dan Van Dyke (Marietta, OH/Warren Local)** and sophomore righthander **Drew Binkowski (Bowling Green, OH/Bowling Green)** accounted for all four wins for the Scots. Denison rebounded from its loss to Wooster with two victories against Wittenberg on Apr. 11. CWRU and Ohio Wesleyan swept Earlham (1-9; 8-12) and Oberlin (1-5; 3-19), respectively, to round out Saturday's North Coast action. Both of CWRU's wins came in extra innings. Sophomore centerfielder **Gordon Daily (Darlington, PA/Blackhawk)** was 5-for-10 with a home run and three doubles to pace the Spartans.

GOLF REPORT: Six North Coast squads will participate in the 12-team Wooster Invitational on Friday and Saturday to highlight this week's schedule. The 36-hole event will be held at the Wooster Country Club, site of this year's NCAC Championships.

Three-time defending NCAC champion Allegheny continued its outstanding season by taking the team title at the 14-team Denison Invitational on Apr. 10-11. The Gators, who have won three tournaments in four starts this spring, posted a 36-hole total of 615 at the par-71 Granville Golf Course. Wooster was second at 622, followed by Otterbein in third and Denison (636) in fourth. Wooster senior **Jeff Nimeh (Penfield, NY/Penfield)** placed second at 148 to lead all North Coast individuals. Allegheny was led by sophomore **Nick Mahramas (Pittsburgh, PA/South Park)**, who tied for fourth at 152. In other action, Ohio Wesleyan put four individuals in the top 10 on the way to a win at the 12-team Muskingum Invitational on Apr. 5-6. The Bishops totaled 595 over 36 holes at the par-70 EagleSticks Golf Course to easily outdistance Otterbein and Denison (619). Ohio Wesleyan junior **Ian Miller (Mount Vernon, OH/Mount Vernon)** and Denison junior **Chris Baker (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** finished first and second at 144 and 148, respectively.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Kenyon (1-2; 5-4) entertains Wooster (1-2; 3-7) on Saturday in this week's only NCAC contest. First-place Ohio Wesleyan (3-0; 9-1), which remains atop the latest USILA Division III poll, is idle until a non-conference match versus Denison (2-1; 5-3) on Sunday.

Ohio Wesleyan stretched its win streak to nine with victories against Kenyon and Roanoke last week. Senior midfielder **Josh Whichard (Washington, NC/Bullis (MD))** scored three goals, including what turned out to be the decisive score with 3:26 to play, in the Bishops' 15-14 win over fifth-ranked Roanoke on Apr. 11. Denison and Wittenberg (2-1; 6-3) also are coming off two-win weeks. Senior midfielder **Steve Hettrich (Exton, PA/Downingtown)** exploded for 11 goals in Denison victories against Oberlin (0-3; 1-6) and Greensboro, while senior attacker **Jeff Collins (Grand Island, NY/Grand Island)** totaled seven goals and four assists in Wittenberg triumphs over Wooster and Oberlin. Collins continues to lead the NCAC in

scoring with 29 goals and 11 assists (4.44 ppg).

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (5 0; 6 2) can move another step towards securing the top seed in the NCAC Tournament with a win at Wooster (1-3; 5-6) on Saturday. The Big Red head into the final two weeks of the regular season with a one-game advantage over defending North Coast champion Oberlin (4-1, 4-4) and a one and one-half game edge over Ohio Wesleyan (3 1; 3 4). They have already defeated both teams in conference play.

Denison remained spotless against NCAC competition with a 26-13 victory against Kenyon (1-2; 3-5) on Apr. 8. Freshman attacker **Laura Peace (Lutherville, MD/St. Paul's)** had seven goals against the Ladies and five more in a 15-11 triumph over Division II Millersville on Apr. 11. She is the North Coast's leading scorer with 33 goals and seven assists (5 00 ppg). In other action, junior midfielder **Ali Lacavaro (Broomall, PA/Baldwin)** had a career-high eight goals in Kenyon's 19-13 win over Fredonia State, sophomore **Kim Miller (Mechanicsburg, OH/Mechanicsburg)** broke a school record with 16 ground balls as Wittenberg (1-2; 7-5) took a 13-6 decision from Earlham (0-4; 0-5), and senior midfielder **Amy Kremen (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** scored four times as Oberlin posted an 8-7 victory against Wooster.

SOFTBALL REPORT: CWRU (2-0; 13-4-1) has a big week ahead with NCAC doubleheaders at Allegheny (3-1; 13-9) on Tuesday and Denison (0-2, 2-13) on Saturday. The Spartans are the only North Coast team without a conference loss.

CWRU opened its NCAC schedule by sweeping a doubleheader from visiting Kenyon (0-4; 2-16) on Apr. 11. Sophomore pitcher **Becky Palmer (Bennington, VT/Mt. Anthony Union)** picked up three wins and allowed just four runs on the week as the Spartans added a 3-1 win over Baldwin-Wallace on Apr. 8. In other action, sophomore third baseman **Jen Lorenzen (Sebastopol, CA/Analy)** was 5-for-7 with four doubles and four runs batted in as Allegheny took a twinbill from Denison on Apr. 10. Lorenzen is the North Coast's second-leading hitter with a batting average of .484.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: It is likely that the top seed in this year's NCAC Tournament will be determined in Granville on Wednesday as defending North Coast champion Denison (3-0; 12-3) entertains Kenyon (4-0; 12-5). Denison visits CWRU (3-2; 8-2) on Friday and Kenyon travels to Wooster (1-1; 9-7) on Saturday to highlight the remainder of the week's action.

Denison stretched its win streak to six with a win over Allegheny (1-1; 11-4) last week. The Big Red are tied for first with Kalamazoo in the latest NCAA Midwest Region rankings. Junior **Lee Hays (Worthington, OH/Kilbourne)** heads their lineup with an 11-3 mark at #1 singles. Kenyon, meanwhile, is coming off victories against Wittenberg (2-2; 5-5), Ohio Wesleyan (0-4; 4-8) and Oberlin (0-2; 2-12).

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Denison (3-0; 6-3) and Kenyon (2-0; 9-4) will travel to the Midwest Regionals in Madison, Wis., over the weekend before returning to face each other in Gambier on Apr. 21. Ohio Wesleyan (4-1; 8-1) hosts Wooster on Tuesday and visits Oberlin (1-1; 5-9) on Sunday to headline this week's NCAC schedule.

Denison and Ohio Wesleyan continued their outstanding play with a pair of wins last week. Denison closed the week with an impressive 7-2 victory against Allegheny (2-2; 14-2), handing the Gators just their second loss. In other action, Earlham (0-2; 3-3) broke into the win column for the first time with three victories, including a 5-4 triumph over Mount St. Joseph on Apr. 6. Freshman **Stephanie Crites (Spencer, IN/Owen Valley)** won twice at #3 singles and once at #4 to pace the Quakers.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Seven NCAC schools will participate in the All-Ohio Championships at Ohio Wesleyan on Saturday. Wittenberg's women and men placed fourth and sixth, respectively, to lead the North Coast contingent at last spring's 19-team event.

Ohio Wesleyan's women continued their fine season with a second-place finish at the eight-team Marv Frye Invitational in Delaware on Apr. 10. The Bishops won six events and totaled 146 points to trail only Baldwin-Wallace in the team standings. Kenyon (66) placed fifth. Ohio Wesleyan was led by senior **Alison**

Albrecht (Norwich, VT/Hanover (NH)), who won the shot put (43' 7") and discus (148' 5"), surpassing NCAA automatic qualifying standards in both events. Freshman **Stephanie Moss (Aurora, OH/Crestwood)** won the 800 (2:20.8) and 1500 (4:59.02), while sophomore **Danielle Albrecht (Norwich, VT/Hanover (NH))** won the hammer throw (111' 11") and placed second in the shot put (39' 9-1/2"). Ohio Wesleyan had three top-three finishes on the way to 62 points and sixth place in the eight-team men's field. In other action, CWRU's men and women each won two events at the non-scoring Spartan Invitational. Senior **Tammie Rupnik (Troy, OH/Troy)** won the 400 hurdles (1:06.74) and placed third in the 100 hurdles (16.10).

HONOR ROLL: Ohio Wesleyan senior **John Camillus (Centerville, OH/Centerville)** has earned first-team GTE Academic All-America honors in men's basketball. Camillus, a senior wing, was a first-team All-NCAC selection after averaging 14.3 points and 3.2 assists per game this season. He carries a 4.0 grade-point average with majors in philosophy and pre law.... **Dennis Harris**, women's track & field coach at CWRU, was recently honored for his role overseeing the school's National Youth Sports Program (NYSP) summer camp. CWRU was named the most-improved program in 1997 and Harris has been asked to serve as the state coordinator for the 1997-98 NYSP lobby process. The NYSP program, which is co-sponsored by the NCAA and the U.S. Government, is a free sports camp for inner city youths. CWRU has hosted a camp for five weeks each summer over the past 30 years.... Kenyon is tied for 10th in the NCAA Division III Sears Directors' Cup standings after the completion of the winter sports season. Points are awarded based on team results from NCAA championships. The Directors' Cup is administered by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

COACHES CORNER: Ohio Wesleyan head coach **Roger Ingles** picked up his 400th career victory with a 10-7 win at Ohio State on Mar. 31. The Bishops have earned five NCAC championships and have compiled a record of 405-218-7 (.648) in his 15 seasons at the school.... Allegheny has hired **Blair Hrovat** as head football coach. Hrovat, a native of Cleveland and a 1985 graduate of Edinboro, has been offensive coordinator at Division II South Dakota since 1992 and assistant head coach since last June. He succeeds **Ken O'Keefe**, who has accepted the head coaching position at Fordham after guiding the Gators to a 79-10-1 (.883) record and six NCAC championships over the past eight seasons.... Allegheny also has announced the addition of **Paul Hogan** as men's soccer coach. Hogan, a 1995 graduate of Charleston (W.Va.), has been an assistant coach at Duke for the past two years. He was a three-time All-West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference selection as a goalkeeper at Division II Charleston.... **Chris Wilberding** and **Dave Engle** have assumed new coaching responsibilities at Wittenberg. Wilberding, men's tennis coach for the past two years and assistant men's basketball coach since 1995, has been named golf coach. Engle, meanwhile, replaces Wilberding as men's tennis coach. He is already in his second season as women's tennis coach.... Earlham has announced the resignation of **Tony Gary** as men's basketball coach. Gary recently completed his sixth season as the Quakers' head coach with an overall record of 26-121.

BASEBALL -- Wooster sophomore first baseman **Shane Flinner (Shreve, OH/Triway)** and CWRU sophomore pitcher **Matt Borto (Crown Point, IN/Andrean)**. Flinner was 5-for-9 with two home runs and seven runs batted in during the Scots' 4-0 week. He also was walked or hit by pitch six times and reached base in 11 of 15 plate appearances. Borto, meanwhile, pitched all 10 innings in CWRU's 3-2 win at Earlham on Apr. 11. He allowed six hits, two walks and struck out seven.

MEN'S LACROSSE -- Denison senior midfielder **Steve Hettrich (Exton, PA/Downingtown)**. Hettrich totaled 11 goals in victories against Oberlin and Greensboro. He set a school record for goals in a game by a midfielder with eight in a 15-3 triumph over Greensboro on Apr. 11.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE -- Ohio Wesleyan senior attacker **Jen Durgin (Hingham, MA/Hingham)**. Durgin accounted for 10 goals and two assists in wins over Wooster and Allegheny. She had a career high seven goals in a 22-8 victory at Allegheny on Apr. 11.

SOFTBALL -- CWRU sophomore pitcher **Becky Palmer (Bennington, VT/Mt. Anthony Union)**. Palmer picked up three consecutive victories, allowing just four runs (three earned) and 11 hits over 17 innings. She struck out 14 and did not walk a batter.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD: Denison freshman **Joe Dunham (Laramie, WY/Laramie)** and Wooster sophomore **Tim Sir Louis (Medina, OH/Highland)**. Dunham won the 5000 (15:17.3) at the Marv Frye Invitational in Delaware on Apr. 10, while Sir Louis took the pole vault (13' 6") and long jump (19' 7-1/4") in a quadrangular meet at Oberlin on Apr. 10.

WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD: Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Stephanie Moss (Aurora, OH/Crestwood)** and Wooster junior **Deidra Reid (Maple Heights, OH/Maple Heights)**. **CWRU HOSTS WITTENBERG IN KEY SOFTBALL CLASH; OHIO
WESLEYAN LAX, WOOSTER BASEBALL TOP DIVISION III POLLS**

April 20, 1998

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (12 0; 30 3) has taken control of the North Coast race heading into the final two weeks of the regular season. The Scots can secure the top seed in the upcoming NCAC Tournament with two wins in their final four conference games. The top four teams from the standings will qualify for the tournament, which will be held at the high seed on May 7-8. Wooster hosts second-place Wittenberg (8 3; 20 7 1) and third place Ohio Wesleyan (7 3; 26 5) visits fifth place Allegheny (5 5; 21 9) on Saturday to highlight this week's schedule.

Wooster, which has moved back into the top spot in the ABCA/Collegiate Baseball Division III poll, increased its win streak to 18 with doubleheader sweeps of Oberlin (1-9; 3-23) and CWRU (4-7; 9-14) last week. Sophomore outfielder **Bryan Kinney (Pittsburgh, PA/Plum)** was 7-for-11 over the four games to pace the Scots. Junior outfielder **Trevor Urban (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** hit a grand slam in the top of the seventh inning as Wooster scored seven times in the final frame to take an 8-2 decision from CWRU in the second game of their doubleheader on Apr. 18. Wittenberg also is coming off a four-win week, highlighted by two wins over Ohio Wesleyan on Apr. 14, while Kenyon (3-7; 13-15) won three times in four starts. Senior infielder **Chris Schwoy (Baltimore, MD/Curley)** was 7-for-11 with six runs batted in to pace the Lords.

GOLF REPORT: Five North Coast squads will be in the field at Ohio Wesleyan's Strimer Invitational, which will be held at the Oakhaven Golf Club on Friday and Saturday. The event will be the final tuneup for the NCAC Championships at the Wooster Country Club on May 1-2.

Wooster continued its outstanding spring with a team title at its own Parlor-Bank One Tournament on Apr. 17-18. The Scots carded a 624 at the Wooster Country Club to defeat Otterbein by 12 strokes. Denison (641) and Ohio Wesleyan (642) placed fourth and fifth in the 12-team field. Wooster freshman **Nick Balcken (Chardon, OH/Chardon)** earned medalist honors at six-over par 150. Wooster senior **Jeff Nimeh (Penfield, NY/Penfield)** shared second place at 154, followed by Denison sophomore **Dan Gilligan (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** in fourth at 155 and Wooster senior **Dave Winpisinger (Henderson, NV/Brunswick (OH))** in fifth at 156.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (3-0; 10-1) can secure at least a share of its 10th North Coast championship with a win at Oberlin (0-3; 3-6) on Wednesday. The Bishops, who close the regular season against Wittenberg (2-1; 7-4) on Apr. 30, continue to be ranked first in the USILA Division III poll. Twelfth-ranked Denison (2-1; 5-4) visits Wittenberg on Tuesday and Wooster (1-3; 3-11) on Saturday in other upcoming NCAC action.

Ohio Wesleyan posted an 11-8 victory against visiting Denison on Apr. 19 to complete a sweep of the two-game season series between the teams (only the first game counts in the conference standings). Junior attacker **Evan Dunne (Pound Ridge, NY/Fox Lane)** scored four of his career-high five goals in a 15-minute span over the second and third quarters for the Bishops. Sophomore midfielder **Dan Stroka (Flemington, NJ/Hunterdon Central)** had one goal and assisted on three of Dunne's scores. Sophomore goalie **Andy Kureth (Novi, MI/Detroit Country Day)** recorded 16 saves and did not allow a goal as Kenyon (2-2; 7-4)

took a 15-1 decision from Wooster on Apr. 18 in last week's only NCAC match.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (6-0; 7-4) has secured the top seed in next week's NCAC Tournament. The Big Red, who close the regular season against visiting Allegheny (1-5; 2-9) on Saturday, will receive one of two byes through the quarterfinals in the six-team event. The other bye will go to the winner of Saturday's match between Ohio Wesleyan (5-1; 5-4) and Oberlin (5-1; 7-4) in Oberlin. Fifth-place Wooster (2-4; 6-8) visits sixth place Wittenberg (1-4; 7-7) on Friday in another North Coast contest that will have direct bearing on tournament seeding.

Oberlin and Ohio Wesleyan won a total of five games without a loss to highlight last week's schedule. Senior midfielder **Amy Kremen (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** had five goals as Oberlin opened a three-win week with an 18-8 triumph over Kenyon (3-3; 6-6) on Apr. 15. Ohio Wesleyan got six goals and six assists from junior attacker **Jenny Feldman (North Potomac, MD/Bullis)** in victories against Wittenberg and Earlham (0-5; 0-7). In other action, junior midfielder **Ali Lacavaro (Broomall, PA/Baldwin)** totaled 17 goals as Kenyon won three of four contests.

SOFTBALL REPORT: The NCAC's inaugural championship could be on the line Saturday when CWRU (4-1; 15-5-1) hosts Wittenberg (3-1; 9-12). CWRU can clinch at least a share of the title with two wins, while Wittenberg, which also visits Denison (0-4; 5-15) on Wednesday, can take the North Coast crown outright with four straight victories on the week. Allegheny (4-1; 14-12) also remains in the championship picture. The Gators close the season at Kenyon (0-4; 2-20) on May 2.

Allegheny took a 4-3 decision from CWRU on Apr. 14 to highlight last week's action. Senior centerfielder **Laura Fromm (Pittsburgh, PA/Baldwin)** had two hits and drove in three runs for the Gators. Game two of the doubleheader was postponed due to rain. The Spartans rebounded with a doubleheader sweep of Denison on Apr. 18. Sophomore righthander **Becky Palmer (Bennington, VT/Mount Anthony Union)** pitched all 14 innings as CWRU posted 10-0 and 4-0 victories. She struck out 13 and did not walk a batter.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Defending North Coast champion Denison (4-0; 13-3) can solidify its claim to the top seed at the upcoming NCAC Championships with wins at Wittenberg (4-3; 7-6) on Tuesday and Wooster (2-2; 10-8) on Thursday. The Big Red have won seven consecutive matches and are tied for first with Kalamazoo in the latest NCAA Midwest Region rankings. Kenyon (5-1; 13-6) entertains Allegheny (4-1; 15-4) on Saturday in what figures to be a battle for the tournament's second seed.

Denison is coming off a 5-2 win over Kenyon on Apr. 15. The Lords rebounded to post a 5-2 victory against Wooster on Apr. 18, while Allegheny topped Grove City, Ohio Wesleyan (0-6; 4-11), Oberlin (0-4; 2-14) and Wittenberg in a 4-0 week. Freshman **Matt Sowa (Pittsburgh, PA/Shaler)** picked up four wins at #4 and #6 singles to pace the Gators. Sowa also teamed with sophomore **Dave Howell (Solon, OH/Solon)** for four wins at #2 doubles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: The top seed in the upcoming NCAC Championships will be on the line in Gambier on Tuesday as Kenyon (2-0; 9-4) hosts Denison (5-0; 8-3). The Ladies have won 11 of the last 12 North Coast titles, interrupted only by Denison in 1994. Denison also has a key match at Ohio Wesleyan (6-1; 10-1) on Saturday.

Kenyon earned its fifth Midwest Regional title in the last seven years over the weekend. The Ladies topped Defauw, Hope and Gustavus Adolphus by a combined score of 24-3. Sophomore **Caryn Cutlibert (Arlington, VA/Yorktown)** led the way with three consecutive wins at #1 singles. Denison blanked Wittenberg (1-4; 4-14) and Oberlin (2-3; 6-11) in its only action. Juniors **Wendy Floering (Cincinnati, OH/Madeira)** and **Kelly Mickelson (Athens, OH/Athens)** won twice at #1 doubles for the Big Red to improve to 9-2 overall and 5-0 in the NCAC.

Other individual titles went to Wittenberg senior **Lori Lyle (Middletown, OH/Middletown)** in the 100 (12.5), Wooster senior **Annie Gillespie (Bay Village, OH/Bay)** in the 400 hurdles (1:04.22), Oberlin senior **Trista Thornberry (Whitefish, MT/Whitefish)** in the 1500 (4:47.9) and CWRU sophomore **Carmen Brabham (Pataskala, OH/Watkins Memorial)** in the 3000 steeplechase (12:10.2). Ohio Wesleyan (49.5) and Wooster (39) placed seventh and eighth of 18 teams to pace the NCAC men. Junior **David Spring (Lancaster, OH/Lancaster)** won the 110 hurdles (14.92) for the Bishops. CWRU junior **Bob Madden (Aurora, OH/Shawnee (NJ))** and Wittenberg senior **Bart Lubbers (Columbus, OH/Worthington)** also were winners in the javelin (170' 8") and triple jump (47' 1 1/2"), respectively.

**SIX NORTH COAST CHAMPIONSHIPS SET THIS WEEKEND;
OHIO WESLEYAN NEARS 10TH MEN'S LACROSSE TITLE**

April 27, 1998

CLEVELAND Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (14-0; 34-3) has already clinched the top seed in the upcoming NCAC Tournament heading into the final week of the regular season. Ohio Wesleyan (10-4; 29-6) and Denison (9-5; 15-11) also figure to make the four-team tournament field, leaving Wittenberg (8-5; 21-9-1) and Allegheny (8-6; 24-10) to battle for the final position. Wittenberg hosts Allegheny on Saturday to highlight this week's North Coast schedule.

Wooster, ranked first in the latest ABCA/Collegiate Baseball Division III poll, stretched its win streak to 22 with four victories last week. Junior centerfielder **Trevor Urban (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** was 8 for 16 with a home run and five runs batted in as the Scots topped Baldwin-Wallace and Walsh before sweeping a doubleheader from Wittenberg on Apr. 25. Ohio Wesleyan and Allegheny won three of four in NCAC play, splitting a twinbill in Meadville over the weekend. Freshman righthander **Scott Spriggs (Urbana, OH/Graham)** fired a four-hitter in his first collegiate start as the Bishops salvaged the split with a 12-2 win in game two. Kenyon (6-8; 16-16) also is coming off a 3-1 week, while Oberlin (2-12; 4-26) moved up a spot in the standings by taking a 2-1 decision from CWRU (5-8; 12-15) in the second game of their doubleheader on Apr. 25. Junior righthander **Carson Keeble (Medical Lake, WA/Reardon)** allowed five hits over eight innings to pace the Yeomen.

GOLF REPORT: Allegheny and Wooster will be the favorites at the 14th NCAC Championships, which will be held at the Wooster Country Club on Friday and Saturday. The Gators and Scots have placed first or second in every major tournament they have entered this month. Ohio Wesleyan and Denison also figure into the championship picture. Allegheny earned its third consecutive North Coast title (fifth overall) with a three-stroke victory over Wooster last season. Allegheny senior **Bobby Ruffing (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)** earned NCAC individual championships in 1995 and 1997.

Wooster is coming off a first-place finish at Ohio Wesleyan's 14-team Strimer Invitational over the weekend. The Scots totaled 612 to edge the host Bishops by three strokes in the 36-hole event held at the Oakhaven Golf Club in Delaware. Denison (635) tied for fifth. Wooster senior **Jeff Nimeh (Penfield, NY/Penfield)** earned medalist honors at two-over par 146. Allegheny, meanwhile, completed its regular-season schedule with a five-stroke victory over SUNY-Binghamton in the 15-team Cross Creek Golf Classic at the Country Club of Hershey on Apr. 19-20. Freshman **Nate Smith (Brookville, PA/Brookville)** was the individual champion with a six-over par 111 for 27 holes.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Ohio Wesleyan (4-0; 12-1) can capture sole possession of its 10th NCAC championship with a win over visiting Wittenberg (2-2; 10-5) on Thursday. The Ohio Wesleyan-Wittenberg match completes the season's North Coast schedule.

Ohio Wesleyan remains first in this week's USILA Division III poll. The Bishops have won 12 straight since a season-opening loss to Division I Butler. Senior **Darren McGurn (Chester, NJ/Mendham)** had six goals and an assist in a 20-8 win over Alfred on Apr. 25. Denison (4-1; 7-4) solidified its hold on second place with NCAC wins over Wittenberg and Wooster (1-4; 3-12). The Big Red also moved up one notch to 11th in the national poll. In other action, junior **Paulo Ribeiro (Lexington, MA/Lexington)** scored a career-high six goals as Kenyon (3-2; 8-4) posted a 16-4 victory against Oberlin and Wittenberg won three of four starts to guarantee its first winning season since reinstating lacrosse as a varsity sport in 1983.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: Denison (7-0, 9-4) is the top seed in this week's NCAC Tournament, which begins with quarterfinals on Tuesday. Denison and second-seeded Oberlin (6-1; 9-4) receive byes through the opening round in the six-team event. Third-seeded Ohio Wesleyan (5-2; 6-5) hosts sixth-seeded Wittenberg (2-5; 8-8) and fourth seeded Kenyon (4-3; 7-7) entertains fifth seeded Wooster (3-4; 7-8) in the quarterfinals. The semifinals and finals will be held at Kenyon on Saturday and Sunday.

Denison completed its regular season schedule with a 21-18 victory against Colorado College on Apr. 22 and a 23-2 triumph over Allegheny (1-6; 2-12) on Apr. 25. Freshman **Laura Peace (Lutherville, MD/St. Paul's)** had six goals versus Colorado, while junior **Allison Offenburger (Worthington, OH/Worthington)** scored four times against Allegheny. Seniors **Anne Ewens (Providence, RI/Wheeler)** and **Amy Kremen (Baltimore, MD/Friends)** had four goals apiece as Oberlin secured the second seed with a 16-11 win over Ohio Wesleyan on Apr. 25. Senior **Katherine Roberts (Ithaca, NY/Ithaca)** broke an NCAC record with her 75th career assist as the Yeowomen took a 16-5 decision from Canisius on Apr. 26. Roberts also scored five goals in the two victories.

SOFTBALL REPORT: Allegheny (4-1; 15-18) needs two wins at Kenyon (0-4; 3-21) on Saturday to secure the inaugural NCAC championship. Kenyon also entertains Denison (0-6; 5-17) on Wednesday to round out the North Coast schedule for the final week of the regular season.

Allegheny had no conference games last week, but solidified its position atop the standings by virtue of a doubleheader split between CWRU (5-2; 17-7-1) and Wittenberg (6-2; 14-13) on Apr. 25. Sophomore outfielder **Holly Mehringer (Massillon, OH/Perry)** was 4-for-5 with a triple and two runs scored as Wittenberg posted a 6-1 win in the nightcap. She was 5-for-10 with a pair of stolen bases as the Tigers won twice at Denison on Apr. 22.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Defending North Coast champion Denison (6-0; 16-3) will be the top seed in the NCAC Tournament, which will be held for the first time at Wittenberg on Friday and Saturday. The Big Red, who have won 10 consecutive matches, took a 4-1 decision from Kenyon in last year's final. Kenyon (6-1; 15-6) and Wooster (4-3; 12-9) will be the second and third seeds. The top three seeds have accounted for all 13 North Coast titles, led by Denison with seven.

Denison has one of the NCAC's top two performers at all six singles positions. Juniors **Lee Hays (Worthington, OH/Kilbourne)**, **John Ginther (Akron, OH/Firestone)** and **Jeremy Edesess (Indianapolis, IN/Brebeuf)** are 14-4 at #1, 11-5 at #3 and 13-3 at #4, respectively. Hays and Edesess also are 12-6 at #1 doubles. Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Justin Kattan (Akron, OH/Revere)** is 14-2 at #1 singles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon (3-0; 13-5) will again be the top seed and favorite at the NCAC Tournament, which will be held at CWRU on Friday and Saturday. The Ladies won their 11th North Coast title and third NCAA Division III crown last spring. The second seed will go to the winner of Tuesday's match between Denison (5-1; 10-5) and Ohio Wesleyan (6-1; 10-2) in Delaware. Allegheny (4-2; 17-2) is the fourth seed.

Kenyon is coming off an 8-1 triumph over Denison on Apr. 21. The Ladies are led by sophomore **Caryn Cuthbert (Arlington, VA/Yorktown)**, who is 8-1 at #1 singles and 18-4 overall, and senior **Renee Brown (Yellow Springs, OH/Yellow Springs)**, who is 9-3 at #4 singles and 17-4 overall. Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Christel Hain (Charleston, SC/England)** is 10-2 at #1 singles.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Wittenberg's men and Ohio Wesleyan's women look to defend team titles at the 14th NCAC Championships, which will be held at CWRU on Friday and Saturday. North Coast indoor champion Wooster, which placed third outdoors last spring, is joined by Allegheny, Denison and Ohio Wesleyan as the leading contenders in what should be a tightly contested men's meet. Ohio Wesleyan's women are favored to repeat, but will be pushed by Wooster and indoor champion Denison.

Allegheny senior **Jim Mormino (Mayfield Heights, OH/Mayfield)** and Kenyon junior **Katie Varda (Ada, MI/Forest Hills Central)** won the decathlon and heptathlon, respectively, as the NCAC staged the multi-event portion of the conference meet at Ohio Wesleyan on Apr. 25-26. This is the first time that the events have been scored in the NCAC Championships. Mormino and Varda each won four events, with Varda reaching an NCAA provisional qualifying standard in the heptathlon.

**WOOSTER TO HOST NORTH COAST BASEBALL TOURNEY;
OHIO WESLEYAN RANKED FIRST IN FINAL MEN'S LAX POLL**

May 4, 1998

CLEVELAND Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (15-1; 36-4) has earned the top seed and will host the NCAC Tournament on Thursday and Friday. Ohio Wesleyan (11-5; 32-7), Denison (9-5; 15-11) and Wittenberg (9-5; 23-10-1) round out the field as the second, third and fourth seeds, respectively. The double-elimination event will be played at Art Murray Field on the Wooster campus and at Thurman Munson Stadium in Canton.

Wooster has won 23 of 24 games since returning from its spring trip and is ranked first in this week's ABCA/Collegiate Baseball Division III poll. The Scots, who own six North Coast titles, are 5-1 against the other three teams in the tournament. Ohio Wesleyan is ranked eighth in Division III and is coming off a doubleheader split with Wooster on May 3. The Bishops have won five NCAC crowns. Denison and Wittenberg are looking for their first North Coast championships.

GOLF REPORT: Allegheny had three of the top six finishers on the way to its fourth consecutive team title at the NCAC Championships held at the Wooster Country Club on May 1-2. The Gators, who have won six of 14 North Coast crowns, totaled 606 over 36 holes at the par-72, 6,466-yard layout. Wooster (621) placed second for the second straight season, followed by Denison (640) in third and Ohio Wesleyan (643) in fourth. Allegheny freshman **Nate Smith (Brookville, PA/Brookville)** earned medalist honors with consecutive rounds of 73 for a two-over par total of 146. He is the fourth freshman in five years to win the event. The Gators also got outstanding performances from junior **Mike Gasper (Washington, PA/Trinity)**, who placed second at 148, and senior **Bobby Ruffing (Shaker Heights, OH/Shaker Heights)**, who shared fifth at 155. Wooster senior **Steve King (Medina, OH/Medina)** and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Ian Miller (Mount Vernon, OH/Mount Vernon)** tied for third at 152 and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Ryan Casclani (Monongahela, PA/Ringgold)** tied for fifth at 155 to round out the top six.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan (5-0; 13-1) will be joined by Denison (4-1; 7-5) in the 12-team NCAA Tournament field. Denison, ranked 11th in the final USILA Division III poll, will play at fifth-ranked Washington & Lee (12-2) in a first round match on Wednesday. The Denison-Washington & Lee winner will advance to face top-ranked Ohio Wesleyan in the quarterfinals on Saturday. The NCAC has had two teams in the national tournament in each of the past three seasons and six times in 14 years overall. Ohio Wesleyan is making its 15th NCAA Tournament appearance and Denison its ninth.

Ohio Wesleyan increased its win streak to 13 and secured sole possession of its 10th North Coast title with a 30-7 victory against Wittenberg (2-3; 10-6) on Apr. 30. The Bishops were led by junior attacker **Evan Dunne (Pound Ridge, NY/Fox Lane)**, who matched a career best with five goals, and senior attacker **Darren McGurn (Chester, NJ/Mendham)**, who had three goals and five assists. Third-place Kenyon (3-2; 9-4) closed its fifth consecutive winning season with a 12-7 triumph over Wooster (1-4; 3-13) on Apr. 29. Sophomore midfielder **Kurt Cross (Bellevue, WA/Overlake)** scored five goals to pace the Lords.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: North Coast runner-up Denison (10-5) has received its 10th bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Big Red will visit Johns Hopkins (13-2) on Wednesday in the first round of the

12-team event.

Oberlin (11-4) captured its third conference championship in four years with a 12-11 win over Denison in the finals of the NCAC Tournament at Kenyon on May 3. Senior midfielders **Anne Ewens (Providence, RI/Wheeler)** and **Katherine Roberts (Ithaca, NY/Ithaca)** had five goals each and senior goalie **Alysia Oakley (Wilmington, NC/St. Andrew's)** had 18 saves to pace the Yeowomen, who overcame a 6-3 halftime deficit. Ewens was one of three players with three goals as Oberlin took a 15-12 decision from Ohio Wesleyan (7-6) in the tournament semifinals on May 2. Freshman attacker **Laura Peace (Lutherville, MD/St. Paul's)** scored six goals as Denison posted a 24-7 win over Kenyon (8-8) in its semifinal contest.

SOFTBALL REPORT: Allegheny (4-1; 17-20) has claimed the inaugural NCAC championship. The Gators split a doubleheader with second-place Wittenberg (6-2, 14-15) and won the only game played against third place CWRU (5-2; 17-7). CWRU freshman first baseman **Adrienne Douglass (Marietta, OH/Marietta)** won the North Coast batting crown with a .481 average. She also led the conference in doubles (10) and runs batted in (32). The North Coast's top two pitchers were Allegheny junior **Jacelyn Peterson (Monroeville, NJ/Delsea Regional)**, who finished at 9-7 with a 1.77 earned run average, and CWRU sophomore **Becky Palmer (Bennington, VT/Mount Anthony Union)**, who was 17-7 with a 2.10 ERA. Palmer pitched all 167 innings for the Spartans.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Top-seeded Denison (20-3) outscored three opponents 12-1 on the way to its second consecutive team title at the NCAC Championships held at Wittenberg on May 1-2. The Big Red, who have won or shared eight of 14 North Coast titles, capped their championship run with a 4-1 triumph over second-seeded Kenyon (17-7) in the finals. Sophomore **Cole Newman (Bexley, OH/Bexley)** and juniors **John Ginther (Akron, OH/Firestone)** and **Jeremy Edesess (Indianapolis, IN/Brebeuf)** each won twice in singles and doubles for Denison. Wooster (15-10) took third place with a 4-2 victory against Allegheny (17-8) in the consolation finals.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: North Coast champion Kenyon (16-5) has earned its 12th consecutive NCAA Tournament berth. The Ladies, who claimed their third Division III title last spring, will be the second seed in the 14-team event held at Washington & Lee from Tuesday-Friday. They will receive a bye through the first round and face the winner of the match between Hope (7-1) and Claremont-Mudd-Scripps (15-3) in the quarterfinals on Wednesday.

Kenyon did not lose on any court and dropped only one set over three matches on the way to its fourth straight team title at the NCAC Championships held at CWRU on May 1-2. The Ladies, who own 12 of 14 North Coast titles, took a 9-0 decision from Denison (13-7) in the finals. Senior **Ali St. Vincent (Bay Village, OH/Bay)** upped her record to 15-7 with a pair of wins at #1 singles. Denison has placed second 11 times in 14 years. Ohio Wesleyan (12-4) captured third place with a 5-4 win over Allegheny (18-4) in the consolation finals.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: Allegheny's men and Ohio Wesleyan's women captured team titles at the NCAC Championships held at CWRU on May 1-2. Allegheny won four individual events and totaled 166 points to outdistance Ohio Wesleyan (142) and Wooster (140) in the men's field. The North Coast championship is the third for the Gators and their first since 1993. Ohio Wesleyan's women also won four events on the way to 148 points and their fifth NCAC crown. The Bishops, who also won last year's title, edged Wooster (147) by one point in the closest women's meet in conference history. The closest previous margin was Allegheny's 11-point win over Ohio Wesleyan in 1992. Four men won two events, including Wooster sophomore **Reggie Ray (Norton, OH/Wadsworth)** in the 100 (10.81) and 200 (21.83), Denison freshman **Joe Dunham (Laramie, WY/Laramie)** in the 1500 (4:01.96) and 10,000 (31:53.15), Wittenberg senior **Bart Lubbers (Columbus, OH/Worthington)** in the long jump (22' 8") and triple jump (45' 1/4"), and Ohio Wesleyan junior **Ike Reid (Hartford, CT/Loomis Chaffee)** in the shot put (49' 3/4") and discus (146' 9"). Allegheny junior **Amy Schuckert (North Canton, OH/GlenOak)**, who won the 800 (2:17.12) and 1500 (4:42.30), and Wittenberg senior **Lori Lyle (Middletown, OH/Middletown)**, who swept the 100 (12.51) and 200 (26:08), were the only women to win multiple events.

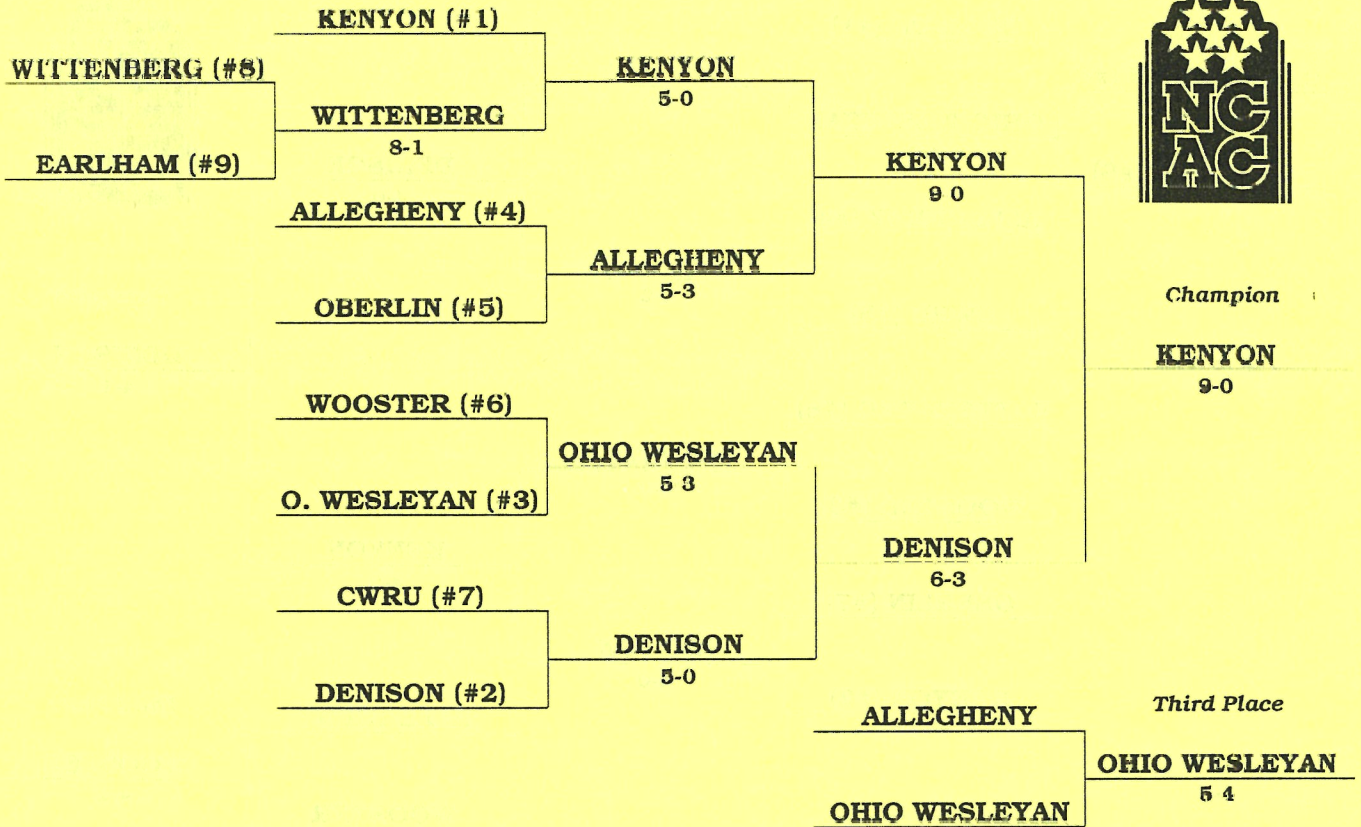

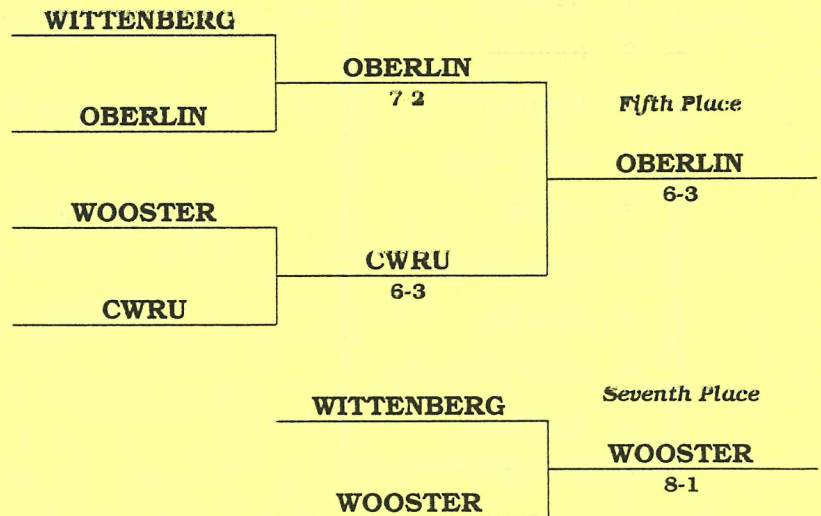

**DENISON CLAIMS SECOND ALL-SPORTS TITLE;
 FOURTH SCHOOL TO WIN IN LAST FIVE YEARS**

CLEVELAND -- Denison posted top-four finishes in 18 of 22 sports on the way to its second North Coast Athletic Conference All-Sports championship. The Big Red built a 1.5-point advantage after the winter season and finished strong with one championship and three second place finishes in the spring to total 149.5 points and break the previous scoring record of 146 set by Wittenberg in 1995-96. Denison's previous All-Sports title came in 1985-86.

Defending champion Wooster earned second place with 138 points, followed closely by Kenyon (126) in third, Wittenberg (125.5) in fourth, Allegheny (123) in fifth and Ohio Wesleyan (121.5) in sixth. Case Western Reserve (79.5), Oberlin (62.5) and Earlham (39.5) complete the standings in positions seven through nine.

Denison's championship campaign featured three NCAC titles (women's soccer, women's indoor track & field and men's tennis) and eight second place finishes. The Big Red improved their standing in 13 sports and added 31.5 points to their total from a year ago -- the largest point increase in a non-expansion season in conference history. Allegheny and Wooster won or shared five North Coast championships, while CWRU (+13) joined Denison in making a double-digit scoring jump.

The All-Sports award is given annually to the school that performs the best across the NCAC's 22 sports. Nine points are awarded for a first place finish, eight for a second, seven for a third, and so on. Men's and women's performances are combined, exemplifying the North Coast's commitment to equity and balance among programs. Wooster won three of the first four All-Sports championships, interrupted only by Denison in year two. Ohio Wesleyan followed with a six-year run leading to titles by Wooster (twice), Wittenberg and Denison over the past four seasons.

Allegheny leads the way with 64 team championships in 15 different sports during the NCAC's 14 playing seasons. Ohio Wesleyan is next with 62 titles, followed by Kenyon (54), Denison (50) and Wooster (40).

NCAC Spring Sports Update

**WOOSTER TOP SEED IN BASEBALL REGIONAL;
KENYON DUO WINS NCAA DOUBLES CROWN**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT: Wooster (38-4) and Ohio Wesleyan (33-8-1) have earned bids to the NCAA Tournament and will participate in the six team Midwest Regional at Thurman Munson Stadium in Canton from Thursday-Sunday. North Coast champion Wooster is the top seed and host, while Ohio Wesleyan is seeded third. Marietta (39-8) is the second seed, followed by Anderson (30-12), Hope (25-10) and Mary Washington (25-10) in positions four through six, respectively. Wooster (16) and Ohio Wesleyan (10) have made a total of 26 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances and the NCAC has been represented by at least two teams 11 times in 14 seasons. Wooster captured its third Midwest Regional title last spring and went on to place second in the eight team national finals.

Wooster earned its seventh North Coast championship with two wins at the NCAC Tournament in Canton on May 7-8. The Scots, who have won 25 of their last 26 games, topped Wittenberg (24-11-2) and Ohio Wesleyan in the four-team event that was shortened to single elimination due to rain. Sophomore righthander **Drew Binkowski (Bowling Green, OH/Bowling Green)** went all 10 innings and allowed three earned runs in Wooster's 6-4 win over Ohio Wesleyan in the championship contest. Junior **Brian Claypool (Leechburg, PA/Kiski Area)** sent the game into extra innings with a pinch hit, three run home run with two outs in the ninth inning for the Scots. Wooster junior centerfielder **Trevor Urban (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** was 6-for-11 with two home runs and four runs batted in to earn Most Valuable Player honors.

GOLF REPORT: North Coast champion Allegheny will be joined by Wooster and Ohio Wesleyan in the 23-team field at the NCAA Championships. The 72-hole event will be held at the Jekyll Island Golf Club in Jekyll Island, Ga., from Tuesday-Friday. Allegheny is making its 22nd consecutive NCAA appearance, extending the second-longest streak in the nation. The Gators, who won the national title in 1983, placed fourth last spring. Allegheny (22), Ohio Wesleyan (19) and Wooster (17) have combined to make a total of 58 appearances in the 24-year history of the Division III event. Allegheny freshman **Nathan Smith (Brookville, PA/Brookville)** owns the North Coast's lowest stroke average at 74.5. He was the medalist at the NCAC Championships with a two-over par 146 at the Wooster Country Club on May 1-2.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan (14-1) visits Nazareth (12-2) on Saturday in the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. Washington (Md.) and Gettysburg will play in the other semifinal, with the championship set for May 24 in Piscataway, N.J. Ohio Wesleyan, which is making its 15th post-season appearance in 19 years, has reached the finals four times.

Senior attacker **Darren McGurn (Chester, NJ/Mendham)** had four goals and two assists as Ohio Wesleyan advanced in the tournament and increased its win streak to 14 with a 17-8 victory at Washington & Lee in the quarterfinals on May 9. Junior attacker **Evan Dunne (Pound Ridge, NY/Fox Lane)** and sophomore midfielder **Dan Stroka (Flemington, NJ/Hunterdon Central)** also scored four goals for the Bishops. Denison (7-6) closed its season with a 16-13 loss to Washington & Lee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on May 6.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT: North Coast runner-up Denison (10-6) closed its season with a 22-8 loss at Johns Hopkins in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament on May 6. The post-season appearance was the Big Red's 10th in 14 seasons.

Ohio Wesleyan junior attacker **Jenny Feldman (North Potomac, MD/Bullis)** won the NCAC scoring title with 34 goals and 29 assists for an average of 5.25 points per game. Feldman also led the conference in assists (2.42 apg). Ohio Wesleyan senior **Jen Durgin (Hingham, MA/Hingham)** totaled 58 goals and 10 assists to rank first in goals (4.46 gpg) and second in points (5.23 ppg).

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT: Kenyon senior **Alain Hunter (Washington, DC/Woodson)** and Denison juniors **Lee Hays (Worthington, OH/Kilbourne)** and **Jeremy Edesess (Indianapolis, IN/Brebeuf)** will represent the North Coast at the individual portion of the NCAA Championships at Williams from May 18-20. Hunter and Hays will participate in the 32-man singles tournament, while Hays and Edesess form one of 16 doubles teams.

North Coast champion Denison (19-4) closed another outstanding season with a 6-1 loss to Gustavus Adolphus in the semifinals of the Midwest Regional on May 9. The Big Red were one of 16 teams to participate at four regional sites.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT: North Coast champion Kenyon (18-6) placed second in the NCAA Championships at Washington & Lee from May 5-8. The Ladies, who have three national crowns and four second-place finishes over the past 11 years, posted a 6-3 win over Claremont-Mudd-Scripps in the quarterfinals and a 5-0 victory against Gustavus Adolphus in the semifinals before dropping a 5-1 decision to Skidmore in the championship match.

The Kenyon tandem of sophomore **Caryn Cuthbert (Arlington, VA/Yorktown)** and **Erin Hockman (Aurora, OH/Western Reserve)** won the national championship in the doubles portion of the NCAA event. Cuthbert and Hockman won four consecutive matches, capped by a 6-3, 3-6, 7-6 (4) win over Amanda Mitchell and Nicole Podendorf of New Jersey on May 11. Cuthbert won four of five matches and placed second nationally in singles.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT: The NCAA Championships will be held at Macalester on May 21-23. Individual qualifiers will be released later in the week.

**ALL-NCAC BASEBALL SQUAD ANNOUNCED;
MISSLER, VAN DYKE EARN TOP HONORS**

CLEVELAND -- Ohio Wesleyan senior third baseman **Ryan Missler (Powell, OH/Dublin)** and Wooster senior righthander **Dan Van Dyke (Marietta, OH/Warren Local)** have been named Player and Pitcher of the Year to highlight the 1998 All North Coast Athletic Conference baseball selections.

Missler, a three-time, first-team All-NCAC honoree, hit .485 with team-highs of 15 doubles, 14 home runs and 66 runs batted in for the Bishops. He won his first North Coast batting crown and moved into sixth place on the school's career list with a .388 average.

Van Dyke led the conference with 10 wins to improve his career total to 24, tied for fifth in school history. He finished the season with a 10-3 record and a 4.50 earned run average. He is a two-time, first-team All-NCAC selection.

Five other players -- Ohio Wesleyan senior first baseman **Eric Heise (Port Clinton, OH/Port Clinton)**, Ohio Wesleyan senior second baseman **Brent Weaver (Berlin, OH/Hiland)**, Wooster junior third baseman **Travis Snyder (Wooster, OH/Triway)**, Wittenberg junior outfielder **Bryan Magoteaux (Piqua, OH/Piqua)** and Wooster junior outfielder **Trevor Urban (Olmsted Falls, OH/Olmsted Falls)** -- made the All-NCAC first team for the second consecutive season.
